We need all parents' and guardians' full engagement to be the great school community we know we are.

5th Grade Catalina Trip Confirmed for 2020

Next school year our 5th graders (4th graders this year) will be invited to participate in a 3-day / 2-night learning trip to the Catalina Island Marine Institute (CIMI). The dates are Wednesday, October 7 - Friday, October 9. The teachers and principal felt that this year's trip was outstanding, so we are electing to continue this program. This educational activity supports our Marine Science education program and helps to build student solidarity too. As in the past this program is completely funded by voluntary community donations hopefully including sizable support from the PTA to help offset costs. If we do not raise enough voluntary donations, then the trip must be canceled as the school does not have enough funding to underwrite this <u>supplementary</u> educational experience for our youth. By July we must put down a semi-refundable down payment of roughly \$5,000. As with this school year we will ask the PTA assume this risk. The total cost this year all-in was about \$18,000. 4th grade PTA Room Parents are asked to speak with other 4th grade parents about fundraising, recruiting voluntary donations, and to contact Principal Hertz ASAP. July will be here soon. All fundraising must receive pre-approval from both the PTA and the Principal so please do not collect anything yet! The Board of Education must approve the trip in advance too. A very limited number of highly responsible parents will be needed to help staff keep the children safe and engaged. Recruiting will begin in August. All volunteers will pay a transportation-housing-meal fee upfront. Go Sealions!
