The Board of Education called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m. in the Board Conference Room at the District Offices, 1651 16<sup>th</sup> Street, Santa Monica, CA. At 4:31 p.m. the Board of Education moved to Closed Session regarding the items listed below. The public meeting reconvened at 5:53 p.m. in the Board Room.

# IV. BOARD OF EDUCATION - COMMENDATIONS / RECOGNITIONS

 Board of Education President Julia Brownley – Outgoing Julia Brownley was recognized for her twelve years of service as an SMMUSD Board Member – Becently, Mr. Brownley was elected to the

SMMUSD Board Member. Recently, Ms. Brownley was elected to the CA State Assembly in the November 7, 2006, general election.

Superintendent Talarico presented Ms. Brownley with the Julia Brownley Collection of books that will be placed in each of the district's three high school libraries. The collection follows the theme of successful women and women in leadership positions.

The Board presented Ms. Brownley with a plaque and framed poster of Samohi, since all of her children attended the high school. The board members expressed their appreciation for Ms. Brownley's years of dedication to the board, mentorship, and her passion for excellent education for the students of SMMUSD. They congratulated her on winning the statewide office.

Laurie Newman from Senator Sheila Kuehl's office and Louise Rishoff from Assembly Member Fran Pavley's office presented Ms. Brownley with a state resolution from the CA Assembly, commending her commitment to quality education and years of service.

Susan Nissman from Supervisor Zev Yaroslavsky's office presented Ms. Brownley with a resolution recognizing her dedication to the education and welfare of the district's students.

Vice President Kathy Wisnicki presented Ms. Brownley with a resolution from the City of Malibu, highlighting her accomplishments and contributions to the board.

Ralph Mechur with the Education Foundation thanked Ms. Brownley for her hard work and support of the Ed Foundation. Keryl Cartee, SEIU Local 660 representative, commended Ms. Brownley for initiating movement within the district to get goals accomplished.

Assemblywoman Brownley thanked everyone for their kindness. She said it was an honor to serve with each board member; she learned something profound from each of them. She promised to take the experience of serving on a board of education with her to the state assembly. Ms. Brownley welcomed Barry Snell and Kelly Pye to the board, and said she was proud to be a part of the selection process for the new Superintendent.

Principal Tara Brown addressed the Board of Education regarding updates at Franklin Elementary School, including the Writers' Workshop program that has dramatically improved student writing abilities and grants that the school is applying for in order to improve the instructional skills of the teachers. The school adopted a merit program to support appropriate playground and classroom behavior; students who show model behavior receive a "Friends of Franklin" T-shirt. School safety has improved by making sure the front gate stays locked, visitors sign in at the front office, and the adoption of a valet program for student drop-off.

*Ms.* Brown announced that Tennessee Congressman Harold Ford visited the school; he and the students had an opportunity to ask and answer questions of each other.

*Ms.* Brown concluded her report by mentioning this year's focus for the teachers' professional development meetings is technology. The Apple computer store has agreed to train the teachers on anything computer related.

Pattie Fitzgerald, Franklin's PTA President, commended Principal Tara Brown and Assistant Principal Deanna Sinfield for their wonderful work; she said the kids love them.

Ms. Fitzgerald informed the board that Franklin PTA's theme for the year is "Enriching Ourselves and Our Community." This theme was made apparent as Ms. Fitzgerald outlined the community outreach Franklin has achieved, including raising money for UNICEF during a Trick-or-Treat campaign, a turkey food drive, and the Mending Kids International program, a nonprofit program that brings children from around the world for medical care. Franklin teamed with Webster Elementary School, and each class of students "adopts" one of the children brought from another country, collecting and donating everyday items for that child while s/he is receiving medical treatment.

Ms. Fitzgerald explained that there were over two hundred entries in the Reflections contest this year, and that student writing was especially strong. Franklin and Roosevelt held a combined holiday choir performance this month. The fund raising events this year include a book fair, carnival, snow night, and silent auction. Ms. Fitzgerald concluded her report by announcing that PTA parent participation this year reached 100%, and she invited the board members to attend film night in March.

Vice President Wisnicki expressed her delight in student achievement and the school's outreach to the community. Superintendent Talarico said she loved Pattie's energy. She reported that during a recent meeting with Principal Brown and Assistant Principal Sinfield, she witnessed firsthand their excellent leadership skills and problem-solving abilities.

## A. Student Board Member Reports

Sarah Paxton – Malibu High School

Student Board Member Sarah Paxton addressed the Board of Education regarding updates at Malibu High School. The blood drive yielded a donation of 84 units of blood. Girls' varsity soccer beats Crossroads four goals to one. The school's students took a survey regarding ways to improve the school; parents are also encouraged to take the survey, which is on the school's website. The Christmas tree lot opened last week; proceeds go toward the athletics program. The middle school is holding a Winter Wonderland dance prior to winter break. Students learned about alternative fuel sources from the Nols vegetable bus that came to campus; the bus runs primarily on vegetable oil. Makeva Ward, the school's accountant, has accepted a position at another institution; December 15<sup>th</sup> is her last day at the school.

Sara Nickpay - Santa Monica High School

Student Board Member Sara Nickpay addressed the Board of Education regarding updates at Santa Monica High School. There will be a pep rally on December 19<sup>th</sup> to honor the winter sports, and the school is in the middle of Spirit Week. Two concerts will be held next week: the twentyfirst orchestral performance and the nineteenth choir performance. The Samohi Slam fundraiser basketball game held on November 30<sup>th</sup> was very successful, and Boys' basketball won the El Segundo Tournament. The Roberts Art Gallery has a new exhibit of work entitled, "High School." The production of "A Mid-Summer Night's Dream" has begun. In honor of AIDS Awareness Day on December 1<sup>st</sup>, the school held a daylong presentation in Barnum Hall. Bobby Shriver, co-founder of the product RED (an organization that raises awareness and funds for the treatment and elimination of HIV/AIDS), came and spoke during the presentation.

Steven Bravo – Olympic High School

Student Board Member Steven Bravo addressed the Board of Education regarding updates at Olympic High School. The school held a car wash

fundraiser a couple weeks ago. Elizabeth Cruz has been coming to campus to help students find jobs, fill out applications, and write resumes. For the first time in forty-five years, Olympic High School is initiating the process to become WASC credited. The school recently received a grant for their arts program. They are currently looking for a local venue to hold the show for their competition.

Keryl Cartee addressed the Board of Education regarding SEIU's focus on the Unite to Win Realignment within California. The transition of union members from Local 660 to Local 99 will take place in January 2007. Ms. Cartee, on behalf of Local 660, congratulated Julia Brownley on winning the assembly seat; the union looks forward to working with the assemblywoman in the future. Ms. Cartee welcomed new board members Barry Snell and Kelly Pye; the SEIU Executive Committee members at SMMUSD look forward to working with them to improve the educational process for the district's students.

# D. PTA Council President Report - Laura Rosenbaum

Laura Rosenbaum addressed the Board of Education with congratulations to Assemblywoman Brownley, gratitude to Vice President's Wisnicki's service, and gratitude to the staff at Franklin Elementary School for their report. Ms. Rosenbaum also thanked the PTA members who helped with Measure BB, especially the co-chairs.

Ms. Rosenbaum recommended that the Equity Fund Oversight Committee broaden its membership to include more than just the majority of PTA members who are currently on the committee. She also stressed the need to continue to communicate the message of education to both cities.

# X. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Talarico updated the Board of Education regarding the search for an interim and a permanent Chief Financial Officer. Two interviews have been held for the interim position, time during which Paul Silvern, Chair of the Financial Oversight Committee, had a chance to speak with the candidates. The district is receiving referrals and trying to schedule times for interviews prior to the winter break. Regarding the permanent CFO position, Superintendent Talarico has been speaking with different firms who have had success in the past for placing CFOs.

*Ms.* Talarico mentioned that she is balancing her visits to schools with meetings with community leaders who have been very gracious to the district.

The Superintendent informed the board of the retreat she her directors had on December  $\delta^{th}$  at the Pepperdine conference facilities. Activities during the retreat involved members of management assessing their own levels of personal courage, team building exercises, and a commitment to themselves to show courage and have a difficult conversation that s/he has been putting off.

She completed her report by wishing the communities of both Malibu and Santa Monica a wonderful holiday.

### RE: APPROVAL OF THE 2006-07 FIRST INTERIM REPORT

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.25

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the 2006-07 First Interim Report and the corresponding budget adjustments.

COMMENTS: Education Code (EC) Sections §35035 (g), §42130, and §42131 require the governing board of each local educational agency (LEA) to certify at least twice a year as to the LEA's ability to meet its financial obligations for the remainder for that fiscal year and for the subsequent two fiscal years.

The Board of Education adopted the 2006-07 budget on June 29, 2006, and it was approved by the Los Angeles County Office of Education (*LACOE*).

Since the adoption of the initial budget, changing conditions have necessitated adjusting the District budget. All of the expenditure and revenue changes previously approved by the Board or proposed for approval at this time are individually identified in the First Interim Report (October 31, 2006), which is included as a part of this document.

The First Interim Report was developed based on the following Revenue and Expenditure Assumptions.

#### **REVENUE ASSUMPTIONS:**

- 1. State Revenue Limit projection is based on a 5.92% COLA for 2006-07.
- 2. The Base Revenue Limit for Santa Monica-Malibu will be \$5,627.84 per ADA (2005-06 P-2 ADA 11,582.5), with no applied deficit factor.
- 3. The Lottery allocation is currently estimated to be \$148 per prior year annual ADA. Of this amount, \$25 is allocated for instructional materials.
- 4. The District will participate in the State's Class Size Reduction Program for Grades K-3 and will receive \$1,024 per pupil for Grades K-3.

- 5. The payment for Mandated Costs Reimbursement through 2001-02 is \$611,729.
- 6. Special Education transfer from the Revenue Limit is \$2,210,287. Special Education Settlement at \$4.52 per 1999-00 ADA is \$52,328. The Special Education estimated funding for AB 602 is \$6,315,314, and the estimated federal funding is \$2,468,910.
- 7. Instructional Materials Funding Realignment Program will be funded at \$65.91 per pupil (October 2005 CBEDs -12,031).
- 8. The local Parcel Tax for Measure "Y" at \$116.88 per parcel, will generate \$3,726,811. Measure "Y" began in 2001 and will run for 10 years, expiring in June, 2011.
- 9. The Measure "S" parcel tax at \$225 per parcel is estimated to generate \$6,573,000. Measure "S" began in 2003 and will run for 6 years, expiring in June, 2009.
- 10. The District will receive \$6,4700,000 of financial support from the City of Santa Monica. In the current agreement, the City's contribution will run for the next 10 years out from the 2004-05 fiscal year.
- 11. The combined lease revenue is \$2.40 million, which is from the Doubletree Hotel, Madison Site, 9<sup>th</sup> & Colorado and 16<sup>th</sup> Street properties. Of this amount, approximately \$1,00,000 annually is pledged to support outstanding Certificates of Participation (COPs) Series "B" and "C" with a current face value of approximately \$20,000,000.
- 12. There is \$300,000 estimated interest revenue for the Unrestricted General Fund.
- 13. The District will receive \$15 per pupil for the Art and Music Block Grant.
- 14. The total of \$1,308,605 for the 2005-06 deferred revenues is added to 2006-07 current revenues for various programs.
- 15. Transfer \$500,000 from Fund 21 to Fund 01 to support the Ongoing Maintenance Program.

### EXPENDITURE ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Changes post budget adoption:
  - 0.2 FTE increase for Malibu High 6<sup>th</sup> period teacher
  - 0.4 FTE increase for McKinley Assistant Principal
  - 2.0 FTEs Special Ed teaching position
  - 1.0 FTE temporary increase for Special Ed Psychologist
  - 3.75 FTEs I/A Intensive Behavioral Intervention Special Ed
  - 1.0 FTE Physical Therapist for Special Ed
  - 1.0 FTE Office Specialist at Roosevelt
- 2. Salary:

No projections of salary increases are included, except the step and column increases for Certificated and Classified employees.

- 3. Statutory Benefits:
  - 8.25 % STRS employer contribution rate
  - 6.20% OASDI contribution rate
  - 1.45% Medicare contribution
  - 0.05% SUI contribution
  - 4.00% Workers' Compensation contribution rate
  - 9.124% PERS employer Contribution rate
  - 3.896% PERS Reduction
- 4. Effective 1/1/2007, the premium rates for District-paid employee medical are increased as follows:
  - Blue Shield (HMO) 13.79%
  - Kaiser Permanente 7.39%
- 5. Due to our participation in the State's School Facilities Modernization Program, we are currently required to budget 3% of the total General Fund budget for the Ongoing Maintenance Program.
- 6. A contribution of \$500,000 to the Deferred Maintenance Fund (Fund 14) has been budgeted, representing the estimated District match.
- 7. A contribution of \$75,000 to the Child Development Fund (Fund 12) has been budgeted for the extra costs incurred by the minimum days of elementary schools.

 A contribution of \$500,000 to the Retiree Benefits Fund (Fund 71) has been budgeted to reserve for the implementation of GASB 45.

The Following pages include a General Fund - Revenue Summary and a General Fund Expenditure Summary, as well as individual summaries for major funds and a Multi-Year Projection for the Unrestricted General Fund. The following documents are included as Attachment A: 2006-07 First Interim Budget Assumptions and the complete J-200 Series of Reports.

The Superintendent and board members thanked Pat Ho, Director of Fiscal Services, and Angelita Dalan, Assistant Director of Fiscal Services, for their hard work in compiling the First Interim document.


Pat Ho summarized the document for the board members and responded to the boards' questions.

Board Members suggested a study and review of trends in carrying over of funds by school sites and/or departments.



## RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE SANTA MONICA-MALIBU UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT ESTABLISHING A CITIZENS' BOND OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE AND APPROVING BYLAWS THEREFORE

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District (the "District") previously adopted a resolution requesting Los Angeles County (the "County") to call an election for general obligation bonds (the "Bond Election") to be held on November 7, 2006; and

WHEREAS, notice of the Bond Election was duly given; and on November 7, 2006, the Bond Election was duly held and conducted for the purpose of voting a measure for the issuance of bonds of the District in the amount of \$268,000,000 (the "Measure BB"); and

WHEREAS, based on the Canvass and Statement of Results for the County, more than fiftyfive percent of the votes cast on the Measure BB were in favor of issuing the aforementioned bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the District wishes hereby to establish such independent citizens' bond oversight committee in connection with issuance of bonds under Measure BB and to approve Bylaws governing such committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE SANTA MONICA-MALIBU UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DOES HEREBY FIND, DETERMINE AND CERTIFY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Authorization</u>. Measure BB was authorized pursuant to paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIIIA of the California Constitution and subdivision (b) of Section 18 of Article XVI of the California Constitution in accordance with the requirements of the Strict Accountability In Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000 (the "Act").

Section 2. <u>Establishment of Committee</u>. An independent citizens' bond oversight committee (the "Committee") is hereby established for the purposes set forth in the Act.

Section 3. <u>Bylaws</u>. The Committee shall operate pursuant to the Board approved Bylaws. The Committee shall have only those responsibilities granted to them in the Act and in the Bylaws. The Bylaws, as submitted herewith and attached hereto, are hereby approved.

Section 4. <u>Other Actions</u>. Officers of the Board and members of the Committee established hereunder are hereby authorized and directed, jointly and severally, to do any and all things and to execute and deliver any and all documents which they may deem necessary or advisable in order to give effect to and comply with the terms and intent of this Resolution. Such actions heretofore taken by such officers, officials and staff are hereby ratified, confirmed and approved.

## CITIZENS' BOND OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE BYLAWS

Section 1. <u>Committee Established</u>. The Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District (the "District") was successful at the election conducted on November 7, 2006 (the "Election"), in obtaining authorization from the District's voters to issue up to \$268,000,000 aggregate principal amount of the District's general obligation bonds (the "Measure BB"). The election was conducted under Proposition 39, being chaptered as the Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000, at Section 15264 *et seq.* of the Education Code of the State ("Prop 39"). Pursuant to Section 15278 of the Education Code, the District is now obligated to establish the Committee in order to satisfy the accountability requirements of Prop 39. The Board of Education of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District (the "Board") hereby establishes the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (the "Committee") which shall have the duties and rights set forth in these Bylaws. The Committee does not have legal capacity independent from the District.

Section 2. <u>Purposes</u>. The purposes of the Committee are set forth in Prop 39, and these Bylaws are specifically made subject to the applicable provisions of Prop 39 as to the duties and rights of the Committee. The Committee shall be deemed to be subject to the *Ralph M. Brown Public Meetings Act* of the State of California and shall conduct its meetings in accordance with the provisions thereof. The District shall provide necessary administrative support to the Committee as shall be consistent with the Committee's purposes, as set forth in Prop 39.

The proceeds of general obligation bonds issued pursuant to the Election are hereinafter referred to as "bond proceeds." The Committee shall confine itself specifically to bond proceeds generated under Measure BB. Regular and deferred maintenance projects and all monies generated under other sources shall fall outside the scope of the Committee's review.

Section 3. <u>Duties</u>. To carry out its stated purposes, the Committee shall perform only the following duties:

3.1 <u>Inform the Public</u>. The Committee shall inform the public concerning the District's expenditure of bond proceeds.

3.2 <u>Review Expenditures</u>. The Committee shall review expenditure reports produced by the District to ensure that (a) bond proceeds were expended only for the purposes set forth in the Measure BB; and (b) no bond proceeds were used for any teacher or administrative salaries or other operating expenses.

3.3 <u>Annual Report</u>. The Committee shall present to the Board, in public session, an annual written report which shall include the following:

(a) A statement indicating whether the District is in compliance with the requirements of Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3) of the California Constitution; and

(b) A summary of the Committee's proceedings and activities for the preceding year.

3.4 <u>Duties of the Board and/or Superintendent</u>. Either the Board or the Superintendent, as the Board shall determine, shall have the following powers reserved to it, and the Committee shall have no jurisdiction over the following types of activities:

(a) Approval of contracts,

(b) Approval of change orders,

(c) Expenditure of bond funds,

(d) Handling of all legal matters,

(e) Approval of project plans and schedules,

(f) Approval of all deferred maintenance plans, and

(g) Approval of the sale of bonds.

3.5 <u>Measure BB Projects Only</u>. In recognition of the fact that the Committee is charged with overseeing the expenditure of bond proceeds, the Board has not charged the Committee with responsibility for:

(a) Projects financed through the State of California, developer fees, redevelopment tax increment, certificates of participation, lease/revenue bonds, the general fund or the sale of surplus property without bond proceeds shall be outside the authority of the Committee.

(b) The establishment of priorities and order of construction for the bond projects, which shall be made by the Board in its sole discretion.

(c) The selection of architects, engineers, soils engineers, construction managers, project managers, CEQA consultants and such other professional service firms as are required to complete the project based on District criteria established by the Board in its sole discretion.

(d) The approval of the design for each project including exterior materials, paint color, interior finishes, site plan and construction methods (modular vs. permanent) which shall be determined by the Board in its sole discretion.

(e) The selection of independent audit firm(s), performance audit consultants and such other consultants as are necessary to support the activities of the Committee.

(f) The approval of an annual budget for the Committee that is sufficient to carry out its activities.

(g) The appointment or reappointment of qualified applicants to serve on the Committee, subject to legal limitations, and based on criteria adopted in the Board's sole discretion as part of carrying out its function under Prop 39.

#### Section 4. <u>Authorized Activities</u>.

4.1 In order to perform the duties set forth in Section 3.0, the Committee may engage in the following authorized activities:

(a) Receive and review copies of the District's annual independent performance audit and annual independent financial audit as required by Article XIIIA of the California Constitution.

(b) Inspect school facilities and grounds for which bond proceeds have been or will be expended, in accordance with any access procedure established by the District's Superintendent.

(c) Review copies of deferred maintenance proposals or plans developed by the District.

(d) Review efforts by the District to maximize bond proceeds by implementing various cost-saving measures.

#### Section 5. <u>Membership</u>.

5.1 Number.

The Committee shall consist of at least seven (7) members appointed by the Board of Education from a list of candidates submitting written applications, and based on criteria established by Prop 39, to wit:

- One (1) member shall be the parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the District.
- One (1) member shall be both a parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the District and active in a parent-teacher organization, such as the P.T.A. or a school site council.
- One (1) member active in a business organization representing the business community located in the District.
- One (1) member active in a senior citizens' organization.
- One (1) member active in a bona-fide taxpayers association.
- Two (2) members of the community at-large.
- 5.2 Qualification Standards.

(a) To be a qualified person, he or she must be at least 18 years of age.

(b) The committee may not include any employee, official of the District or any vendor, contractor or consultant of the District.

5.3 <u>Ethics: Conflicts of Interest</u>. By accepting appointment to the Committee, each member agrees to comply with Articles 4 (commencing with Section 1090) and 4.7 (commencing with Section 1125) of Division 4 of Title 1 of the Government Code. Additionally, each member shall comply with the Committee Ethics Policy attached as "Attachment A" to these Bylaws.

5.4 <u>Term</u>. Except as otherwise provided herein, each member shall serve a term of two (2) years, commencing on the date of the first meeting of the Committee. No member may serve more than two (2) consecutive terms. At the Committee's first meeting, members will draw lots or otherwise select a minimum of two members to serve for an initial one (1) year term and the remaining members for an initial two (2) year term.

5.5 <u>Appointment</u>. Members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Board through the following process: (a) appropriate local groups will be solicited for applications; (b) the Superintendent will review the applications; and (c) the Superintendent will make recommendations to the Board.

5.6 <u>Removal; Vacancy</u>. The Board may remove any Committee member for any reason, including failure to attend two consecutive Committee meetings without reasonable excuse or for failure to comply with the Committee Ethics Policy. Upon a member's removal, his or her seat shall be declared vacant. The Board, in accordance with the established appointment process shall fill any vacancies on the Committee. Vacancies shall be filled within 90 days from the initial date of each such vacancy.

5.7 Compensation. The Committee members shall not be compensated for their services.

5.8 <u>Authority of Members</u>. (a) Committee members shall not have the authority to direct staff of the District, (b) individual members of the Committee retain the right to address the Board, either on behalf of the Committee or as an individual, and (c) the Committee may only receive copies of reports and documents which have been previously presented to the Board and which are a public record.

#### Section 6. <u>Meetings of the Committee</u>.

6.1 <u>Regular Meetings</u>. The Committee shall meet at least once a year but no more frequently than quarterly.

6.2 <u>Location</u>. All meetings shall be held within the boundaries of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District.

6.3 <u>Procedures</u>. All meetings shall be open to the public in accordance with the *Ralph M*. Brown Act, Government Code Section 54950 et seq. Meetings shall be conducted according to such additional procedural rules as the Committee may adopt. A majority of the number of Committee members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business of the Committee.

#### Section 7. District Support.

7.1 The District shall provide to the Committee necessary technical and administrative assistance as follows:

(a) preparation of and posting of public notices as required by the *Brown Act*, ensuring that all notices to the public are provided in the same manner as notices regarding meetings of the District Board;

(b) provision of a meeting room, including any necessary audio/visual equipment;

(c) preparation and copies of any documentary meeting materials, such as agendas and reports; and

(d) retention of all Committee records, and providing public access to such records on an Internet website maintained by the District.

7.2 District staff and/or District consultants shall attend Committee proceedings in order to report on the status of projects and the expenditures of bond proceeds.

7.3 No bond proceeds shall be used to provide District support to the Committee.

Section 8. <u>Reports</u>. In addition to the Annual Report required in Section 3.2, the Committee may report to the Board from time to time in order to advise the Board on the activities of the Committee. The Annual Report shall be in writing and shall summarize the proceedings and activities conducted by the Committee.

Section 9. <u>Officers</u>. The Superintendent shall appoint the initial Chair to serve for an initial two (2) year term. The Committee shall elect an initial Vice-Chair. Thereafter, the Committee shall elect a Chair and a Vice-Chair who shall act as chair only when the Chair is absent.

Section 10. <u>Amendment of Bylaws</u>. Any amendment to these Bylaws shall be approved by a majority vote of the Board.

Section 11. <u>Termination</u>. The Committee shall automatically terminate and disband 180 days after all Measure BB bond proceeds are spent.

## CITIZENS' BOND OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE ETHICS POLICY STATEMENT

This Ethics Policy Statement provides general guidelines for Committee members in carrying out their responsibilities. Not all ethical issues that Committee members face are covered in this Statement. However, this Statement captures some of the critical areas that help define ethical and professional conduct for Committee members. The provisions of this Statement were developed from existing laws, rules, policies and procedures as well as from concepts that define generally accepted good business practices. Committee members are expected to strictly adhere to the provisions of this Ethics Policy.

#### POLICY

• CONFLICT OF INTEREST. A Committee member shall not make or influence a District decision related to: (1) any contract funded by bond proceeds or (2) any construction project which will benefit the committee member's outside employment, business, or a personal finance or benefit an immediate family member, such as a spouse, child or parent.

• OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT. A Committee member shall not use his or her authority over a particular matter to negotiate future employment with any person or organization that relates to: (1) any contract funded by bond proceeds, or (2) any construction project. A Committee member shall not make or influence a District decision related to any construction project involving the interest of a person with whom the member has an agreement concerning current or future employment, or remuneration of any kind. For a period of two (2) years after leaving the Committee, a former Committee member may not represent any person or organization for compensation in connection with any matter pending before the District that, as a Committee member, he or she participated in personally and substantially. Specifically, for a period of two (2) years after leaving the member works shall be prohibited from contracting with the District with respect to: (1) bidding on projects funded by the bond proceeds; and (2) any construction project.

• COMMITMENT TO UPHOLD LAW. A Committee member shall uphold the federal and California Constitutions, the laws and regulations of the United States and the State of California (particularly the Education Code) and all other applicable government entities, and the policies, procedures, rules and regulations of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District;

• COMMITMENT TO DISTRICT. A Committee member shall place the interests of the District above any personal or business interest of the member.

RE: CREATION OF POSITIONS TO SUPPORT THE ATTAINMENT OF PRESCHOOL OPERATIONS (CURRENTLY EASTER SEALS) AT JOHN ADAMS AND WASHINGTON WEST LOCATIONS

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.29

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the creation of teachers and assistants positions and the creation of an applicant pool to operate the full-day/full-year preschool at John Adams and Washington West if the California State Department of Education (CSDE), Child Development Division, allows the District to operate the program.

COMMENT: On October 5, 2006, the Board of Education discussed the acquiring of full-day/full-year preschool at John Adams Preschool and Washington West. Board members expressed their desire to bring the program into the district and asked staff to bring items back to the Board when decisions would be appropriate.

> UPDATE: The Easter Seals Board of Directors is meeting this month to consider returning the Santa Monica portion of their full-day/full-year program to the State. The CSDE staff is meeting in Sacramento to determine the process of moving the program from Easter Seals to SMMUSD. More information should be available at the December 14, 2006, board meeting.

> STAFF POSITIONS NEEDED: Since the target date for acquisition of the program is February 1, 2007, it is necessary to create teaching and assistant positions at the December 14, 2006, Board of Education meeting. While we will not know the final outcome of the Easter Seals and CSDE negotiations by the December board meeting, the district may create the positions and post the job descriptions before the actual transition process has been finalized. This is necessary because the recruitment and processing of applicants will require several weeks, and the applicants would need to be processed and ready to be hired and begin operations on the day the funding begins. The final hiring process will not be completed until the transition budget and timeline are known and agreements have been signed.

> Assuming the negotiations with CSDE are successful and all the previous childcare slots are obtained, CDS would

require the following additional staff positions created to operate the full day program at John Adams Preschool and Washington West.

1-- Lead Teacher 8 hours
3--8 hour teachers
2--4 hour teachers
2--8 hour assistants (range 18)
3--6 hour assistants (range 18)
1--5 hour assistant (range 18)
5--3.5-hour assistants (range 18)

In addition, CDS and the Special Education department have created a new inclusion preschool class at Lincoln Preschool. CDS requests the creation of positions for that program.

1--4 hour teacher
1--3.5 hour assistant (range 18)

FISCAL IMPACT: The action requested at this time is to create the positions and begin the advertising of positions and creation of an application pool. Staff will return to the Board in January 2007 with budget information and for approval to operate the program. The budget will be funded entirely with funds from CSDE and Santa Monica College. Current staff and benefit costs will be included and there will be no local general fund contribution required to support the program(s).
