

National School Walk Out



March 14th was the National School Walk Out event. SMMUSD elementary schools chose to use this opportunity to have age-appropriate discussions about peace, kindness, and diversity. At McKinley classes discussed PRIDE and the Pillars of Character. While these discussions aren't new for our students as they regularly think about and model our PRIDE philosophy, students had valuable and meaningful conversations about peace at McKinley and in the community. We had also intended to take a school picture spelling out PRIDE but we couldn't fly our drone due to an unexpected no-fly order. However, a few days later our drone took off, and our 500 students and 100 staff came together to show our McKinley PRIDE! On March 14th our 5th graders also participated in a "walk out" experience led by Student Council. After a thoughtful and inspirational speech by the Student Council President, the 5th graders marched along the inside perimeter of the school. The students carried signs about peace, love, acceptance, and kindness, and they enjoyed hearing cars honk in support of them. It was wonderful to see our students experiencing a peaceful form of social justice activism.

Fun for 5th Grade: Ballroom Dance and Pali Camp

It was a big month for our 5th graders! First they had an evening ballroom dance performance where they danced the swing, waltz, tango, fox trot, and a traditional Hawaiian dance. Thank you to the instructors from SMC Dance Academy, and to all of you who have donated to the Santa Monica Malibu Education Foundation which funds the Ballroom program in addition to programs like visual arts and theater. Then the 5th graders were off to Pali Camp in Running Springs. The students had a blast climbing the ropes course, dissecting squid, hiking, and even karaoke singing! They got to play in a bit of snow, and brave a little rain, and came back with new confidence and friendships.



2nd Grade Wax Museum

The 2nd graders participated in a project-based learning experience that culminated in a "Wax Museum" event. Students selected and researched an influential figure in history or present time. Then parents and students were invited to come to the museum (the auditorium) to view all the 2nd graders dressed up as and embodying their character. Viewers would press the students' buttons to "activate" them, and they would come alive to tell the viewer all about themselves. Nice job 2nd graders!



3rd-5th State Testing April 30-May 23

In one month the 3rd-5th graders will take the state test called the CAASPP. You can find information about the assessment and practice tests at <u>www.caaspp.org</u> and <u>www.smarterbalanced.org/parents/</u>

You can help our students be successful by:

- 1. Having them go to bed at least an hour earlier
- 2. Making sure they arrive to school on-time or early (we start testing first thing in the morning and go until recess)
- 3. Eat a healthy filling breakfast
- 4. Encouraging your child and telling them to relax and not be nervous; the students are going to do great!
- 5. You can also donate healthy snacks and fun rewards (pencils, stickers etc.) to your child's classroom.



Did you know there is no longer an API, AYP, or Program Improvement? Now there is a more detailed and complex state accountability system called Dashboard. GREAT SCHOOLS FORUM



School/Parent Partnership: What Parents can do to Help

Parents often ask us how they can help. We love when parents/guardians want to help support the school and work with us partners! Here are 5 things every parent/guardian can do that make a significant impact on your child's school experience and the school as a whole.

- 1. Be informed
 - a. Know your child's strengths and areas of need so you can support the school's efforts at home. Talk to your child's teacher and read notes/grades sent home.
 - b. Know what is happening at school. Read the mini-messenger and Wednesday Folder weekly.
- 2. If you have a question or concern contact the person directly
 - a. Don't wait; we want to help. Contact the teacher directly, or if you still have a question/concern or have something more serious, contact an administrator.
- 3. Read at home with your child
 - a. Research shows that reading at least 20 minutes a day with your child significantly improves their success in school. This is even more important than homework!
 - b. You can read aloud, have your child read to you, or have your child read silently and after ask comprehension questions.
 - c. You can read in any language. Bilingualism deepens students' knowledge and thinking skills.
- 4. Donate to PTA and the Santa Monica Malibu Education Foundation
 - a. Your donation impacts our students' educational experience. Your Ed Foundation donation pays for staff like our theater and visual arts classes as well as instructional aides. Your PTA donation pays for stuff like supplies, assemblies, technology, and field trips.
- 5. Support a positive school climate
 - a. Attend meetings like PTA, ELAC, and AASG.
 - b. Coordinate, volunteer, and/or attend school events like the Fall Festival and International Day.
 - c. Share your enthusiasm and positivity! Students thrive when the adults around them display positive attitudes and flexibility. Particularly in today's challenging political and cyber climate, we want our elementary students to feel safe and confident by seeing their adults modeling the PRIDE philosophy. And of course respectful constructive feedback with suggestions and offers of help are welcome.
