Weeks, Sarah. **Oggie Cooder** - Oggie, a 4th grade "cheese sculptor," is shunned by all the other kids because he's different, that is until he comes to the attention of a popular T.V. talent show that spotlights the weird.

Beck, W.H. **Malcolm at Midnight** – A smaller than average rat at McKenna School must prove himself to join a secret society of classroom pets.

Cleary, Beverly. **The Mouse and the Motorcycle** - Ralph, an adventure-loving mouse, and his adventures on a toy motorcycle. One of a series.

Dahl, Roald. **Fantastic Mr. Fox** - Mr. Fox is surrounded--and he's going to have to come up with a truly fantastic plan to dig himself out of trouble this time!

Ibbotson, Eva. **One Dog and His Boy** –Hal, his dog Fleck, and friend Pippa journey with four rescued dogs to Scotland.

Claybourne, Anna. **The Science of a Glass of Water** (X530.4 Claybourne) – Learn what water is, how we use it, and why our world may be running dry.

Cusick, Dawn. **Get the Scoop on Animal Poop: from Lions to Tapeworms, 251 Cool Facts about Scat, Frass, Dung & More!** (X591.5 Cusick) – Discusses animal droppings and their uses, importance and meaning.

Peterson, Judy Monroe. **Fossil Finders: Paleontologists** (X567.9 Peterson) – Describes what a paleontologist does, and how to become one.

Sidman, Joyce. **Dark Emperor & Other Poems of the Night.** (X811 Sidman) – Poems celebrating the wonder and mystery of animals and plants at night.

Silverstein, Shel. **Where the Sidewalk Ends** (X811 Silverstein) - A boy who turns into a TV set is one of the characters in a collection of humorous poetry.
