A regular meeting of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Board of Education was held on Thursday, November 2, 2006, in the Malibu City Council Chambers, 23815 Stuart Ranch Road, Malibu, CA. The Board of Education called the meeting to order at 4:17 p.m. in the upstairs Conference Room at the Malibu City Council Chambers, 23815 Stuart Ranch Road, Malibu, CA. At 4:18 p.m. the Board of Education moved to Closed Session regarding the items listed below. The public meeting reconvened at 5:52 p.m. in the Council Chambers.

IV. BOARD OF EDUCATION - COMMENDATIONS / RECOGNITIONS

• Webster Elementary School

Principal Phil Cott addressed the Board of Education regarding recent activities at Webster Elementary School, including a field trip in which the students had an opportunity to interact with students with moderate to severe disabilities at a handicap accessible playground. The field trip was made possible by Shane's Inspiration, a non-profit organization dedicated to improving the lives of children with disabilities by building universally accessible playgrounds, allowing children of all abilities to play alongside one another. Mr. Cott explained that the field trip was one example of how Webster Elementary School focuses on enhancing student learning by allowing the students to experience a variety of activities and points of view firsthand.

Mr. Cott then presented a DVD of the 5th grade trip to Yosemite that occurred this past June. The trip represented a culmination of the experiences the students had participated in during their tenure at Webster. The DVD showed students hiking, climbing, working together, gathering around campfires, and having fun outdoors. It was the sixteenth year Webster's 5th graders had made the trip to Yosemite.

Webster's PTA President, Leslie Frost, informed the Board of Education that Webster strives to produce well-educated, well-rounded students. The parents and other members of the community have an active part in this education, as is evident in the 28,000 logged volunteer hours, including parents supervising playground activities. In order to reduce paper and improve efficiency, a group of parents created a web site, allowing parents to access all flyers and informational bulletins distributed by the school and teachers.

Ms. Frost then updated the Board regarding the needs of Webster, including a cohesive list of supplies needed and guidelines for emergency/disaster preparedness. She requested more playground supervision and suggested that the polystyrene trays in the cafeteria be replaced with more environmentally friendly trays. Board Member Wisnicki asked district staff to follow-up with a previously made request for non-polystyrene materials in the cafeterias.

Superintendent Talarico thanked Principal Cott and Ms. Frost for their presentation, adding that during her visits to Webster she has noticed the wonderful activities the students experience.

VIII. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Public Comments is the time when members of the audience may address the Board of Education on items not scheduled on the meeting's agenda. All speakers are limited to three (3) minutes. When there are a large number of speakers, the Board may reduce the allotted time to two (2) minutes per speaker. - Ms. Valerie Joslin and Ms. Fiona Afshar addressed the Board of Education regarding their concerns of overcrowding on the Sunset Mesa Bus route in Malibu. Board Member Wisnicki requested information from district staff regarding how many bus passes were issued, how many families paid for a pass versus how many students were actually riding, and why was there a delay in hiring a new bus driver. Board Member de la Torre asked staff to investigate why some families were denied a pass.
- Mr. Tony Dolz, Ms. Janette Frazier, Ms. Angelina Fernandez, Mr. Bernard Carroll, Mr. Carl Olson, and Ms. Robin Hvidston addressed the Board of Education regarding their concerns about the legal status of immigrants working in the U.S.

A. Student Board Member Reports

Sarah Paxton – Malibu High School

Ms. Paxton informed the Board of Education that the Malibu High ASB will hold its first Winter Formal on December 1st; they hope to make it an annual event. The Homecoming Dance was a huge success, and the Middle School held a costume contest on Halloween. The girls' varsity

volleyball team is competing this evening for a league title, and senior Chealse Mosser won CIF League Individuals for tennis. Ms. Paxton commended the school administration for ensuring the safety of the students when a high-speed chase ended near the campus on Pacific Coast Highway earlier that day. She informed the Board that Mr. Panish, a government/economics teacher, encouraged every eligible student to vote in the November 7th election. Ms. Paxton wished good luck to each Board Member running for an elected position.

D. PTA Council President Report - Laura Rosenbaum

Ms. Rosenbaum began her report by commending Webster Elementary School for their presentation and the parent involvement at the school site. She then reminded the Board of the PTA Council's support of Measure BB in the November election. Ms. Rosenbaum expressed the PTA's interest in helping the community understand how the district is working to ensure the safety of the students on and off the campuses as well as on the Internet. The PTA Council is concerned with the failure rate of male students and the social implications associated with these numbers; she requested an analysis of the achievement data of males in order to determine methods for improving male student achievement. Regarding the Equity Fund, the PTA Council will be reviewing the contributions from the schools as well as gathering representatives from the school sites to be a part of the oversight committee. The PTA Council will be holding its holiday breakfast on December 5, 2006.

X. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Talarico updated the Board of Education regarding the overcrowding of Malibu Bus Route C (AKA Sunset Mesa Bus). Ms. Talarico reminded the Board that she rode the bus on September 21, 2006, to assess the situation herself; she made the recommendation that another bus driver be hired to drive a second bus along the route to reduce overcrowding. The Director of Classified Personnel informed the Superintendent that after posting the job position one candidate was eligible, but declined the position. The Superintendent said that she would review the district's policy regarding bus passes and also investigate why some families had been denied a pass. Board Members Bloomfield and Wisnicki suggested that the issue be put on a future agenda.

The Superintendent then reminded everyone to vote on November 7th. She updated the Board regarding the separate informational mailers that had been sent to families from the district, including a parent-centered mailer sent out on October 26th, a broader community mailer sent out on October 27th, and a Malibu-centered mailer on October 30th. Additionally, a Measure S update was distributed to the community.

Board Member de la Torre mentioned that at the Edison Elementary School's Festival there were Cranes for Peace representing and paying tribute to the children who have died as a result of the war in Iraq.

- (2) The property is needed and will be used by the recipient for carrying out for the residents of a given political area one or more public purposes, or, if an approved nonprofit tax-exempt organization or 8(a) business, the property is needed for and will be used by the recipient for educational or public health purposes, or for programs for older individuals, or for business purposes. The property is not acquired for any other use or purpose, or for sale or other distribution; or for permanent use outside the state, except with prior approval of the State Agency for Surplus Property, hereafter referred to "the SASP".
- (3) Funds are available to pay any and all costs and charges incident to the receipt of surplus property, that the property is not being acquired for any other use(s) or purpose(s), is not for sale.
- (4) Any transaction shall be subject to the nondiscrimination regulations governing the donation of federal surplus personal property issued under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, (41 USC 2000d-2000d-4a), as amended; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 USC 794), as amended; Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. 1681-1688), as amended; and Section 303 of the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (42 USC 6101-6107).
- (5) If the Donee is designated by the Federal Small Business Administration 8a Program as a socially and economically disadvantaged small business and the SASP has determined the Donee is eligible to receive federal surplus personal property as a donation, the Donee certifies that the property acquired is needed and will be used solely for the conduct of the Donee's business enterprise; and the Donee certifies to A. (3), A. (4), and A. (5) above.

B. The Donee agrees to the following federal conditions:

- (1) All items of property, other than items with a unit acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more and passenger motor vehicles, regardless of acquisition cost, shall be placed in use for the purpose(s) for which acquired within one year of receipt, and shall be placed in continuous use for one year from the date the property was placed in use. In the event the Donee does not so place the property in use, or in continuous use, the Donee shall immediately notify the SASP and, at the Donee's expense, make the property available for transfer or other disposal as directed by the SASP.
- (2) Special handling or use limitations as are imposed by the Federal General Services Administration (GSA) on any item(s) of property under which the item(s) are being allocated to the Donee.
- (3) In the event the Donee does not so use the property as required by C. (1) and C. (2), above, at the option of the GSA title and right to the possession of such property shall revert to the United States of America and, upon demand, the Donee shall release such property to such person as the GSA or its designee shall direct.
- C. The Donee agrees to the following conditions applicable to items with a unit acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more and passenger motor vehicles, except vessels of 50 feet or more in length and aircraft, regardless of acquisition cost:
 - (1) The property shall be placed in use within one year of receipt and shall be used only for the purpose(s) for which acquired and for no other purpose(s).
 - (2) There shall be a period of restriction which will expire after such property has been used for the purpose(s) for which acquired for 18 months from the date the property is placed in use, except for such item(s) of major equipment for which the SASP designates a further period of restriction.
 - (3) In the event the property is not so used as required by C. (1) and C. (2), above, at the option of the SASP title and right to the possession of such property shall revert to the State of California, and the Donee shall release such property to such person, as the SASP shall direct.

D. The Donee agrees to the following terms, reservations and restrictions:

- (1) From the date the Donee receives the property and throughout the time period(s) imposed by B. or C. above (as applicable) remain in effect, the Donee shall not sell, trade, lease, lend, bail, cannibalize, encumber, or otherwise dispose of such property or remove it permanently for use outside the State of California without the prior approval of the GSA or the SASP. The proceeds from any sale, trade, lease, loan, bailment, encumbrance, or other disposal of the property, when the GSA or the SASP authorizes such action, shall be remitted promptly by the Donee to the GSA or the SASP, as applicable. If a Donee takes action in ignoring or disregarding the foregoing restrictions after the date the Donee receives the property and before expiration of the time periods imposed by C. or D. as applicable at the option of the GSA or the SASP, the Donee shall pay to the GSA or the SASP any proceeds derived from the disposal, and/or the fair market or fair rental value of the property at the time of such unauthorized disposal as determined by the GSA or the SASP as applicable.
- (2) If at any time from the date the Donee receives the property and throughout the time periods imposed by B. or C. above (as applicable) the Donee determines that some or all of the property is no longer suitable, usable, or further needed for the purpose(s) for which it was acquired, the Donee shall promptly notify the SASP and shall, as directed by the SASP, return the property to the SASP, or release the property to another Donee or another state agency or a department or agency of the United States, or sell or otherwise dispose of the property. The Donee shall remit the proceeds from any sale promptly to the SASP.
- (3) The Donee shall make reports to the SASP which shall state the use, condition and location of the property, and shall report on other pertinent matters as may be required from time to time by the SASP.
- (4) At the option of the SASP, the Donee may abrogate the conditions set forth in B, above, and the terms, reservations and restrictions pertaining thereto in D by payment of an amount determined by the SASP.

E. The Donee agrees to the following conditions applicable to all items of property:

- (1) The property acquired by the Donee is on an "as is," "where is" basis without warranty of any kind.
- (2) If the Donee carries insurance against damages to or loss of property because of fire or other hazards, and damage to, loss or destruction of donated property with unexpired terms, conditions, reservations or restrictions occurs, the SASP will be entitled to reimbursement from the Donee out of the insurance proceeds in an amount equal to the unamortized portion of the fair value of the lost, damaged or destroyed property.
- F. Terms, conditions, reservations and restrictions set forth in the Conditional Transfer Document executed by the authorized Donee representative are applicable to the donation of aircraft and vessels of 50 feet or more in length having an acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more, regardless of the purpose for which acquired

CHAPTER II

THE PERSONNEL COMMISSION

Rule 2.1 COMMISSION ORGANIZATION AND PROCEDURE - BY LAWS

2.1.1 ORGANIZATION (EDUCAITON CODE 45243, 45247)

A. The Personnel Commission of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District shall consist of three members.

2.1.2 APPOINTMENT (EDUCATION CODE 45240, 45248, 45249)

- A. Members of the Commission are appointed alternately be the State Superintendent of Public Instruction and by the Executive Officer of the State Personnel Board, each of whom may consider the recommendation of the Board and other interested parties.
- B. The District shall select nominees for the Commission according to the joint guidelines of the State Personnel Board and State Superintendent of Public Instruction for selection and nomination of school district personnel commissioners.
 - 1. The recruitment process shall be open.
 - 2. A prescreening panel shall be appointed and shall consist of a representative from each of the following: Board; Commission; each recognized employee organization; the community.
 - The prescreening panel shall review the qualifications of all candidates and shall recommend a nominee to the Board for approval and transmittal to Sacramento for appointment.

2.1.3 QUALIFICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP (EDUCATION CODE 45244)

A. A member of the Commission shall be a registered voter, resident within the District and shall be a known adherent to the principle of the merit system. No member of the Board shall be a member of the Commission nor shall any Commission member, during his/her term of service, be an employee of the District.

2.1.4 TERMS OF OFFICE (EDUCATION CODE 45247)

A. The term of each Commissioner is for three years and expires at noon, December 1. The term of one Commissioner expires each year. On or about September 1 of each year the Director of Classified Personnel shall notify the Board and concerned employee groups of the name and home address of the Commissioner whose term will expire and whether he/she will accept reappointment. The notification shall also list the appointing authority and indicate that the Board must follow the provisions of the joint guidelines.

2.1.5 ELECTION OF OFFICERS

A. At the first meeting following the December 1 of each year, the Commission shall elect one member as Chairperson and one member as Vice Chairperson to serve a term of one year or until a successor is duly elected. The Chairperson shall be the presiding officer of all regular and special meetings. In the event of the absence of the Chairperson, the Vice Chairperson shall preside.

2.1.6 REMOVAL OF A COMMISSIONER (GOVERNMENT CODE 3060)

A. An accusation in writing may be presented to the Grand Jury of Los Angeles County if a Commissioner is incompetent, fails to attend meetings or becomes incapacitated and is unable to fulfill the duties of the office.

California Education Code §45247

45247. Appointees to a commission in a district which has newly adopted the system shall take office upon receipt of notification of appointment but the term of office shall run from noon of the first day of December next succeeding.

In school districts with a three-member personnel commission, the initial appointee of the governing board shall serve a three-year term, and the term of the appointee recommended by classified employees, and the third member selected by the two other members shall be for two years and one year respectively.

In school districts which have elected to establish a fivemember personnel commission, one of the initial appointees of the governing board, and one of the initial appointees nominated by the classified employees shall serve three-year terms. The term of the other initial appointee of the governing board, and the other initial appointee nominated by the classified employees of the district, shall be for two years, and the term of the appointee selected by the other members of the commission shall be for one year.

Subsequent terms shall be for three years commencing at noon the first day of December.

A three-member commission may perform any act authorized or required by law when two members have been appointed.

A five-member commission may perform any act authorized or required by law when three members have been appointed.

It is recommended that the Board of Education accept the Financial Oversight Committee's recommendation to approve Mr. Gordon Lee to fill one (1) of the (2) FOC vacancies and re-advertise for the vacant position and extend the FOC application process until December 15, 2006 to allow for additional applicants to apply. It is further recommended that the current renewal terms of members be modified to grant first-time members a one (1) year term as well as to allow modifications to other members' terms, as detailed below.

COMMENTS: At the June 1, 2006 Board Meeting, the Board approved Reappointment of Term to the Financial Oversight Committee for Craig Hamilton (Item A. 27), which also stated that (2) vacancies are to be filled, with the application process to be conducted under the Office of the Superintendent. Subsequently, a Press Release was distributed as well as posted on the District's website on June 12, 2006, SMMUSD Board of Education Accepting Applications for Financial Oversight Committee.

At the July 27, 2006 Board Meeting, the Board approved extending the FOC application deadline to August 31, 2006 (Item A. 29), due to a less than anticipated response received to the initial Press Release/District website posting.

Subsequently, (3) applications were received by that deadline and were reviewed by the FOC at their meeting on September 5, 2006. Committee members then requested, and the Board granted at their September 14, 2006 Board Meeting (Item A. 14), another extension of the application deadline to September 30, 2006. The FOC subcommittee interviewed the (3) applicants at their meeting on October 10 9, 2006, however, and at their special meeting on October 16, 2006, they the full Committee unanimously approved (1) applicant, Mr. Gordon Lee for recommendation to the Board.

The FOC is asking for another extension of the application process until December 15, 2006 to fill the (1) remaining vacancy.

Modification of Members' Terms:

The FOC also approved a motion to modify members' term ending dates to December $31^{\rm st}$ of the relevant year to allow for recruitment during the fall in the future.

RE: RESUMPTION OF FULL DAY/FULL YEAR PRESCHOOL PROGRAM

DISCUSSION ITEM NO. D.1

It is recommended that the Board of Education consider the resumption of the preschool full day/full year General Childcare program previously relinquished by the district in 2002. Child Development Services would resume operating the full day/full year John Adams Child Development Center and one full day/full year preschool classroom at Washington West on February 1, 2007. It is recommended that the Board of Education consider authorizing staff to send a letter of request to the California Department of Education for the return of the program currently operated by Easter Seals in collaboration with Santa Monica College and SMMUSD Child Development Services. recommended that the Board of Education consider authorizing staff to work closely with Santa Monica College and Easter Seals to provide a smooth transition for children and families currently enrolled in the Easter Seals program, if the State agrees to return the program to the district.

BACKGROUND

In 2001 the School Board determined that the full day/full year program could not continue without a general fund contribution and chose to return the funds allocated for preschool childcare to the State. The State awarded the funds to Easter Seals beginning July 2002, and Easter Seals has operated the program at Lincoln and JAMS preschools in a collaboration with SMC and the SMMUSD CDS since then.

The collaborative was able to operate the program because SMC agreed to contribute funds (\$100,000 plus two teachers in-kind or the equivalent salaries) and SMMUSD contributed space for the program. With an ongoing commitment from SMC to continue the annual funding they have been granting Easter Seals and by blending Head Start funds with State funds for qualifying children, CDS would be able to operate the full day program without support from the general fund and therefore the return of the program to SMMUSD would be cost neutral for the District.

Funding Issues

State general childcare funds are "earned" by serving low-income children. A specific amount of additional funding (estimated to be just over \$630,000 annually) would be made available to the district for childcare. CDS currently receives CDE general childcare funds (approximately \$1,232,605) for before/after

school programs as well as winter, spring, and summer childcare for school age children. The State specifies that these funds provide full day/full year childcare for children between the ages of 0-12 whose families have a need for childcare because they work or go to school.

The returned State funds (\$638,104) would be used for full day/full year preschool/childcare for approximately 84 preschool children. The program would be located at JAMS preschool and in one room at Washington West. If CDS finds that the JAMS childcare center and the Washington West full day program are unable to use all the available funded slots, the slots could be used at additional sites or reassigned to provide pre-kindergarten childcare during the summer or for expanding our school age childcare subsidy program. In the future, the slots could be used for infant/toddler programs.

Staffing Issues

One of the reasons for terminating the JAMS and Lincoln childcare center programs in 2002 was the expense of classified assistants. If the district takes back the funding, at least four 6, 7, or 8 hour classified assistant positions will be required to operate the program. The result will be a more stable work force and better conditions for children, although the staffing costs will increase.

Mr. Tim Walker clarified for the Board of Education that it was the district's intention to keep the program cost neutral, and the issue would come before the Board of Education if monetary adjustments were needed.

Ms. Judy Abdo clarified that the classification for the staff positions is already in place.

Ms. Leon-Vazquez inquired as to whether families who have not been deemed low-income could pay for the services. Ms. Abdo confirmed that they could. She also mentioned that the Cal Works program could pay for student participation.

Ms. Abdo confirmed that there are 88 pre-school students in this program.

This item will be brought forward as an Action Item for the Board at a future meeting.
