#### It's Time for Parent Teacher Conferences!

Wondering what to expect at your first Parent/Teacher Conference? At this 15-20 minute conference your child's teacher will let you know about how your child is doing in school. Your teacher will not give you a report card yet; report cards will go home February 9<sup>th</sup>. Your meeting next week is all about checking in and discussing your child's progress. Your teacher will give you a typed Progress Report, that summarizes your child's strengths as well as some things he/she can work on. Your teacher will talk to you about your child's progress in academics, work habits, and behavior. These are some things you can do to help us have productive and positive conferences.

- 1. <u>Arrive on time.</u> Teachers often have conferences scheduled back-to-back, so we really appreciate it when you come on time so we can stay on schedule.
- 2. Let your teacher know ahead of time if you have a complex matter to discuss. Teachers typically reserve 15-20 minutes for you, so it's helpful for them to know ahead of time of any questions or concerns you might have so they can prepare student work or data to share with you.
- 3. <u>Share information</u>. It is helpful to teachers to know more about their students' home life, interests, and families so that they can tailor instruction to meet their needs. Please share any strengths, challenges, or information you think might be relevant for the teacher to know.
- 4. <u>Ask questions</u>. If anything doesn't make sense, please let the teacher know so he/she can clarify. Or if you leave the meeting and think of questions later, go ahead and email the teacher.
- 5. <u>Parents as partners.</u> Educating students is a team effort between home and school. Be sure to ask your teacher what things you can do at home to support your child's learning. Also check in to see what school activities or events you can be involved in.

McKinley Math Coach and Blended Learning Cohort teacher Ms. Kim, facilitated a Rotational Blended Learning style professional development for McKinley teachers Wednesday, October 4, 2017. The Agenda reflected a menu of Math focused offerings where teachers had the ability to reinforce number talks strategies, the inclusion of sentence frames, creating intentional talk lesson plans and exploring digital tools. McKinley Elementary's Site Leadership Team selected Academic Discourse as their professional development focus for the year. Ms. Kim, who is also the PD Leader and part of the SLT worked with Sheri Hynding (EdTech TOSA and Blended Learning Coach) and was supported by Rosa Serratore (PreK-12 Math Coordinator) and McKinley Principal Dr. Ashley Benjamin as they work to create more engaging professional development opportunities for teachers.



#### Fun Fact for Parents

Adding just ten minutes of reading time per day will dramatically increase the number of words your child reads each year - especially for students who do not yet read proficiently. For example, a student at the 30th percentile who spends an extra ten minutes a day on book reading will read around 700,000 words each year, surpassing the amount of reading currently done by students at the 70th percentile. (Adams, 2006).
