RE: CALIFORNIA PUBLIC SCHOOL LIBRARY ACT OF 1998 (K-12)

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.4

It is recommended that the Board of Education re-approve The Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Library Plan 2001-2002. This plan was written with the input from a district-wide committee made up of librarians, library aides, teachers, administrators, and a member of the Board of Education. This plan is written and submitted in compliance with AB862. The 2001-2002 Plan has been reviewed, and remains in effect for the 2002-2003 school year.

Background and Rationale

AB682 stipulates that a district must have a school library plan approved and certified by the governing board in order to receive the allocation attached to this legislation. The District will receive approximately \$5.33 per ADA for grades K-12, and these funds will then be distributed according to the district-wide school library plan.

AB862 does not identify the elements of the school library plan, but rather leaves that up to the local governing board. The SMMUSD plan includes:

- Vision and Mission Statements
- Library and Information Literacy Student Outcomes
- Teacher Outcomes
- Purposes of School Librarians/status of SMMUSD Libraries
- Three-year Action Plan and Timeline
- Budget recommendations
- Evaluation Process

The items that can be purchased with the funds include:

• Library resources, *i.e.*, Books, periodicals, microforms, AV materials, computer software, CD ROMs.

All materials purchased must conform to California Curriculum standards and frameworks, and to standards for the use of library media program materials and resources.

 Equipment necessary to provide access to school library resources within the school library and on-line resources.

Timeline:

Districts must submit to the State Department of Education prior to January 17, 2003:

• Certification that the governing board has approved the California Public School Library Act of 1998 Plan.

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.15

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve an increase in Budget Limitation (BLA #4) from \$12,621,298 to \$12,857,673 in the form of Contract Amendment 7.2 with an amount equal to \$236,375 for the modernization work attributed to differing site conditions and added scope of work.

Funding: State Modernization Funds

COMMENTS: During the course of construction at the Grant, Adams, Lincoln, Rogers and Olympic schools, certain added work was performed by Jacobs' subcontractors attributed to either differing site conditions, unanticipated hazardous material remediation or added work requested by the District. In addition, certain work specified by design, but not required under field conditions was deleted.

Jacobs Facilities, Inc. has negotiated twenty-five change orders with four of its subcontractors to perform the necessary work as set forth in the attached proposed Contract Amendment 7.2. The change order amount is \$236,375, the associated contingency is \$16,953 and the Jacobs Facilities, Inc. Program construction management free is \$66,843. Funding for the work will come from the unallocated budget for Santa Monica Schools. The following page is a summary of the cost associated with the BLA #4, including this proposed amendment.

The Proposition X Oversight Committee has reviewed this item and recommends approval.

CONTRACT AMENDMENT NO. 7.2

This document (hereinafter as "Amendment") dated November 6, 2002, will serve as Contract Amendment Number 7.2 to the Program Management Agreement ("PM Agreement") dated August 12, 1999 and is between the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District ("Owner") and Jacobs Facilities, Inc. ("Jacobs"). This Amendment supplements Contract Amendments 7 and 7.1 All terms and conditions used herein shall reflect the original language as stated in the PM Agreement or any subsequent amendments as currently approved.

In consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements set forth below, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the parties hereto, the Owner and Jacobs hereby amend and supplement the PM Agreement as follows:

SCOPE

Scope adjustments within this Amendment cover work associated with Bid Package 1B, Modernization of Grant, Rogers, Adams, Lincoln and Olympic schools, as identified in the attached twenty-five change order documents issued to one of four subcontractors performing work under contracts with Jacobs.

COST

Costs as stated in the current contract as amended will be modified in accordance with the attached summary. A fixed price amount of \$127,442 to compensate Jacobs and its subcontractors is added to BLA 4 accordingly.

SCHEDULE

The work described herein has been performed and, therefore, impacts to schedule, if any, have been incurred. Jacobs agrees to waive any claim for extended performance and consequent impact damages provided that the Owner does not assess liquidated damages against this BLA.

This Amendment applies only after it has been fully executed by both parties.

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the following list of budget reductions for the 2002-03 fiscal year.

COMMENTS: The First Interim Report budget revisions will be presented at the December 12, 2002 Board Meeting. Based on a draft of the First Interim Report, an anticipated shortfall is predicted at \$1,500,000 to the current budget. The actual savings from these budget reductions will be approximately 40-50% of the annual amounts show in this report.

Immediate Implementation

- 1. Institute an immediate hiring freeze in lieu of layoffs for the current fiscal year. \$300,000
- 2. Communicate to the Principals a reduction of their SIP Budget by 25%, which represents State budget reductions/delays. \$198,000
- 3. Communicate to the Program Managers a reduction of their Targeted Instructional Improvement Grant budgets by 25%, which represents State budget reductions/delays.

- 4. Freeze the Medicare Budget discontinue the carryover allocations for this year. \$294,000
- 5. Consult with the Merit Systems Commissioners regarding the concept of combining the management of both Classified Personnel and Certificated Personnel under the Director of Human Resources. - 6. Fill the current Special Education Coordinator positions (2) from existing staff. Staff should currently hold administrative credential. \$219,000

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.21

It is recommended that the Board approve the following restriction on the issuance of bus passes for students using district transportation to access public education:

To prevent overcrowding on the buses, bus passes will be issued on a "first come, first serve" basis. The maximum number of bus passes for the 2001/2002 school year will be **530** and will be allocated as follows:

Malibu High School and Middle School, Cabrillo & Pt. Dume

Route A (Malibu north end, from Trancas to Leo Carrillo Beach): 81

Route B (Malibu north central, from John Tyler to Point Dume): 94

Route C (Malibu south, Sunset Mesa to Topanga): 94

Route D (Malibu south central, Big Rock to Civic Center): 88

Route E/F (Santa Monica @ Adams & Lincoln): 88

Webster

Route G: 85

After the maximum number of bus passes have been sold, remaining students wishing to purchase bus passes will be placed on a "waiting list" and will be issued passes as seating vacancies occur. Special or emergency circumstances will be addressed on a case-by-case basis. The Director of Transportation will approve special or emergency situations.

COMMENT: Every student who uses SMMUSD district transportation services (rides a regular bus route) is required to obtain a bus pass. This applies to all routes to all Malibu schools: Cabrillo, Pt. Dume, and Webster Elementary Schools, and Malibu High and Middle Schools.

Bus pass fees are established by approval of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Board of Education.

Currently, the following fee **exemptions** exist for all students, permit and non-permit alike:

- 1) any Special Education student for whom transportation is a part of the written IEP
- 2) a resident Malibu student attending Santa Monica High School
- a resident Santa Monica student or non-resident permit student, attending any district school for which there is existing district transportation, for voluntary desegregation purposes
- any student, resident or non-resident, who qualifies for the district's free lunch program under current Federal guidelines; resident or non-resident students who qualify for reduced lunches under current Federal guidelines will pay a reduced fee
- 5) pupils of school district employees are eligible to receive reduced bus pass fees for intradistrict transportation at current Board-approved per pupil rates of \$50 for routes of 10 miles or less in one direction and \$100/ routes of 11 miles or more

Proof of eligibility for free or reduced fares must be provided at the time of application for ridership.

Bus pass fees are established by approval of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Board of Education.

failure of Measure EE to pass.

<u>Section 1 - Elementary and Secondary</u>

F. Acceptance of Gifts

Philosophy

The goal of the Board of Education is to provide each student with the highest quality educational program. The Board recognizes that the needs of the students require carious learning opportunities. It is the intent of the Board that gifts accepted by the District provide equitable educational opportunities to meet the needs of our students.

Amendment to Board Policy 6300 (a) (b): Acceptance of Gifts. This amendment (where applicable) supercedes all criteria listed below.

Specifically, this amendment prohibits giving of gifts by individuals, groups or organization to specific schools in order to replace any personnel/program/item authorized by the Board of Education in its budget reduction decisions for the 2002-03 and 2003-04 budget.

While funds may continue to be donated for certain areas, those educational programs which have been impacted by budget reductions in the 2002-03 and 2003-04 school year may not benefit from donations to discreet sites. Furthermore, any personnel/program/item may be restored only if it is restored at all sites from which it was cut.

Gifts that relate to areas in which there have been budget reductions will be donated to the school district but can be designated for a particular school. A needs assessment will be conducted by a committee at each school composed of parents, teachers and the principal. The committee must approve the disposition of all gifts, which should be in accordance with the schools identified needs, before a request for acceptance is submitted to the Board of Education. All gifts and donations will be formally accepted by the Board of Education in accordance with administrative procedures subject to the following criteria:

1. Gifts are of direct or closely related instructional value and will be not cause the instructional program of the school in which the gift is used to differ from established district curriculum. If a gift is offered that does not appear on the prioritized list of needs or is not if direct instructional value, the committee and the principal will evaluate the gift and make a recommendation regarding acceptance.

F. Acceptance of Gifts (b) (continued)

- 2. Gifts of money for personnel will be used for instruction, consulting services, assemblies, aides to assist in the instructional program, for supervision of students (i.e., noon aides) or clerical help. Certificated personnel will be hourly only; however, classified personnel may be hourly, part time or full time. All personnel whose services are paid for with gift funds must be hired through the Personnel Office.
- 3. The Business Services Division must approve all gifts requiring installation and maintenance, and appropriate money must accompany requests for acceptance of gifts. If gift items require an ongoing maintenance contract, the money for that contract must accompany the gift.
- 4. Gift funds allocated to a school, which meet the above-referenced criteria, shall be placed in a specifically designated restricted program account. And funds remaining in this account at the end of the fiscal year shall carry forward into the ensuing fiscal year.
- 5. The foregoing rules also apply to gifts from student body organizations or any on-campus improvement projects not financed or processed through normal requisitioning procedures.
- 6. With gifts of opportunity, the Superintendent/designee is authorized to accept gifts on behalf of the Board of Education where a delay until the next Board of Education meeting will cause the gift offer to be retracted.
- 7. Schools will be allowed to establish a revolving cash fund created by gift money. The fund shall not exceed \$100 per teacher per semester.
- 8. Gifts given by individuals not in conjunction with fund raising under a value of \$100 do not need Board approval, it being stipulated that such funds have successfully met the above-referenced criteria.

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.18

It is recommended that the Board of Education rescind the one-year moratorium established August 22, 2002, in Board Policy 5117, Interdistrict Permits.

COMMENT: In light of the failure of the State of California to fund the District's budge adequately and due to the failure of Measure EE to pass, the Board of Education must take every step available to generate substantial income for on-going district programs.

One way of increasing the revenue stream almost immediately is to:

- 1) rescind the one-year moratorium established by the Board August 22, 2002, for receipt of new interdistrict permit students and
- 2) actively solicit new interdistrict students to begin classes here at the onset of the second semester, Tuesday, January 28, 2003.

Permits may be received at any time but new interdistrict permit students may not begin instruction until January 28, 2003.

As space is identified, school assignments will be made in the following prioritized order:

- 1) <u>Intra</u>district permit students who are currently on a wait-list(according to existing district policy)
- 2) Siblings of current interdistrict permit students who could not be assigned to the district school of choice and who have not previously enrolled in the District

3) Space created by either or both of the abovereferenced reassignment will be offered to new interdistrict permit student on a first come, first serve basis.

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the creation of a new Ad Hoc Advisory Committee to consider placing a new parcel tax (or other taxing mechanism) on the Spring, 2003, (or future date to be determined) ballot and approve the following charge and membership.

CHARGE

The Ad Hoc Advisory Committee shall review and analyze projected District revenues and expenditures, and recommend to the Board of Education the advisability of requesting the general public to authorize a new parcel tax or modified version there of. The Committee should be established and begin its work immediately, but no later than December 10, 2002, and be directed to submit its recommendation(s) to the Board no later than the last Board Meeting in January, 2003.

The Committee should address the following questions:

- 1. How critical is it for the School District to initiate a second parcel tax (in any form) as one of its sources of operating revenue?
- 2. If a new parcel tax is recommended, would any portion of the rate be identified for a categorical expenditure purpose(s). If so, how much, or what percentage, would be identified for what purpose(s)?
- 3. What would the rate of the new parcel tax be?
- 4. What would the structure of the new mechanism be?

MEMBERSHIP

It is suggested that the Committee have 25-30 members, and should be representative of:

- the business community
- / the governments of the Cities of Santa Monica and Malibu
- / employee organizations
- / parent groups
- / the community at large
- / any signers of the ballot argument against Measure EE The members of the Financial Oversight Committee Task Force will serve as ex officio members of the committee.

The Committee shall select its own chairperson, establish its meeting schedule and determine its information needs. The Superintendent of Schools and the Assistant Superintendent for Fiscal and Business Services will facilitate the work of the

Committee and make arrangements for providing information and human resources as needed by the Committee.

COMMENT: Board members are requested to submit names to the Superintendent's office to be considered for nomination to this committee. Appointments will be made at this Board of Education meeting (11/21/02).
