Board of Education Regular Meeting - Thurs., June 30, 2022

Upcoming board meetings in July 2022:

• Thurs., July 21, 2022, 46 p.m. (regular meeting at the DO for board members and executive staff and via Zoom for all other staff and members of the public)

The board took action on the following:

- The board adopted new world languages textbooks. This was discussion on June 23
- The board approved the Single Plan for School Achievement (SPSA) for each school.
- The board approved the Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) for 2022-23. A
 public hearing on the LCAP was held during the June 23 special board meeting.
- The board approved the General Fund Budget for 2022-23. A public hearing on the budget was held during the June 23 special board meeting.
- The board revised the 2022-23 districtwide calendar to list the last Monday in March as a district holiday honoring César Chávez's birthday and June 19 as a holiday honoring Juneteenth.

The board discussed the following:

- The District English Learners Advisory Committee and Health & Safety and Visual & Performing Arts (VAPA) DACs presented their end-of-year reports to the board.
- In an effort to improve board meeting efficiency and effectiveness, the board discussed proposed changes to Board Bylaws 9322 Meeting Conduct and 9323 Agenda/Meeting Materials. Following the discussion, during which legal counsel answered board members' questions, the board decided to conduct a pilot (beginning with the August 11 board meeting) that would place public comments on agendized items near the beginning of the agenda and would limit the total number of minutes a member of the public could speak during a meeting to six minutes.
