0 API Scores -

Mr. Deasy reported that there was very positive news regarding the district's API index scores which have increased over the last two years. One hundred percent of the District's schools scored in the top 70% of the state. Mr. Deasy cited two examples of outstanding achievement: Muir Elementary School raised its API score by 104 points over two years and John Adams Middle School raised its score by 60 points.

- 0 Malibu High School - Recognition Malibu High School has been notified that it will have a site visitation by the California Distinguished School panel. This is one of the last formalities before being named a CaliforniaDistinguished School.
- Mr. Deasy also reported that the Cotsen Family Foundation is working with • veteran faculty mentoring individuals to an even higher lever of outstanding performance. SMMUSD is one of four districts chosen to work with the Foundation.
- Lastly, Mr. Deasy noted that a letter as to how staff, students and families can be supportive and supported in uncertain times and in times of war. Emergency plans are in place at all schools and our facilities are safe for students and staff.

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the attached resolution authorizing the District to issue Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes (TRANS) for the fiscal year 2003/2004. The TRANS will be issued for one year in an amount of \$5,000,000.

COMMENTS: TRANS are short-term debt instruments issued by school districts throughout the State to create an additional reserve to the General Fund - Unrestricted. In this District, the reserve will act as a cushion to the General Fund - Unrestricted in the event that the District experiences temporary cash flow needs. These cash flow needs may occur as a result of the timing mismatch between the receipt of revenues and the expenditure of General Fund - Unrestricted monies.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE SANTA MONICA - MALIBU UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF 2003-2004 TAX AND REVENUE ANTICIPATION NOTES AND REQUESTING THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH NOTES BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 53850 *et seq.*, of the Government Code of the State of California (the "Act") contained in Title 5, Division 2, Part I, Chapter 4, Article 7.6 thereof, the Santa Monica - Malibu Unified School District (the "District"), on or after the first day of its 2003-2004 fiscal year, may borrow money by issuing notes in anticipation of the receipt of taxes, income, revenue, cash receipts and other moneys to be received by the District attributable to its fiscal year ending June 30, 2004, for any purpose for which the District is authorized to expend moneys, including but not limited to current expenses, capital expenditures and the discharge of any obligation or indebtedness of the District; and

WHEREAS, Section 53853 of the Act provides that such notes may be issued by the appropriate County Board of Supervisors on behalf of the District upon the authority of a resolution of the governing board of the District; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Education (the "District Board"), being the governing board of the District, desires the assistance of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles (the "County Board") in the borrowing of not to exceed \$5,000,000 by the issuance of notes hereby designated as the "Santa Monica - Malibu Unified School District 2003-2004 Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes" (the "Notes"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Notes shall be payable no more than 12 months after the date of issue, and the Notes shall be payable only from revenue received or accrued during the fiscal year in which the Notes were issued; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 53856 of the Act, the District may pledge any taxes, income, revenue, cash receipts or other moneys deposited in inactive or term deposits (but excepting certain moneys of the District), to the repayment of the Notes, which shall be issued as a general obligation of the District, and to the extent not paid from the taxes, income, revenue, cash receipts and other moneys of the District pledged for the payment thereof, shall be paid with interest thereon from any other moneys of the District lawfully available therefor, as required by Section 53857 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Notes to be issued hereunder in Fiscal Year 2003-2004 when added to the interest payable thereon, may not and do not exceed 85 percent of the estimated amount of the uncollected taxes, income, revenue (including but not limited to revenue from state and federal governments), cash receipts and other moneys of the District which will be available for the payment of principal of the Notes and the interest thereon, as required by Section 53858 of the Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, this Board of Education of the Santa Monica - Malibu Unified School District hereby determines and resolves as follows:

- <u>Section 1</u>. <u>Recitals</u>. All of the recitals set forth herein are true and correct, and the District Board so finds and determines.
- <u>Section 2</u>. <u>Authorization of Issuance of Notes: Terms Thereof</u>. The District Board hereby authorizes the issuance of the Notes in a principal amount not to exceed \$5,000,000, with the final principal amount to be determined by the Superintendent of the District (the "District Superintendent") after consultation with the Financial Advisor (defined in Section 8 below). The Notes are to be numbered from one consecutively upward in order of issuance, to be in the denominations of \$5,000, or integral multiples thereof, as determined by the Treasurer and Tax Collector of the County (the "County Treasurer"); to be dated the date of delivery thereof; to mature (without option of prior redemption) 12 months after their date of issue; and to bear interest, payable at maturity and computed on a 30day month and 360-day year basis, at the rate or rates determined at the time of sale thereof.

Both the principal of and interest on the Notes shall be payable, only upon surrender thereof, in lawful money of the United States of America. The County Treasurer is authorized to act as a trustee, fiscal agent, paying agent, dissemination agent and/or presentation agent (the "Fiscal Agent") in connection with the Notes, and the County may also appoint an agent or other third party to perform any or all of such duties.

- Section 3. Form of Notes. The Notes shall be issued in fully registered form (except as otherwise provided herein), and shall be substantially in the form and substance set forth in Exhibit A, as attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein, the blanks in said form to be filled in with appropriate words and figures (described in Section 6 below) as the County Treasurer may determine and approve. There shall be delivered with the Notes a legal opinion of Bond Counsel (defined in Section 8 below) respecting the validity of the Notes and the exclusion from gross income of the interest thereon for federal income tax purposes and the exemption of interest thereon from present State of California personal income taxes.
- <u>Section 4</u> <u>Deposit of Note Proceeds: No Arbitrage</u>. The proceeds of sale of the Notes (net of costs of issuance) shall be deposited in or to the credit of the general fund of the District or otherwise as directed by the District Superintendent, to be withdrawn and expended for any lawful purpose for which the District is authorized to expend moneys, including, but not limited to, current expenses, capital expenditures

and the discharge of any obligations or indebtedness of the District. The District hereby covenants that it will comply with the requirements of a Tax Certificate (or similar instrument) to be executed by the District with respect to the Notes and any other instructions requested by or otherwise provided by such Bond Counsel.

Section 5. Payment of Notes.

- a. Source of Payment. The principal amount of the Notes, together with the interest thereon, shall be payable from taxes, income, revenue, cash receipts and other moneys which are received by the District during the 2003-2004 fiscal year and which are available therefor. The Notes shall be a general obligation of the District, and to the extent the Notes are not paid from the Pledged Revenues defined below, the Notes shall be paid with interest thereon from any other moneys of the District lawfully available therefor, as provided herein and by law.
- Pledged Revenues. As security for the payment of the principal of and b. interest on the Notes, the District hereby pledges an amount equal to 50 percent of the principal amount of the Notes from the unrestricted revenues received by the District in the month ending February 28, 2004; an amount equal to 50 percent of the principal amount of the Notes from unrestricted revenues received by the District in the month ending May 31, 2004; and an amount sufficient to pay interest on the Notes and any deficiency in the amount required to be deposited during any prior month, from unrestricted revenues received by the District in the month ending May 31, 2004 (such pledged amounts being hereinafter called the "Pledged Revenues"). The term "unrestricted revenues" shall mean taxes, income, revenue, cash receipts, and other money of the District as provided in Section 53856 of the Act, which are intended as receipts for the general fund of the District and which are generally available for the payment of current expenses and other obligations of the District.

The principal of the Notes and the interest thereon shall be a first lien and charge against and shall be payable from the first moneys received by the District from such Pledged Revenues, as provided by law.

In the event that there are insufficient unrestricted revenues received by the District to permit the deposit into the Repayment Fund (hereinafter defined) of the full amount of Pledged Revenues to be deposited from unrestricted revenues in a month, then the amount of any deficiency shall be satisfied and made up from any other moneys of the District lawfully available for the repayment of the Notes and the interest thereon.

- Deposit of Pledged Revenues in Repayment Fund. The Pledged Revenues c. shall be held by the County in a separate and special fund designated as the "Santa Monica - Malibu Unified School District, 2003-2004 Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes Repayment Fund" (the "Repayment Fund") and the County will administer the Pledged Revenues through and including the maturity date of the Notes and apply such funds as directed in this Resolution. Any moneys deposited in the Repayment Fund shall be for the sole benefit of the owners of the Notes and until the Notes and all interest thereon are paid, or until provision has been made for the payment of the Notes and all interest thereon in accordance with their terms, the moneys in the Repayment Fund shall be applied only for the purposes for which the Repayment Fund is created. The County Treasurer is directed to deposit all Pledged Revenues subject to deposit as provided in this Section 5.c when and as received directly into the Repayment Fund, without further instruction by the District. From the dates of receipt by the County Treasurer of any of the Pledged Revenues subject to such deposit, the District shall have no right, title or interest therein.
- d. <u>Disbursement and Investment of Moneys in Repayment Fund</u>. All Pledged Revenues shall be deposited into the Repayment Fund upon receipt. After such date as the amount of Pledged Revenues on deposit in the Repayment Fund shall be sufficient to pay in full the principal of and interest on the Notes, when due, any moneys in excess of such amount remaining in or accruing to the Repayment Fund shall be transferred to the general fund of the District or otherwise as directed by the District Superintendent. On the maturity date of the Notes, the moneys in the Repayment Fund shall be used, to the extent necessary, to pay the principal of and interest on the Notes.

Moneys in the Repayment Fund, to the greatest extent possible, shall be invested in legally permitted investments as directed by the County Treasurer or by the District Superintendent, which may include, but not be limited to, a guaranteed investment contract and the Los Angeles County Pooled Investment Fund or any other investment which the County Treasurer or the District Superintendent deems prudent. The County Treasurer (who is hereby designated as agent of the District for these purposes) is hereby requested to invest and/or to direct the investment of the proceeds of the Notes in accordance with the County's policy governing the investment of such funds.

e. <u>Covenant Regarding Additional Short-term Borrowing</u>. The District hereby covenants and warrants that it will not request the County Treasurer to make temporary transfers of funds in the custody of the County Treasurer to meet any obligations of the District during the 2003-2004 fiscal year pursuant to the authority of Article XVI, Section 6 of the Constitution of the State of

California or any other legal authority.

- <u>Section 6</u> <u>Execution of Notes</u>. The District hereby requests the County Treasurer, or his designated deputy, and the appropriate officers of the County Board to execute the Notes by their manual or facsimile signatures and to affix a facsimile of the seal of the County thereon; and such officers shall be authorized to cause the blank spaces thereof to be filled in prior to initial delivery as may be appropriate.
- <u>Section 7</u>. <u>Approval of Sale of Notes.</u> The Notes will be sold at a public or private sale, at the time and place and upon the terms provided in a resolution of the County Board; <u>provided</u> that the aggregate principal amount of the Notes does not exceed \$5,000,000 and the interest rate does not exceed eight percent (8%) per annum.
- Authorization and Approval of Preliminary Official Statement and Section 8. Official Statement. The District hereby appoints The Stiepel Group, Inc. as Financial Advisor to the District (the "Financial Advisor") and appoints Richards, Watson & Gershon, A Professional Corporation, as Bond Counsel ("Bond Counsel") in connection with the issuance of the Notes. The officers of the District are authorized and directed to provide information regarding the District in connection with the preparation of a Preliminary Official Statement and an Official Statement relating to the Notes and any other necessary or appropriate document or documents relating to the Notes. The Financial Advisor is hereby authorized to prepare and distribute such Preliminary Official Statement and Official Statement in connection with the offering and sale of the Notes. The District Superintendent, or his designee, is hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name of the District, to cause the Preliminary Official Statement relating to the Notes to be deemed final for the purposes of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended. The District Superintendent, or his designee, is hereby further authorized and directed, for and in the name of the District, to execute and deliver the Official Statement.
- <u>Section 9</u> <u>Continuing Disclosure</u>. The Continuing Disclosure Certificate relating to the Notes (the "Continuing Disclosure Certificate"), in the form attached as <u>Exhibit B</u>, is hereby approved. Each of the District Superintendent, the Assistant Superintendent or their respective designees, acting singly, is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver, for and in the name of the District, the Continuing Disclosure Certificate in substantially said form, with such changes

therein as the officer executing the document may approve (such approval to be conclusively evidenced by such officer's execution and delivery thereof).

- Section 10. Delivery of Notes. The proper officers of the County are hereby requested to deliver the Notes to the original purchaser thereof. All actions heretofore taken by the officers and agents of the District with respect to issuance, delivery and sale of the Notes are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified, and the officers of the District are hereby authorized and directed to do any and all things and take any and all actions which they, or any of them, may deem necessary or advisable in order to consummate the lawful issuance and delivery of the Notes in accordance with this Resolution and resolutions hereafter adopted by the County Board.
- Section 11 <u>Further Actions Authorized</u>. It is hereby covenanted that the District, and its appropriate officials, have duly taken all proceedings necessary to be taken by them, and will take any additional proceedings necessary to be taken by them, for the levy, collection and enforcement of the taxes and other revenues pledged under this Resolution in accordance with the law and for carrying out the provisions of this Resolution. The District Superintendent, officers and staff of the District are hereby directed to take such further action as may be necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution and to execute and deliver any and all agreements, certificates and other documents that they or Bond Counsel may deem necessary or advisable to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution without further approval of this District Board.
- <u>Section 12</u> <u>Limited Liability</u>. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein or in the Notes or in any other document mentioned herein, the District shall not have any liability hereunder or by reason hereof or in connection with the transactions contemplated hereby except to the extent payable from moneys available therefor as set forth in Section 5 hereof and the County is not liable for payment on the Notes or any other obligation of the District hereunder.
- Section 13. Designation as Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligations. The District Board hereby designates the Notes as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" within the meaning of Section 265(b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

Section 14. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately. PASSED AND ADOPTED by the Santa Monica - Malibu Unified School District this March 19, 2003 by the following vote:

The Notes are being issued pursuant to a Resolution of the District adopted on ______, 2003 and a Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the County adopted on ______, 2003 (collectively, the "Resolutions"). The District covenants and agrees as follows:

SECTION 1. <u>Purpose of the Disclosure Certificate</u>. This Disclosure Certificate is being executed and delivered by the District for the benefit of the Holders of the Notes and to assist the Participating Underwriter in complying with the Rule.

SECTION 2. <u>Definitions</u>. In addition to the definitions set forth in the Resolutions, which apply to any capitalized term used in this Disclosure Certificate unless otherwise defined in this Section, the following capitalized terms shall have the following meanings:

"Dissemination Agent" shall mean the District, or any successor Dissemination Agent designated in writing by the District and which has filed with the District a written acceptance of such designation.

"Holders" shall mean the registered owners of the Notes or, while the Notes are registered in the name of The Depository Trust Company or its nominee, the beneficial owners of the Notes.

"Listed Events" shall mean any of the events listed in Section 3(a) of this Disclosure Certificate.

"Participating Underwriter" shall mean any of the original underwriters of the Notes required to comply with the Rule in connection with offering of the Notes. "Rule" shall mean Rule 15c2-12(b)(5) adopted by the Securities and Exchange Commission under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as the same may be amended from time to time.

"State Repository" shall mean any public or private repository or entity designated by the State as a state repository for the purpose of the Rule and recognized as such by the Securities and Exchange Commission. As of the date of this Disclosure Certificate, there is no State Repository.

SECTION 3. Reporting of Significant Events.

- (a) This Section 3 shall govern the giving of notices of the occurrence of any of the following events:
 - (i) Principal and interest payment delinquencies;
 - (ii) Non-payment related defaults;
 - (iii) Unscheduled draws on debt service reserves reflecting financial difficulties;
 - (iv) Unscheduled draws on credit enhancements reflecting financial difficulties;
 - (v) Substitution of credit or liquidity providers, or their failure to perform;
 - (vi) Adverse tax opinions or events adversely affecting the tax-exempt status of the Notes;
 - (vii) Modifications to rights of the Holders of the Notes;
 - (viii) Unscheduled bond calls;
 - (ix) Defeasances;
 - (x) Release, substitution or sale of property securing repayment of the Notes; and
 - (xi) Rating changes.

- (b) Whenever the District obtains knowledge of the occurrence of a Listed Event, the District shall as soon as possible determine if such event would be material under applicable federal securities laws.
- (c) If the District determines that knowledge of the occurrence of a Listed Event would be material, the District shall promptly file a notice of such occurrence with the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board and each State Repository. Notwithstanding the foregoing, notice of Listed Events described in subsections (a)(viii) and (ix) need not be given under this subsection any earlier than the notice (if any) of the underlying event is given to Holders of affected Notes pursuant to the Resolutions.

SECTION 4. <u>Termination of Reporting Obligation</u>. The District's obligations under this Disclosure Certificate shall terminate upon the defeasance or payment in full of all of the Notes.

SECTION 5. <u>Dissemination Agent</u>. The District may, from time to time, appoint or engage a Dissemination Agent to assist it in carrying out its obligations under this Disclosure Certificate, and may discharge any such Dissemination Agent, with or without appointing a successor Dissemination Agent. The Dissemination Agent (if other than the District) shall not be responsible in any manner for the content of any notice or report prepared by the District pursuant to this Disclosure Certificate.

SECTION 6. <u>Amendment; Waiver</u>. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Disclosure Certificate, the District may amend this Disclosure Certificate, and any provision of this Disclosure Certificate may be waived, provided that the following conditions are satisfied:

(a) If the amendment or waiver relates to the provisions of Section 3 it may only be made in connection with a change in circumstances that arises from a change in legal requirements, change in law, or change in the identity, nature or status of an obligated person with respect to the Notes, or the type of business conducted;

(b) The undertaking, as amended or taking into account such waiver, would, in the opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel, have complied with the requirements of the Rule at the time of the original issuance of the Notes, after taking into account any amendments or interpretations of the Rule, as well as any change in circumstances; and (c) The amendment or waiver either (I) is approved by the Holders of the Notes, or (ii) does not, in the opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel, materially impair the interests of the Holders of the Notes.

SECTION 7. <u>Additional Information</u>. Nothing in this Disclosure Certificate shall be deemed to prevent the District from disseminating any other information, using the means of dissemination set forth in this Disclosure Certificate or any other means of communication, or including any other information in any notice of occurrence of a Listed Event, in addition to that which is required by this Disclosure Certificate. If the District chooses to include any information in any notice of occurrence of a Listed Event in addition to that which is specifically required by this Disclosure Certificate, the District shall have no obligation under this Agreement to update such information or include it in any future notice of occurrence of a Listed Event.

SECTION 8. <u>Default</u>. In the event of a failure of the District to comply with any provision of this Disclosure Certificate any Holder may take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate, including seeking mandate or specific performance by court order, to cause the District to comply with its obligations under this Disclosure Certificate, provided that any such action may be instituted only in the Federal or State court located in the County of Los Angeles. A default under this Disclosure Certificate shall not be deemed an event of default under the Resolution, and the sole remedy under this Disclosure Certificate in the event of any failure of the District to comply with this Disclosure Certificate shall be an action to compel performance.

SECTION 9. <u>Duties, Immunities and Liabilities of Dissemination Agent</u>. The Dissemination Agent shall have only such duties as are specifically set forth in this Disclosure Certificate, and the District agrees to indemnify and save the Dissemination Agent (if other than the District), its officers, directors, employees and agents, harmless against any loss, expense and liabilities which it may incur arising out of or in the exercise or performance of its powers and duties hereunder, including the costs and expenses (including attorneys fees) of defending against any claim of liability, but excluding liabilities due to the Dissemination Agent's negligence or wilful misconduct. The obligations of the District under this Section shall survive resignation or removal of the Dissemination Agent and payment of the Notes.

SECTION 10. <u>Beneficiaries</u>. This Disclosure Certificate shall inure solely to the benefit of the District, the Dissemination Agent, the Participating Underwriter and Holders from time to time of the Notes, and shall create no rights in any other person or entity.

RE: AUTHORIZATION OF ONE-YEAR RESTRUCTURING OF DAC REPORTS

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.16

It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize the following restructuring of the District Advisory Committee (DAC) report process for one year only. This suggestion is being made in light of the current budget crises brought upon the district by the severe reduction in State funding to public education.

COMMENT: Typically, each Board-appointed DAC is encouraged to present a year-end report to the Board that both outlines its accomplishments of the previous year and offers thoughtful suggestions relative to the wants and needs of the committee's discreet constituency. (Board Policy and Administrative Regulations 1220; available on the district's website, <u>www.smmusd.org</u>, click on "I Want to Know About," scroll down to and select "Policies.")

The incredible budget cuts that the district is now forced with making suggests that this reporting process be changed for one year only. It is staff's opinion that early input from each DAC would be very helpful to the Board in its budget-decision making process.

Through early interface, the Board would have a precise indication of which, if any, of the particular kinds of services currently being considered for discontinuance or reduction are most important to a given constituency. Additionally, the reports would be structured in such a way as to allow for an appropriate, highly specific public forum. Finally, staff believes that in providing this reporting opportunity to the community, two additional purposes may be achieved:

- 1) dissemination of new and vital budgetary information
- 2) possible identification of new revenue streams for district programs.

While it is understood that the timing is very tight, it is also presumed that each committee is keenly aware of what proposals it would make in its regular Spring report and that any such ideas would be made in correlation to the district's adopted Strategic Plan.

It is therefore suggested that each committee:

- select 20-minute time slot from those provided below; the time slots would be guaranteed on a first-come, first-serve basis
- 2) prepare a report for the Board that would follow these guidelines:
 - A) 5-7 minutes: careful delineation of which particular kinds of services are most valued by the committee and why. This segment would include rationale, statistics, projected impact on all stakeholders, etc.
 - B) 2-3 minutes: NEW suggestions for increasing field-specific revenue streams
 - C) 2-3 minutes: NEW or amended strategies for crosscurricular teaming to maximize the dollars the district does have
 - D) 2-3 minutes: NEW or amended action plans for supporting the ideas, specifically tied to the strategic plan
 - E) 2-3 minutes: staff liaison comments

At the end of 20 minutes the report would stop. Period.

Committees not wishing to participate at this time would be given the standard reporting opportunity in May.

The final variance in the reporting process would be that there would be no commitment of any district funding for any of the proposals.

Committees to report are: Child Care and Development Community Health & Safety Fine Arts Instructional Technology Intercultural Advisory Special Education Sports and Physical Education Other Board-appointed committees (Chapter One, Gifted and Talented, Bilingual) may report as well by following the above-listed procedure. Moving forward in such a way seems vital to the Board's deep understanding of the wishes of the its constituents.

DISCUSSION NO. D.1

It is recommended that the Board of Education discuss a proposed plan developed by the Santa Monica Malibu Unified School District Math Committee designed to accelerate the achievement of all middle school students. Through this plan all students will be able to enter the ninth grade ready for geometry or a higher level class.

COMMENTS: This discussion item is centered on a proposed plan designed to accelerate the achievement of all middle students by enabling them to take Algebra 1 before the 9th grade thereby meeting the California State Standards for the study of Mathematics. While each middle school currently has students finishing Algebra, not all students have had this opportunity. This plan will outline the classes and support systems that will greatly increase the likelihood that all students will be ready to take Geometry, or a higher level course, in the ninth grade. These students will then be eligible to take advanced math courses, which greatly increases their opportunities to satisfy the entrance requirements of many competitive colleges and universities.

Copies of the PowerPoint presentation will be made available at the meeting.

DISCUSSION NO. D.2

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the following potential restorations to the 2003-04 budget:

COMMENTS: As we proceed with our deliberations on how to balance the 2003-04 budget, staff presented the Board an extensive list of budget reductions to consider. Staff recommended and the Board approved all the reductions which now total \$13.7 million. These reductions represent as equitable an application as possible to all programs and services. Staff believes that we should begin our 2003-04 budget planning by establishing a starting point that is \$13.7 million lower than our current budget.

Staff further recommends that the Board begin a process to establish guidelines that would restore budget cuts as additional revenue becomes available. The Board may not be able to restore all the proposed reductions, but an attempt should be made to develop a list of programs and services that would be restored by the successful passage of our School Funding Measure, additional ongoing support (from the Cities), and the hopeful restoration of State and Federal categorical programs.

To begin the process of establishing a method to determine the order to which programs and services should be restored, staff recommends that the Board begin the process by establishing a commitment to restore the teaching and administrative staff to the core education program. Namely, the recommendation is to first restore elementary education staffing, then to restore middle school and high school staffing. All other proposed budget cuts could be considered for restoration after the staffing of the basic education system is restored.

It is critical to establish these packages of possible restoration as a <u>flexible</u> plan - a road map, if you will, given what we know today. It is almost assured that the financial picture will be different in June and, as such, you allow yourself the latitude to adjust decisions accordingly.

From the initial budget cuts of \$13.7 million, staff proposes the first restoration be at the elementary schools, followed by the restoration of staff at the middle and high schools:
