




Greatest Progress: English Language Arts, Mathematics, Graduation, and Suspensions




Greatest Progress: English Language Arts, Mathematics, English

Language Proficiency Graduation, and Suspension Rates





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
Greatest Need: Chronic Absenteeism, and College and



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
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

Interim Participation Rate – All Students




