It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the District's participation in the Valued Youth Program.

COMMENT: On May 5, 2005, the Valued Youth Program was included as one of the programs to be implemented to enhance student performance. John Adams was identified as the pilot site. Students who are disengaged or who are identified as likely to become disengaged are trained to be academic tutors for young children. Identified students have engaged in rigorous training in a program similar to what a classroom assistant would experience. These tutors spend one (1) hour a day, three times a week, in a neighboring elementary school working as classroom-based tutors in grades K-3. Adult mentors from the business community are matched to every youth. The tutors are paid for this work experience and there are a number of celebrations and learning opportunities that go with the program.
