COMMENT:

The District has been awarded a new ARRA-funded competitive EETT grant. This award follows on the heels of two prior EETT competitive grants received over the past five years. Our previous EETT grants focused on technology integration in math and science for grades 4 – 11. The new ARRA EETT grant focuses on data systems and formative assessment at the middle school and high school levels. This grant will enhance our data-driven work by providing additional training and technology for secondary classroom teachers, counselors, and administrators. EETT ARRA competitive funds will equip selected middle school and high school classrooms with electronic responder systems that will serve as a formative assessment tool, allowing the class immediate feedback with graphic displays of student responses to a proposed question or problem. Selected teachers will receive additional training in the use of formative assessment data to improve instruction. The grant will provide high school counselors with tools to identify and address the needs of adolescents who begin to disengage from the educational process. The grant will also enhance training opportunities in the District's implementation of a new student information system as well as the existing data warehouse system.

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.14

It is recommended that the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District ("District") Board of Education find that the Malibu Middle and High School Fire Alarm Project ("Project") is exempt under the Class 1 and 4 Categorical Exemptions, approve the Project, and authorize staff to file a Notice of Exemption ("NOE").

COMMENTS: As part of the Measure BB Bond, the District developed the Project to provide an automatic, addressable, fire alarm system protecting all of the Campus school buildings. The Project specifically consists of installing new fire alarm detection devices, audible and visible notification devices, control panels and related infrastructure, raceways, wires, and subpanels supporting the system. The fire alarm system components would be installed in and on existing school buildings and would be connected utilizing attached raceways and underground raceways between buildings.

Due to its limited scope, only minor above-ground changes would occur on the school building exteriors and all trenching to run the cable raceways will be between the buildings in the developed area of the Campus. Thus, this Project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") under the Class 1 and 4 Categorical Exemptions. (Cal. Code of Regs., Title 14, Chapter 3 ["CEQA Guidelines"], §§ 15301 and 15304.) The Class 1 Categorical Exemption is for a project that "consists of the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures. facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that existing at the time of the lead agency's determination. The types of 'existing facilities' itemized below are not intended to be all-inclusive of the types of projects which might fall within Class 1. The key consideration is whether the project involves negligible or no expansion of an existing use. Examples include but are not limited to: [¶] (a) Interior or exterior alterations involving such things as interior partitions, plumbing, and electrical conveyances; [¶]...[¶] (f) Addition of safety or health protection devices for use during construction or in conjunction with existing structures, facilities, or mechanical equipment, or topographical features including navigational devices." (Id. § 15301.)

This Project fits the Class 1 Categorical Exemption because it consists of the installation of small fire alarm components to the interior and exteriors of the existing public school buildings; the alarm components and its connections are akin to electrical conveyances, since power and alarm signal data are carried by wires in raceways; the fire alarms are health and safety protection devices that will be used in connection with the school's buildings; and the addition of the fire alarm system will not, and cannot, expand the use of the school's buildings or the Campus. Rather, the fire alarm system will simply protect the existing school buildings from fire.

The Class 4 Categorical Exemption is for a project that "consists of minor public or private alterations in the condition of land, water, and/or vegetation which do not involve the removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees except for forestry and agricultural purposes. Examples include but are not limited to [¶]...[¶] (f) Minor trenching and backfilling where the surface is restored." (CEQA Guidelines, § 15304.) This Project fits the Class 4 Categorical Exemption because it is a public alteration of land that only involves minor trenching and excavation (within the developed portion of the Campus) to run cables and raceways for the fire alarm system, backfill of the trenches, and restoration of the surfaces. No healthy, mature, scenic trees are near the Project's location as the nearby trees are only small, non-native, ornamentals.

Under the CEQA Guidelines, an NOE is filed with the Clerk of Los Angeles County after approval of the Project. Staff requests authorization to file an NOE should the Project be approved.

It is recommended that the Board of Education find that the Merritt Drive and Busch Drive Water Main and Lower Busch Pressure Reduction Station Project ("Project") is exempt under the Class 3 Categorical Exemption, approve the Project, and authorize staff to file a Notice of Exemption ("NOE").

COMMENTS: In order to provide adequate water flow for fire suppression at the Malibu Middle and High School, the Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 29's ("Waterworks") water system requires expansion. The Project consists of trenching to approximately five feet below the surface of certain portions of the rights of way of Merritt Drive and Busch Drive, installing approximately 1,200 feet of new water mains, and installing a pressure reducing station at the Waterworks' Lower Busch Tank Site. All Project work will occur on the Waterworks' properties.

> On October 21, 2009, the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District ("District") submitted to the Waterworks a Statement By Applicant for Water Service Agreeing to Install Certain Water Facilities Before Service for the Project. The District engaged Cannon to conduct the engineering and product construction plans and specifications for the Project acceptable to the Waterworks.

> In order to proceed with the Project, the District is applying to the City of Malibu for a Coastal Development Permit exemption. The application requires submittal of proof of the Project's environmental clearance.

> Due to its limited scope, only a minor above-ground change would occur at the Waterworks' Lower Busch Tank Site with the addition of a concrete pad-mounted 13 feet long by 10 feet wide by 4 feet tall pressure reducing station. The new water mains will be installed under the streets in the streets' rights of way. Thus, this Project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") under the Class 3 Categorical Exemption. (Cal. Code of Regs., Title 14, Chapter 3 ["CEQA Guidelines"], § 15303.) The Class 3 Categorical Exemption is for a project that "consists of construction and location of limited numbers of new, small facilities or structures; installation of new equipment and facilities in small structures; and the conversion of existing small structures from one use to another where only minor modifications are made in the exterior of the structure. The numbers of structures described in this section are the maximum allowable on any one legal parcel. Examples of this exemption include but are not limited to [¶]...[¶] (d) Water main, sewage, electrical, gas, and other utility extensions, including street improvements, of reasonable length to serve such construction." (Ibid.) This Project fits the Class 3 Categorical Exemption because it consists of the installation of a limited number of new water mains below the street surfaces, which will be restored and the construction of a small pressure reducing station at the Waterworks' Lower Busch Tank site. The Project is not a utility extension,

but the exemption authorizes such which further supports that the Project fits within the exemption.

Under the CEQA Guidelines, an NOE is filed with the Clerk of Los Angeles County after approval of the Project. Staff requests authorization to file an NOE should the Project be approved.

RE: NURSE STAFFING AND ANNUAL REPORT

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.

At the November 18, 2010, board meeting, board members received a factual report on the provision of health services in the district for the 2010-2011 school year. At that meeting, the board asked that the nurses present their annual report of responsibilities and activity thus far and that an action item be placed on the next board agenda that includes the return of one or more nurses to the workforce as a short-term solution to health provision options.

If additional staffing is approved, the recruitment process would begin immediately. Staff would offer temporary contracts to the newly recruited employees with an ending date of June 22, 2011. The estimated cost of one nurse working for spring semester is \$45,643, including benefits. The cost of two nurses working second semester is \$91,286. This one-semester cost can be compared to the annual and ongoing cost of one additional nurse at \$91,286 and two additional nurses at \$182.572.

The **attached chart** shows the likely deployment of one or two additional nurses. The allocation is based on student need. This chart is a modification to one previously given to the board and shows the days of nursing service using current and future scenarios.

Staff can answer any further questions in future correspondence and in the budget development process for the 2011-2012 school year.

Staff recommends against increasing nurses at this time in order to more fully assess the new staffing configurations made just this school year.

Comment:

On behalf of its schools, the District takes seriously its responsibilities under state and federal law to communicate the various aspects of performance covered by the School Accountability Report Card (SARC). The District seeks to ensure that our parents and community members have an accurate, complete, and up-to-date SARC from which they can understand each school's performance and make decisions on behalf of their students.

At its November 2010 meeting, the State Board of Education approved the 2010-11 School Accountability Report Card template and, at the same time, received a report from the California Department of Education that, due to budget and staffing reductions, the department would not be able to fill in some of the data that typically is provided to districts as they prepare their SARCs. This shift of responsibility for that data collection and reporting to each district (and school) now requires districts and school sites to take on additional duties just as the holidays approach.

Because of the lateness in approving the template and the necessity for school districts to assume responsibility for manually gathering and inputting some of the data required for the 2010-11 SARC posting on February 1, the district and its schools are seeking a 60-day extension from the statutorily-required posting date of February 1.

This will insure that the District is communicating all opportunities directly to the local contractors.

The Act also requires that ads be placed in specific publications annually that invite contractors to submit their contact information and be included in our list. Contractors can be added at any time at their request or by the District. The District can also remove a contractor from the list upon being deemed not qualified to bid. The District can withdraw from the Act at any time by filing a resolution of that election with the State Controller's Office.

The recommendation and proposed resolution have been reviewed by counsel.

RESOLVED, Contractors List. A list of contractors shall be developed and maintained in accordance with the provisions of Section 22034 of the Public Contract Code and criteria promulgated from time to time by the California Uniform Construction Cost Accounting Commission.

RESOLVED, Notice Inviting Informal Bids. Where a public project to be performed is subject to the provisions of this Resolution, a notice inviting informal bids shall be mailed to all contractors for the category of work to be bid, as shown on the list developed in accordance with this Resolution and/or to all construction trade journals as specified by the California Uniform Construction Cost Accounting Commission in accordance with Section 22036 of the Public Contract Code. Additional contractors and/or construction trade journals may be notified at the discretion of the Superintendent, or her/his designee; provided however:

- a. If there is no list of qualified contractors maintained by the District for the particular category of work to be performed, the notice inviting bids shall be sent only to the construction trade journals specified by the Commission.
- b. If the product or service is proprietary in nature such that it can be obtained only from certain contractors, the notice inviting informal bids may be sent exclusively to such contractors.

RESOLVED, <u>Award of Contracts</u>. The Superintendent and/or such District staff as she/he may designate are each authorized to award informal contracts pursuant to this Resolution.

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the 2010-11 First Interim Report and the corresponding budget adjustments.

COMMENTS: Education Code (*EC*) Sections §35035 (g), §42130, and §42131 require the governing board of each local educational agency (*LEA*) to certify at least twice a year as to the LEA's ability to meets its financial obligations for the remainder for that fiscal year and for the subsequent two fiscal years.

The 2010-11 Budget was adopted by the Board of Education on June 18, 2010, and was approved by the Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE).

Since the adoption of the initial budget, changing conditions have necessitated adjusting the District budget. All of the expenditure and revenue changes previously approved by the Board at the meeting of November 4, 2010, or proposed for approval at this time are individually identified in the First Interim Report (October 31, 2010), which is included as a part of this document.

The First Interim Report was developed based on the following Revenue and Expenditure Assumptions.

REVENUE ASSUMPTIONS

(.39%) statutory COLA for 2010-11 Revenue Limit funding

The Base Revenue Limit for Santa Monica-Malibu USD will be \$6,445.84 per ADA (2009-10 P2 ADA – 11,104). A <17.963% > deficit factor is applied to the Revenue Limit. The adjusted Based Revenue Limit will be \$5,287.97 per ADA. The total Revenue Limit is \$59,286,726.

The 2010-11 Enrollment is 11,557, which are decreased by 48 students.

The Lottery allocation will be \$130 per annual ADA, of which \$112.50 is for unrestricted expenditures and the remaining \$17.50 is for Proposition 20 – Mandated for Instructional Materials.

The District will participate in the K-3 Class Size Reduction Program and receive \$1,071 per pupil, less the 30% of penalties for increasing class size to 23:1, and the total projected revenue is \$1,731,772.

No COLA and a <17.963%> of deficit for Special Education Funding. Adjusted Special Education Based Revenue Limit funding is \$5,060.26. Special Education transfer from the Revenue Limit is \$1,895,270. Special Education Mandate Settlement at \$4.52 per 1999-2000 ADA is \$52,328.

The 2009-10 Mandated Reimbursement is not included in the 2010-11 Budget.

The Measure "R" parcel tax at \$350.84 per parcel is estimated to generate \$10,531,164 after processing senior exemptions.

The District will receive \$7,797,281 of financial support from the City of Santa Monica.

The District will receive \$135,000 of Joint Use Agreement funding from the City of Malibu.

The combined lease revenue is \$2,980,706, which is from the DoubleTree Hotel, Madison site, 9th & Colorado and 16th Street properties.

The projected revenue of Tier III programs is \$4,674,339.

The preliminary entitlement of the "Education Jobs Fund" is \$2,174,607.

The "Save Our Schools" fundraising raised \$1,517,202 as of August 30, 2010.

The projected PTA's contribution is \$2,110,183

Although the requirement is suspended for the 2010-11 fiscal year, the District is budgeting 2.8% of the total General Fund (Restricted and Unrestricted) budget for the Ongoing Maintenance Program.

The cost of Property and Liability Insurance is \$1,165,823.





RE: CONSIDER REVISING AR 6163.2 – ANIMALS AT SCHOOL

INFORMATION ITEM NO. I.01

It is recommended that the Board of Education consider revising AR 6163.2 – Animals at School.

COMMENTS: The changes address the definition and use of service animals on a school campus.

Because this is an AR, it will not need to return for board approval.

Attached is the revised AR.

ANIMALS AT SCHOOL

In accordance with Board policy, a teacher or student may bring an animal into the classroom for instructional purposes with prior approval of the principal or designee. When a parent/guardian has provided notification that his/her child has an allergy, asthma, or health condition that may be affected by the animal, the teacher shall remove the animal from the classroom or provide an alternative instructional activity for the student as appropriate.

All animals brought to school must be in good physical condition and appropriately immunized. The teacher shall ensure that the species of animal is appropriate for the instructional purpose and age and maturity of the students.

Students bringing animals to school (including service animals), must have the written consent of the parent/guardian and must first obtain the consent of the teacher and the appropriate site administrator. Reasonable accommodations shall be made for service animals used by individuals with a disability.

All animals, with the exception of service animals, are prohibited on school transportation services. (Education Code 39839; 13 CCR 1216)

All animals shall be humanely and properly housed in cages or containers specific for the species or otherwise appropriately controlled. The teacher shall also ensure that cages and containers are cleaned regularly and that waste materials are removed and disposed of in an appropriate manner. If the animal is to remain in the classroom longer than one day, the teacher shall be responsible for care and maintenance of the animal and ensure proper care when school is not in session, such as weekend, vacations and holidays.

The teacher shall ensure that students receive instruction regarding personal hygiene around animals. Students must receive training in appropriate handling and care of the animals so as to not cause harm to the animal or provoke aggressive behavior. As a matter of proper hygiene, students must thoroughly wash their hands after handling an animal.

Animals under the control of public safety officials may have access to District property and program locations for enforcement, educational and public relation purposes. Use of these animals is under the jurisdiction of the applicable local ordinance; or state and/or federal laws, codes and regulations. The provisions of this policy directly related to the safety of students, staff and visitors are to be brought to the attention of these officials by the site or program administrator; or the teacher in the absence of an administrator.

Non-Service Animals

Students shall not bring poisonous or wild animals to school. If wildlife specimens are used in a biology class, protective gloves and a face shield shall be worn by anyone handling these specimens and the animals' saliva and neurological tissue shall be treated as infectious.

Animals brought to school by professional handlers for demonstration purposes must be under the control of the handlers at all times. All precautions should be taken to assure that the animals do not pose a threat to students, staff or visitors.

ANIMALS AT SCHOOL (continued)

Animals brought to school by students or staff shall generally be taken home the same day they are brought to school.

Non-service animals must be removed immediately from District premises upon the request of the school site or program administrator, the Risk Manager, or the Superintendent or designee.

Service Animals

The use of service animals must comply with all relevant federal and state laws; pertinent local ordinances, rules and regulations; and the provisions of this implementing regulation of District policy. The use of service animals in public places is determined individually whether a student may need a service animal as part of his or her Section 504 Plan or IEP. Requests for exceptions to any provision set forth herein may be presented in writing for evaluation and consideration by the District on a case-by-case basis.

Definitions

- 1. Individual with a Disability: As defined by Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- 2. Service Animal: Any animal individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability. These tasks include, but are not limited to: guiding individuals with impaired vision; alerting individuals who are hearing impaired to intruders or sound; providing minimal protection or rescue work; pulling a wheelchair; or fetching dropped items. The service the animal is providing must be directly related to the functional limitation of the person's disability. Therapy or companion animals, including pets, are not service animals, are not covered under the Americans with Disabilities Act, and therefore, are not permitted on District facilities or at Districtspensored activities. Any dog that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disability. Examples of work or tasks performed by service animals include, but are not limited to, assisting individuals who are visually-impaired with navigation and other tasks, pulling a wheelchair, assisting an individual during a seizure, alerting individuals to the presence of allergens, and helping individuals with psychiatric and neurological disabilities by preventing or interrupting impulsive or destructive behaviors.

Right to Use of Facilities and Services

An individual with a disability has the right to be accompanied in, or on, District property and facilities by a service animal specially trained for that person, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Upon request, the user of the service animal shall provide information about the specific individualized training of the animal, including what task(s) the animal performs for the individual.
- 2. The user of the service animal must provide evidence of proper licensure, inoculations and identification.
- 3. The user of the service animal is responsible for the care and conduct of the service animal at all times. The service animal must be under user control at all times. The user of the service animal is responsible for the cleanliness of the service animal, including

- flea control and other protective measures for health and safety; and for assuring the proper and safe disposal of all waste elimination of the service animal.
- 4. The service animal shall not exhibit aggressive behavior toward staff, students, or any individuals; and may not otherwise pose a direct threat to the health and/or safety of others, and may not be disruptive to the educational environment.

The public entities are prohibited from asking an individual about the nature or extent of his or her disability or requiring documentation that the animal has been certified, trained, or licensed as a service animal. A public entity, however, may ask the individual: (1) whether the animal is required because of a disability, and (2) what work or task the animal has been trained to perform, except when "it is readily apparent that an animal is trained to do work or perform tasks for an individual with a disability. A public entity may ask the individual to remove his or her service animal from the premises if the animal is out of control and the animal's handler does not take effective action to control it, or if the animal is not housebroken.

If any of the above conditions are not met, the user can be required to remove the service animal and not bring the service animal back to District premises, or the school bus, until the user has mitigated the relevant deficiency.

Liability for Service Animals

The user of a service animal shall keep the service animal properly harnessed, or leashed and under control at all times. The owner/user of the service animal is solely responsible for any damage to persons, premises or facilities caused by that service animal. The District assumes no responsibility for service animals.

Special Education/Section 504 Students

For special education students (i.e. those students qualifying for special education services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Action (IDEA)), Individualized Education Program (IEP) teams may consider whether or not a service animal (meeting the definition above) is required to meet a particular student's unique needs. Should such a service animal be found to be required by an IEP team, conditions for the use of such a service animal should be referenced in the IEP document. Similarly, should a service animal be included in a student's Section 504 Plan, the conditions for the use of such a service animal should be referenced in the Plan document.
