- Aggie Norris, Chester Englander, Virginia Kohfeld, Zina Josephs, Janis Gabbert, and Paul Fernandez, members of the public, spoke in opposition of reducing elementary music teacher positions.
- Richard McKinnon, a member of the community, and Lulu Mickelson and Theo Benjamin, Samohi students, informed the board that Bike It Day would be held on March 10, with events occurring at 9:00am and noon. Mr. Snell asked how the Solar Alliance convinces students to ride their bikes to school. Ms. Michelson listed the various methods the students use to encourage their fellow peers. She

added that the campus could use more bike racks. Mr. de la Torre asked if there were incentives for students to participate. Ms. Michelson said one idea was to set a number of participants as a goal, and then rewarding a district-wide prize.

# A. Student Board Member Reports (15)

#### Pyoung Kim – Santa Monica High School

Student Board member Kim brought copies of the Samohi newspaper for the board members. Mr. Allen requested a copy of the newspaper be included in the board members' Friday Packets.

Ms. Kim reported that the Samohi production of RENT received accolades in the local newspaper. The production was a collaboration among theater, dance, music, and ROP - over forty students worked behind and on the stage. On March 8 at 7:00pm will be the dedication of the new organ in Barnum Hall. Lieutenant Colonel Randy Bresnik, NASA astronaut, will be visiting the campus tomorrow to speak to the students. The Southern California School Bands and Orchestra Association Festival is being held today and tomorrow. Twenty-four bands and fourteen orchestras from the L.A. area will participate. I House won the House for House competition, a fundraiser for victims of the Haiti earthquake. Open House has been moved to March 23. The UCLA Blood Drive was held on March 2. The goal was to have 130 liters donated – 152 liters were donated. Bike It! Day will be on March 10; board members are encouraged to participate. Ms. Kim reported that both the girls' and boys' basketball teams are competing for CIF regional championships. The school also sent a wrestler to CIF state finals this weekend.

#### Roya Sahafi – Malibu High School – no report

Emily Yeskel – Olympic High School

Student Board member Yeskel reported that in the past few weeks, Olympic students have heard from great speakers. Dr. Terrance Roberts, an original member of the Little Rock Nine, shared his experience with the students. Deputy Chief of the Criminal Division for the City of Santa Monica, Terry White, also visited the campus. He is a great ally of the school and assists students and staff whenever called upon.

The Criminal Justice class heard from SMPD Captain Wendell Shirley and one of his cadets. The class will also hear from a detective from the Juvenile Services Department to answer questions regarding the rights of minors. The Sober Living class heard from recovering alcoholics this past Monday. The students were able to relate to the guest speaker, who was a twenty-one-year-old. The Student Council is currently raising money for Haiti and will continue to do so for the next few weeks. The students are also exploring fundraising ideas and deciding which events to hold next.

The campus is hosting its first three-day WASC review from April 18 through 21. The staff and students are hard at work preparing for the visit. Ms. Yeskel extended an invitation to the board members and senior cabinet for a welcome event on April 18.

# B. SMMCTA Update – Mr. Harry Keiley (5)

*Mr.* Keiley reported that SMMCTA is concerned about the number of positions that will potentially be reduced for next year. He commented that this has been a deep and prolonged recession for two years, and that reductions in funding from the state have resulted in these difficult decisions to cut positions and pay. Mr. Keiley said the union members appreciate the early retirement incentive. He thanked the parent community and Chamber of Commerce for helping to put together and get the message out about the school funding measure. SMMCTA feels fortunate that the communities are committed to doing everything they can to preserve the quality of SMMUSD schools.

# C. S.E.I.U. Update – Ms. Keryl Cartee-McNeely (5)

*Ms.* Cartee-McNeely thanked the board for having Item No. A. 21 on tonight's agenda. She said that SEIU will discuss with the district how to implement the furlough days. She closed her report by announcing that Assemblywoman Brownley has agreed to Walk a Day in the Shoes of an SEIU employee.

#### D. PTA Council – Shari Davis (5)

Ms. Davis reported that she is wearing a Save Our School unity bracelet in honor of the statewide Day of Action designed to bring awareness to the chronic underfunding by the state and federal governments. She said the parents in the district have expressed appreciation for the sacrifice employees are making. The school funding measure is now officially Measure A. PTA has started to work to make the communities aware of the need for the measure and how they can help. Every school has agreed to strongly support the passage of Measure A. Over \$100,000 has been raised as financial backing from parents to make sure the measure is successful. People can visit www.savesantamonicamonicaschools.org to find out more. Phone banking is being held at SMMCTA headquarters. PTA Council has been following the development of the strategic plan through its two reps on the team. Ms. Davis said PTA will encourage participation and get the word out about the community open houses in April. The PTA Council Special Ed Committee is preparing for the Spring Forum, which will be held on April 24 at Lincoln Middle School. The next committee meeting will be on March 8 at 7pm at the district office, and the main focus will be a Q&A session with Dr. Sara Woolverton. The next full council meeting will be on March 16 at 11:00am in Malibu.

#### 6:50 pm X. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT (5)

Superintendent Cuneo thanked SMMCTA, SEIU, and the management team for the tentative agreements. The concessions made in the agreements represent a reduction of \$2 million this year and next that will help offset some of the deficit. Mr. Cuneo announced that California was not among the states chosen to receive federal Race to the Top dollars. The federal government will provide California with feedback. States can reapply in June for another round of funding.

Samohi's boys' and girls' basketball teams are competing for the CIF regional championships. Last weekend, ROP entrepreneurial students competed in the sixth annual business plan competition – Samohi students swept the event. ROP Coordinator Rebel Harrison thanked the ROP instructors for their hard work and dedication. She said the student presentations were remarkable. Mr. Mechur asked to see the business plans and presentations. Mr. Cuneo reported that the debut of the new organ at Barnum Hall will be held on March 8 at 7:00pm.

## ADMINISTRATIVE LEEWAY IN ABSENCE OF DISCRETION REGARDING BOARD POLICY

The Superintendent shall have the power to act in cases where action must be taken and where the Board of Education has not provided guidelines for administrative action.

The Superintendent shall inform the Board when action is taken and may recommend that a Board policy and/or administrative regulation be established concerning the issue.

Through the adoption of written policies, the Governing Board conveys its expectations for actions that will be taken in the district, clarifies roles and responsibilities of the Board and Superintendent, and communicates Board philosophy and direction. However, the Board recognizes that, at times, issues may arise in the operation of district schools that are not addressed in Board policy or administrative regulation. When resolution of such issues necessitates immediate action, the Superintendent or designee shall have the authority to act on behalf of the district.

If the matter involves a policy decision where controversy is foreseeable, or a matter that has a significant impact on student learning or safety, the Superintendent or designee shall notify the Board as soon as practicable after its occurrence. The Board president and the Superintendent shall schedule a review of the action at the next regular Board meeting. If the action indicates the need for additions or revisions to Board policies, the Superintendent or designee shall make the necessary recommendations to the Board.

## **Tier 3 Categorical Flexibility**

The Board has determined that it is in the best interest of the district to utilize the categorical program flexibility authorized by Education Code 42605. In accordance with Education Code 42605, for the 2008-09 through 2012-13 fiscal years, the Superintendent may suspend statutory or regulatory program and funding requirements for Tier 3 categorical programs reflected in any of the district's Board policies, administrative regulations, bylaws, or exhibits to the extent that such suspension does not affect the terms of any existing district contract or bargaining agreement. He/she may also suspend any such language reflected in any district procedure, rule, plan, or employee or student handbook. As necessary, the Superintendent or designee shall consult with other staff, district legal counsel, and/or the chief business official regarding the district's exercise of this flexibility.

The Superintendent or designee shall regularly report to the Board regarding how the district is exercising the flexibility and whether the desired results are being achieved.

RE: 2010-11 BUDGET PLANNING

## DISCUSSION ITEM NO. D.01

This item allows the Board of Education the opportunity to continue its discussion from the February 18, 2010, board meeting regarding the proposed budget reductions and staff recommendations for the 2010-11 budget.

This conversation will help to put the major action items regarding notifying certificated staff into context of the budget as a whole.

\*\*\*\* \*\*\*\* \*\*\*\* \*\*\*\* \*\*\*\*

*Ms.* Maez's presentation can be found under Attachments at the end of these minutes. She summarized that Measure A, if passed, would generate \$5.7 million per year in revenue. The reductions the district needs to meet are in excess of \$9 million.

*Mr.* de la Torre asked if there was a maximum of furlough days legally allowed for a school district. *Ms.* Maez said the law requires a minimum number of student attendance days.

In regards to changes in staffing levels over past years, Dr. Escarce asked why classified positions had increased. Dr. Matthews explained that the classified data was arrived at by examining the number of classified employees on payroll; however, this data does not reflect whether or not the classified employees were part-time or full-time. He said classified positions are more susceptible to being part-time than are certificated. He added that one major area of classified staff increase was in the Special Education Department and instructional assistants. Mr. Allen asked how much Special Education had grown in last five years. Dr. Matthews said he would have to research that data.

*Mr.* Barry asked why the health premium assumption was changed. Ms. Maez explained that the district had historically used a 7% increased to develop interim reports. However, current trends in the healthcare system and patterns of cost increases allowed the district to make a less conservative assumption.

*Mr.* de la Torre requested information comparing SMMUSD to similar districts regarding administers and health benefits, as well as a comparison between budgeted versus actuals numbers for the past few years. Mr. Snell requested that this data show where unexpected revenue sources were introduced along the timeline.

*Mr.* Mechur assured the community that the board would do everything possible to maintain programs, but that there was a major deficit that needed to be addressed. He encouraged people to work with the Measure A Campaign Committee. Ms. Kelly, Ms. Leon-Vazquez, and Dr. Escarce also encouraged members of the community to support the work of the committee.

Ms. Kim asked how many pink slips were sent last year. Dr. Matthews said no certificated pink slips were sent out last year.

*Mr.* Allen commented that there is an educational detriment to the decision the board made regarding furlough days, as well as putting a hardship on district parents to find childcare for their children for those five days. Dr. Escarce reminded the board that the furlough days are not included in the 2011-12 school year.

# SCHOOL CALENDAR

The Superintendent or designee shall recommend to the Board of Education a calendar for each school that will meet the requirements of law as well as the needs of the community, students and the work year as negotiated for represented personnel.

Each school calendar shall show the beginning and ending school dates, legal and local holidays, orientation meeting days, minimum days, vacation periods and other pertinent dates.

The district shall offer <del>180</del> <u>175</u> days of instruction per school year <u>for school years 2009-10</u>, <u>2010-11</u>.

Staff development days shall not be counted as instructional days.

Notification of the schedule of minimum days shall be sent to all parents/guardians at the beginning of the school year. If any minimum days are added to the schedule, the Superintendent or designee shall notify parents/guardians of the affected students as soon as possible and at least one month before the scheduled minimum day. (Education Code <u>48980</u>)

If a school will be used as a polling place on an election day, the Board shall determine whether to continue school in session, designate the day for staff training and development, or close the school to students and nonclassified staff. (Elections Code <u>12283</u>)
