A regular meeting of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Board of Education was held on Thursday, October 2, 2008, in the Malibu City Council Chambers: 23815 Stuart Ranch Road, Malibu, CA. The Board of Education called the meeting to order at 4:14 p.m. in the upstairs Conference Room at the Malibu City Council Chambers. At 4:15 p.m., the Board of Education moved to Closed Session regarding the items listed below. The public meeting reconvened at 5:46 p.m. in the Council Chambers.

Superintendent Cuneo introduced Principal Phil Cott. Mr. Cott proudly reported that Webster Elementary School's API score jumped all the way to 933. Also, the fourth grade writing scores increased dramatically. This October marks a year since the Malibu fire damaged part of Webster. Mr. Cott invited the board to come and see the new gardens that have been replaced since the fire. The site also received a State Water Resources Control Board grant that funded a beautiful native garden designed to catch runoff water. Mr. Cott informed the board that the classroom damagd during the fire still has not been repaired. He understands that this is due to a holdup at the state level.

Mr. Cott then reported that the school just completed the Safely Ever After program. Patty Fitzgerald, cofounder and creator of Safely Ever After, visited the classrooms and held two parent workshops. The program is designed to address child safety issues in a proactive way.

For several years, Webster has incorporated are into the everyday curriculum. Art Studio, taught by Diane Hines, combines art production with

art history. Each grade participates in the projects. This year, each of the projects is based on the art techniques of various children's book illustrators, including water color and collage. This May, students will display their work during the annual art show and multicultural potluck.

Mr. de la Torre asked if the campus held other cultural celebrations throughout the year. Mr. Cott replied that some of the assemblies have a cultural focus, but that the teachers frequently strive to incorporate multiculturalism into the curriculum. Ms. Leon-Vazquez asked how Webster's success in 4th grade writing could be replicated at other sites. Dr. Wisnicki suggested that Mr. Cott and his 4th grade teachers share their information at a Principals' meeting. Mr. Cott replied that it is not always clear why scores are higher on one test than another, but there is definitely an upward trend. He added that 4th grade writing scores increased this year districtwide.

A. Student Board Member Reports Jaime Black – Santa Monica High School (3) – no report

Roya Sahafi – Malibu High School (3)

Student Board Member Sahafi reported that the Wellness and Health Fair was held in the gym on September 29, and the vision and hearing tests for eight graders was held on October 1. Freshmen were able to participate in a Making High School Count seminar. A site Measure BB meeting was held today on campus. Last Friday, ASB students and other student leaders from Malibu travelled to SAMOHI to attend the quad rally and meet students and staff. Also, students from Malibu have been invited to SAMOHI's Homecoming, and vise versa. Dr. Wisnicki mentioned that the Malibu High School football team was thus far undefeated.

Isis Enriquez – Olympic High School (3)

Student Board Member Enriquez reported that Maryoln Freedman, Director Student Health and Safety, will be visiting to discuss how new safety procedures will affect the campus. The goal is to have students learn this new information and pass it along to others. Guitar teacher Mark Harris had his brother and sister visit from Cedar Rapids, Iowa, to work the students in the new drum class. His sister, Dr. Lileah Harris, and his brother, Peter Harris, a Grammy- and Emmy-winning composer, taught the class jazz cords, theory, FUNK rhythms, piano technique, and improvisation.

This week, Student Council started exploring the idea of creating a task force to revitalize the dress code for Olympic High School. They are examining the dress code of other schools to use as a model.

There will be a costume contest for Halloween. Prizes will be given to the most creative, scariest, and a random costume. Winners will receive an iPod Shuffle.

Ms. Enriquez then reported on K-9 Connection, a 3½-week program in which the students learn how to set and achieve goals while working with rescued and abandoned dogs. All of the students are working hard and expect to graduate from this program next week. Ms. Enriquez said that the dogs seem to be enjoying themselves, too.

On behalf of Olympic High School, Ms. Enriquez thanked Ms. McKenzie for helping to find the most appropriate and applicable jobs for the individual students. The school greatly appreciates everything Ms. McKenzie does and the time she invests.

Ms. Kennerly reported that the PTA Council has experienced a flurry of activity since the start of school. The first PTA Council revealed that almost each school site has a new PTA President. Mr. Cuneo addressed the group during that first meeting. Also during the first meeting, PTA Council endorsed Measure AA (Santa Monica College bond) and Measure SM (City of Santa Monica). Ms. Kennerly then mentioned the highlights of the recent PTA Special Education Committee. Judith Meister has been selected as the Committee Chair. There are two key objectives for the committee: the Fall Forum and the Parent Resource Network. The Fall Forum will be held on November 15 at JAMS; there will be a keynote speaker, a presentation of the handbook, and breakout sessions. The Parent Resource Network has demonstrated a real sense of collaboration and teamwork among the community stakeholders. The PTA Special Education Committee has requested an open application process for the Working Group.

X. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT (5)

Superintendent Cuneo began his report by congratulating Chris Carter, a teacher at John Muir Elementary School. He was recently honored with the Office Max "A Day Made Better" Award, in which he received \$1,500 worth of classroom supplies. Local Office Max employees presented Mr. Carter with the supplies in his classroom. The school was very appreciative of the community's and company's support.

The Special Education handbook will be published (in both English and Spanish) and ready for the November Special Education Forum. The forum itself is sponsored by the PTA Council and district. The Parent Resource Network group is examining the possibility of having a representative on each campus to liaise with parents and the community. Mr. Cuneo announced that the board will be presented with an update regarding the long range planning for the Special Education collaborative. Short term planning includes training for staff regarding the IEP process. The Malibu Special Education Back to School Night will be held on Tuesday, October 7. Mr. Cuneo will be attending, and has already met with a group of Special Education parents from Malibu who have expressed their satisfaction with the district's Special

Education program. Mr. Cuneo stressed that a collaborative effort will help to ensure success.

Back to School Night activities at the sites have been successful and well-attended. Mr. Cuneo was pleased to see how many parents participated in Back to School Night at the various sites.

District Office Clean Sweep Day was held this past Monday. Employees at the district office spent that entire day cleaning out old files and organizing offices. At midday, there was a BBQ and potluck. Board Member Snell, who stopped by during the day, commented that staff seemed happy to have the opportunity to clean and organize their work spaces.

To conclude his report, Mr. Cuneo congratulated Mr. de la Torre regarding the Grand Opening of the Pico Youth and Family Center, which will be held this Saturday, October 4.

It is recommended that the Board of Education establish a new position: Manager, Maintenance and Construction, in order to better serve the needs of the district. This position will direct and inspect the construction, repair and maintenance of District facilities, properties and equipment; and supervise the work of maintenance personnel engaged in the construction, repair and maintenance of district facilities, properties, and equipment.

COMMENT:

Under the supervision of the Director, Facilities Management the Manager, Maintenance and Construction will be responsible for planning, obtaining approvals, directing and coordinating the maintenance and repair of District facilities as well as the construction of new facilities, building additions and improvements. Additionally, the Manager, Maintenance and Construction will supervise personnel and inspect the work of building and mechanical trades. As the BB projects begin, the Manager, Maintenance and Construction will communicate with contractors, consultants and district and school site administrators regarding BB and ongoing maintenance projects. (See attached job description.)

In reviewing the functions and organization of the Facilities Management Department, it has been determined that the district would best be served by two Managers reporting to the Director, rather than an Assistant Director. The Department currently has a Manager, Facilities and Grounds who supervises the operations staff. The new position of Manager, Maintenance and Construction will provide a supervisor for the building and mechanical trades.

Ms. Maez clarified for Dr. Wisnicki that this position is not intended to manage the Measure BB projects. There is already a salary range attached to the position. Dr. Wisnicki requested to see that range.

PERSONNEL COMMISSION SANTA MONICA-MALIBU UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

MANAGER OF MAINTENANCE AND CONSTRUCTION

DEFINITION

Under general direction, plans, assigns, coordinates, directs and inspects the construction, repair and maintenance of District facilities, properties and equipment and supervises and inspects the work of maintenance personnel engaged in the construction, repair, and maintenance of District facilities, properties, and equipment.

TYPICAL DUTIES

- 1. Plans, obtains approvals, directs, and coordinates the maintenance and repair of District facilities, structures and equipment as well as the construction of new facilities, building additions and improvements.
- 2. Supervises lead Maintenance positions and supervises and inspects the work of building and mechanical trades personnel involved in maintenance and construction of District facilities, properties and equipment.
- 3. Plans and oversees a wide variety of projects for the repair, renovation and alteration of District facilities performed by outside contractors and/or District personnel.
- 4. Establishes and executes on an annual basis a controlled inspection program of District facilities to identify and quantify non-deferrable and deferrable backlogs of maintenance and repair.
- 5. Plans, coordinates, develops and updates a <u>three</u> year maintenance and repair plan on an annual basis and implements the plan consistent with known fiscal constraints.
- 6. Reviews the inventory and physical condition of District facilities and equipment to develop and execute an effective preventive maintenance program.
- 7. Communicates with contractors, consultants and District and school site administrators regarding department activities and services.
- 8. Receives, evaluates, prioritizes, assigns and ensures completion of approved work orders.
- 9. Confers with lead Maintenance positions regarding work schedules and associated problems, resolves scheduling conflicts, verifies priorities and delegates the direct supervision of maintenance, repair, renovation and alteration work to be performed by District personnel.

- 10. Defines standards of quality and quantity of work, inspects work in progress to check methods and to ensure compliance with District standards, Building, Health and Safety and Education Codes and other applicable federal, State and local laws and regulations.
- 11. Reviews and in some cases, prepares cost estimates of material, equipment and labor for major repairs, renovations and alterations of District facilities, including trade tasks and phasing, diagrams and material take off sheets and requisitions.
- 12. Determines appropriateness of utilizing private contractors, prepares bid specifications, coordinates work activities with contractors and inspects completed work.
- 13. Establishes priorities and develops an overall schedule of projects and their completion dates.
- 14. Prepares and administers budgets and appropriate management plans for staffing and operation of the Maintenance Department.
- 15. Establishes policies for effective operation of all emergency, capital outlay and long range services.
- 16. Work cooperatively with school administrators and other District administrators in establishing maintenance programs, which enhance and support instructional and non-instructional activities at individual sites.
- 17. Requisitions and maintains materials, equipment and supplies.
- 18. Initiates, reviews and/or approves in-service training programs for Maintenance Department personnel.
- 19. Meets with sales personnel in discussions and demonstrations to analyze and evaluate new products and techniques.
- 20. Prepares regular written reports on progress of renovations, alterations and repairs and maintains records of completed work and work in progress.
- 21. Performs related duties as assigned.

SUPERVISION

Supervision is received from the Director of Facilities Management. Supervision is exercised over lead maintenance positions, building and mechanical trades personnel and other personnel as assigned.

Five years supervisory experience in diversified building construction and maintenance work, preferably in a multi-site operation, such as schools or office buildings.

Special Requirements:

Must maintain a valid California driver's license and be insurable by the District's carrier and must have the use of a personal vehicle and telephone.

Physical Requirements:

Ability to safely lift, carry, push and/or pull up to 50 pounds; ability to bend, crawl, stoop, kneel, crouch, twist, turn and climb up and down ladders, stairs, scaffolding and ramps of one or more stories above ground.

NOTE:

Incumbent will be exposed to working around machinery, moving vehicles and construction sites. Incumbent may also be required to serve on the District's emergency response team and also be required to be on call back and standby duty.

DISCUSSION ITEM NO. D.01

The Superintendent and staff will report on the progress of the Special Education Collaborative to date, its goals and principles. The report will also address the opportunity for community input regarding the draft criteria for the selection of the Special Education Working Group membership, their roles and responsibilities, and the proposed timeline for Working Group applications. Supporting documents will be available at the meeting.

NOTE: This report will be repeated at the October 16th board meeting, which will be held at the Santa Monica City Council Chambers, in order to allow residents of Santa Monica to receive this information.

The board agreed to not have a board member on the Working Group. Dr. Wisnicki added that having a board liaison to the Working Group would be acceptable, but a board member should not be part of the decision making process within that group. Dr. Escarce wanted to make sure word gets out about the applications. Dr. Wisnicki wanted to make sure the district would communicate with Malibu Special Education community as well. Mr. de la Torre requested that point #3 under Goals of the Collaborative (attached) read "Develop a collaborative approach..." Mr. Cuneo informed the board that he was working to develop a districtwide communication plan that would also address communication regarding Special Education.

SMMUSD Special Education Collaborative "Working Collaboratively for 21st Century Special Education Students"

Presented at the Board of Education Meetings October 2 and October 16, 2008

Goals of the Collaborative:

- 1. Recommend strategies to the Superintendent that will strengthen the quality and climate of Special Education throughout the district
- 2. Clarify roles and decision making authority as well as inclusive and respectful processes for Special Education
- 3. Develop a collaborative approach for addressing issues of change

Guiding Principles

The intent of this effort is to both strengthen the quality and climate of Special Education <u>and</u> to establish a precedent and a prototype for how the district addresses issues. We want to design and build the *social architecture*, the agreed upon structures and the inclusive and respectful processes that will support educational professionals and the communities they serve to deliberate productively on behalf of what is best for all students.

To be successful, we will have to do the following:

- articulate clear boundaries and decision rights
- agree to explicit rules of engagement
- use a smaller representative working group along with broad community engagement
- design a well-organized, interactive process
- communicate often to all stakeholders about process, progress, and outcomes
- assure that the process is fair and transparent
- build capacity for productively addressing difficult issues
- assure sustainability by identifying the leadership, accountability, and resources for follow through

This will be a fast-tracked process so that recommendations can be incorporated into the next budget cycle. The set of strategic priorities, once approved by the Board, will require ongoing leadership, capacity building, and monitoring.

Project Structure and Roles

The Superintendent:

- appoints the Working Group and receives its recommendations
- keeps the Board and the school community apprised of the progress on a regular basis
- is a member of the Sponsor Group

The Sponsor Group

The Superintendent, CAO, Director of Special Education, and Project Leader will serve as the Sponsor Group for the Special Education Collaborative. The Sponsor Group is part architect, part advisor, and part champion. Over the life of the collaborative, sponsoring work will have four aspects:

- Ensure that the initial expectations are clear, the resources available, and the support sufficient
- Advise and participate as the Working Group requires
- Be informed of the Working Group's deliberations and recommendations
- Translate recommendations into work plans, providing leadership and resources for implementation

Project Lead

The SMMUSD Project Lead will:

- Partner with Claros Group to provide context, plan, and lead the Working Group meetings
- Inspire the Working Group to full constructive participation
- Assure ongoing communication with community stakeholders
- Manage the project timeline and deliverables.

Martha Durán-Contreras is designated as the Project Lead. Her membership in the Sponsor Group will assure consistent communication and guidance. The Project Lead is responsible for assuring frequent communication that keeps all stakeholders informed, efficient use of SMMUSD and consulting resources, and capacity building to support the transformation.

Working Group

The Working Group will convene in November 2008 and work through February 2009, at a minimum. The charge of this group is to review, integrate, and prioritize Special Education goals, strategies, and deliverables currently embedded in disparate documents, including the Barber Report and earlier strategic planning documents. The Working Group will submit recommendations to the Superintendent, who will share these recommendations with the Board in February 2009.

Working Group Participant Roles and Responsibilities:

- Commit up to twenty hours per month for three months to meetings, collecting input, and communicating with key constituents
- Follow the rules of engagement developed by the group
- Actively participate in all deliberations
- Facilitate two-way communication with important stakeholder groups
- Attend all scheduled meetings

Claros Group

This effort will be supported by Laura Peck of the Claros Group and her associates. They provide expertise in organizational assessment and re-modeling and helping organizations navigate change. Ms. Peck will work closely with Martha Durán-Contreras to design and facilitate the project flow as well as the team meetings.

WORKING GROUP

Composition

This work group will have sixteen members, drawn equally from the District and the community.

District members may include principals, psychologists, SDC teachers, RSP, coordinators, speech and language specialists, instructional aides, general education teachers.

Community members may include CREST, Board of Education members, SE parents, GE parents, community members at large.

Others may be invited in as needed, for example, Human Resources, Finance, IT, or legal counsel.

Criteria for Membership Selection

- Represent diversity and a diverse viewpoints and able to consider the good of all
- Have a history of active participation and be willing and ready to have new conversations
- Credible in eyes of peers
- Represent balance of perspectives, grade levels, and school sites
- Willing to hear and respect all perspectives
- Committed to participating in robust communication between the working group and local sites, job-alikes, and the parent community
- Demonstrated leadership skills
- Voluntary service, committed to meeting a minimum of 20 hours/month for four months
- Overlapping membership with key stakeholder groups, including involvement in planning efforts and the Barber report

Selection Process

The Superintendent in consultation with the Sponsor Group develops the criteria for membership of the Working Group.

The Superintendent will give an update on the progress of the Special Education Collaborative as a discussion item at the next two consecutive Board of Education meetings on Oct. 2nd in Malibu and Oct 16th in Santa Monica. This gives an opportunity for community input regarding the criteria. People can also send their written input to Martha Durán-Contreras (duran-contreras@smmusd.org) no later than the 17th of October.

The Sponsor Group will incorporate community feedback regarding criteria and finalize the application for the Working Group. Applications will be available October 20 and due October 30. Applications will be available at the reception desk at the District Office or can be requested from Martha Durán-Contreras, Project Lead, either by phone (310) 450-8338, ext. 282 or by email at duran-contreras@smmusd.org.

In early November, the Superintendent will convene a Selection Committee composed of the Sponsor Group and chairs (or their representatives) from the SEDAC and the PTA-Special Education Committee. The Selection Committee will review the applications for diversity and parity and recommend membership to the Superintendent by November 7th.

The Superintendent will review the recommendations and appoint members to the Working Group in time for the first meeting of the Special Education Collaborative.
