She also has promoted student engagement through her innovative project-based learning experiences, and through coordinating enrichment such as leading the student newspaper, The McKinley Times. She also has spent the last 7 years volunteering her time as a playroom volunteer at the Stuart House (UCLA Rape Treatment Center).
