<u>Comments</u>: An allowance of \$110,000 was included in Contract Amendment #4 to provide a retractable band shell for the Barnum Hall, however, the acquisition and installation of the shell was not included in the awarded subcontracts. After working towards acquisition of the band shell, Jacobs discontinued procurement. District Staff subsequently decided to delete the allowance. Jacobs and District Staff agreed to reduce the Program Management Costs by (\$24,251). The District will procure the band shell directly from the manufacturer.

> As a result of the extended performance of work at Barnum Hall, the period of performance for construction administrative services by the Architect of Record was comparably extended. In accordance with the terms of the Agreement for Program Management Services, the District is required to compensate Jacobs Facilities, Inc., for the additional WLC construction administrative services. Assessed liquidated damages will cover this additional expense.

The net of the two items is a credit to SMMUSD in the amount of \$19,771, which is a decrease to the BLA.

CONTRACT AMENDMENT NO. 4.4

In consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements set forth below, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the parties hereto, the Owner and Jacobs hereby amend and supplement the PM Agreement as follows:

SCOPE

- 1. The work identified in Amendment 4 as the band shell is deleted from the scope of work.
- Jacobs shall be compensated, consistent with ¶2.10.6 of the PM Agreement, for WLC Architects' additional professional services specified in the attached copy of the Professional Services Supplement dated September 27, 2001.

COST

Costs as stated in the current contract or amendment will be modified as noted below:

- 1. The allowance of \$110,000, the amount originally set aside in Amendment 4 for the band shell, is hereby deleted from the BLA. Additionally, Jacobs and the SMMUSD agree to reduce the Program Management Fee by 15.3% of the total cost or \$24,251.
- A fixed price amount of \$114,480, the amount of the increase set forth in the Professional Services Supplement to WLC Architects, is added to the Program Management Costs.

This Amendment applies only after it has been agreed to and fully executed by both parties.

SCHEDULE

There is no change in the schedule or associated milestones set forth in BLA 4 as a condition of this Amendment.

COMMENT: In the course of the modernization work at the Adams Auditorium, damage was discovered to the roof trusses above the stage area which supported the roof, as well as the stage rigging. The cause of this damage is undetermined; however, the structural members have failed and the area is unsafe for occupancy.

> The damage was discovered by Jacobs Facilities, Inc. (JFI) when it was noticed that one of the stage rigging support beams supported by the roof trusses, which are inside of a ceiling and not visible from the stage, exhibited signs of significant deflection. JFI prepared a Preliminary Change Order for DSA approval for the damaged beam. During the review process, DSA was interested in what supports were above the ceiling for the stage rigging and requested that JFI provide additional information. Following this request, JFI accessed the ceiling/attic area to examine the existing roof trusses, finding severe damage and failure in ten of the thirteen trusses.

> The sole source negotiation resulted in a cost of \$506,128 with Jacobs Facilities, Inc. and I.C.E. Builders, Inc. which is more than 6% below the lowest and most current cost estimate (\$539,181). The attached summary details the budget associated with this BLA.

The complete budget limitation agreement, along with the Master Contract, is on file for public review in the Office of the Assistant Superintendent for Fiscal and Business Services.

COMMENT: The Board of Education has previously approved the design and the construction of the Barnum Hall Phase I and Phase II construction projects. During the Barnum Hall Phase I construction project performed in the late nineties, the new stage was designed and built around the Wenger orchestra shell specifications. The orchestra shell is a Wenger production model, whose specifications have been reviewed, amended and approved by Santa Monica High School's Music Department and the Restore Barnum Hall Committee. A credit of \$134,251.00 was received from Jacobs Facilities Inc. for the deletion of the orchestra shell from the Barnum Hall Phase II Budget Limitation Agreement. A unanimous vote of all Board Members present is necessary for the Board of Education to pass a sole source declaration.

The Proposition X Oversight Committee has reviewed this and concurs with the recommendation.

COMMENT: At its meeting of June 18, 2002, the Los Angeles Board of Supervisors adopted Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) Regulation 18730 (2 California Code of Regulations, Section 18730) as the model code for all agencies for which the Board is the code reviewing body. Local agencies that have been using the County's model code must formally replace it by adopting a single page incorporating Regulation 18730 by reference. Regulation 18730 becomes the agency's code. This replacement is pursuant to instructions received from the Board of Supervisors, County of Los Angeles.

> In addition, the list of positions in the District subject to the Conflict of Interest Code needs to be expanded to include the Deputy Superintendent and Personnel Commissioners.

RE: NEW JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY FOR DELINQUENT TAX FINANCING PROGRAM

DISCUSSION ITEM NO. D.1

A new source of revenue has been developed by establishing a new Joint Powers Authority (JPA) amongst California school districts, community college districts and county offices of education. The enclosed proposal outlines a program whereby the delinquent property taxes within Los Angeles County would be purchased by a newly-formed JPA, which would then be entitled to any interest or penalty payments on these delinquencies.

The JPA would be underwritten by Plymouth Financial Company, Inc. who will administer the program and assume all risks. Each member school district will receive 8% of its delinquent tax base within its area.

It is estimated that Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District would generate approximately \$94,000 per year. In the initial year of operation, the collections will incorporate the tax years 1998 through 2004.

This opportunity presents itself because Los Angeles County is not part of the "Teeter Plan". Currently, 53 of 58 California counties are under the Teeter Plan, in which those counties' Auditor-Controllers pay their school agencies 100% of delinquent tax principal. For this guarantee, those counties are allowed to keep any interest or penalty generated by the delinquent property taxes. In this proposal, the JPA will act as the Auditor-Controller in a Teeter Plan county.

Staff recommends that the School District consider joining this JPA.
