It is recommended that the Board of Education award the Office Furnishings/Measure BB construction and Ed Services offices, Bid #9.02, to  $\overline{\text{TBD}}$  KI, in an amount not to exceed \$64,499.18.

COMMENTS: The office space for the Measure "BB" Bond Program has been identified. The area will accommodate both the construction offices for Measure "BB" and Education Services staff. This bid will allow for thirteen workstations, conference room, plan room, and copy room. It is anticipated that the furnishings will be delivered and installed by the end of August 2008. This office will be the first to be furnished with low VOC, sustainable materials, and be the district's "Green Flagship" office for not only the furnishings, but also carpeting and paint. <u>KI ranks as one of the</u> highest sustainable, green companies in the industry.

It is recommended that the Board of Education award the LAN/WAN equipment and installation services to  $\underline{AT\&T Global Services}$  for a total amount of \$3,461,630.00.

COMMENTS: The Board of Education directed staff to proceed with the Measure "BB" Technology Implementation Plan for both the Data Center and site infrastructure during the board meeting of April 17, 2008, based on discussion and presentation to the board regarding the Implementation Plan on April 16, 2008. This bid will include core and edge switches, WAN and Internet routing equipment upgrades, hardware to support wireless networking, and VOIP (Voice Over IP) systems.

Staff anticipates that the equipment will be ordered in stages to accommodate the Measure "BB" Bond program schedule, site needs, and new technologies as they become available. Staff evaluated proposals based on certifications, references, design and technical solutions, costs and completeness of submittals. Upon review it was determined that AT&T Global Services had the most complete design and the lowest cost technical solution.

Bids were sent to eight (8) vendors, three (3) attended the job walk and mandatory vendors conference on June 16, 2008. Bid award is based on design and technical solutions, certifications, references, and cost. Two (2) bidders responded with bids as listed below:

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.26

It is recommended that the Board of Education award a contract to Think Energy, Inc. to provide support to District staff with the preparation and administration of a Request for Proposal (RFP) for Photovoltaic/Power Purchase Agreement vendors in the amount of \$20,000.

COMMENTS: At their April 8, 2008, meeting the Santa Monica City Council agreed to provide grant support in the amount of \$20,000 to facilitate the preparation and administration of an RFP process to select a Photovoltaic/Power Purchase Agreement vendor to provide for the installation of PV at district school sites. Staff requested that Mark Crowdis of Think Energy, Inc. provide a proposal to assist the district with its goal of installing PV/PPA panels at nine elementary school sites no later than summer 2009.

Think Energy's scope of work includes:

- Review electricity bills and school sites to determine target amount of PV per campus
- Submit RFP for PV/PPA vendors to district for internal review
- Issue RFP, conduct and coordinate site visit(s)
- Apply for SCE rebates
- Receive RFP responses, provide analysis of responses, assist with the selection of a vendor district with negotiations of selected vendor

• Ongoing support through implementation

Think Energy, Inc. is a full-service renewable energy company that works both in the United States and internationally to accelerate the transition to clean energy markets and economies. Think Energy has worked with hundreds of companies, colleges, government organizations, and non-profit organizations to assess, choose, and install a range of on-site technologies. Included on Think Energy's client list are Global Green, Los Angeles Unified School District, Toyota Motors, and Whole Foods Markets. Think Energy develops the most cost-effective, feasible solutions by tracking technology trends, monitoring performance of suppliers and vendors, and tracking available renewable energy and efficiency incentives to reduce costs to customers.

District staff conferred with the staff at Global Green and LAUSD, and Think Energy received excellent recommendations.

The total fees for this scope of work will be \$20,000 and will be paid by the City of Santa Monica.

### RE: APPROVAL TO ALLOCATE MEASURE BB FUNDS-BUDGET DISCUSSION

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.39

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve life safety projects identified during the programming phase of Measure "BB" (Grant, McKinley, Rogers, Pt. Dume, and Webster) and fund the projects from the unallocated Measure "BB" funds. It is also recommended that Edison Elementary School budget be increased to complete the school to district standards. It is also recommended that allocations for one year of cost escalation and allowances for fire alarm system upgrades be applied to other previously funded projects. It is further recommended that the technology program budget be adjusted to balance the scope and the budget.

Discussion: Recommended Funding Allocations and Program Budget spreadsheets (attached).

Action 1: Approve \$300,000 for reconfiguration of Grant Elementary main entry - Discussion/Rational

- Action 2: Approve \$100,000 for reconfiguration of McKinley Elementary main entry - Discussion/Rational
- Action 3: Approve \$200,000 for reconfiguration of Rogers Elementary main entry - Discussion/Rational
- Action 4: Approve \$265,000 for gas line replacement at Pt. Dume Elementary - Discussion/Rational
- Action 5: Approve \$306,000 for fire alarm replacement at Webster Elementary - Discussion/Rational
- Action 6: Approve \$1.485M for parking lot at Webster Elementary - Discussion/Rational
- Action 7: Approve \$4M of additional funding for Edison Elementary School from \$29M to \$33M.
- Action 8: Approve \$6.425M for one year of construction escalation.
- Action 9: Approve \$5.646M for fire alarm system upgrades (includes Action 5 above)

### Action 10: Approve \$425,000 for technology funding allocation to balance the scope and the budget for the core program requirements

All other site-approved projects are forecasted to be within budget allocations based on discussions with the sites to reduce scope.

The Measure "BB" Oversight Committee reviewed these items during their meeting of June 23, and approved the above budget allocations as revised.
