A meeting of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Board of Education was held on Thursday, October 7, 2004 in the Board Room of the District Offices, 1651 16th Street, Santa Monica, CA. A. Student Board Member Reports

• Ms. Mari Sahba, Olympic High School filed the following report: Olympic High School was recently audited by the California Department of Education for our California High School Exit Exam testing and we are proud to report we did very well.

Our new program, Sound Art, has been going extremely well. The students have completed a great CD which expresses their appreciation for Olympic and their enthusiastic outlooks on our school. The class has been teaching Olympic students how to express themselves by writing lyrics and making beats to fit the mood. Sound Art is showing us all how talented our students are. All of us at Olympic look forward to continue hearing more and more CD's created by all the students involved. We are all grateful for having this program available to Olympic.

The new guitar class that has been started is absolutely amazing. This program would not have been possible without Tom Whaley so we thank him greatly for all his support. We are very fortunate to have Mark Harris as the guitar teacher. You may know of Mark Harris from the group, VENICE. He is an excellent guitar teacher and is working so hard for all the students learning to play guitar. We have brand new electric acoustic guitars which everyone is amazed with. In this class students learn the discipline and structure of learning how to study music and learn basic cords as well as songs. I have been hearing many students saying that they look forward to coming to school to be able to go to guitar class and play. Since guitar has opened, attendance is increasing. Olympic thanks everyone involved in this program.

Olympic held a Back to School night which went very well. The parents were very pleased to hear about all the new programs and see how their children are progressing in their classes.

Our school is working together with the Ocean Park Community to paint a historical mural on our school of Ocean Park's neighborhood. We are very fortunate to have such a talented artist as David Legaspi painting with us. Olympic looks forward to getting started.

Ms. Vasquez thanked the Board of Education for awarding the bid for replacing seating in Barnum Hall.

October 8th is Homecoming at Samohi. Ms. Vasquez distributed athletic event passes to all Board Members so that they could attend various athletic competitions taking place every week at the school.

A college fair was held last Tuesday with 150 colleges and 2000 people attending.

The Samohi Band performed at the County Fair. On Saturday the school will host auditions for the State honor choir. They are expecting participants from all over Southern California.

A blood drive for the Red Cross will be held on the campus on October 26. Ms. Vasquez noted that each year Samohi Students donate more blood than any other school.

D. Santa Monica Malibu Education Foundation Report - Ralph Mechur Mr. Mechur reported that through the Academic Enrichment Grants, the Foundation has provided \$36,000 to teachers throughout the district for 2004-05. Grant money from the Bells and Books of Knowledge will provide the district's libraries with \$50,000. Part of the funds will be used to purchase poetry books and sponsor poetry events.

The SMM Education Foundation is working with the district on administration of the newly adopted gift policy. An MOU will be coming to the Board for review.

For the Arts is holding an online auction of Sam Francis prints. A benefit performance by the Westside Ballet of the Nutcracker will be held on December 10 at the Wadsworth Theater. They are hoping to have a premiere showing of a new film at the American Cinematheque (formerly the Arrow Theater).

In the Spring, they hope to hold one or more concerts in Barnum Hall as well as a theatrical event. Celebration of the Arts 2005 is scheduled to take place on the evening of April 8 and all day April 9 and 10 on the pier and will feature all the fine arts performers in the district.

Lastly, the Foundation will be putting together a phone-a-thon to raise funds to implement third grade general music for next year.

E. Special Education District Advisory Committee Report - Tricia Crane
Tricia Crane addressed the Board of Education on behalf of the Special Education
DAC and requested that the Board formally adopt the Special Education Strategic
Plan which was presented to the Board in June, 2004.

X SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Virginia Avenue Shooting Incident - The superintendent reported that a joint meeting was being sponsored by the District and the City of Santa Monica. Superintendent is in daily contact with the SM Police Department Staff is working to ensure that students and staff are safe and that they feel safe at school. To date changes include: only the Kansas entrance will be open during school hours. A designated pick up area has been established at the southwest parking lot for CREST children and other children being picked up after 4 p.m. The PTA has requested an audit of the school for public safety. An outgrowth of the audit will generate bids and specifications for improved safety gates, grounds improvements, etc. The City, District and SM Police Department will hold an additional meeting at the school in January to keep everyone informed of progress on this issue.

The Board of Education directed the Superintendent to place this item on the October 21 meeting for discussion and further that the Superintendent meet with City officials regarding the steps being taken to improve community safety.

- Enrollment Dr. Deasy reported that enrollment has declined this year as was predicted. District-wide, there are 152 fewer students, most of which occurred at Santa Monica and Malibu High Schools. Enrollment has increased at the middle schools and at Olympic High School.
- Location of Malibu Board Meetings Meetings in Malibu will be held at the Malibu City Council Chambers as a new location for the foreseeable future.

EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE SANTA MONICA-MALIBU UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND

ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT - BUSINESS AND FISCAL SERVICES

The following Employment Agreement is entered into between the Governing Board of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District (hereafter referred to as "District" or Board"), and **Winston Braham** (hereafter referred to as "Assistant Superintendent - Business and Fiscal Services" or "Assistant Superintendent").

Section 1. Term. Winston Braham is hereby employed as the Assistant Superintendent - Business and Fiscal Services, which has been designated by the Board as a senior management position of the Classified service pursuant to Education Code Sections 45100.5 and 45108.5. The term of employment for a one year period commencing October 1, 2004, and ending October 1, 2005, and shall be subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

Section 2. Salary. The Assistant Superintendent shall receive a base annual salary of One Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000). In addition to the base annual salary, the Assistant Superintendent shall receive a stipend for graduate degrees in the same amount given to other District employees.

This salary may be renegotiated with the Board of Education at the end of each contract year. Any salary increase for the Assistant Superintendent for each subsequent fiscal year shall be based upon performance and determined at the discretion of the Superintendent and Board of Education. This base salary, contingent on a satisfactory evaluation and the attainment of goals and objectives to be mutually determined by the Superintendent. However, the parties agree not to reduce the annual salary below the figure stated unless by mutual consent..

Section 3. <u>Duties and Responsibilities</u>. The Assistant Superintendent shall be governed by and shall perform duties and responsibilities as set forth in the California Education Code and the formal job description for the position of "Assistant Superintendent - Business and Fiscal Services" adopted by the Board of Education, as well as, Rules and Regulations of the State Board of Education and Rules, Regulations, Policies, and Directives of the Governing Board of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District, and shall perform such duties and responsibilities at a professional level of competence and with due diligence.

Section 4. <u>Professional Activities/Organizations</u>. The District encourages the Assistant Superintendent to participate in professional organizations and activities, provided that such participation is consistent with his overall responsibilities to the District and, further provided that such participation does not interfere with the satisfactory performance of his duties and obligations to the District. Actual and necessary expenses incurred by the Assistant Superintendent in connection with attendance at work related conferences and workshops approved by the Board, shall be paid by the District.

Section 5. Work Year. The work year under this Agreement shall consist of 222 days during each school year. The work days shall be determined by the Superintendent. Any compensation for days worked beyond the required work year shall be at the discretion of the Superintendent in consultation with the Governing Board. Senior Management employees shall be entitled to holidays defined in Sections 37220 and 37221 of the California Education Code, and any additional local holiday granted by the Board for twelve (12)-month management employees of the District.

The Assistant Superintendent shall be entitled to thirteen (13) days of sick leave/personal necessity annually. Earned sick leave shall be cumulative, as provided by State law and Board policy. In addition to the 13 days of sick leave/personal necessity, the Assistant Superintendent shall be entitled to up to five (5) days of bereavement leave without loss of pay. Consultant services may be engaged in by the employee during regular working days only upon the written approval of the Superintendent/Board of Education.

Section 6. Fringe Benefits.

- A. <u>Health and Welfare Benefits</u>. The Assistant Superintendent shall be entitled to receive a choice of health insurance plans for the current school year to be selected from the plans available from the Publicj Employees' Retirement System (PERS) health benefits program. Dependents may be covered, depending on the plan selected by the Assistant Superintendent. The District shall also provide full cost coverage of Delta Dental or PMI for the Assistant Superintendent and his dependents.
- B. <u>Disability Insurance</u>. Assistant Superintendent shall receive disability insurance at the rate indicated in the current SEIU contract.
- C. <u>Retirement Contributions</u>. The District shall pay the employer contribution rate (currently 8.25%) to the State Teacher Retirement System (STRS) or **Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS)** on behalf of the Assistant Superintendent. The employee's contribution shall be payable only to STRS or PERS, and the Assistant Superintendent shall not be entitled to an equivalent amount with respect to severance pay, or any other compensation not specifically referred to in the Employment Agreement.
- Section 7. Evaluation. The Superintendent shall annually review and establish the Assistant Superintendent's performance objectives on or before October 15th of each year. The performance of the Assistant Superintendent shall be evaluated at least once per year, by means of a written evaluation. The written evaluation shall be prepared by the Superintendent and shall be based upon, but not limited to, the Assistant Superintendent's performance of the duties and responsibilities contained in the job description, and written goals and objectives established by mutual agreement between the Superintendent and the Assistant Superintendent. The written evaluation shall be discussed with the Assistant Superintendent, after which a written summary of the discussion and evaluation shall be provided for the Assistant Superintendent.

Section 8. <u>Termination of Agreement</u>. Not withstanding the provisions of this Agreement, said Agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual consent of the Assistant Superintendent and the Board of Education, subject to Government Code Sections 53260 and 53261.

During the term of this Agreement, the Assistant Superintendent may be dismissed by the Board for cause as defined in Education 44932. In the event such cause is for reasons other than unsatisfactory performance, an unsatisfactory evaluation shall not be a condition precedent for such dismissal.

During the term of this Agreement, the Assistant Superintendent may be dismissed by the Board at will and/or without cause, subject to Government Code Sections 53260 and 532861. Pursuant to Government Code Section 53260, the maximum cash settlement the Assistant Superintendent may receive shall be an amount equal to the monthly salary of the employee multiplied by the number of months left on the unexpired term of the Agreement. If the unexpired term of the agreement is greater than eighteen (18) months, the maximum cash settlement shall be an amount equal to the monthly salary of the Assistant Superintendent multiplied by eighteen (18). Pursuant to Government Code Section 53261, the cash settlement shall not include any other non-cash benefits except health benefits as set forth in this Agreement, which may be continued for the same duration of time as the cash settlement or until the Assistant Superintendent finds other employment, whichever occurs first. Such termination shall be effective ninety (90) days following written notice by the Board.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement or the policies and regulations of the Board, the Board may elect not to renew this Agreement, and/or not to reemploy the Assistant Superintendent upon expiration of this Agreement pursuant to Education Code Section 35031.

Section 9. Applicable <u>Law</u>. This Contract is subject to all applicable laws of the State of California, rules and regulations of the State Board of Education, and rules, regulations and policies of this Board.

Of the ten members, one individual is to be appointed from the Financial Oversight Committee and one from the Proposition X Advisory Committee. The Charge to the Committee will be to undertake a comprehensive facilities study of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District while adhering to the tenants of the District's Strategic Plan. The study will examine the results of Proposition X, determine the needs met and those unfulfilled in terms of facilities in the District.

It is further recommended that the Committee form a relationship with the Cities of Santa Monica and Malibu and Santa Monica College in an effort to maximize efforts in areas of common interest.

The Committee will make recommendations to the Board of Education for future facilities needs and specifically, how these needs could be met, including but not limited to the hiring of a professional expert in the area of needs assessment. Included in the report to the Board would be a determination of if and when the District should prepare for a capital facilities bond initiative and project(s). Should the Committee provide the Board with a recommendation that a capital facilities project should be undertaken, the report should be designed in such a fashion as to become the justification and blueprint for such a project.

Appointments to this Committee shall be in the traditional representative format, acknowledging all the stakeholder groups in the community.

The Committee should feel free to call upon the services of any and all staff and community members in its deliberations, but the working group should be as streamlined as possible.

The proposed date of the launch of the study is November 15, 2004 with the aim of preparing and delivering a report to the Board of Education within one calendar year.

The Committee will issue a request for proposals (RFP) in early January 2005 to secure the services of a professional expert to assist in a comprehensive analysis of facilities needs in the District.

Superintendent of Schools 2004-2005 PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Addendum to the agreement between the Board of Education of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified Schools and the Superintendent of Schools, John Deasy, attached hereto and made a part hereof the original employment agreement dated June, 2003, at Santa Monica, California.

In addition to the regularly performed duties of the Superintendent, the following performance targets are identified as optimal desirable deliverables, which when reached, will be compensated according to the agreement of employment between the Board of Education and the Superintendent of Schools.

PERFORMANCE TARGETS

The following three major Performance Targets have been identified as part of our plan to raise the achievement of all students while simultaneously closing the achievement gap.

- 1.) Improvement and intensive oversight of the Special Education program, systems, and operations.
- Guiding and intensive effort to bring focus, support and improvement to the teaching and learning work at John Adams Middle School.
- Developing considerations for Board options for middle and high school age youth other than the choices currently provided by the district.

Improvement and intensive oversight of Special Education programs, systems, and operations

The district provides special education services to approximately 10% of our student population. The quality of the administration, leadership, and content of these programs can be improved. The recent work of a strategic plan that was offered to the Board for consideration has a number of good starting points towards this improvement. The Superintendent will now construct an implementation plan to improve the programmatic offerings, the

operations, and the systems in our Special Education department. The implementation plan will be constructed after a performance analysis of the department's operations and capacities. Anticipated in the analysis will be the identification of several areas for immediate improvement. Among these areas will be: the IEP construction, notification, and renewal process, parental communication systems, internal professional staff communication systems, financial expenditure and reporting systems, and decision making systems involving budgetary, legal, and programmatic offerings.

The Superintendent will publish the implementation and action plan by November 15, 2004. Frequent updates to the Board and community on the progress of plan implementation will take place no less than bimonthly. Among the items that will be contained in the plan will be:

Systems Improvement Targets

- 1.) A plan to computerize the construction of IEPs
- An effective plan for parental and staff communication around the systems of IEP construction, renewal, and implementation
- 3.) An effective parental communication system
- 4.) An effective Internal staff communication system
- 5.) An improved fiscal expenditure and reporting system
- 6.) An improved accountability and reporting system for the use of legal services, NPA/NPS placement decisions, filing and identification systems, and compliance and comportment of settlement agreement systems
- 7.) An analysis of needed and currently assigned personnel throughout the entire special education services in the district will be taken to determine efficiencies and needs to be met

Operations Improvement Targets

- 1.) A design for an improved and efficient central leadership structure and the intensive professional development of those in the roles will be constructed and implemented
- 2.) A performance improvement and training program will be developed and implemented
- 3.) A comprehensive three year staff development calendar will de developed and implemented
- 4.) As a response to the special education strategic plan, a flow chart and timeline marked action plan will be developed as a staff response to the recommendations and proposals in the strategic plan and a formal method

- to meld the strategic plan with the district's official Strategic Plan will be accomplished
- 5.) A budgetary analysis will be conducted to determine efficiencies and planning necessary to hold down the cost of the LGFC, without a compromise to the quality or improved quality of program. A clear target of cost containment and savings will be determined and made as a separate target

Programmatic Improvement Targets

- 1.) A staff recommended and research-based math curriculum will be proposed and adopted
- 2.) A LRC will be established and opened in Malibu
- A specific program for students with Autism Spectrum will be planned and opened before the close of the school year
- 4.) A fully operational diagnostic pre-school center will be opened
- 5.) A regular cycle of programmatic targets will be initiated, so that the following year's targets will be known before the school year ends
- 6.) The Circle of Friends activities will be appropriately institutionalized in the schools.

TASKS TO BE COMPLETED

- 1.) By 11.15.04 the action plan will be published by the superintendent
- 2.) Bi-monthly updates will be given to the Board at regularly scheduled Board meetings
- 3.) By 12.31.04 the plan for computerizing IEPs will be published and an implementation plan completed by 06.01.05
- 4.) A performance improvement plan and program will be implemented by 01.01.05
- 5.) Improved communication systems and plan will be implemented by 12.01.04
- 6.) An improved fiscal reporting and accountability system will be fully operational by the second interim reporting period
- 7.) An improved central leadership organizational structure will be proposed by 11.15.04 and implemented during the current school year
- 8.) A performance improvement system and 3 year professional development calendar will be created and implemented by 12.31.04
- 9.) Fiscal targets for cost savings will be published by the beginning of the budget forecast sessions and methods to meet these targets announced
- 10.) The staff's response and plan for the special education strategic plan will be produced for Board consideration no later than 02.01.05, including how this plan will be phased in and implemented and how it will be joined to the district's Strategic Plan.
- 11.) A math curriculum will be proposed and adopted by the close of this school year
- 12.) A LRC will be opened in Malibu this school year
- 13.) A programmatic offering for students with Autism Spectrum will be developed and planned for initiation during this school year
- 14.) Remaining operational targets speak for themselves with respect to tasks completed

QUALITY INDICATORS

- 1.) Surveys conducted by staff will report that the majority of parents surveyed will report **substantial improvement** in the programmatic targets, operational targets, and systems improvement targets identified in this plan.
- 2.) Staff will report accomplished targets as **implemented with regularity** and of **high quality** on our routine score cards reporting system.

The John Adams Middle School has the most impacted population of all the middle schools in SMMUSD. We are committed to helping John Adams meet and exceed both their AYP and AMO targets in the future. It is clear that an intensive effort of support and focus is required to accomplish this important goal.

TASKS TO BE COMPLETED

- 1.) AYP and AMO targets will be set and a specific action plan developed to meet these targets no later than October 15 2004.
- 2.) A plan to provide intervention, improvement, and support for school performance, operations, and the systems of support necessary will be constructed.
- 3.) A multi-year plan will be developed for the systemic improvement of student achievement and the teaching and learning processes at John Adams (similar to the one developed at SAMOHI several years ago). A first draft will be presented no later than February 1, 2005 and a final plan no later than May 1, 2005.
- 4.) A design and improvement coach will be provided to the John Adams community.
- 5.) The selection of the new principal will be completed by June guided by the expectations and commitments in the new plan.

QUALITY INDICATORS

- 1.) All AMO targets will be met for John Adams
- 2.) AYP will be accomplished for John Adams
- 3.) The multi-year plan for improvement will be presented at the first Board meeting of February as an initial draft and as a final plan at the first meeting of the Board in May. The Board will rate the plan as comprehensive and of high quality
- 4.) Regular reporting of the school's progress in designing its plan will be reported to the Board of Education.
- 5.) The remainder of the targets speak for themselves with respect to accomplishment

Development of intervention programs and plans for additional options for youth grades 6-12.

The superintendent will present the results of the study of intervention programs found in the 2003-2004 performance targets. With the completion of the analysis and study, among other improvements developed, will be a plan to develop and offer students options to complete their education in grades 6-12 in settings other than the established schools currently in operation will be developed and presented for consideration no later than February 2005. The development of these options will be guided by the goal of smaller learning communities for students, the reduction of overall enrollment at SAMOHI, and providing options for high school education as a choice for youth who are in a pattern of decline and failure where their success in our current options are likely to be compromised.

TASKS TO BE COMPLETED

- 1.) Results of the study and investigation will be presented in full by 11.30.04
- 2.) Implication of the study with respect to improvement plans will be presented to the Board by 02.15.05
- 3.) By 01.31.05 a plan for options for Middle and High school age students to increase options for schooling will be presented. This plan will propose specific options, timelines, and an implementation and development plan
- 4.) External support for funding these options will be presented to the Board by 03.01.05

QUALITY INDICATORS

- 1.) The majority of the Board will rate the quality of the findings of the study as **of high quality**
- 2.) The majority of the Board will rate the quality of the plan, its implementation plan, and the support plan as **of high quality**

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.21

It is recommended that the Board of Education adopt the 2004-05 Performance Targets for the Superintendent of Schools.

At the regular meeting of September 23, 2004 the Board of Education met in Closed Session with the Superintendent and set the following performance targets for 2004-2005:

- 1) Improvement and intensive oversight of the Special Education program, systems and operations.
- 2) Guiding and intensive effort to bring focus, support and improvement of the teaching and learning work at John Adams Middle School.
- 3) Developing the analysis of intervention programs and developing considerations for Board options for middle and high school age youth other than the choices currently provided by the district.

The Superintendent's Performance Targets are established annually and are adopted as an addendum to the agreement between the Superintendent of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District and the Board of Education. The targets listed above are in addition to duties regularly performed by the superintendent.

The 2004-2005 Performance Targets will be distributed in their entirety at the meeting.

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This item was moved forward on the agenda.

With regard to target 1) on a motion by Ms. Brownley and seconded by Ms. Leon-Vazquez, the Board of Education directed that an item be placed on the October 21, 2004 Agenda to adopt the Special Education Strategic Plan with the understanding that the plan requires further study by staff and that the action would be a starting point for the work to be undertaken in the Special Education Department. It is not a wholesale adoption of each and every recommendation included in the plan, but would move the plan forward so that the needs of the students would be advanced.

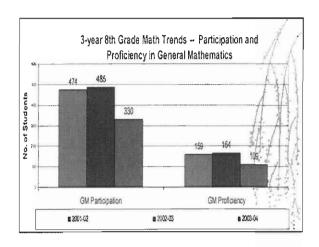


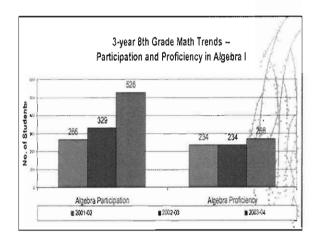


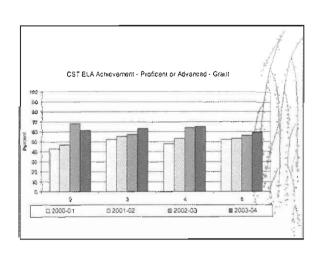


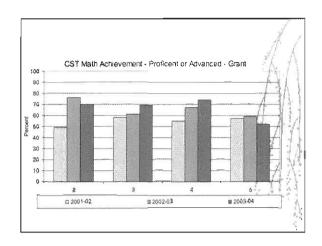


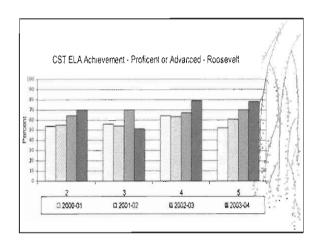


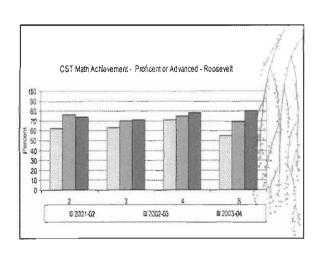


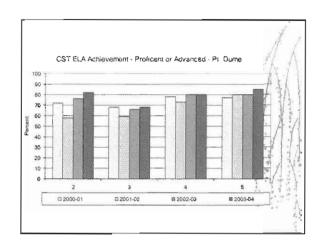


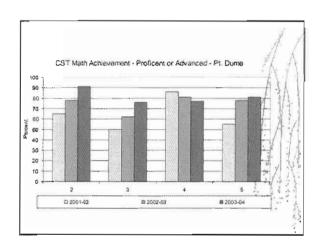


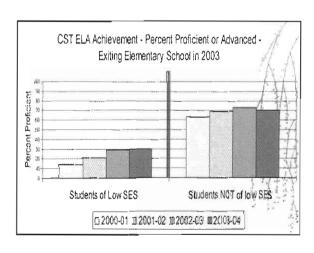


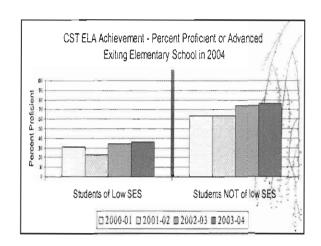


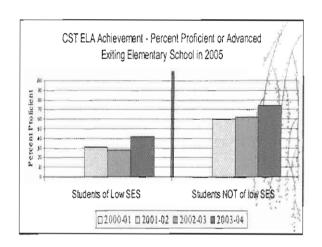


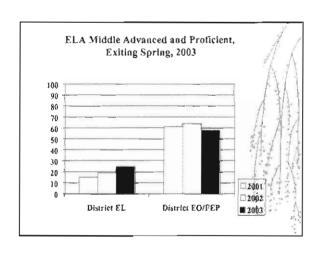


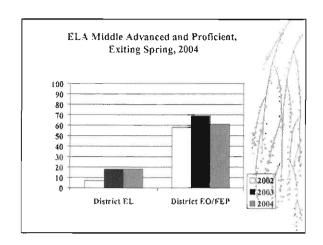


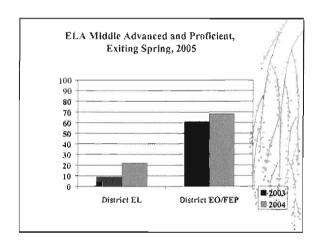






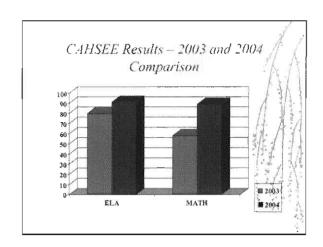


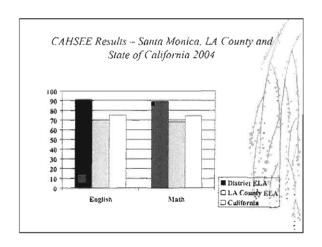


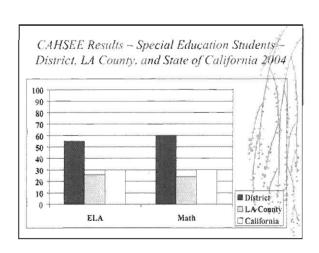


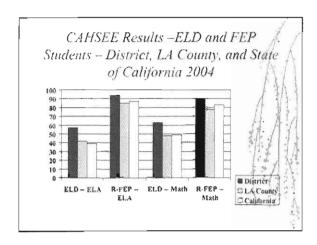
California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) Results

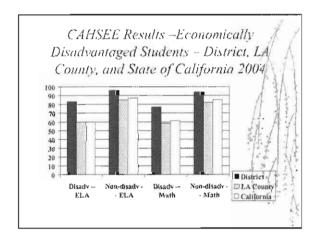
- Beginning with the class of 2006, all students must pass the CAHSEE in order to graduate.

- Overall, student performance in SMMUSD schools on the CAHSEE improved significantly from 2003 to 2004.





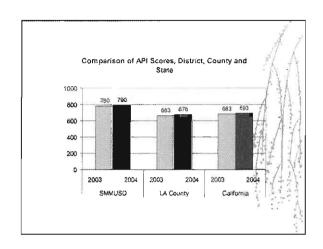


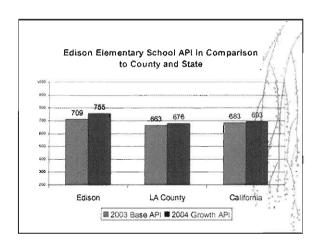


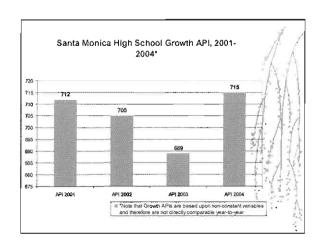


Academic Performance Index (API)

- → Interim goal = 800; ultimate goal = 1000

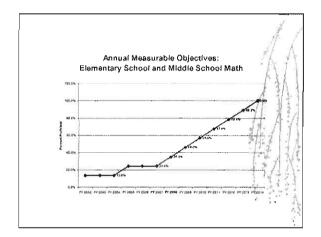


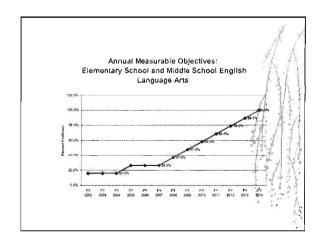




Annual Measurable Objectives

- Annual Measurable Objectives or steps on the path to 100% proficiency – are set by the state.

- Each year, the district and each individual school receive a report on which AMOs were met, based on state test scores for all students and relevant subgroups.

The California Standards Tests measure student achievement on grade level standards and are administered to all students in grades 2-11. The California High School Exit Exam is given to all 10th grade students and, beginning with the class of 2006, students must pass the examination in order to graduate. Overall achievement results (for the district and individual schools) from the 2004 testing will be presented to the Board. Trends in performance for the past two or three years will be discussed.

Additionally, district performance and the overall performance of district schools on the Annual Measurable Objectives associated with Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) -- a measure intended to mark progress toward the attainment of the goals embodied in the No Child Left Behind Act -- and California's Academic Performance Index (API) will be reviewed.

Data from these tests and comparative measures of performance help schools and the central office identify program needs, prioritize professional development needs, and develop datadriven school improvement plans.
