#### McKinley Recognized by the Board of Education for Black History Month Teachings

At the February 15<sup>th</sup> BOE meeting, under the commendations and recognitions portion of the agenda, Dr. Benjamin presented about the many unique things McKinley does for Black History Month. She shared about how International Day is special event that celebrates our diversity through dance, food, and cultural experiences. She also talked about how McKinley is one of only two elementary schools in SMMUSD that has an African American Support Group (AASG). This year McKinley has two African American related assemblies, we had an African drum and dance experience, and the other in the Spring is a dance performance that tells the history of hip hop. During Black History Month our librarian displayed and read aloud books by Black authors and of Black characters and themes, and during Friday Morning Announcements students shared about influential figures in Black history. Dr. Benjamin discussed how McKinley teachers use Responsive Classroom techniques and Morning Meetings to discuss social justice topics and build classroom community. Lastly she shared three classroom projects. The first project was by Ms. Kim (4<sup>th</sup>) and Dr. Moore (K), who read books and articles about a wide variety of individuals who have made an impact on American history and then transferred 3 facts and a photo to guilt. For a second project by Dr. Moore's class each student chose a guote from Dr. King that spoke to them, and created an art piece using the quote. Mr. Edwards (4<sup>th</sup>) began his project with a series of read alouds about specific figures and actions during the Civil Rights Movement. His students then conducted a family interview project on the legacy of MLK and perspectives on social change, that students then later shared with each other to determine common and unique experiences. Overall, the efforts above tie into both our school site focus of Academic Discourse, as well as the District's newly adopted Diversity Standards. Dr. Benjamin was proud to share the work we are doing to make our school a model school in both academics and social justice. We are teaching our students to uphold our PRIDE philosophy, and preparing them to be positive members of the community and the world.
