


**Dear Parents

Summarize the plot.


Rate the book on a scale of 1 to 5.

Eleven-year-old Melody has cerebral palsy and cannot speak. When she gets a talking device, students and teachers learn of her smarts and inner strength.

Herlong, M.H.***Buddy***

Twelve-year-old Li'l T and his family face great losses caused by Hurricane Katrina, including leaving Buddy, their very special, three-legged dog, behind when they must evacuate.

Hiaasen, Carl***Hoot***

Roy, who is new to Florida, becomes involved in another boy's attempt to save a colony of burrowing owls from a proposed construction site. Newbery Medal Honor Book.

Spinelli, Jerry***Crash***

Seventh-grader John "Crash" Coogan has always been comfortable with his tough behavior, until a new friend and his grandfather's stroke make him reconsider.

Telgemeier, Raina***Smile***

As if sixth grade isn't hard enough, Raina has to overcome braces, retainers, headgear, earthquakes, boy troubles and frenemies.

Non-FictionFleischman, Sid***Escape!: the Story of the Great Houdini***

An entertaining account of the magician and king of escape artists, Harry Houdini.

Scieszka, Jon***Knucklehead***

In this comic-scrapbook biography, Jon recounts being one of six brothers, the class clown, and his childhood in the turbulent Sixties.

Fantasy & Science FictionNielson, Jennifer A.***The False Prince***

In a discontented kingdom, civil war is brewing. To unify the divided people, a plan is devised to find an impersonator of the king's long-lost son and install him as a puppet prince.

Oppel, Kenneth***Airborn***

Matt, a young cabin boy aboard an airship, and Kate, a wealthy young girl traveling with her chaperone, team up to search for the existence of mysterious winged creatures.

Stead, Rebecca***When You Reach Me***

Sixth-grader Miranda receives mysterious notes that predict future tragic events in her New York neighborhood.

Tolkien, J.R.R.***The Hobbit***

Hobbit Bilbo Baggins faces adventures in a land inhabited by dwarves, elves, goblins, dragons, and humans.

Walden, Mark***H.I.V.E.: The Higher Institute of Villainous Education***

Thirteen-year-old Otto is kidnapped and taken to a secret academy where all of the top young minds are being trained as the next generation of super-villains.

Historical FictionCholdenko, Gennifer***Al Capone Does My Shirts***

A twelve-year-old boy named Moose moves to Alcatraz Island in 1935, dealing with life and his autistic sister. Newbery Honor and American Library Association Best Book.

Meloy, Maile***Apothecary***

Follows a fourteen-year-old American girl whose life unexpectedly transforms when she moves to London in 1952 and gets swept up in a race to save the world from nuclear war.

Williams-Garcia, Rita***One Crazy Summer***

Three sisters travel to Oakland, California, in 1968 to spend a month with the mother who abandoned them.

Mystery & Adventure FictionDowd, Siobhan***The London Eye Mystery***

After Ted and Kat's cousin Salim vanishes from the London Eye Ferris wheel, the siblings investigate and solve the mystery of his disappearance.

Hahn, Mary Downing***Closed for the Season***

When thirteen-year-old Logan and his family move to a house in rural Virginia, he discovers that a woman was murdered there and becomes involved in the search to uncover the killer.

Horowitz, Anthony***Stormbreaker***


After the death of his uncle, fourteen-year-old Alex Rider continues his uncle's dangerous work for Britain's intelligence agency, MI-6.

Nelson, O.T.***The Girl Who Owned a City***

When a plague sweeps over the Earth killing everyone except children under 12, ten-year-old Lisa organizes a group to build a new way of life.

Smith, Roland***Peak***

Fourteen-year-old "Peak" Marcello is arrested for climbing a skyscraper. The judge orders Peak to live with his father, who wants him to be the youngest person to scale Mount Everest.
