 - CDE Reclassification Criteria:



- Assessment of English Language Proficiency (ELPAC)
- Comparison of Performance in Basic Skills
 - Local or state assessments to determine students are meeting academic measure in ELA
- Teacher Evaluation
 - Use the student's academic performance as evidence or curriculum mastery.
- Parent Opinion and Consultation
- SMMUSD Criteria (1-5):

 - Score of "4" on English language proficiency assessment of California (ELPAC)

CAASPP

- SMMUSD Criteria (Teacher Evaluation)
 - Teachers evaluate students on speaking, listening, reading and writing tasks in class.
 - Teachers measure how well students express ideas clearly and communicate using academic language.
 - Teachers also evaluate students' performance on classwork to ensure students are "on par" with English-only peers.
- SMMUSD Criteria (Parent Opinion and Consultation)
 - Parents/guardians meet with school administrator and staff to review student data and provide input.
 - Secondary students are encouraged to attend reclassification meetings whenever possible.
- SMMUSD Criteria (Students with IEPs)
 - Assessment of English Language Proficiency

- EL Master Plan: Seal of Biliteracy
 - Purpose: The State Seal of Biliteracy (SSB) recognizes high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing one or more languages in addition to English. The SSB is awarded by the California Department of Education's State Superintendent of Public Instruction in accordance with specified criteria set forth in the legislation. This recognition is marked by a gold seal on the diploma or transcript.
 - Eligibility Criteria (in English): All requirements must be met.
 - Complete all English language arts requirements for graduation with an overall grade point average of 2.0 in those classes.
 - Pass the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) for English language arts administered in grade eleven, at or above the "standard met" achievement level.
 - For English Learners (Els): Demonstrate English proficiency on the English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC), or any previous or successor state English language proficiency assessment, in transitional kindergarten, kindergarten, or any of grades 1 to 12, inclusive.
 - Eligibility Criteria (in a language other than English): One of the following must be met.
 - Pass a word language Advance Placement (AP) examination with a score of 3 or higher, or an International Baccalaureate (IB) examination with a score of 4 or more.
 - Successfully complete a four-year high school course of student in world language, attaining an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher in that course of study, and demonstrate oral proficiency in the language comparable to that required to pass an AP or IB examination.



- Pass the SAT II world language examination with a score of 600 or higher.
- Application Timeline
 - Now-March 3: Disseminate information about the State Seal of Biliteracy.
 - March 3: Deadline for students to submit the online application.
 - March 3-16: Counselors/advisors review applications, follow up with students as necessary, and validate requests.
 - Before graduation: Gold seal affixed to student's diplomas.

 - Laura Hernandez-She seconds Berenice's request because parents can share this with their students.
 - Alicia Mignano-what are the common ways students receive this Seal of Biliteracy? Is this offered to all students or a selected few?
 - Nazareth Riquelme- It is open to all students.
 - Alex Aspron-When is the reclassification celebration?

 - Laura Hernandez- Only reclassified students will be invited.
