UNADOPTED March 2, 2006

A meeting of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Board of Education was held on Thursday, March 2, 2006 at SMMUSD District Offices, 1651 16th Street, Santa Monica, CA. The Board of Education called the meeting to order at 4:15 p.m. in the Board Conference Room of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Administrative Offices and moved to Closed Session for the reasons listed under section III. The public business meeting reconvened at 5:47 p.m. in the in the Board Room.

IV BOARD OF EDUCATION - COMMENDATIONS / RECOGNITIONS

- Samohi Orchestra and Joni Swenson Dr. Deasy noted that the Santa Monica High School Symphony was the first public high school to perform at the Disney Hall. The ninety-four member Symphony performed to a sold out crowd. The Symphony, expertly directed by Joni Swenson, was repeatedly awarded enthusiastic approval by the audience. The evening reminded everyone about what can be done by supporting the fine arts and was a testament of the quality music program in our District. On behalf of the Board of Education, President Brownley presented Ms. Swenson with a bouquet of flowers.
- At this time, President Brownley announced the sad and tragic death of Eddie Lopez, a 10th grade student at Santa Monica High School who was shot and killed Tuesday night. A youth prayer service was being held later this evening at 7:15 p.m. at Santa Monica's Catholic Church. Most of the discussion items relate to Santa Monica High School, and since staff, faculty, students and parents may wish to attend the service, the Board of Education set an additional meeting

on March 9 to address items D.1, D.2, D.3 and D.4. Dr. Matthews will attend a coalition meeting of Santa Monica High School students, staff and parents early next week to provide them with information that would have been discussed at this meeting. That information will also be shared with the Board of Education at the special meeting set for March 9, 2006.

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VIII PUBLIC COMMENTS

Public Comments is the time when members of the audience may address the Board of Education on items not scheduled on the meeting's agenda. All speakers are limited to three (3) minutes. When there is a large number of speakers, the Board may reduce the allotted time to two(2) minutes per speaker. The Brown Act (Government Code) states that Board members may not engage in discussion of issues raised during "VIII, Public Comments" except to ask clarifying questions, make a brief announcement, make a brief report on his or her own activities, or to refer the matter to staff. This Public Comment section is limited to 20 minutes. If the number of persons wishing to address the Board of Education exceeds the time limit, additional time will be provided in Section XVI, CONTINUATION OF PUBLIC COMMENTS.

- Marlene Herrera addressed the Board of Education concerning violence on the Samohi campus. She stated that Hispanic parents of students in regular education classes do not feel that their children are represented at the school. She further stated that some parents feel unwelcome and discriminated against at the school; therefore, they are unwilling to participate in activities.
- Margarita Gonzalez addressed the Board of Education stating that Latino parents feel they are not represented at the school. She stated that there has been less participation by parents and that is because there are fewer students in classes for English learners than there are Latino students in regular education classes. She requested a representative for Latino parents of students in regular education classes.
- Crystal Quinn addressed the Board of Education requesting more security guards at Santa Monica High School. She would also like to see a stronger police presence on city streets surrounding the school, especially near Lincoln and Pico.
- Jules Bagneris stated that there was a situation in the community and that he recognized there is no wall around the Santa Monica High School campus or the community. He stated that if we deal with issues on campus then events can be prevented in the community. Mr. Bagneris stated that he was profoundly disappointed that the discussion items were postponed to another date and felt that the issues needed to be dealt with at this evening's meeting. He suggested that the Police chief and city manager be invited to the meeting when the items will be discussed.

Mr. Bagneris noted that Senator Sheila Kuehl is holding a Community Forum on Gang Violence in Santa Monica on Saturday, March 18, 2006 10 a.m. - noon at John Adams Middle School.

A. Student Board Members Reports

Alon Nachshon, Santa Monica High School, opened his report by stating how saddened was was by the tragic loss of Eddie Lopez. A banner has been made so that students could share their words of condolence. Fundraisers are being planned to help the family with expenses. The school community held a rememberance ceremony in the Greek Theater in honor of Eddie. Today, friends and family shared their personal memories of Eddie which the students felt were very motivating. Alon wished the best to the Eddie's family and stated that Eddie Lopez will live forever in his heart.

The orchestra and band performed beautifully in the Southern California festival today. The AP Art Show, TRAPA, will begin March 9 at 6 p.m. Samohi Idol will take place Thursday with eight talented performers scheduled for the event. New plants and landscaping are popping up all around campus. Lastly, Alon reported that the Boys Basketball Team made it all the way to the semi-finals.

• Mali Huffman, Olympic High School, reported that with the recent tragedy in the community, all the students have been calm and very empathetic with cousins of Eddie Lopez on our campus. The Student Council is planning a fundraiser in the next week as the school's local effort to contribute to the family.

Fourth period classes focused on CAHSEE preparation across the school. Students are in their second, three-week cycle and have shown great gains in classroom data. Students who have passed both portions of the CAHSEE are working on their expository and narrative writing skills.

B. SMMCTA Update - Mr. Harry Keiley thanked the Board of Education for delaying discussion on items D.1-D.4 to another date. Larry Silvers provided copies of the collective bargaining agreement for members of the Board of Education.

Mr. Keiley stated that the association had sent its thoughts and prayers to the Eddie Lopez family. He also stated that it was now a time to push for transformation of heart to find peace in the communities and resolve and bring an end to senseless violence.

RE: ANALYSIS OF MATHEMATICS DATA AND FRAMEWORK FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF MATHEMATICS TEACHING AND LEARNING

DISCUSSION ITEM NO. D.4

Mathematics instruction and student achievement are hotly contested topics, not simply in the State of California but both nationally and internationally as well. International comparisons suggest that U. S. students at each level (elementary, middle and high school) tend to lag behind many of their counterparts in the other leading industrial countries. Much has been made of these international comparisons and there are many competing theories about how best to teach essential mathematics concepts to children.

In the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District, we have had sustained increases in elementary mathematics achievement over the past four years. In 2005, just under 75 percent of our second and third graders tested at the proficient or advanced level on the California Standards Tests (CSTs). Fourth and fifth grade scores, too, have improved, with fully 67 percent of fourth graders and 62 percent of fifth graders testing at the proficient or advanced level. Middle school mathematics achievement has trended upward as well, with 54 percent of sixth graders and 55 percent of seventh graders scoring at the proficient or advanced levels on the 2005 CSTs.

A quick look across these scores, however, tells the tale that has been of concern to teachers, administrators and members of the Board of Education for some time. While our achievement is admirable, there is reason to be concerned about the readiness of many of our eighth graders to undertake Algebra as the eighth grade curriculum. At best, a longitudinal look at the data (assuming some degree of vertical articulation among mathematics tests at the state level) suggests that about 50 percent of our students are ready to undertake Algebra as eighth grade students.

In addition to concerns about student readiness to undertake Algebra at eighth grade, there are also concerns about the proper sequencing of, and options for, high school mathematics. The Board of Education has supported implementation of a third year of required mathematics for all high school students, and beginning with the Class of 2007, all students will be required to take three years of high school mathematics. The expectation

is that many more students will engage in UC/CSU approved coursework as a result of this change. There is also a need to discuss additional course offerings for the third year of mathematics for those students who prefer a non-algebra third year option. (The typical sequence for UC/CSU approval is Algebra I, Geometry and Algebra II.) We have been offering increasing opportunities for students to engage in accelerated mathematics instruction, particularly at the middle school level. This year, there is one section of geometry for eighth grade students at each of our middle schools. Preliminary results from two geometry classes last year indicated that these students will learn and achieve at high levels. These and other opportunities for acceleration of the "traditional" mathematics sequence also will create a need for additional mathematics options at the high school level.

An additional topic of concern is the achievement of students with special needs in the area of mathematics. Students with special needs who take the CSTs perform significantly below their peers -- with 50 percent proficient or advanced at 2nd grade, 30 percent at fourth grade, 21 percent at fifth grade and 16 percent at seventh grade. Overall 40 percent of the students with special needs pass the California High School Exit Examination the first time they take the test as sophomores. This CAHSEE pass rate is roughly half of the district's overall pass rate for first time test takers in mathematics.

In this presentation, we will discuss analysis of data that staff have been engaged in concerning the long-term enrollment of students in, and success at, mathematics coursework between fourth grade and high school graduation. Additionally, we will present a preliminary draft of a framework for the improvement of mathematics teaching and learning districtwide. One component of this framework will include the incorporation of mathematics and mathematics-focused instructional technology that will occur as part of our implementation of the Enhancing Education Through Technology grant that we recently received. Other components will address the various issues outlined above.

While disappointed that our initial search for a mathematics coordinator did not yield a final candidate, staff believe that we must discuss the shape of mathematics teaching and learning in advance of the appointment of a mathematics coordinator, so that potential cost implications can be factored into budget planning, appropriate professional development can be determined, and ongoing work furthered or rethought before the start of the 2006-2007.
