# SMMUSD Reopening Plan

7/16/20

Board of Education approved plan

- Model C: all students participate in distance learning

7/17/20

Governor's Order

- School districts may reopen for in-class learning once their county has been off the state's monitoring list for 14 consecutive days.

NOTE: SMMUSD will continue to plan for in-class teaching & learning for when it is safe to return to campuses (clearance from state & county).



# Distance Learning

## General Expectations

- Two working groups redesigning teaching & learning
  - District Leadership & Principals (43) & Teaching & Learning (68)
  - ES, MS, & HS Distance Learning Expectations
- Weekly & daily schedule
- Daily live instruction
- Daily minimum instructional minutes
- Daily attendance (participation in online activities & work completion)
- Standards-based instruction
- Incorporation of independent learning/performance tasks, assignments, & projects
- Ongoing assessments of student learning & progress

## Technology Devices & Digital Resources

- Chromebooks for students
- Hotspots for students, as needed
- Use of common digital platforms (Google Classroom/Google Meet, Seesaw, Zoom and Screencastify to record lessons)



# Distance Learning

## Assessments

- District-wide diagnostic assessment created and/or identified by teachers to determine student performance levels & identified areas of need
- Implement a variety of formative assessments to gauge student learning &/or engagement (exit slips, learning reflection, classroom poll, Google form)
- Grade level & department teams develop common formative assessments to monitor student learning
- Monitor student learning & progress using district-wide interim assessments by grade level & department

## Addressing Learning Loss & Extra Support for Special Populations

- Develop a tiered re-engagement process that outlines strategies to support students who are absent for more than three school days or 60% of the instructional days in a school week
- Extra social emotional and/or academic support provided through small and/or individual live sessions with students
- As health protocol permit, bring small groups of student for in-person intervention (English Learners, Homeless Foster Youth, Low Income, SpEd, and At-Promise students)



# Distance Learning

## Special Education

- IEPs held via electronic platform until further notice
- Continue services virtually & provide small-group or individual instruction to work on IEP goals
- Teachers & providers work with families on best way to accommodate student's learning needs
- Support students with goal areas or services that are served within general education classroom
- Only if/when deemed safe, begin to bring students on campus in small groups in a tiered approach according to individual need
- Ensure adequate equipment & supplies to meet student & staff needs prior to bringing students on campus
  - Plan for students with difficulty observing physical distancing or intolerance to wearing face covering
  - Proper protective equipment for paras & other staff
  - Clear face shields &/or plexiglass barriers when working closely with students
  - Breaks every 15-20 minutes to move to outside space
  - Masks for all adults & students, unless exempted



# Distance Learning

## Professional Learning

- School site teams coming together for planning (School Leadership Team, Faculty Advisory Council, & grade level/department teams)
- Additional district-wide summer professional learning & preparation days for teachers
- Opportunities for teacher leaders to provide training & share their implementation of best practices for distance learning
- Daily prep time for teachers
- Weekly collaboration time for grade level &/or department teams
- Weekly professional learning for elementary & secondary teachers offered by Educational Services

## Family Engagement and Support

- Back to School Conference (Ed Services & Student Services)
- Training on digital platforms Google Classroom/ Google Meets, Seesaw, Zoom, Illuminate Parent Portal
- Updates on [SMMUSD Family Resource](#) web-page



# Distance Learning

## Accountability

- Students participating in live instruction & completing all assignments (expectations forthcoming)
- Teachers implementing distance learning expectations developed by Teaching & Learning Working Group (district leadership, principals, & teachers)
- Parents as equal partners supporting their student's participation in daily live instruction & completion of assignments
- Principals supporting teachers' implementation of Distance Learning expectations
- District providing professional learning & necessary supports (technology, instructional materials, classroom space)

## With District

- Update contact information (email & phone numbers)
- Survey students, families, & staff every 4-6 weeks to evaluate DL
- Updates on SMMUSD & Family Resource web page
- Superintendent's regular message

## With Principal

- Site DL Orientation
- Weekly communication
- Monthly Coffee with the Principal
- Updates on school web page

## With Teacher

- Classroom DL Orientation
- Weekly communication regarding learning expectations for students (TK-12) through Google Classroom, Seesaw, &/or email
- Regular updates in Illuminate (grades 6-12)

# Student Supervision Possibilities

- Supervision of students for distance learning during the school day
  - Create priority list:
    - *Children of employees who need to be at work, socio-economically disadvantaged, English Learners, homeless/foster youth, students with disabilities, & at-risk students*
  - Limited locations throughout district
  - Staffed by school-day district staff (non CDS)
    - *Serves as a supervision location only*
    - *Not instruction-based*
- After-school care offered via CDS/CREST (fee-based)
- Possibly partner with community organizations



# Distance & On-campus Opportunities

- Comply with health protocols to coordinate programs & specific groups of students for in-person instruction & experience
  - VAPA
  - Athletics
  - Special populations
- Establish superintendent's advisory group of health experts on COVID-19
  - Help interpret & analyze local data & guidance from CDC, LA County, & state
  - Assist in planning for in-person activities & help determine when viable to reopen (scientific perspective)
