Juan Cabrillo PTA Co-Chairs Linda Willig and Lori Hayes presented the Cabrillo Elementary School report including students: Emma Willig, Sawyer and Payden Hayes. The PTA motto this year is, "you get what you give." They are proud of Cabrillo and the environment set by the Principal, Pat Cairns.

No new programs are planned for the year. The PTA will focus on refining those already in place. They hope to send their teachers for training seminars and supply them with ½ -day substitutes. They are also working on strengthening their traffic control team which assists during drop-off and pick-up times.

The Co-Presidents requested help from the Board of Education to help fund a part-time reading teacher to aid them in closing the achievement gap.

Lastly. Ms. Rodriguez reported that she and the superintendent attended the Annual 33<sup>rd</sup> District PTA conference in October. The topic of this year's conference was the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Federal legislation.

#### X SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Deasy expressed the district's sadness in learning that long-time employee and recent retiree. Jan Williams had passed away earlier in the week. Jan was the former Assistant Director of Fiscal Services and had worked in the district 27 years. Her sons, A.Dee and Robert, are also employees of the district. He expressed his condolences and indicated that a formal memorial would be included as part of the November 20 Board meeting.

The superintendent indicated that the October 2, 2003 CBEDS enrollment figure is 12,842 students. Of this number, 17% are permit students compared to 22% three years ago. The district is experiencing a growth in resident enrollment, especially in Malibu due to new housing developments.

The superintendent announced that St. John's Hospital has increased it's monetary contribution to the district which will enable staff to restore the athletic trainer position at Santa Monica High School. The district is grateful to David Blake, CEO, St. John's Hospital for making this possible.

## Parents Respond to District's Ad Hoc Immersion Parents' Committee

## **Immersion Directory Needed**

Gregg Heacock of Samohi Immersion: Samohi's Immersion Parents' meeting was quite productive. People agreed that no real election for representatives for the Ad Hoc Immersion Parents' Committee could take place until we had communicated to all families and that we should do so while soliciting information for an Immersion Directory.

Irma Carranza of JAMS Immersion: I think we should ask Peggy and her staff to assist us with putting the directory together; and probably most appropriate because of the confidentiality issue. In her new role overseeing the program she too will need to look at data and have access to student info. In her authority she can contact the schools and get the listings, which is easy to do. A letter can then be sent to each family asking permission to be listed in the directory, similar to what Edison does when compiling its directory.

## Reassessment of Committee Membership Needed

Dana Johnson of Samohi and JAMS Immersion: My sense is that the program starts to falter at the high school level. At Edison, obviously, everyone is devoted to the program. At JAMS, while Immersion is not the only program offered, the administration has seemed to me to be devoted to ensuring its success. At SAMOHI, however, the Immersion students (and program) seem to get lost in the crowd. If that's true, and the high school is really where some serious efforts need to be directed to implement (rather than simply maintain) a good program, perhaps the number of parent representatives from the high school should be greater than proposed.

Frank Kosa of Edison Immersion: I don't see the need for an Edison "majority." It seems to me that more representation at the middle school and high school would be better. That said, a group of 21 people seems waaaaaay too many to me. It's the kind of thing I'd expect of Alexander Hamilton to insure that nothing happen quickly, or possibly at all.

Gregg Heacock of Samohi Immersion: At our meeting there was objection to the lack of parity among the three groups. There was no compelling reason offered for having more members on the committee representing Edison, fewer for JAMS, and fewer still for Samohi. One person suggested 6-6-6, with possibly equal representation for Spanish-speaking families and English-speaking families. In selecting four people, two Spanish-speaking and two English-speaker, the group hoped to advance the process without giving in to the numbers suggested by the Pathways Committee.

Irma Carranza of JAMS Immersion: Has anyone suggested that maybe a teacher from each school be part of this committee? I would strongly recommend this. I think the teachers are an important component in terms of what we are trying to do and see happen. I, for instance, haven't heard from them as to what they believe to be the program's strengths and weaknesses. They may hold the answers to a lot of our questions and/or have the same concerns. Having them be part of this committee would enhance our understanding of the aspects of the program. In turn, we as parents could voice our support for what they would like to see improved as well.

## **Funds and Recognition Needed**

William Pryor of JAMS Immersion: This program is a jewel, yet few recognize its value.

Gregg Heacock of Samohi Immersion: Repeatedly, the issues of money and recognition came up. Students at Samohi need funds for a senior trip. We need funds to hold events. The program needs funds. Our Immersion Program is one of 5 nationwide and while dual immersion is generally recognized as the best model for learning another language. Still, we find it difficult to get our own district and high school to give this program the attention it deserves. Children who have been coming to school one hour early throughout middle and high school get no recognition for their effort. Certainly, one task for the Ad Hoc Immersion Parents' Committee is to bring funds and attention to this program.

## Board Meeting 10/6/03 Camden Vilkin

We are currently planned to build a monument in honor of the Malibu High School Track and Field coach, Frank Page, who passed away a few weeks ago. The monument will be built near the school's track.

The Mock Trial Club just competed in its first competitive mock trial and scored very high and will find out next week if they won the competition.

The middle school just produced the play, Peter and Wendy. It was a big success with great attendance.

The middle school also just put on a Halloween festival called, The Haunting. The carnival was also very well attended.

The high school is currently rehearing a talent competition called, Cabaret. It will be open to the public on November 10<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>. The primary themes will be singing, dancing and drama.

Our Fall sports are concluding and the Winter sports will be starting next week. Malibu High will be competing in several sports in CIF.

This week has been our homecoming week with numerous activities occurring every day. Powerpuff games were played yesterday and today. The girls played footfall and the boys were the cheerleaders. Everyone had a lot of fun and the turnout was a huge success. Tomorrow morning we have a pep rally, during the day a water polo game and at night our Homecoming football game under the lights.

#### CONTRACT AMENDMENT NO. 18.1

This document (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment") dated August 18, 2003, will serve as Contract Amendment Number 18.1 to the Program Management Agreement ("PM Agreement") dated August 12, 1999, and is between the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District ("Owner") and Jacobs Facilities, Inc. #### RECOMMENDATION NO. A.20

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the submission of the Point Dume Marine Science Elementary School (PDMSS) Whale Tail Stewards of the Sea Grant in the amount of \$25,570.

Comment: Through this grant, 625 second and third grade Title I students at Muir, McKinley, Edison and Will Rogers Elementary schools will, over a two year period, experience the following objectives:

- 1. Provide hands on experiments to engage students in the scientific process that are based on the California Science Standards
- 2. Build student knowledge about marine biology to help students make connections about the role human beings play in the sustainability of a balanced ecosystem
- 3. Provide two-way community building experiences by capturing lab experience on digital video based on California Content Standards for listening and speaking and English Language Arts use of technology as a multimedia tool for communication.

Second Grade: Second Graders will learn about plankton, its importance as the basis of the food chain, and the impact pollution can cause on plankton. Students will observe phytoplankton and zooplankton through microscopes and learn about their amazing adaptations: zooplankton and the lifecycles; phytoplankton and the process of bioluminescence. Students will make observations in our Deep Sea Room as well as engage in "hands-on" observation of different habitats, ecosystems and the Rocky Shore Touch Tank.

Third Grade: Third Graders will experience an environmental lesson on Ocean Habitats and the effects of human influence on different ecosystems. Through "hand-on" observation of our aquariums and touch tank,

students will examine the different habitats and the physical adaptations that help animal survival. Students will participate in three different environmental experiments that show the cumulative impact of pollutants in our ocean. 1) Trash: Pollution, problem, solution 2) Concrete: Too much? A Permeability Experiment 3) Storm Drain Runoff: Fertilizers, Pesticides, and Soil Erosion travel through storm drains, streams and eventually effect the ocean.

Evaluation: Title I schools will check out digital video cameras from PDMSS to create a Public Service Announcement (PSA) back at site: PSA to show significance of how humans impact the coastal environment, and what individuals need to do to help keep our coastline healthy and balanced.

# Superintendent of Schools PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Addendum to the agreement between the Board of Education of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified Schools and the Superintendent of Schools, John Deasy, attached hereto and made a part hereof the original employment agreement dated May 3, 2001, at Santa Monica, California.

In addition to the regularly performed duties of the Superintendent, the following performance targets are identified as optimal desirable deliverables, which when reached, will be compensated according to the agreement of employment between the Board of Education and the Superintendent of Schools.

# PERFORMANCE TARGETS

The following four major Performance Targets have been identified as part of our plan to raise the achievement of all students while simultaneously closing the achievement gap.

- 1.) Conducting a comprehensive evaluation of all major support, remediation, and intensive intervention programs operated in our school district with the aim of making recommendations to the Board for programmatic continuance, redesign, elimination, or enhancement.
- 2.) Providing support and public information for the first phase of the redesign of Santa Monica high School. In addition, to provide a coherent and comprehensive plan for phase II of this effort.
- 3.) Establishing a set of community text-based investigation groups designed to study the achievement differences in African American and Latino student populations. The aim of these year long study groups will be to offer a set of recommendations to the Board of Education, based in the research and literature, for what should be done to enhance achievement in the student populations studied.
- 4.) Leading an aggressive effort to build the capacity of the leadership in our central office. This type of leadership will be customer-service oriented and model competent, responsive, and accountable high performing leadership team behaviors.

# Evaluation and assessment of entire spectrum of major support, remediation, and intensive intervention programs

The district offers a wide range of intensive intervention, support and remediation programs, as well as, several programs designed to accelerate learning opportunities for students. Most of the programs are designed to improve the achievement for students of color and economic disadvantage.

The superintendent will undertake a comprehensive study of all major programs, assess their effectiveness, and make recommendations to the Board on continuance, maintenance, redesign/modification or enhancement of these programs based on the findings of this study. Proposal of study design will go to the Board by October 30, 2003 and results will be before the Board by April 30, 2004. An interim report will be communicated to the Board by February 15, 2004.

These reports will include a number of information items of which at least two specific components will be a comprehensive overview of our student achievement assessment program and an assessment of our suspension/expulsion data. Among the questions used to guide this study will be:

- 1.) Are the programs achieving their goals?
- 2.) How can we improve existing program effectiveness?
- 3.) How can we improve programs that are not working or that are duplicative?
- 4.) What is the best role for the community liaisons?
- 5.) Are community liaisons being supported at the school sites?
- 6.) How do we create a methodology to hold administrators accountable for various program supports?
- 7.) What supports are missing in the District?

### TASKS TO BE COMPLETED

- 1.) Outline the components of the study and inform the Board
- 2.) Share the study's intent, scope, and timeline with the administrative team
- 3.) Choose a team of staff to assist in the study's completion
- 4.) Complete the first phase of the study by February 1, 2004
- 5.) Report findings to date, to the Board by February 15, 2004
- 6.) Using both the findings and the research on these programs provide a thoughtful, high-quality set of recommendations to the Board for action with respect to each program. This will include a budgetary analysis and costbenefit analysis for each program.

# **QUALITY INDICATORS**

- 1.) The Board will rate the quality of the study proposal as high or better on their feedback rating sheet, attached to the proposal. Any additional questions the Board seeks to answer inside of the study will be included in the final proposal.
- 2.) The Board will rate the quality of the interim report presented on or before February 15, 2003 as high or better.
- 3.) The Board will rate the quality of the final report as high or better. This report will assess the effectiveness and quality of each program studied, its cost-benefit relationship to the budget, the ability to determine each program's effectiveness and efficacy with respect to student achievement, and recommendations for each. The Superintendent will make a coherent, logical, and informed set of recommendations for the Board to consider as a result of the study.

## SANTA MONICA HIGH SCHOOL'S REDESIGN

The Santa Monica High School community is undergoing an extensive redesign initiative aimed at closing the achievement gap, improving the achievement of all students, and increasing the personalization for all members of the learning community. This crucial first implementation phase is underway this school year. The superintendent will participate actively and publicly in supporting the efforts of redesign.

The Superintendent will actively support the efforts of redesign and continuously inform the board of the progress of redesign. The superintendent and his staff will make quarterly reports to the Board on the progress of redesign at SAMOHI at public Board meetings. This phase I stage of redesign will include a study of results, implications of modifications of our current course of action, and the launch of phase II activities.

# TASKS TO BE COMPLETED

- 1.) Working with the administration to develop a system to effectively evaluate the consequences, both intended and unintended, of redesign. These include both academic and non-academic outcomes. Report these routinely.
- 2.) Develop an accountability system for house leaders and departmental leaders
- 3.) Improve the instructional activities of faculty so that the California Standards are incorporated into their pedagogy, and subsequently evidenced in student achievement.
- 4.) Develop a methodology for assessing student engagement, staff climate during implementation.
- 5.) Develop intensive intervention programs for students who are struggling and a means for early identification of these students.
- 6.) Provide extensive professional development for faculty and staff in both content areas and in the means and goals of redesign.

# **QUALITY INDICATORS**

- 1.) A metric of indicators will be constructed and monitored regularly with the expectation that there will be a significant improvement in the reported data as compared to the last 3 years of data.
- 2.) A set of targets will be constructed based on the final collection of data from phase I of the redesign, which will have rigorous and high expectations of not less than 10% improvement points for student achievement in ELA and MATH on the CST.
- 3.) Faculty who participate in professional development activities provided by the superintendent will rate the quality of these events as high or better on the summative rating score.
- 4.) Faculty will rate the experience of house meetings and house-based meetings and house sponsored professional development as high or better and as significantly improved from recent years.
- 5.) There will be significant improvement on the key indicators used in our High Places Survey. (8-10 percentage point improvement or better)

# TEXT STUDY GROUPS OF ACHIEVEMENT DIFFERENCES IN AFRICAN-AMERICAN AND LATINO STUDENTS

The district has had a pernicious achievement gap, identified and articulated, for many years. The central mission of the District is to close this gap while simultaneously improving the achievement for all students.

The superintendent will undertake a study of achievement, engagement, and learning conditions for both the African-American and Latino Communities of SMMUSD. This study will be a yearlong process involving the staff and community. Periodic reports of progress will be presented to the Board. By May, the groups will present recommendations, learning, and implications of this study to the Board of Education.

### TASKS TO BE COMPLETED

- 1.) By October 1, 2003 study groups will be set up, locations identified, and monthly meetings will begin.
- 2.) Authors of the text's used will be contacted in order to obtain their assistance with our work.
- 3.) Those texts that are not available in Spanish will be either translated or transcribed.
- 4.) Leaders for each text-based discussion/study group will be identified and provided professional development in order to assist them in leading effective group work

### **OUALITY INDICATORS**

- 1.) Participation in the groups will not vary by more than 15% during the course of the year.
- 2.) Participants in the study groups will rate the quality of discussion and group experience as HIGH or better on the monthly rating forms.
- The Board will rate the quality of the final presentation given by the groups as HIGH or better on the rating cards provided with the final report. These ratings will also apply to the quality of recommendations provided by the Superintendent following the presentation.

# BUILDING STRONG AND COMPETENT CENTRAL OFFICE LEADERSHIP


An intensive effort will be designed and implemented to correct a long-standing observation that the central office (its staff and leadership) has not been responsive or customer oriented. The Superintendent will focus energy, action, and resources to develop a central office leadership team that is responsive, competent, and accountable. Part of the plan to improve the achievement of all students while simultaneously closing the achievement gap is to develop a central office leadership team that is responsive, competent, and accountable and measured by a performance assessment system for both individuals and teams that is aligned to the district's actions to reach its collective student achievement goals. The focus of skill improvement will center on: acquiring critical information needed by our school leaders, providing a high quality customer-service type of behavior with respect to the demands and expectations of school leaders, acting with behaviors that model high performance team activities.

### TASKS TO BE COMPLETED

- a. Develop a performance assessment system for individual and teams that is aligned to the district's ability to reach its collective student achievement goals
- b. Provide retreat experiences to help shape skills, develop measurable deliverables, and support the strategic plan for improving student achievement.
- c. Develop a coordinated and detailed roadmap for central office area teams. This will have a full range of supports and professional development opportunities, all tightly focused at improving student achievement for all students while simultaneously closing the achievement gap.
- d. Initiate an intensive focus of activity on the coaching of central office senior leadership as was done for principals over the last two years.
- e. Identify3-4 key performance improvement targets for: Fiscal, Superintendent's office, Personnel (certificated and classified), Maintenance and Operations, Student and Family Services, Special Education Services, Purchasing, Information Services and Education Services. Align internal activities to accomplish improvement in these services as measured quarterly by the building leadership teams.

# **QUALITY INDICATORS**

- II. A performance assessment system, developed and used, will indicate that 85% of the performance targets of senior leadership will be accomplished at a level of quality judged to be proficient or better by the end of this year.
- III. The quarterly assessment (interim score cards) will demonstrate substantial improvement in the ratings given by school leadership teams of the quality of service and leadership coming from each of the following central office teams: Superintendent's Office, Personnel, Fiscal, Maintenance and Operations, Student and Family Services, Special Education Services, Education Services. (NB the base line for these metrics will be established by October 15, 2003, which is the first data collection date)
- IV. The senior leadership of the central office will rate the quality of the coaching experience engaged in this year as high or better by the end of the year, as measured in the quarterly rating process.
