Clickbait

An image or headline that tries to get you to click on it, usually for advertising purposes





ACTIVITY: AVOIDING CLICKBAIT

- **Clue #1:** It seems **impossible** or **unbelievable**.
FOR EXAMPLE: "Think Your Cat Loves You? It's Actually Plotting to Make You Sick."
- **Clue #2:** It tries to **shock** you.
FOR EXAMPLE: "You Won't Believe This!" or "The Answer Is Genius!"
- **Clue #3:** It refers to a **celebrity** or **popular topic**.
FOR EXAMPLE: "Kylie Jenner Talks Selfies and Bubble Tea: You Won't Believe What She Says!"

Bully

The person who is doing the bullying



A Bystander

A person who observes a conflict or unacceptable behavior, but does not take part in it

An Upstander

A person who supports and stands up for someone else

Reasons Why Cyberbullying Occurs	Ways to Respond if You Are Cyberbullied	Ways to Be an Upstander
Someone acts or looks differently than others	Tell a trusted adult	Inform a teacher, a coach, a parent, or another trusted adult
Someone is angry or resentful toward another person	Ignore the messages	Encourage the target not to respond or retaliate
Someone is jealous of another person	Block the bully	Encourage the target to reach out to a trusted adult
Someone feels bad because they have been bullied	Use reporting tools online	Reach out to the target to see how they are feeling and listen to them

The **headline** is the title of a news article. It's usually printed in big, bold letters near the top of the article.

The **headline** tells readers what the article is about before they start reading.

byline

The byline is the name of the article's author.

It tells readers the name of the person (or people) who wrote the article.

date

The **date** is the exact day (and sometimes time) when the article was published or last updated.

It tells you how recently the article was published and how current the information is.

The **section title** is the category or section of an article on a news website.

It tells you what type of article you're reading and how the article is categorized by the website.

The **image** or **video** helps introduce the article and sometimes shows details that words can't.

advertisements
