Realistic Fiction

Flake, Sharon | The Skin I'm In

Thirteen-year-old Maleeka, uncomfortable because her skin is extremely dark, meets a new teacher with a birthmark on her face. She learns how to love, who she is, and what she looks like.

McCall, Guadalupe Garcia | Under the Mesquite

When Lupita's mother is diagnosed with cancer, the whole family shifts, bringing big changes for this tight-knit Mexican-American family. Pura Belpré Award winner.

Sloan, Holly Goldberg | Counting by 7s

Twelve-year-old genius and outsider Willow Chance must figure out how to connect with other people, and to find a surrogate family for herself after her parents are killed in a car accident.

Van Draanen, Wendelin | Flipped

In alternating chapters, two teenagers describe how their feelings about themselves, each other, and their families have changed over the years.

Non-Fiction

Heiligman, Deborah | Charles and Emma: The Darwins' Leap of Faith

Charles Darwin and his wife, Emma, were deeply in love and very supportive of each other, but their opinions often clashed. Emma was extremely religious, and Charles questioned God's very existence.

Lewis, John; Aydin, Andrew | March: Book One

A vivid first-hand account of Congressman John Lewis' lifelong struggle for civil and human rights, and a modern reflection on the distance traveled since the days of Jim Crow and segregation.

Osborne, Linda Barrett | This Land Is Our Land: A History of American Immigration

This book explores the way government policy and popular response to immigrant groups have evolved throughout U.S. history. A 2017 YALSA Excellence in Nonfiction finalist.

Tunnel, Michael O. | Candy Bomber: The Story of the Berlin Airlift's "Chocolate Pilot"

An American pilot decides to embark on a secret mission in his plane to drop off candy to children during World War II.

Historical Fiction

Levine, Kristin | The Lions of Little Rock

Painfully shy twelve-year-old Marlee sees her city and family divided over school integration, but her friendship with Liz, a new student, helps her find her voice and fight against racism.

Smith, Sherri | Flygirl

Will Ida Mae Jones be able to hide that she is biracial in order to be a female pilot for the WASPs (Women Airforce Service Pilots) during World War I?

Steinbeck, John | The Pearl

Kino is a poor diver gathering pearls from the Gulf of California in order to support his family. Then one extraordinary day, he finds a pearl as large as a sea gull's egg, as "perfect as the moon."

Yang, Gene Luen | Boxers

Little Bao has had enough of missionaries and soldiers roaming the countryside bullying and robbing peasants. Harnessing the powers of ancient Chinese gods, he recruits an army of Boxers-- commoners trained in Kung Fu to fight to free China.

Fantasy & Science-Fiction

Charbonneau, Joelle | The Testing

War has left much of the planet a charred wasteland. The future belongs to the next generation's chosen few, who must rebuild it. But to enter this elite group, candidates must first pass *The Testing*.

Hartman, Rachel | Seraphina

In a world where dragons can assume human form, Seraphina grapples with her identity amid magical secrets and royal scandals, while struggling to accept and develop her extraordinary musical talents.

Pfeffer, Susan Beth | Life as We Knew It

Miranda journals about her life after an asteroid knocks the moon closer to Earth, causing tsunamis, earthquakes and volcanic eruptions.

Wells, H.G. | The War of the Worlds

Extraterrestrials arrive to exterminate all of mankind. Will they succeed?

Mystery & Adventure Fiction

Auxier, Jonathan | The Night Gardener

Two abandoned Irish siblings travel to work as servants at a creepy, crumbling English manor house, where they are confronted by a mysterious spectre and an ancient curse.

Evans, Richard Paul | Michael Vey: The Prisoner of Cell 25

Michael discovers that he has the power to control electricity, and he's not the only one in his high school. Soon, he and his friends are hunted by a shadowy organization that wants to use their powers to take over the world.

Maetani, Valynne E. | Ink and Ashes

With the discovery that her late father was a member of the yakuza - the Japanese mafia - seventeen-year-old Claire Takata is thrust into a world of danger and uncertainty.

Paulsen, Gary | Brian's Winter

Brian is forced to survive a winter in the wilderness with only his survival pack and hatchet.
