Exciting News: Performing Arts Theater Instruction is Coming to McKinley!

I am thrilled to announce that starting at the end of October, all McKinley students will get to participate in performing arts theater classes!

Here at McKinley, we are fortunate to receive extracurricular instruction in <u>Science</u> (funded by P.S. Science and the Santa Monica Malibu Education Foundation), <u>Music</u> (funded by the District and the Ed Foundation), and <u>Visual</u> <u>Arts</u> (funded by the Ed Foundation and P.S. Arts). McKinley teachers, the administration, and Site Governance discussed how theater was the one area missing from our wonderful instructional program, and felt that it would be a great way to engage students and develop the Whole Child. We also analyzed 16-17 state test (CAASPP) data, Fastbridge, and other assessment data, and determined that developing students' oral language skills and providing students with opportunities for academic discourse and engagement would benefit all our students; performing arts would help to achieve this goal. Other schools similar to McKinley who have brought theater to their schools have seen benefits such as increased language development, social/emotional growth, and engagement.

So we have contracted with P.S. Arts to provide <u>Performing Arts Theater</u> <u>instruction</u> (funded by the Education Foundation)! The theater teachers will be collaborating with McKinley teachers, to ensure that their lessons are tied to our ELA State Standards and to our ELA Curriculum. This way the instruction will build upon and extend the learning that is happening in classrooms. For example, in 2nd grade students are learning about folktales, and theater lessons may involve acting out folktales from different cultures.

All students will receive 11 sessions of theater, 3rd-5th in October-February, and TK-2 in February-May. Classes will be 50 minutes for grades 1-5, and 30-45 minutes for TK-K. The 11th class will be an "Informance" when parents will be invited to attend so you can see how the theater class instruction and format looks.

We are proud and excited to bring this special learning opportunity to our students.
