
SMMUSD's Core Beliefs about English Learners

- 5. English learners and their families are partners in the learning process






Identification



Make sure to clearly understand the district's core beliefs about English Learners and the purpose of the Home Language Survey. If parents/guardians have questions about the HLS or the district's core please, please make sure to ask the front office staff at the school site!

How are students identified as English Learners in SMMUSD?

- 1. Parents/guardians complete a HOME LANGUAGE SURVEY (HLS) upon enrollment in a California public school
- 1. If a parent/guardian writes a language other than English on the first three questions of the HLS, SMMUSD is required to assess the student's English language proficiency
- 1. The assessment all districts in California are required to use is called the English Language Proficiency Assessment (ELPAC)






It's important for students to always do their best on the ELPAC. SMMUSD uses student's scores on the ELPAC for reclassification and placement decisions.

What is the ELPAC exam?

- ★ The Initial ELPAC exam assesses the English reading, writing, speaking and listening of students who may be English Learners
- ★ A student's score on the Initial ELPAC determines whether or not a student is classified as an English Learner (EL) or an Initial Fluent English Proficient (IFEP)
- ★ English Learners take the *Summative* ELPAC every year until reclassification
- ★ Parents/guardians receive their <u>child's</u>
 <u>score report</u> on the Initial and
 Summative ELPAC in the mail





English Learners should receive two types of instruction in ELD: Integrated and Designated ELD.

What instruction and support do ELs receive to develop English skills?

★ English Learners are required by law to receive English Language Development (ELD) throughout their school day across all content areas



Elementary School: Provided by the classroom teacher




Secondary School: Provided by the classroom teachers and/or a Designated ELD teacher




Tree Map

Reclassification




It takes approximately 5-7 years for a student to become proficient in a new language

SMMUSD has an alternate reclassification process for students with IEPs or 504 Service Plans who may be eligible for alternate reclassification


How are ELs reclassified as Fluent English Proficient (RFEPS)?

- ★ SMMUSD's four reclassification criteria are as follows:
 - Overall score of 4 on ELPAC
 - Meeting/exceeding standards on state or local ELA assessments
 - Teacher input and recommendation
 - Parent input and consultation
- ★ During a reclassification meeting parents/guardians can expect:
 - A school site administrator to facilitate the meeting and staff member(s) to attend
 - A review of the student's classwork and state/district test results
 - An opportunity for parents/guardians to ask questions and share input
 - A copy of the reclassification form (formal copy sent home after district approval)
