

2020-2024 CULTURE & CLIMATE SURVEY


Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District (SMMUSD) partners with Hanover Research to administer an annual Culture and Climate Survey to students (Grades 4-12), staff, families, and community members. The survey was administered four times: in Spring of 2024, 2023, 2022, and 2021. SMMUSD uses this survey to gather perceptions and opinions and to identify areas of strength and weakness within the district. A total of 14,624 responses were collected across the four administration periods. This infographic provides a summary of key findings across the four survey administrations. Note: An asterisk (*) indicates a statistically significant difference between groups or years. Question text and answer options marked with † are truncated for clarity and brevity.


OVERALL QUALITY

A large majority of respondents rate SMMUSD's education as either good or excellent. However, overall perceptions of SMMUSD education quality continues to decrease in 2023-24, with students providing lower ratings than parents and staff over the past four years.

INSTRUCTIONAL EXPECTATIONS BY YEAR


The majority of respondents demonstrate positive perceptions of instructional expectations of SMMUSD schools. Notably, the levels of respondents that agree that schools offer a variety of academic courses, as well as adequately challenges advanced students, are at their highest levels among all survey years. However, schools adequately challenging advanced students remains the lowest-rated metric within instructional expectations.

INSTRUCTIONAL EXPECTATIONS BY GROUP

Respondents' perceptions of SMMUSD's instructional expectations widely differ based on respondent group, with students and parents providing significantly lower ratings compared to staff. Parents express particular concern regarding SMMUSD schools' ability to adequately challenge advanced students.






STUDENT PERCEPTIONS OF INSTRUCTION

In 2023-24, student perceptions of classroom instruction either remained constant or slightly decreased compared to the previous year. Students provide higher perceptions of the importance and relatedness of subjects, but lower ratings of how learning relates to their future or the outside world.

**Often + **Very Often




SOCIAL ENVIRONMENT

Student experiences of discrimination are comparable to 2022-23 survey results, with only minor percentage changes. Most students agree that they feel welcome and included at school, but fewer agree they feel comfortable issuing complaints about discrimination.


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PERCEPTIONS OF ADMINISTRATION

In 2023-24, perceptions of school administrators are significantly lower compared to last year across all measures. Significantly fewer respondents in 2023-24 agree that are in-tune with teachers' and staff members' concerns compared to the prior school year.




POST-HIGH SCHOOL PREPARATION

In which of the following areas do you feel your high school has not prepared you well enough for college and/or a future career?




Which of the following engagement opportunities did your school offer to parents during the school year? Select all that apply (Parents Only)

Which of the following might prevent you from attending college this fall?


