A regular meeting of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Board of Education was held on Thursday, December 13, 2007, in the District Administrative Offices: 1651 16th Street, Santa Monica, CA. The Board of Education called the meeting to order at 4:15 p.m. in the Board Conference Room at the District Offices: 1651 16th Street, Santa Monica, CA. At 4:16 p.m., the Board of Education will move to Closed Session regarding the items listed below. The public meeting reconvened at 6:35 p.m. in the Board Room.

IV. BOARD OF EDUCATION – COMMENDATIONS / RECOGNITIONS

Olympic High School

Superintendent Talarico introduced Principal Janie Gates, whom she said was well respected in the community for her service to the students. She said that Ms. Gates brings innovated electives to the school to spark the students' natural curiosity for learning.

In her presentation, Ms. Gates walked the board through the composition, purpose, and features of the continuation school. During the six-hour school day, students attend seven forty-five minute classes. Each teacher serves as an advisor to twenty or so students. On any given day, 120 to 140 students are present; new students arrive every three weeks. Individual and group counseling services are provided by St. John's Hospital and funded by the City of Santa Monica. A part-time counseling position was added from AB1802 funds to support students who have not yet passed the CAHSEE. Ms. Gates explained that each student goes through a five step process upon first entering Olympic High School: "Getting it Together," "Focusing on School," "Learning," "Meeting Goals," and "Succeeding in Life." Student Board Member Shippey, who was a co-presenter with Ms. Gates, commented that the

first two steps are the most difficult for students, but the remaining three steps go pretty quickly. He said that the counselors make sure students stay on track throughout the day.

Ms. Gates proudly announced that the high school gained WASC accreditation for the first time in the school's forty-one year history. She then presented the courses offered at the school. She explained that all coursework is linked to State Content State Content Standards. Blast Beat is an entrepreneurship project in the music industry; students in the class were featured in the Santa Monica Daily Press. Robert Gilliam teaches the dance class, which is funded by the Education Foundation. In the criminal justice class, students learn about the penal and education codes and how these dictate police procedures and policies. Mark Suminski, the new debate teacher, teaches students how to formulate, research, and deliver an argument. Kristen Hensley teaches the new drama class, in which students focus on improvisation, theater history, and theatrical techniques. The drum class, also funded by the Education Foundation, provides students with the opportunity to learn rhythm and cadence with drums representing a variety of ethnic backgrounds. The guitar class has seen many guest musicians, including Jackson Browne, Matt Laug from the Eagles, and award-winning composer Chris Horvath; the Education Foundation funds the guitar class instructor. The film class was designed by SMPD Officer Erik Milosevich in collaboration with writer/producer Robert Raisch. Marina Magallanes and Brenda Morales, two students at Olympic, won two awards at the Santa Monica Teen Film Festival for their documentary Remnants of Vietnam. The K9 Connection program, provided by OPCC, provides students the opportunity to train animals from shelters to ready them for adoption. Police Activities League Physical Education allows students to direct their aggression in a safe and appropriate environment. Sober Living is a weekly panel of speakers who share their experiences in overcoming various forms of addiction and recovery. The venicearts Mentoring Program provides students with the use of a photo lab and cameras. Cesar Berban, an Olympic student, had the opportunity to participate in a seven-week intensive program at USC's School of Cinema Inner-City Filmmakers Summer Program, during which Cesar learned various filmmakers' crafts. In the 20th Century Film class, students discuss the issues of each film as they debate contrasting political and social viewpoints. Due to its wide variety of elective courses, Olympic High School received the California Continuing Education Association Exemplary Program Award. Ms. Gates concluded her report by thanking the board and district staff for their continuous support.

Board Vice President de la Torre inquired as to the strategies being employed for students to pass the CAHSEE. Ms. Gates explained that each day during fourth period, students focus on the skills needed to pass the CAHSEE or develop and hone their writing skills. Board Member Leon-Vazquez said it was great to see how engaged the students are. Superintendent Talarico announced that she would be meeting with Principal Gates soon to discuss the science lab.

• Board of Education President Kathy Wisnicki – Outgoing

Superintendent Talarico thanked Board President Wisnicki for the extra effort she put in when Ms. Talarico first moved to Southern California. She thanked Dr. Wisnicki for providing critical feedback that helped to expand her own leadership skills. She said that she admires Dr. Wisnicki's willingness to have difficult conversations, a willingness that displays her high level of integrity. On behalf of district, the Superintendent gave Dr. Wisnicki a plaque with the dates of her presidency.

Board Vice President de la Torre thanked Dr. Wisnicki for her sacrifice and time. Board Member Snell commented that he appreciated the guidance she provided during his first year on the board, the time she continues to put into traveling to and from Malibu, her great spirit of collaboration, and her professionalism. Board Member Mechur remarked that it was a good thing Dr. Wisnicki was not leaving the board due to her excellent leadership, dedication to providing for all students in the district, and her consummate ability to assess issues and data to help in decision-making. Board Member Leon-Vazquez commented that Dr. Wisnicki's leadership really began before December of last year. She thanked Dr. Wisnicki for putting all her energy into helping create smooth transitions during changes in the district and being able to balance family and board responsibilities. Board Member Pye commended Dr. Wisnicki for her commitment, the amount of hours she dedicates to the district, and her preparedness. Board Member Escarce said that Dr. Wisnicki played a very important role for two years and provided a sense of stability. Student Board Member Lambert commended Dr. Wisnicki for the strength she has shown; her activeness at Malibu High School, on the board, and with her family; her ability to maintain control and balance; and her professionalism. SMMCTA President Keiley praised Dr. Wisnicki for being committed to the well-being of teachers; for taking on a lot of responsibilities last year when then-President Brownley was running for a statewide office; her open lines of communication with SMMCTA; and her courage to speak out. Mr. Keiley presented her with flowers. SEIU Chief Steward Cartee-McNeely commented on how prepared Dr. Wisnicki is for each meeting, how dedicated and committed she is, and her extensive service to several district committees.

Board President Wisnicki thanked her fellow board members and the district for the tremendous opportunities that have helped her to grow as a leader. She stated that she has learned from each of the board members.

• Board of Education Vice President Oscar de la Torre – Outgoing

Board President Wisnicki began by paying tribute to Mr. de la Torre and his sense of balance, his ability to remain calm, and his growth as a leader. She said that she has learned a tremendous amount from him as they formed a bridge between their two communities. Superintendent Talarico thanked him for the year he served as Vice President and for asking the tough questions that hold the district accountable for meeting the needs of the diverse population of students. Board Member Snell said that he found Mr. de la Torre to be inspiring, especially his insight regarding the needs of students of color and other social issues. Mr. Snell said that he looks forward to working with Mr. de la Torre to achieve higher standards in the district. Board

Member Mechur remarked that Mr. de la Torre is a product of this community and that he dedicates himself to lifting up the community as a whole. Board Member Leon-Vazquez commended Mr. de la Torre for bringing a different perspective to the board and for always keeping the interest of the students in mind. Board Member Pye said that she admired Mr. de la Torre for being student-centered. Board Member Escarce thanked Mr. de la Torre for being a wonderful Vice President and a terrific leader who is incredibly eloquent, being able to express in words what board members are thinking. SMMCTA President Keiley commended Mr. de la Torre for his leadership, the change he has brought about, and for being a great asset to the board. SEIU Chief Steward Cartee-McNeely called Mr. de la Torre "a swell guy" and said that she appreciates how approachable he is.

Board Vice President de la Torre thanked the board members and others for their comments. He said that everything he does in his life comes from the principle of leading by example. He thanked both communities for the opportunity to serve on the board. He concluded his remarks by thanking Dr. Wisnicki for being a strong leader; he stated that he learned a lot from her. The Superintendent presented Mr. de la Torre with a plaque with the dates of his vice presidency.

A. Student Board Member Reports

Alec Richker - Santa Monica High School

Board Member Richker updated the board regarding activities at SAMOHI. Progress reports were mailed to students' homes this week. Yesterday, the schools hosted a Red Cross blood drive. The theatre department will be performing Little Women tomorrow at 8:00pm in the Humanity Center and on Saturday at 2:00pm and 8:00pm. The SAMOHI Academic Decathlon competed this past weekend and won all eleven of their matches; they will be competing in the championship in Chicago this coming May. ASB is currently holding a recycling race among the houses to promote a greener SAMOHI. ASB is also selling holiday grams and PA

grams, which will be announced over the PA system. SAMOHI's MECho Annual Toy Drive is underway, during which unwrapped toys will be collected. The overly successful Bike to School Day was held on December 5th; the event was featured on the front page of the Santa Monica Daily Press.

On Tuesday, December 18th, the Orchestra Concert will be held in Barnum Hall at 7:00pm. The Choir Winter Concert will be held at 7:00pm on Thursday at Barnum Hall. Josh Miller, a senior, was recently honored as CNN's "Youth Wonder" Hero for his organization Resilient Youth Foundation. New Lines Cinema is filming on campus; the fake plants and props are fun to see on campus. The Measure "BB" Advisory Committee visited the campus earlier this week. Mr. Richker closed his report by announcing that December 3rd was worldwide AIDS Day. Santa Monica Council Member Bobby Shriver spoke on campus regarding his organization "Product RED," which sells products in major retail stores to raise money for the women and children in Africa affected by AIDS.

Kristen Lambert – Malibu High School

Student Board Member Lambert reported that the Soulgaze Club held its third annual Help the Homeless Drive. Operation Smile is holding a Dollar Drive, the Key Club is holding a toy drive, and the ASB is holding a Covenant House Gift Drive. The Chamber Singers are selling Holiday Grams, the Student Store is hosting a sale, holiday PE sweats are being sold at reduced prices, and Jostens Class Rings are on sale. The middle school is hosting a holiday soccer tournament. A blood drive will be held on December 18th at UCLA. Malibu High School's Choir Winter Concert was held on December 11th and the Band/Orchestra Concert is scheduled for next week. A senior/parent workshop will address the topic of playing sports in college. The Mock Trial team has had many successes; Ben Robbins, a member of the team, won Outstanding Defense Witness for all of L.A. County. Ms. Lambert concluded her report by announcing the theatre department performed the surrealist comedy The Skin of Our Teeth by Thorton Wilder.

John Shippey – Olympic High School

Student Board Member Shippey's report was part of the Olympic High School presentation at the beginning of the meeting.

B. SMMCTA Update – Mr. Harry Keiley

Mr. Keiley began his report by announcing the SMMCTA Board of Directors is analyzing the pros and cons of common assessments at the secondary level. The Board of Directors will create essential questions regarding common assessments, such as, "Are the tests helpful?" Mr. Keiley said that he looked forward to discussing with staff the additional FTE at SAMOHI for Special Education. He thanked the Measure "R" committee and their dedication to getting the measure passed in February. He confirmed that SMMCTA would help in the support of the measure. Mr. Keiley reported that the union leadership team would be reviewing the First Interim Report. He said that he was pleased to see the budget is healthy, but expressed concern that the

number of FTEs for administrators has not been reduced in proportion to declining enrollment.

Board President Wisnicki extended the board's congratulations to Mr. Keiley for his election to the CalSTRS Board. Board Member Escarce thanked him for providing his headquarters for the Measure "R" campaign. Dr. Escarce requested that the Superintendent follow up with Mr. Keiley's request for the extra FTE at SAMOHI.

D. PTA Council President Report – Rebecca Kennerly

Ms. Kennerly thanked President Wisnicki for her professionalism and leadership. She was pleased to have worked with Dr. Wisnicki over the years, including when they were both members of the PTA Executive Council. Ms. Kennerly thanked Board Vice President de la Torre for his openness and collaboration with district parents and staff. She reported that Public Schools Week, which was coordinated by the Communications Coalition, was amazing. She thanked SMMCTA for providing refreshments during the Open House events. The PTA Council breakfast that was held earlier in the month was a great event. Ms. Kennerly stated that the PTA Council has also joined forces to provide relief for the victims of the Malibu fires. She concluded her report by announcing the Measure "R" renewal campaign is going well. She thanked Mr. Keiley for providing meeting space for the campaign committee.

X. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Talarico announced that the first ever Public Schools Week was well attended. She thanked Rebecca Kennerly, Richard McKinnon, and Elizabeth Sterns for their hard work in making the week's activities a success and thanked Harry Keiley for providing refreshments during the Open House events. She said that the Communications Coalition would debrief tomorrow to discuss improvements for next year.

The Superintendent proudly announced great news from the school sites. Malibu High School was named in the top 100 high schools nationwide by Newsweek. Edison Language Academy has won the Title I Award. Ms. Talarico called the board's attention to the student artwork that was hanging on the boardroom walls provided by Grant Elementary School.

Ms. Talarico said she would delay her report regarding the Special Education Independent Review when it is time for that item later in the agenda.

Over the past week, the central office has been participating in the gift card drive for the victims of the Malibu Fires. She asked Mr. Walker to expand on the district's other activities for the Malibu fire victims. Mr. Walker reported that those SMMUSD families who had lost their homes in either the October or November fire would receive free lunch for the remainder of the school year.

The Superintendent commended the entire board for its leadership and commitment to becoming a high-performing governance team. She reported that the senior leadership team was also participating in similar retreats and activities. She congratulated Mr. Keiley for his election to the CalSTRS Board.

Board Members Pye suggested that Kindergarten Round Up occur earlier in the year. Board President Wisnicki said that during Public Schools Week she met perspective parents who decided to enroll their students in SMMUSD schools, rather than private schools. Deputy Superintendent Walker said that the Superintendent encouraged the school principals to hold the open house events every month.

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the refunding application and budget for fiscal year 2008-2009 with the Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE) for the purpose of providing Head Start services to eligible families effective July 1, 2008, through June 30, 2009. This agreement is to be executed between the Superintendent of Public Instruction, LACOE, and the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District, wherein LACOE agrees to pay Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Child Development Fund an amount not to exceed \$1,272,499 for the Head Start-Basic Program and \$10,282 for the Head Start Training and Technical Assistance.

COMMENT: Head Start is a federal grant program with a long history of providing comprehensive child development and support services to young children and families with incomes at or below the poverty level. The contract, operates on a minimum of 200 days, provides for the operation of 10 Head Start classes — approximately 194 children in a full day setting in partnership with State Preschool funds.

GOALS (2008-2009)

1. Support the school success of eligible, poor, and low-income children by providing opportunities for their families to transcend the effects of poverty.

Objective:

- Cultivate educationally supportive lifestyles through parent involvement and staff by focusing on math skills by 90 percent of the families participating in a "Parents as Partners" home activity program by June 2009.
- All Head Start Teachers will participate in the Steps to Excellence Project (STEP). Teachers will maintain or increase the rating earned by Los Angeles County Office of Child Care.
- 100 percent of children identified as being overweight and/or with obesity in family history,

will receive information regarding healthy nutritional and lifestyle choices, and resources in the community that host programs geared toward obesity education. 75 percent of those will participate in an interactive movement workshop hosted by the Santa Monica-Malibu USD.

2. Operate a more efficient and proactive preschool program.

Objective:

- Redesign the shared governance system to enhance personnel management and fiscal accountability.
- Transition from current database system of FileMaker Pro to the program selected by LACOE Grantee for record keeping and reporting.

COMMENTS: At the request of the City of Santa Monica, the Board of Education directed staff to prepare a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) in conjunction with an "Independent Review of the District's Special Education Program." This review was to indicate an assessment of the policies, programmatic practices, and financial aspects of the Special Education Program.

The Board of Education also directed the Superintendent to form a review committee to assist in the selection of a vendor or service provider to perform the independent review; a list of the Special Education Review RFQ Process Committee members is attached for reference as Attachment A.

The RFQ document was reviewed by the district's Special Education Advisory Committee (DAC) and over the course of two public meetings of the Board of Education.

A list of potential vendors/service providers who would be in a position to respond to the RFQ is included for reference as Attachment B. In addition to the list, staff placed public notice ads in both The Santa Monica Daily Press and The Malibu Surfside News requesting that parties interested in responding to the RFQ obtain information from the Office of the Superintendent.

A meeting of the Special Education Review RFQ Process Committee was held on November 2, 2007, to provide an opportunity for prospective vendors/service providers to ask questions in conjunction with the RFQ submittal process. Two prospective service providers (Total School Solutions and Public Works, Inc.) attended the non-mandatory November 2, 2007, meeting.

The deadline for submittal of the RFQ document was 3:00 p.m. on November 16, 2007. Three responses were received, as follows:

- > Total School Solutions Fairfield, CA
- ➤ Lou Barber and Associates El Dorado Hills, CA
- > School Services of Calif., Inc. Sacramento, CA

The Committee interviewed the three prospective service providers on December 3, 2007. Based on those interviews and a significant discussion by the committee, consensus was achieved. It was believed that Lou Barber and Associates would be best suited to conduct the independent review of the Special Education Program.

The cost for this review will be approximately \$79,000 (plus certain identified reimbursables as may be approved by the Superintendent) and is based on the defined RFQ requirements. Any addition to the noticed scope of work would be billed on an hourly basis.

Board Member Snell explained that Lou Barber and Associates is highly qualified to complete the independent review. He stressed that a collaborative and open process is a must. Throughout its review, the vendor will provide progress reports to the committee and Superintendent, who will then provide updates to the board. A final report of findings will be given the to committee and board in March. These dates will be included in an agreed-upon timeline between the vendor and the district. Superintendent Talarico announced that she is scheduling an initial meeting with Lou Barber and Associates. Board Member Pye said that she was glad the selection committee reached consensus regarding a vendor. Board Member Leon-Vazquez reported that the SEDAC was satisfied with the vendor selection.

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.29

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the 2007-08 First Interim Report and the corresponding budget adjustments.

COMMENT: Education Code (EC) Sections §35035 (g), §42130, and §42131 require the governing board of each local educational agency (LEA) to certify at least twice a year as to the LEA's ability to meet its financial obligations for the remainder for that fiscal year and

for the subsequent two fiscal years.

The Board of Education adopted the 2007-08 budget on June 28, 2007, and it was approved by the Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE).

Since the adoption of the initial budget, changing conditions have necessitated adjusting the District budget. All of the expenditure and revenue changes previously approved by the Board or proposed for approval at this time are individually identified in the First Interim Report (October 31, 2007), which is included as a part of this document.

The First Interim Report was developed based on the following Revenue and Expenditure Assumptions.

REVENUE ASSUMPTIONS:

TO:

- 1. State Revenue Limit projection is based on a 4.53% COLA for 2007-08 (\$252 per ADA = 4.48% for SMMUSD). Due to the declined enrollments, the net increase in Revenue Limit funding is \$1,638,289 or 2.52%.
- 2. The Base Revenue Limit for Santa Monica-Malibu will be \$5,879.84 per ADA (2006-07 P-2 ADA 11,360), with no applied deficit factor.
- 3. The Lottery allocation is currently estimated to be \$143 per annual ADA. Of this amount, \$22 is allocated for instructional materials.
- 4. The District will participate in the State's Class Size Reduction Program for Grades K-3 and will receive \$1,071 per pupil for Grades K-3.

- 5. No budget for Mandated Costs Reimbursement in 2007-08.
- 6. Special Education transfer from the Revenue Limit is \$2,121,307. Special Education Settlement at \$4.52 per 1999-00 ADA is \$52,328. The Special Education estimated funding for AB 602 is \$6,423,014, and the estimated federal funding is \$2,508,802.
- 7. Instructional Materials Funding Realignment Program will be funded at \$69.32 per pupil (October 2006 CBEDS -11,902).
- 8. The local Parcel Tax for Measure "Y" at \$120.97 per parcel, will generate \$3,912,000. Measure "Y" began in 2001 and will run for 10 years, expiring in June, 2011.
- 9. The Measure "S" parcel tax at \$225 per parcel is estimated to generate \$6,573,000. Measure "S" began in 2003 and will run for 6 years, expiring in June, 2009.
- 10. The District will receive \$6,736,184 of financial support from the City of Santa Monica. In the current agreement, the City's contribution will run for the next 10 years out from the 2004-05 fiscal year.
- 11. The combined lease revenue is \$2.64 million, which is from the Doubletree Hotel, Madison Site, $9^{\rm th}$ & Colorado and $16^{\rm th}$ Street properties.
- 12. There is \$800,000 estimated interest revenue for the Unrestricted General Fund.
- 13. The District will receive \$16.5 per pupil for the Arts and Music Block Grant.
- 14. The District will receive \$69 per 2007-08 per CBEDS grade 7-12 for Supplemental School Counseling.
- 15. The total of \$1,340,885 for the 2006-07 deferred revenues is added to 2007-08 current revenues for various programs.
- 16. Transfer \$500,000 from Fund 21 to Fund 01 to support the Ongoing Maintenance Program.

- 1. Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Changes post budget adoption:
 - 0.2 FTE increase for Malibu High 6th period teacher
 - 0.5 FTE increase for Pt. Dume teaching position

 - 1.0 FTE Senior Buyer

No projections of salary increases are included, except the step and column increases for Certificated and Classified employees.

- 3. Statutory Benefits:
 - 8.25 % STRS employer contribution rate
 - 6.20% OASDI contribution rate
 - 1.45% Medicare contribution
 - 0.05% SUI contribution
 - 4.00% Workers' Compensation contribution rate
 - 9.306% PERS employer Contribution rate
 - 3.984% PERS Reduction
- 4. Effective 1/1/2008, the premium rates for District-paid employee medical are increased as follows:
 - Blue Shield (HMO) 10.07%
 - Kaiser Permanente 9.17%
- 5. Due to our participation in the State's School Facilities Modernization Program, we are currently required to budget 3% of the total General Fund budget for the Ongoing Maintenance Program.
- 6. A contribution of \$500,000 to the Deferred Maintenance Fund (Fund 14) has been budgeted, representing the estimated District match.
- 7. A contribution of \$75,000 to the Child Development Fund (Fund 12) has been budgeted for the extra costs incurred by the minimum days of elementary schools.
- 8. A contribution of \$750,000 to the Post-employment Benefits Fund (Fund 20) has been budgeted to reserve for the implementation of GASB 45.
- 9. Measure "BB", a General Obligation Bond approved by voters in November 2006, provided \$268 million of debt authorization to the District. The first series, a total of \$60 million, was issued in October 2007 and deposited into the District's Building Fund (Fund 21). A Board appointed advisory committee has been working with staff and the firm selected to provide program management services to establish the allocation of authorized funds. On October 18, 2007, the Board approved a committee recommendation for allocation of approximately \$111 million of the bond authorization. Programmatic and design phases of all projects are moving forward.

The following pages include a General Fund - Revenue Summary and a General Fund Expenditure Summary, as well as individual summaries for major Funds and a Multi-Year Projection for the Unrestricted General Fund. The following documents are included as Attachment A: 2007-08 First Interim Budget Assumptions and the complete SACS Report.

Assistant Superintendent Maez commended the work of the staff for their professional work in assembling the First Interim Report.

Board Vice President Escarce asked for a review of the effectiveness of the enrollment decline control strategies, such as allowing children of SMC workers to attend school in the district. He also requested a simple information sheet showing how school site carry-over money was spent and to show that the district is not deficit spending.

Board Member Wisnicki would like regular updates regarding how schools are spending their funds in order to prevent carry-over. Director Ho clarified for Dr. Wisnicki that there was a typo on page 64: the "Health/Welfare" category should read 10% for 2008-2009 and 2009-2010.

Board Member Pye inquired as to how many SMC employees took advantage of the district's change in permit policy. Superintendent Talarico reported that approximately five SMC families applied for interdistrict permits.

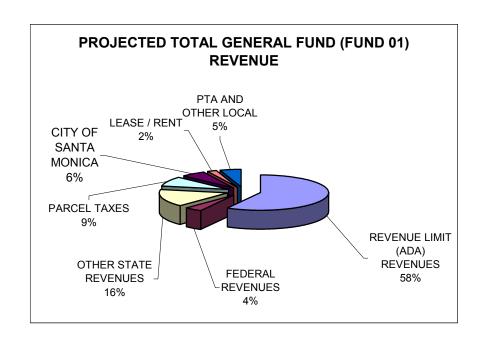
The Superintendent has asked Sally to do a board workshop regarding federal funding.

Board Vice President Escarce inquired as to the possibility of having Kindergarten Round Up earlier in the year to increase enrollment. Board Member Pye wondered about having upper grade transition orientation earlier in the year to increase the number of students who attend SMMUSD's secondary schools. The Superintendent replied that the principals would have to agree and adjust schedules accordingly.

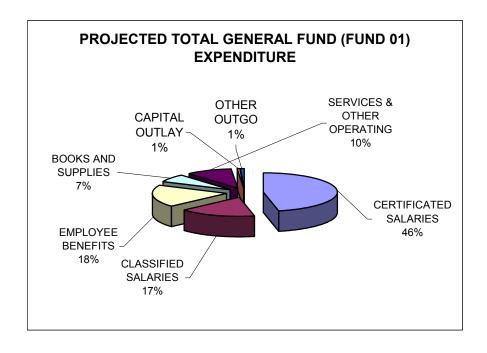

RE: ESTABLISH POSITIONS FOR BARNUM HALL THEATRE OEPRATIONS

AND FACILITY PERMITS - TECHNICAL THEATRE COORDINATOR,

ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT, AND PART-TIME CUSTODIAN

DISCUSSION ITEM NO. D.01

It is recommended that the Board of Education establish the positions of Technical Theatre Coordinator, Administrative Assistant, and a Part-Time Custodian to support the office and Director of Theatre Operations and Facility Permits.

COMMENT:

The second phase of the BARNUM HALL AND THE GREEK THEATRE - FACILITY USE PLAN (adopted by the Board of Education on August 31, 2006) planned for the hiring of these additional staff members in the second year of the plan. The success of the first phase of the plan in Barnum Hall and the Greek Theater on the campus of Santa Monica High School has led the board to expand the initiative districtwide with the establishment of the Director of Theatre Operations and Facility Permits. These three positions will support the Director as the scope of work broadens to include facility permits districtwide. They will better serve the district in generating revenue from the leasing of district auditoria and non-Joint Use Agreement use of the school facilities and fields. Additionally, these positions will support the Director of Theatre Operations and Facility Permits market and oversee the district's properties for use as filming venues.

Board Member Mechur asked for a report on this year's progress regarding revenue from facilities rentals. He asked if the Personnel Commission had weighed in on these job positions. The Superintendent reported that the Personnel Commission does not currently have a backfill of applicants for many empty classified positions. Board Member Leon-Vazquez suggested that a lack of personnel in certain job positions might be a Williams Compliance issue. Board Member Wisnicki has found case law that another district got an injunction to suspend its Personnel Commission due compliance concerns.

Board Member Mechur inquired as to whether or not a new Personnel Commissioner had been appointed. Assistant Superintendent Matthews replied that the deadline for applications was in November. Members of the committee to select a new commissioner have extended the date until January. Until a new commissioner is found, Mr. Bernard has agreed to stay on.

Board President de la Torre inquired as to the duties of the employees who are currently handling facilities use permits. Assistant Superintendent Matthews explained that the permit process begins with school sites, but this new position will take over all duties regarding the district office's responsibilities for granting permits.

Board Member Wisnicki requested further clarification regarding the following before the item returns for action: Will the Technical Theatre Operations supervise large-scale projects, coordinate between the sites, and ensure consistency in fees and charges? She requested to see what revenue-generating facilities rentals were scheduled for the remainder of the year.

TECHNICAL THEATER COORDINATOR

Job Summary

Under the direction of the Director of Theater Operations, the Technical Theater Coordinator organizes, supports and runs event operations of Barnum Hall and the Memorial Greek Amphitheatre, located on the campus of Santa Monica High School (SAMOHI), for student performances and community, commercial and non-profit rentals. The Coordinator is responsible for maintaining the technical theatre equipment performance spaces in the District especially, but not limited to, Barnum Hall and the Memorial Greek Amphitheatre. The position will also be required to support and run large special event and filming rentals in the District, as needed and available. Supervises, schedules and reviews the work activities of assigned staff and student crews.

Representative Duties

- 1. Oversees and provides on-site technical, house and facility management for all events in Barnum Hall and the memorial Greek Amphitheatre.
- 2. Provides professional guidance and assistance to school and rental groups to facilitate and enhance their use of the facilities.
- 3. Oversees, coordinates and integrates the staging of theatrical lighting, sound, video, and other equipment and/or assets, as required for individual performances.
- 4. Provides technical oversight, guidance, and training to student theatrical crew members in basic theater practices, techniques, and work standards.
- 5. Schedules and supervises theater operations staff and student assistants to provide technical production and ushering support. Develops and implements effective customer service standards.
- 6. Oversees and coordinates the troubleshooting, repair and maintenance of theatrical staging equipment and facilities. Maintains a preventative maintenance program and contracts for repairs as necessary.
- 7. Reads, interprets and applies applicable district policies, municipal codes, environmental and safety regulations. Instructs staff and volunteers in work and safety procedures, including the proper operation e of facilities and equipment (e.g., lighting, sound, communication, draperies and seating).
- 8. Participates in the development of operating goals and objectives for the Theater. Recommends, implements, and administers methods and procedures to enhance operation.

- 9. Monitors production costs and provides billing information; maintains inventories of materials and equipment necessary for the operation of performance spaces.
- 10. Acts as the on-site supervisor and District representative for theatre permit rentals. Manages District personnel assigned to permit rental events. Acts as liaison with security, medical, custodial, usher, stagehand, police and other event personnel.
- 11. Receives, inspects and arranges for the proper storage of theatrical equipment. Maintains records of and conducts periodic inventories of such equipment.
- 12. May personally operate lights, sound and other equipment during rehearsals and production.
- 13. Maintains accurate records and files; prepares reports, correspondence and other written materials related to the work.
- 14. Conducts facility inspection before and after events ensuring that event set-up complies with event organizer plans and safety regulations. Prepares document and cost estimates for building or equipment damage.
- 15. Works closely with Samohi administrative staff to maintain positive, cooperative working relationships in coordinating all uses of Barnum Hall and the Greek Theater, and specifically synchronizing and managing campus related events and parking with users of the facilities, and prospective filming.
- 16. Oversees maintenance and safe operation of technical theatre equipment in the other performance facilities in the District, as needed and available.
- 17. May act as Site Representative during large special events and filming rentals at Samohi and other District facilities, as needed and available.
- 18. Performs other duties as assigned that support the overall objective of the position.

ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT - Theatre Operations & Facility Permits

Job Summary

Under general supervision of the Director of Theater Operations and Facility Permits, provides administrative, secretarial and clerical support for the Theater Operations & Facility Permits office; organizes, processes, and bills Facility Permits of the District; performs a variety of administrative, database and support functions to relieve the staff of administrative details; and performs other related work as necessary.

Representative Duties

- 1. Processes Facility Permit Requests and issues Facility Permits.
- 2. Tracks Permit billing and receipts, maintains a database of accounts.
- 3. Assists the leasing and use of Barnum Hall and the Greek Theater.
- 4. Composes, types and proofreads agendas, reports and memos on behalf of managers, supervisors and administrators.
- 5. Maintains and updates master calendars for Barnum Hall, the Greek Theater and permits District wide.
- 6. Prepares office correspondence and newsletters.
- 7. Tracks budgetary expenditures for a number of different accounts; researches vendor and purchasing information; administers petty cash funds.
- 8. Compiles and distributes special mailings and promotional materials.
- 9. Prepares, reviews and approves departmental payroll reports and distributes payroll checks.
- 10. Administers work orders and facility service requests.
- 11. Coordinates after school programs and special functions.
- 12. Prepares committee agendas and minutes.
- 13. Explains procedures and provides work direction to classified office support personnel and Student Assistants.
- 14. Researches work practices and office procedures and participates in surveys sponsored by the District or other organizations.
- 15. Establishes and maintains word processing and spreadsheet information used in department databases and reports; organizes and maintains related office filing systems.
- 16. Answers incoming calls and routes individuals to appropriate staff; greets and directs visitors to appropriate personnel;

- screens, sorts, distributes and prepares department mail and special deliveries.
- 17. Coordinates and makes travel arrangements for conferences, workshops and other meetings to be attended or administered by managers, supervisors, administrators, or other personnel.
- 18. Compiles and presents information within budgetary and activity reports that are used by the school, department, division, or other organizations; assists managerial, professional and administrative staff in completing special projects as needed.
- 19. Performs other functions as assigned or as the situation requires.

CUSTODIAN - Part Time

Job Summary

Under general supervision of the Director of Theater Operations and Facility Permits, performs a variety of custodial activities on the weekend shift; clean and maintain Barnum Hall, the Greek Theater and other facilities used for facility permits in a clean, orderly, and secure manner; provide safety to students, staff and permit holders on the assigned campus; and performs other related work as necessary.

Representative Duties

- 1. Sweep, scrub, mop, seal and wax floors; vacuum rugs and carpets in classrooms, offices, workshops and other work areas; wash windows, chalkboards and walls; scrub and refinish floors; change light bulbs as required.
- 2. Dust and polish furniture and woodwork; clean and polish desks.
- 3. Empty and clean waste receptacles and pencil sharpeners; pick up paper; pick up trash containers and empty into large bins.
- 4. Inspect for vandalism and illegal entry; report hazardous or unusual conditions to the Director.
- 5. Clean restrooms including floors, walls, fixtures, appliances and mirrors; restock supplies; polish metal fixtures.
- 6. Move furniture and equipment; set up cafeteria, auditorium, gymnasium, meeting rooms and classrooms for special events and meetings.
- 7. Turn lights on and off; unlock and lock doors and gates.
- 8. Wash walk and eating areas; clean drinking fountains; make emergency clean-ups in classrooms as assigned.
- 9. Participate as part of a cleaning crew, as directed, for major cleaning assignments.
- 10. Perform minor maintenance to grounds adjacent to assigned buildings.
- 11. Perform related duties as assigned.

(CCTV) VIDEO SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

DISCUSSION ITEM NO. D.02

It is recommended that the Board of Education revise Board Policy 3515 - Digital Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) Video Surveillance System to include language specific to Global Positioning Systems (GP \oplus S) on school buses.

BACKGROUND:

One June 2, 2005, the Board of Education adopted Policy 3515 - Digital Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) Video Surveillance System as part of the campus security effort. The policy is returning with additional language to allow installation and use of Global Positioning Systems (GP $\overline{\text{CS}}$) on school buses. The language is necessary to qualify for grant funding to support student safety efforts.

The text of the policy is attached, with the new language underlined.

Board President de la Torre inquired as to how this change would be communicated with staff. Deputy Superintendent Walker explained that the bus drivers would be informed that GPS systems are on the buses.

SUBTOPIC POLICY REGULATION EXHIBIT

Campus Security X

DETAIL

It shall be the policy of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District to implement a digital Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) video surveillance system at selected sites throughout the district. Video cameras and Global Positioning Systems (GPS) may be used on school buses to monitor student behavior while traveling to and from school and school activities and to track vehicle location, course of direction and speed. The Board believes that such monitoring will deter misconduct and help to ensure the safety of students and staff. Students found to be in violation of the district's bus conduct rules shall be subject to discipline in accordance with district policy and regulations. At the discretion of the Superintendent or designee, school bus video recordings also may be used to resolve complaints by students and/or parents/guardians and to help employees maintain discipline.

The implementation of such a system is solely for the protection of District property and assets from theft and vandalism, and to maintain safety and discipline through deterrence and video documentation and GPS tracking. There is no real-time video monitoring. The systems is are not designed or intended to protect individuals from being victims of violent or property crime, or to detect other potentially illegal or undesirable activities which may occur. However, any information about illegal activities or activities in violation of District policies obtained through the video recordings or GPS records may be used to assist the District or law enforcement as evidence in such cases.

District surveillance cameras will be used in areas deemed appropriate by the Superintendent of Schools, but will not be used in locations where persons have a reasonable expectation of privacy (e.g. bathrooms, locker rooms, changing rooms). Audio recordings shall not be utilized by School District officials for surveillance purposes; such prohibition does not preclude the use of audio recordings by law enforcement officials in accordance with their official duties and/or otherwise authorized by law.

Any video recording used for surveillance purposes in school buildings, school busses or on school property shall be the sole property of the district. Video recordings and GPS records will be reviewed in the event of damage or loss of property, or when there are indications that a crime has been committed or that District policies have been violated. All video recordings and GPS records will be secured to avoid tampering and ensure confidentiality in accordance with applicable laws and regulations. Release of such videos and records will be made only as permissible pursuant to applicable law.

Appropriate signage will be posted at entrances to the school campus and on school busses notifying students, staff and the general public of the District's use of surveillance cameras and GPS systems. Students and staff will receive additional notification, as appropriate, regarding the use of surveillance cameras and GPS systems in the schools or on school busses or school grounds. Such notification may include, but is not limited to, publication in the District calendar, employee handbook and student handbook or in other District materials.

The implementation of the surveillance system shall not replace the need for ongoing vigilance of the District security personnel or school supervision. School administrators shall ensure that due diligence is observed in maintaining general campus security.

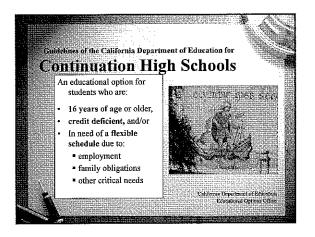


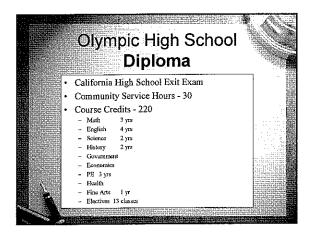


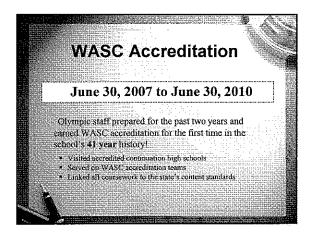


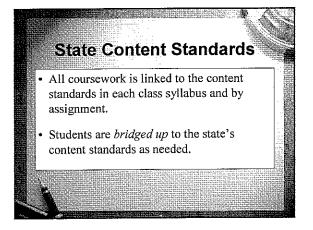


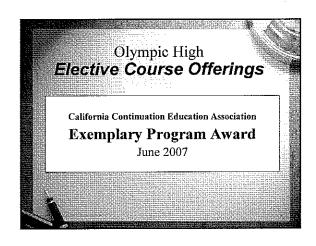


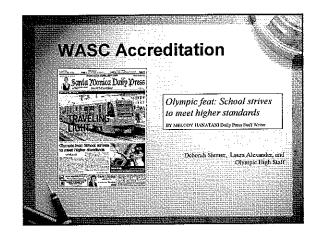


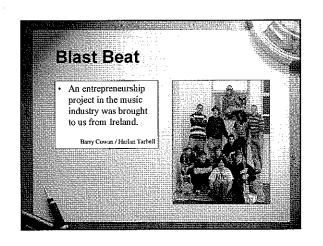


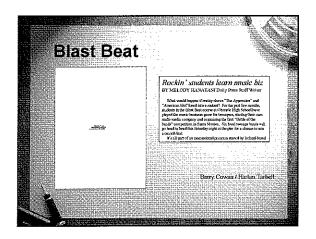


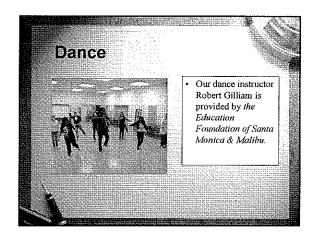


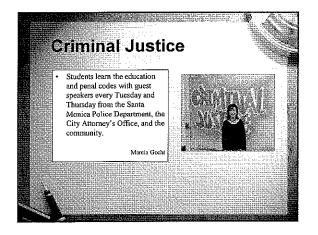


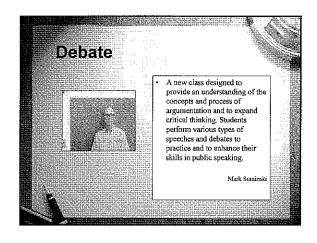


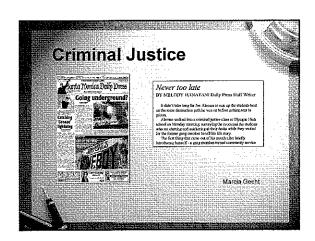


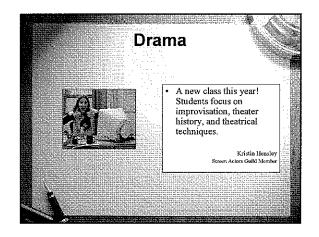


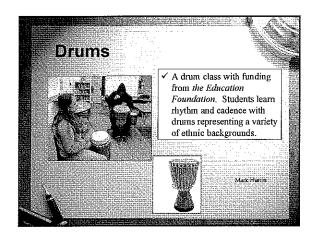


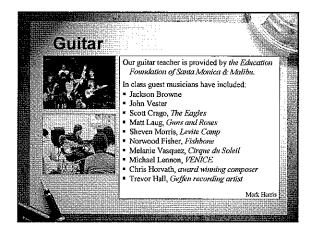


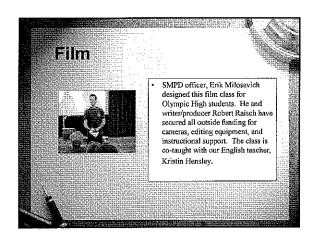


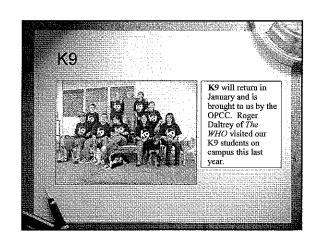


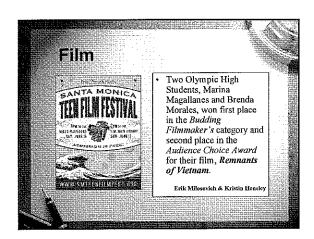


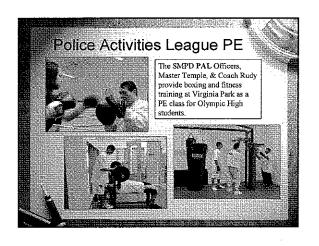


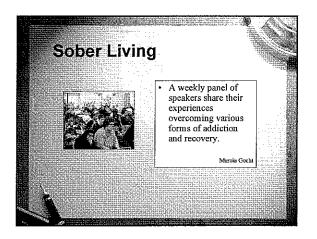


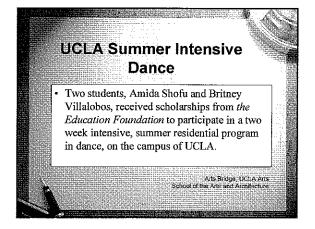


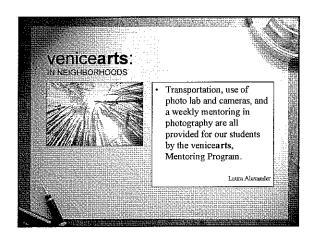


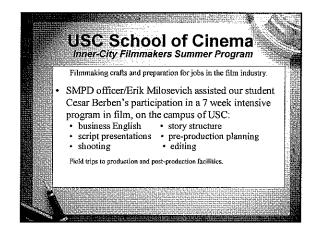


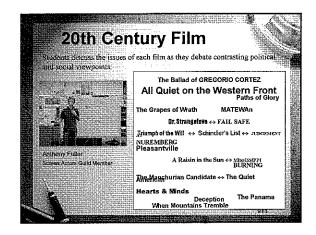


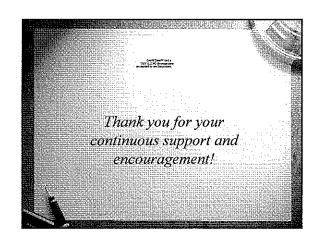












SEIU Monthly Report Board of Education - SMMUSD Thursday, December 13, 2007
