RE: High School Graduation Requirements

On January 23, 2003 the administrative staff from Santa Monica High School presented recommendations on behalf of both SAMOHI and Malibu High, that the Board strongly consider modification of the minimum requirements for high school graduation.

Specifically, staff recommends:

- A. Increase the current mathematics requirement from two (2) to three (3) years, and
- B. Modify the current foreign language/arts requirement to require one (1) year of foreign language and one (1) year of a visual or performing art. At present, students are required to take one (1) year of either visual or performing arts, speech, debate, foreign language or American Sign Language.

With respect to the above staff recommendations concerning adding an additional year of mathematics to the current requirement, the first grade level to be impacted would be the Class of 2007 (current 8th graders). This recommendation therefore, would not go into implementation until the 2005-06 school year.

With respect to the second recommendation, requiring all students to take a full year of foreign language would require immediate additional staffing for the 2003-04 school year. The number of additional FTE required could be as high as five (5), but would likely be lower given we are currently staffed to accommodate those students who would have taken a foreign language anyway.

My recommendation at this time is that we increase the mathematics requirement from two (2) to three (3) years effective with the 2005-06 school year. With respect to the foreign language/visual and performing arts requirement, I recommend we hold on implementation until such time that the district's financial resources will allow us to properly implement it.

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.18

It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize the following restructuring of the District Advisory Committee (DAC) report process for one year only. This suggestion is being made in light of the current budget crises brought upon the district by the severe reduction in State funding to public education.

COMMENT: Typically, each Board-appointed DAC is encouraged to present a year-end report to the Board that both outlines its accomplishments of the previous year and offers thoughtful suggestions relative to the wants and needs of the committee's discreet constituency. (Board Policy and Administrative Regulations 1220; available on the district's website, www.smmusd.org, click on "I Want to Know About," scroll down to and select "Policies.")

The incredible budget cuts that the district is now forced with making suggests that this reporting process be changed for one year only. It is staff's opinion that early input from each DAC would be very helpful to the Board in its budget-decision making process.

Through early interface, the Board would have a precise indication of which, if any, of the particular kinds of services currently being considered for discontinuance or reduction are most important to a given constituency. Additionally, the reports would be structured in such a way as to allow for an appropriate, highly specific public forum. Finally, staff believes that in providing this reporting opportunity to the community, two additional purposes may be achieved:

- dissemination of new and vital budgetary information
- 2) possible identification of new revenue streams for district programs.

While it is understood that the timing is very tight, it is also presumed that each committee is keenly aware of what proposals it would make in its regular Spring report

and that any such ideas would be made in correlation to the district's adopted Strategic Plan.

It is therefore suggested that each committee:

- 1) select 20-minute time slot from those provided below; the time slots would be guaranteed on a first-come, first-serve basis
- 2) prepare a report for the Board that would follow these
 guidelines:
 - A) 5-7 minutes: careful delineation of which particular kinds of services are most valued by the committee and why. This segment would include rationale, statistics, projected impact on all stakeholders, etc.
 - B) **2-3 minutes:** NEW suggestions for increasing field-specific revenue streams
 - C) 2-3 minutes: NEW or amended strategies for crosscurricular teaming to maximize the dollars the district does have
 - D) 2-3 minutes: NEW or amended action plans for supporting the ideas, specifically tied to the strategic plan
 - E) 2-3 minutes: staff liaison comments

At the end of 20 minutes the report would stop. Period.

Committees not wishing to participate at this time would be given the standard reporting opportunity in May.

The final variance in the reporting process would be that there would be no commitment of any district funding for any of the proposals.

Child Care and Development Community Health & Safety Fine Arts Instructional Technology Intercultural Advisory Special Education Sports and Physical Education

Other Board-appointed committees (Chapter One, Gifted and Talented, Bilingual) may report as well by following the above-listed procedure.

Moving forward in such a way seems vital to the Board's deep understanding of the wishes of the its constituents.

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve <u>Resolution Number 02-22: In Support of (California State) Assembly Constitutional Amendment 4 (Simitian) relating to School District Parcel Taxes.</u>

COMMENT:

"ACA 4 allows local school districts to approve a local parcel tax with a 55 percent majority rather than the two-thirds majority currently required. By lowering the threshold, more school districts will be able to successfully pass a local parcel tax, which will help them raise the money they need to maintain a quality education. ACA 4 still requires a supermajority in passing a tax.

"The California Constitution currently requires a two-thirds majority of a school district's voters to approved a local parcel tax. ACA would lower that requirement to 55 percent."

CSBA Summary

"The California Constitution conditions the imposition of a special tax by a city, county or special district upon the approval of 2/3 of the voters of the city, county, or special district voting on that tax, and prohibits these entities from imposing an ad valorem tax on real property or a transactions or sales tax on the sale of real property.

"This measure would authorize a school district, community college district, or county office of education, with the approval of 55% of its voters voting on the proposition, to impose a parcel tax, as define, and would also make conforming changes to related provisions."

It is recommended that the Board of Education accept and discuss the following draft of potential restorations to the 2003-04 budget:

COMMENTS: As we proceed with our deliberations on how to balance the 2003-04 budget, staff presented the Board an extensive list of budget reductions to consider. Staff recommended and the Board approved all the reductions which now total \$13.7 million. These reductions represent as equitable an application as possible to all programs and services. Staff believes that we should begin our 2003-04 budget planning by establishing a starting point that is \$13.7 million lower than our current budget.

Staff further recommends that the Board begin a process to establish guidelines that would restore budget cuts as additional revenue becomes available. The Board may not be able to restore all the proposed reductions, but an attempt should be made to develop a list of programs and services that would be restored by the successful passage of our <u>School Funding Measure</u>, additional ongoing support (from the Cities), and the hopeful restoration of State and Federal categorical programs.

To begin the process of establishing a method to determine the order to which programs and services should be restored, staff recommends that the Board establishes a commitment to restore the teaching and administrative staff central to the core education program. Namely, the recommendation is to first restore elementary education staffing, then to restore middle school and high school staffing. All other proposed budget cuts could be considered for restoration after the staffing of the basic education system is restored.

It is critical to establish these packages of possible restoration as a <u>flexible</u> plan - a road map, if you will, given what we know today. It is almost assured that the financial picture will be different in June and, as such, that the Board allows itself the latitude to adjust decisions accordingly.

From the initial budget cuts of \$13.7 million, staff proposes the first restoration be at the elementary schools, followed by the restoration of staff at the middle and high schools:
