Model Policy for support of LGBTQ students:

Tara reviewed the draft policy- group suggested to take the document to experts that have appropriate definitions of terms. Committee feels we do not have expertise to review document

Tara decided to have experts review document then bring back to the DAC

Tara: update on Naloxone Education: board wants to know where we are at and what the next steps would be. Board has not adopted a policy regarding Naloxone.

Rachel: We received a lot of naloxone , all school sites received boxes based on a formula on the number of AEDs (defibrillators) at a school site, training of staff has started, Tara and Rachel spoke with school lawyers, schools are training site staff, and the goal is to have training with health and office staff. Our goal is to have continuity of training across all schools. We eventually want to train parents and students.

Laila wanted to know if there have been any student incidents at school and off campus related to fentanyl. Rachel was not aware of any incidents

Rachel segwayed to CPR training: we want to get back to CPR training in house with staff

Tara: Student services updates- working on model policy for transgender, all school safety plans were approved, working on getting some CERT training for staff and disaster training with some urban search and rescue

Cecilia - brought up if the active shooter policy needs to be reviewed, Tara stated Robert just reviewed the policy and the district is staying on top of that

Review of COVID test plan. Currently, every student and staff is given 2 tests on Friday's. Policy may be proposed where test are available to students and staff as needed vs. distributing to everyone on Fridays

Laila: update on restorative justice: staff has had many levels of RJ training

CC wanted an update from Olympic because it's such a high risk student population, Laila and Pat also wanted to hear from new principal, and look at the DAC as a resource

Foster youth have been identified as overly suspended and attendance is truant, as a district we need to work with population making sure they are getting the support they need and ensure we are using alternate means of behavior correction

Pat wanted to know if DAC will participate in interviewing the new superintendent and the possibility of rotating the possibility of a Chair
