A regular meeting of the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Board of Education was held on Thursday, September 23, 2010, in the District Administrative Offices: 1651 16th Street, Santa Monica, CA. The Board of Education called the meeting to order at 4:25 p.m. in the Board Conference Room at the District Offices. At 4:26 p.m., the Board of Education moved to Closed Session regarding the items listed below. The public meeting reconvened at 5:50 p.m. in the Board Room.

VIII. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Public Comments is the time when members of the audience may address the Board of Education on items not scheduled on the meeting's agenda. All speakers are limited to three (3) minutes. When there is a large number of speakers, the Board may reduce the allotted time to two (2) minutes per speaker. The Brown Act (Government Code) states that Board members may not engage in discussion of issues raised during "VIII. Public Comments" except to ask clarifying questions, make a brief announcement, make a brief report on his or her own activities, or to refer the matter to staff. This Public Comment section is limited to twenty (20) minutes. If the number of persons wishing to address the Board of Education exceeds the time limit, additional time will be provided in **Section XVI. CONTINUATION OF PUBLIC COMMENTS.**

- *Kelly Urtz, David Saling, Ed Jacobs, and Marty Mirabal asked the board to reinstate the library coordinator position at JAMS. Dr. Escarce reminded the board that it agreed in August that if the district received more federal dollars than anticipated, then reinstating the middle school library coordinators would be a priority. The board directed the superintendent to bring this back as a discussion item at the next board meeting.*

A. Student Board Member Reports (15)

Tanya Choo – Santa Monica High School

Ms. Choo reported that the first day of school at Samohi was a success and that ASB decorated the campus with balloons and decorations. The senior parent meeting, which was held on September 21, provided parents with information regarding what to expect during the senior year, timelines for college applications, and how to contact the class advisors. Parents also met the new college counselor, Rose Mejia. Tomorrow, seniors will meet with staff to discuss senior activities, college applications, and graduation. Back to School Night will be on Tuesday, September 28.

The varsity football team won its first game, 2-0. Tryouts are now being held for fall and winter sports. Tryouts are also being held for the fall play, "Midsummer Night's Dream."

Elizabeth Wilson – Malibu High School

Ms. Wilson reported that students are very happy with the new bathrooms that were made possible by \$30,000 of parent donations. She thanked the Maintenance and Operations staff for their effort on the bathroom

project. The middle school and high school Back to School nights were held earlier this week. The students would like to thank everyone for their fundraising efforts over the summer. She also thanked Pat Benatar and Neil Giraldo for holding a benefit concert.

Ms. Wilson then announced ASB activities. Because nighttime football games are no longer occurring, ASB worried that there would be low attendance at the Homecoming dance. As a result, the dance will be replaced with a tailgate party on October 15 between the end of school and the beginning of the Homecoming game. The ASB continues its work to increase student participation in activities, including promoting ASB card sales, approving numerous clubs, promoting a magazine drive in October, holding an egg toss during lunch, and establishing a campus beautification committee to plant flowers and paint benches on campus. Students will be taking a field trip to the Los Angeles County Office of Education for a CASC Conference. ASB is also actively working toward implementing SB 1422: California's Future: Highly Qualified Teachers for All Students; Final Report of the Advisory Panel on Teacher Education, Induction and Certification for Twenty-First Century Schools. The students support the governor's decision and are passionate about the importance of giving feedback on the effectiveness of teachers.

Ms. Leon-Vazquez asked about the school's football games. Ms. Wilson said they are held on Fridays during the day due to the restrictions on field lights.

B. SMMCTA Update – Mr. Harry Keiley (5)

Mr. Keiley recognized members of the SMMCTA Board of Directors who were in the audience. He said they joined him in a message of commitment to the board and staff to work as a team in the year ahead.

He said there has been a lot of public discussion lately about education. SMMCTA believes it is good to have these conversations because teacher quality and student achievement matter. But how and where these conversations take place is equally important. As the public debates changes within schools and measuring teacher effectiveness, the union believes there needs to be parallel conversations as well regarding what we can do within organizations to support the work of teachers. Randi Weingarten, President of the American Federation of Teachers said there are three elements necessary to support teachers: 1) Time to do their jobs; 2) Tools and resources to be successful; 3) Trust them to make decisions. SMMCTA recently met with the superintendent and senior staff to discuss evaluations, calendars, and other topics. Mr. Keiley warned that conversations regarding teacher evaluations cannot occur in a vacuum; decision makers also need to consider Time, Tools, and Trust, otherwise the outcomes of these conversations will not be successful. The union wants to work with the district for the benefit of students, teachers, and the district as a whole.

Mr. de la Torre commented that he is interested in working with the union in a collaborative spirit.

C. S.E.I.U. Update – Ms. Keryl Cartee-McNeely (5) – no report

D. PTA Council – Shari Davis (5)

Ms. Davis reported that students and families came back to school this fall full of hope and optimism. PTA was very proud to have partnered with the Education Foundation on the SOS fundraising effort. PTA is now very involved in the Yes on Propositions Y and YY Campaign. She thanked all of the district's PTAs for their generous contributions to the campaign and volunteer hours. She thanked SMMCTA, SEIU, and other community organizations for their support in this effort as well. PTA council is officially co-sponsoring a Candidates Forum on October 6 here at the district office to allow community members to learn more about the November candidates. Ms. Davis reported that the Back to School Nights are in full swing. She thanked staff and administrators, who put so much time into making these nights informative and full of energy. On Tuesday, the PTA Council held its annual retreat to welcome new members. The guest speaker, Dr. Mary Jane Rotheram-Borus, cofounder and director of the UCLA Family Commons in Santa Monica, addressed the members regarding health services available in the city. The next PTA Council meeting will be on October 19.

Ms. Pye thanked Ms. Davis and the PTAs for all their hard work in getting the schools ready for the school year.

X.**SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT (5)**

Superintendent Cuneo thanked SMMCTA and Mr. Keiley for their willingness to have important conversations with the district regarding teacher performance.

The annual State of Our Schools report will be delivered to the public on October 25 in the MLK, Jr., Auditorium in the Santa Monica Main Library, and on October 26 in the MHS library. The event will showcase the school district, the direction for 2010-11, student achievement, and issues the district will be addressing.

Next week, the district will be hosting A Taste of SMMUSD's Food and Nutrition Services Department for seventy students in Malibu. The students will have the opportunity to taste test current and possible food options from various district food services vendors. The Food and Nutrition Services Department will be offering this opportunity to the PTA Council in late October. Mr. Allen requested that the Superintendent inform the Health and Safety DAC of that date as well.

Mr. Cuneo commented that the district learned a great deal from the SOS Campaign, especially immeasurable aspects, such as the impressive levels of cooperation, enthusiasm, and energy generated by the campaign. He has met with the Education Foundation and PTA Council President regarding how the district can build upon that success. The district will take the lead to design a process and conversation regarding fundraising in the future. Both the Education Foundation and PTA Council are open to this. Mr. Cuneo said they would draft a plan and bring it to the board at a future meeting.

The Point Dume Marine Science School charter school petition was delivered to the district on Monday. It will formally be presented to the Board of Education on October 7, at which point the board will review the timeline, next steps, and process. Staff is currently examining the petition and evaluating its completeness.

Mr. Cuneo announced that he would be retiring this June. He said he would bring a proposal to the board with a list of firms to search for the next superintendent. Ms. Pye said the district had been fortunate to have Mr. Cuneo come out of retirement to serve SMMUSD.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN SANTA MONICA-MALIBU UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT
AND SANTA MONICA COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING is made and entered into this 24th day of August, 2010 between **SANTA MONICA-MALIBU UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT** also known as **School District** and the **SANTA MONICA COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT**, also known as **College District** to house the College District's Automotive Technology Program on the District property located at Santa Monica High School.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District (SMMUSD) and the Santa Monica Community College District (SMCCD) have been serving students in the Santa Monica and Malibu areas while SMCCD serves the college level students as well concurrent enrolled high school students, and the SMMUSD has been serving students from pre-school age to grade 12 as well as adult students. Pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding, the parties hereto agree as follows:

PURPOSES AND SERVICES TO BE RENDERED

The SMCCD and the SMMUSD have jointly agreed to provide the following services to house the College District's Automotive Technology Program on the Santa Monica High School campus:

1. The establishment of an articulated Automotive/Advanced Transportation program;
2. The shared use of facilities that benefits both districts in terms of auto facilities and classroom space;
3. The collaboration and articulation of the Automotive/Advanced transportation career and technical educational program between the school district and the college district; and
4. The College District is to reimburse the School District the agreed upon costs (e.g. staff time and teacher extra duty, hauling and disposal services, etc.) associated with the setting up of the program on the Santa Monica High School campus.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING DATES

The following dates have been agreed upon and are subject to change only by prior or mutual agreement between both parties:

1. School year and summer concurrent enrollment at the Santa Monica High School campus for the Automotive/Advanced Transportation Program – beginning Fall, 2010 and ongoing

EXPENSES AND/OR COST TO THE DISTRICT

There are no extraordinary expenses that the School District or the College District assumes under this Memorandum of Understanding except as stipulated in # 4 in **“PURPOSES AND SERVICES TO BE RENDERED.”**

FINGERPRINTING REQUIREMENTS

Education Code Section 45125.1 states that if employees of anyone providing school site Administrative or similar services may have any contact with any under-age pupils; those employees shall be fingerprinted by the Department of Justice (DOJ) before entering to determine that they have not been convicted of a serious or violent felony. If the School District determines that more than limited contact with students will occur during the performance of these services by parties under this Memorandum of Understanding, parties will not perform services until all employees providing services have been fingerprinted by the DOJ and DOJ fingerprinting clearance certification has been provided to the School District.

The School District has determined that College District's instructional services WILL result in contact with under-age pupils. The College District has obtained fingerprinting clearance for all employees as the college district's routine employment requirement.

HOLD HARMLESS CLAUSE

Parties to this Memorandum of Understanding agree to hold harmless and to indemnify both School District and College District from every claim, demand or liability, which may be made by reason of:

- A. Any injury to person or property sustained by the School District and the College District upon or in connection with the work called for in this Agreement, however caused.

- B. Any injury to person or property sustained by any person, firm or corporation caused by an act, neglect, default, or omission of the School District or the College District upon or in connection with the work covered by this Agreement, whether the said injury or damage occurs upon or adjacent to work, the School District or the College District, at their own expense, cost, and risk, shall defend any and all actions, suits, or other proceedings that may be brought or instituted against the School District or the College District on any such claim or demand, and pay or satisfy any judgment that may be rendered against the School District or College District in any action, suit, or legal proceedings or results thereof.

ASSIGNMENT

This Memorandum of Understanding may be reviewed, modified, or revised as appropriate at the request of agency participants to ensure appropriate provisions of services. Neither party may make any change to this MOU or any part thereof without the written consent of the other party.

TERMINATION

Either party may terminate the entire or part of this Memorandum of Understanding upon providing thirty- (30) day written notice, one to the other. However, all programs and/or services shall terminate at the end of the term/semester as not to disrupt student participation.

COMMENT: According to the Education Code SEC.21 Section 56342, prior to recommending a new or continued placement in a non-public, non-sectarian school, the Individualized Education Program (IEP) Team must submit the proposed recommendation to the local governing board for its review and recommendation regarding the cost of such placement.

The recommendations for these severely handicapped students are made by the District IEP Teams in accordance with State and Federal laws. The mandates of IDEA require non-public school services be provided at no expense to parents if there is not an appropriate public school program available. Funding to come from a SELPA-wide non-public school/non-public agency reserve account.

Comments: During the course of the construction of the New Entry, it was observed the soils were not suitable due to high moisture content and would not meet compaction requirements for the new work. Under the direction of the MTGL Soils Engineer, soil was removed, dried and re-compacted in the affected areas. As this work could not be quantified the contractor proceeded with the work on a time and material bases under the close supervision of the MTGL Soils Engineer resulting in the additional time. As this work was not anticipated, it resulted in additional services for MTGL, the Testing and Special Inspection consultant for this project. The construction contract Change Order No. 1 for this work was approved by the Board of Education at their August 18, 2010 meeting.

This Contract Amendment #4, for \$468, is for additional Testing and Special Inspection Services for Grant Elementary School Main Entry Reconfiguration Project as required to support Alfa 26 Construction Company Change Order No. 1. The revised contract total will be \$13,318. The additional costs are within the current project budget as a contract was also approved for Leighton Engineering for soils testing services on this project. The Leighton contract was not utilized, therefore those funds will be de-encumbered and returned to the project budget.

COMMENTS: Consulting Arborist Services are necessary in order to insure proper design and handling of the District's tree and shrub resources during design and construction of the Measure BB projects.

At their May 7, 2009 meeting, The Board of Education approved Contract Amendment #3 to Cy Carlberg, District Consulting Arborist, to develop a Community Outreach Program for the Santa Monica projects to show transparency, stewardship for trees, and ultimate improvements of the various sites. As part of that process, Ms. Carlberg has identified "Hall of Fame" trees at the school sites where Measure BB projects are proceeding, including Santa Monica HS, Malibu HS, Olympic HS, Lincoln MS, John Adams MS, Edison Language Academy, Washington CDS, Grant ES and McKinley ES.

District staff requested that Ms. Carlberg review the Schematic Design and Long Range Plan Updates prepared as part of the Measure BB program for the remaining nine (9) elementary school sites for potential future impacts to candidates to the "Hall of Fame" tree list. - Age
- Branching Architecture

- Location/Placement (is it a featured attribute of the landscape?)
- Suitability at School Site
- Landmark/Heritage/Historic Quality
- Educational Value
- Habitat/Wildlife Value

The “Hall of Fame” tree list and the process for developing it, establish a basis for a District procedure and process for tree maintenance, protection and disposition. A Board memo was issued on August 27, 2010 summarizing the “Hall of Fame” trees and the scope of work included in this contract amendment.

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.26

It is recommended the Board of Education approve the 2009-10 Unaudited Actual Financial Report and staff recommendations for fund balances reservations.

COMMENTS: California Education Code §42100 requires the governing board of each school district to provide the county office of education a report of all revenues and expenditures for the preceding fiscal year. This report must also include any resulting corrections to the current year (2010-11) adopted budget. Although the prior fiscal year formally ended on June 30, final accounting tabulations are not generally completed by the District and the LACOE until the end of August. It is noted that all data contained in the attached report will be subject to final audit by the District's independent auditing firm of Christy White Accountancy Corporation (formerly Nigro Nigro and White).

The 2009-10 fiscal year saw the continuation of serious budget issues for school districts across the State of California. School districts faced deficits in excess of 18% applied to our revenues. The State did allow expanded flexibility to districts to "weather" the storm. These were often one-time solutions that did not solve our ongoing problems. The 2009-10 fiscal year also experienced the infusion of federal funds known as the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA). SMMUSD was fortunate to receive these funds that assisted in sustaining many District programs. These funds are also considered one-time in nature and cannot be counted on to support ongoing expenditures. In addition to using all state provided flexibility and the new federal funding, the Board made the difficult decision to reduce District expenditures by 4.6 million dollars. Those cuts came from District administration, contracted services, a reorganization at Santa Monica High School, staffing ratio changes and a realignment within our Special Education budget. Even with these adjustments, the 2009-10 budget for the District reflected spending in excess of revenue by nearly 8.5 million dollars.

As the fiscal year developed and the District learned that state projections for the 2010-11 budget showed a continued decline in our revenue position, the Board held many workshop sessions in both regular and special meetings to develop priorities and give staff direction regarding the 2010-11 budget. With deficit spending in the neighborhood of 8 plus million dollars, and expecting to grow in the budget year, our large reserves of a few years ago were being rapidly depleted. The Board took significant action in the adoption of the 2010-11 budget which reflected reductions in excess of 7.1 million dollars. Those reductions impacted departments, sites, programs and services across the District. On top of those cuts, the employees of the District accepted 5 days of furlough, which saved the District 2.0 million dollars a year for the 2009-10 and 2010-11 fiscal years.

Two major events having an impact on the District's 2010-11 budget occurred during the months since the adoption of the spending plan in June. The first was a result of the tremendous efforts of our Educational Foundation, PTA and our parent population. A fundraising campaign, known as Save our Schools (SOS), raised over 1.5 million dollars in eight weeks. The second was the adoption by the federal government of the Jobs Bills; we are estimating approximately 2.0 million dollars from that legislation. The Board took action in August to restore many of the reductions made in June and to bring back laid-off employees.

The purpose of this agenda item is to present the final results of operation for the 2009-10 fiscal year. The information is presented in the format required by the state. Staff will be presenting a more user-friendly version of the information to the Board at the meeting. The PowerPoint presentation should be available on the District web site early next week.

Highlights from the 2009-10 Unaudited Actuals

General Fund Ending Balance 2009-10

- 1) **Unrestricted Funds** – The Unrestricted General Fund ending balance (inclusive of a Board-approved 3% Reserve for Economic Uncertainties, revolving cash, warehouse inventory, school site and District carryover funds, etc.) is currently reported to be \$16,784,024.
- 2) The components of that 16.8 million dollar Ending Balance include the following:

- 3) The revenue reported in the District 2009-10 Unaudited Actuals is approximately \$400,000 higher than estimated in June. Over half of this amount was as a result of higher than expected local income. Estimates are historically placed in the budget lower than final results.
- 4) In the combined General Fund, both the Books and Supplies and the Operating Services categories reflect lower expenditures than expected by \$636,000. This difference is caused by the carryover of funds from one year to the next.
- 5) The Undesignated Ending Balance is \$936,000 more than expected. In the analysis of the causes for the increase, staff recognized that the expected Local General Fund Contribution (LGFC) for Special Education was less than had been projected. Staff will further explain this difference during their presentation. A table that details all the LGFC is provided as Attachment 1.

Dr. Escarce asked about the New Revenue Assumption for the current school year on the multiyear projection slide. Ms. Maez said this illustrated what the district used to adopt the budget. The \$5 million for the 2010-11 year should not be considered as "new" revenue, but rather should be included in the first line on the multiyear chart. Ms. Maez said this change would not impact the ending balance projections. She also showed a chart that reflected ending balances without the new additional funds. This change would impact the ending balances on that chart. The corrections to each chart have been made on the district's web site.

Mr. Allen commented that Ms. Maez's presentation underscores the importance of the passage of the City of Santa Monica's Propositions Y and YY.

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.27

The Equity Fund was established to improve the achievement of ALL students while simultaneously closing the achievement gap by mitigating the effects of the unequalized enrichment of schools. AR 3290 allows the distribution of the fund to 1) support district-wide initiatives to provide academic support, intervention and/or remediation in accordance with the mission of the school district; 2) support school sites using the weighted-student formula for distribution of fund; and 3) reserve resources within the fund.

Attached is the distribution chart based on the student demographic and achievement data from spring 2010 and a history of Equity Fund Contribution and Distribution since 2004-05.

COMMENT: As the district moves forward in its goal to close the achievement gap, several initiatives have been initiated to support the students. It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the allocation of \$70,000 from the Equity Fund to enhance and strengthen the 2010-11 school year and summer 2011 districtwide initiatives including Intensive Intervention Summer School (IISS), Connect for Success (incoming 9th graders), Jump Start to Success (incoming 6th graders), the Young Collegians, and Middle School Initiative. It is recommended that the \$70,000 be allocated to Educational Services Department to implement these initiatives be allowed yearly carry-over.

This \$70,000 funding provides:

Intensive Intervention Summer School (IISS):

- IISS supplemental program professional development activities in instructional strategies to increase student achievement in literacy, mathematics; and classroom management tools and techniques and student engagement (Estimated at \$20,000 for approximately 60 IISS teachers for one days);
- An outreach specialist during the summer session to assist in parent participation and student support at Santa Monica High School (Estimated at \$7,000);

Young Collegians/Connect for Success/Jump Start for Success:

- Supplemental instructional materials such as books, general supplies, and field trips for Connect for Success students (incoming 9th graders who meet the IISS criteria, housed at Santa Monica High School); and Jump Start for Success (incoming 6th graders who meet the IISS criteria, housed at JAMS) for the summer and follow up activities during the school year (Estimated at \$13,000);
- Fees, bus tokens, textbooks, publicity and recruitment materials, supplies, field trips for the Young Collegians Program (Estimated at \$10,000) during the summer and school year; and

Middle School Initiative

- Resources for the continuation of the implementation of the Middle School Initiative including conference/workshop attendance, consultant(s), materials, substitutes and extra duty hours for planning and focusing specifically on issues of adolescent development, literacy, mathematics and behavior. (Estimated at \$20,000)

Dr. Escarce asked how soon the sites would be given their allocations. Dr. Chou said they could receive it soon as tomorrow, assuming board approval tonight.

Ms. Choo asked how the allocation was determined. Dr. Chou said there was a weighted student formula that assigned points for students who are English learners, in the Free and Reduced Lunch Program, in special education, or scoring below basic and far below basic in either ELA or math.

Mr. Mechur asked for the point value assigned to each site. He also asked about the process for allocating the money to the sites. Dr. Chou explained that the sites include their plan for using the funds in their Single Plan for Student Achievement, which is submitted to the district in December. Mr. Mechur asked if the information showing how the sites use their funds could be made more public. Dr. Chou said she could have her department pull out that section from each SPSA. She added that the schools combine equity fund monies with other resources to fund some of their programs.

Mr. Allen asked about an evaluation of Young Collegians Program, including student GPAs and grades at SMC. Dr. Chou said that would be part of the IISS presentation in late October. Mr. Allen said he supported districtwide uses of these funds, especially those that have the greatest impact on student achievement. He also asked about the middle school initiative. Dr. Chou said Ms. Harris has been working with the middle school administrators, researching best practices to develop a model for SMMUSD. Mr. Allen requested that staff present more specific information to the board regarding this initiative.

Ms. Leon-Vazquez asked staff to track what happens to SMMUSD students after graduation in order to determine the rate of college graduates.

Mr. de la Torre expressed his concern about the difficulty of fundraising during these difficult economic times. He suggested the district set aside money for students who attend more affluent schools, but are unable to afford basic supplies. He also suggested surveying the PTAs to ask how effective they think the equity fund is in creating equity within the district.

Dr. Escarce emphasized the need for quantitative and qualitative information on the Young Collegians Program.

Mr. Mechur asked about the reduction of IISS funds for Ed Services' proposed allocation. Dr. Chou explained that there were fewer students and fewer training days. Mr. Mechur suggested holding off on this item and approving the allocations following the IISS presentation in late October. Dr. Escarce asked if any of these allocations were time-sensitive. Ms. Leon-Vazquez had no problems with approving the whole amount tonight, having heard a great deal of information about the core work of the Educational Services Department at last week's workshop.

Ms. Pye agreed with Mr. Mechur regarding communication with the community about how equity fund money is being used, but felt posting to the website was not enough. She wondered if there would be a need to use the \$60,000 reserve for schools not meeting AYP. Mr. Cuneo said that could happen, but suggested waiting until the board received more information.

Dr. Escarce MOVED to approve the item, except for the middle school allocation until the board received more information on the goals of the Middle School Initiative. Dr. Escarce withdrew motion, and the board agreed to postpone action until after Item No .D.01.

Following discussion on Item No. D.01, Dr. Escarce reinstated his motion.

DISCUSSION ITEM NO. D.01

The California Department of Education recently released its Accountability Progress Reports (APR) for the state, districts and schools. The APR is a comprehensive system for monitoring academic achievement and is comprised of both state and federal accountability reports.

The state monitors accountability via the Academic Performance Index (API). The API is a composite number representing the results of The California Standards Tests (CST), the California Modified Assessment (CMA), the California Alternate Performance Assessment (CAPA) and passage rates on the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE). The amount of emphasis each type of test and each content area carries is determined by statewide test weights and by the number of students taking each type of test.

Federal results are reported in terms of how well schools and districts meet Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) criteria. The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) requires that all schools and districts meet the same academic targets, regardless of their baseline levels of performance. The AYP targets increase until 2013-14 when 100 percent of students are to be performing at the proficient level or above on statewide tests. The AYP criteria include both participation rates and performance levels in English language arts and math. For elementary and middle schools, performance levels are determined by the CST, CMA and CAPA results for all students in grades two through eight. For high schools, AYP performance levels are determined by proficiency rates on CAHSEE and CAPA for tenth graders only. Additional AYP criteria include meeting API growth targets and graduation rate growth targets.

Schools and districts receiving federal funds under Title I are subject to additional accountability requirements. Those that fail to meet any one of the AYP criteria for two consecutive years are subject to Program Improvement (PI) status. When a school or district is identified for PI, it must provide certain types of required services and/or interventions.

The results of the Accountability Progress Reports for Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District and our sixteen school sites will be reviewed and discussed.

Public Comments:

- *Harry Keiley said that SMMUSD is a high-performing district and that NCLB is flawed.*

Dr. Bradford's handouts can be found under Attachments at the end of these minutes.

Ms. Pye requested Safe Harbor data from previous years. She emphasized the need for a specific and comprehensive plan to address missed AYP goals.

Dr. Bradford explained possible strategies for not only improving AYP, but also serving all students who did not meet their targets. Dr. Escarce warned against arbitrarily throwing various programs at a problem. Dr. Bradford and the board agreed.

Dr. Chou commented that Will Rogers's administration is meeting with site staff to examine how their reading teachers could be deployed to better serve the students.

Ms. Leon-Vazquez wondered what the district could do to increase parent/family involvement in student learning.

Mr. de la Torre suggested staff come back with recommendations for a specific plan to meet the targets and prevent Program Improvement Status.

DISCUSSION ITEM NO. D.02

This discussion item is to allow the Board of Education to hear an update from staff regarding enrollment and staffing data at each site, as of Wednesday, September 15, 2010.

The first day of the fall semester was on Tuesday, September 7, 2010. During the first ten days of each fall semester, the sites conduct a physical count of each student in each classroom at each site (counts fluctuate daily). This data is compared with registration and projections, allowing the district to better manage the actual enrollment numbers. Having accurate enrollment information helps administrators ensure that staffing levels are appropriate and that class sizes are balanced. This report reflects the cumulative information from the day school started through September 15th. Enrollment data will continue to change and updates will be available to the board as requested.

Ms. Moore Washington's presentation can be found under Attachments at the end of these minutes.

Mr. Allen asked about Malibu High School's smaller class sizes. Ms. Moore Washington explained that a smaller high school can offer more challenging master scheduling. Dr. Escarce wondered the average number of classes taken by students at Samohi versus MHS. He also wondered about average class size in non-core classes, such as art. Mr. Allen requested more information about class size at Lincoln Middle School.

Dr. Escarce asked about updates on LAUSD's plans regarding its permit policy. Ms. Freedman said the most recent information from LAUSD suggested it would indeed revise its policy. She also mentioned that the state was considering the Romero Bill/Open Enrollment Act, which would allow a pupil enrolled in a "low achieving school" to enroll in a high performing school anywhere in the state. This could potentially impact SMMUSD's interdistrict permit process.

The Governing Board recognizes the importance of community support of district programs, including voluntary financial contributions, to assist the district in achieving its goals for student learning.

The Board desires to work cooperatively with the educational foundation in determining the purposes for which funds may be used to meet the changing needs of the district and its students. The Board recognizes that an educational foundation is a separate legal entity, independent of the district. However, the foundation is encouraged to provide regular reports to the Board on the status of its work and to communicate ways that the district can help support the foundation's activities.

With the consent of the Superintendent or designee, the educational foundation, as appropriate, may use the district's name, a school's name, a school team's name, or any logo attributable to a school or the district.

The Board supports foundation allocations that serve all district schools equitably.



Overview of APR

State Accountability Requirements

- The Academic Performance Index (API), California's accountability system, measures the performance and progress of a school or district based on results of the CST, CMA, CAPA and CAHSEE exams.
- A school's API is a composite number representing the results of these tests.
- The test results used in calculating the API have different relative emphases based on content area weights given to each type of test.

Base and Growth APIs

- The API is a numeric index ranging from **200** to **1000**.
- In order to allow for phase-in of new indicators or changes in assessments, each annual API reporting cycle includes a Base and a Growth API.
- The Base API starts the reporting cycle and is released approximately a year after testing.

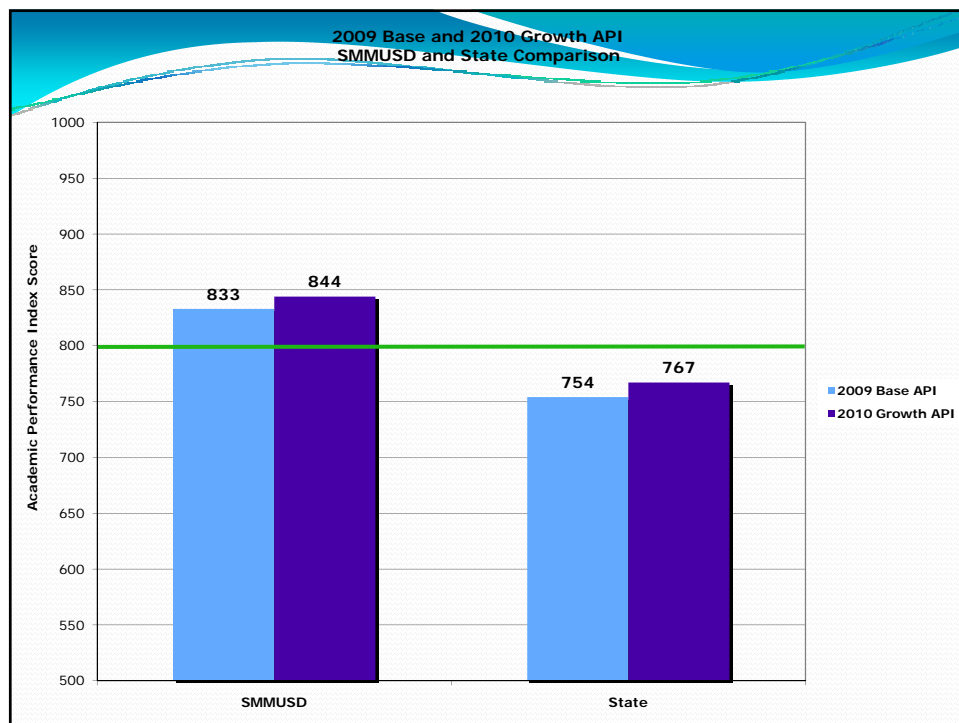
- The Growth API, released after the Base, is calculated in exactly the same way and with the same indicators as the prior year Base, but with test results from the following year.
- The 2010 Growth API is based on the Spring 2010 test results.

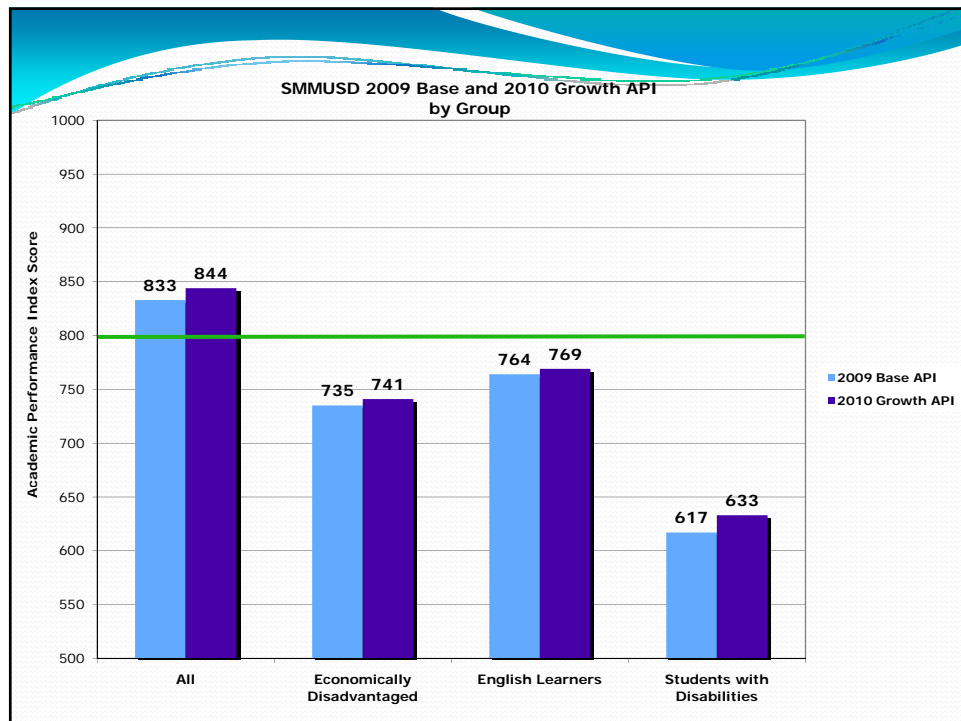
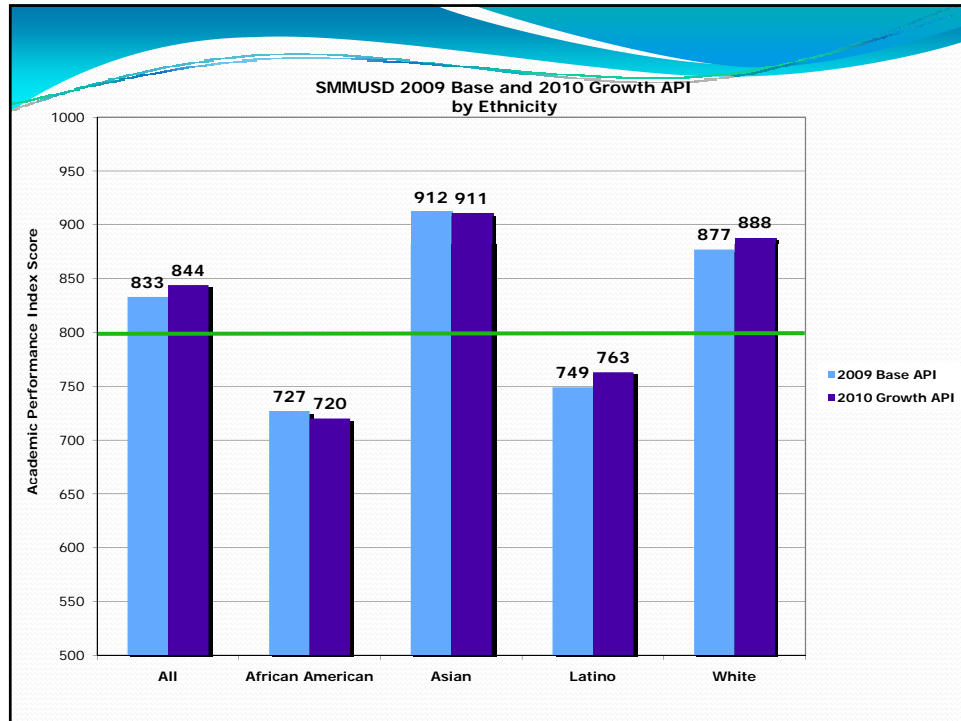

API School Growth Targets

- Growth targets are not applied at the district level.

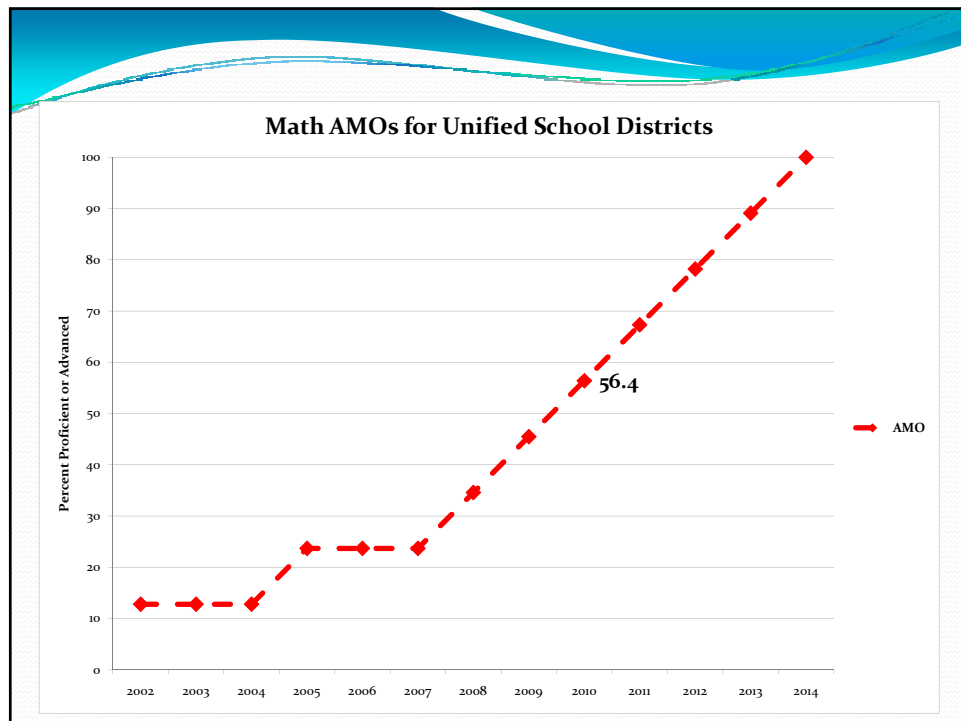
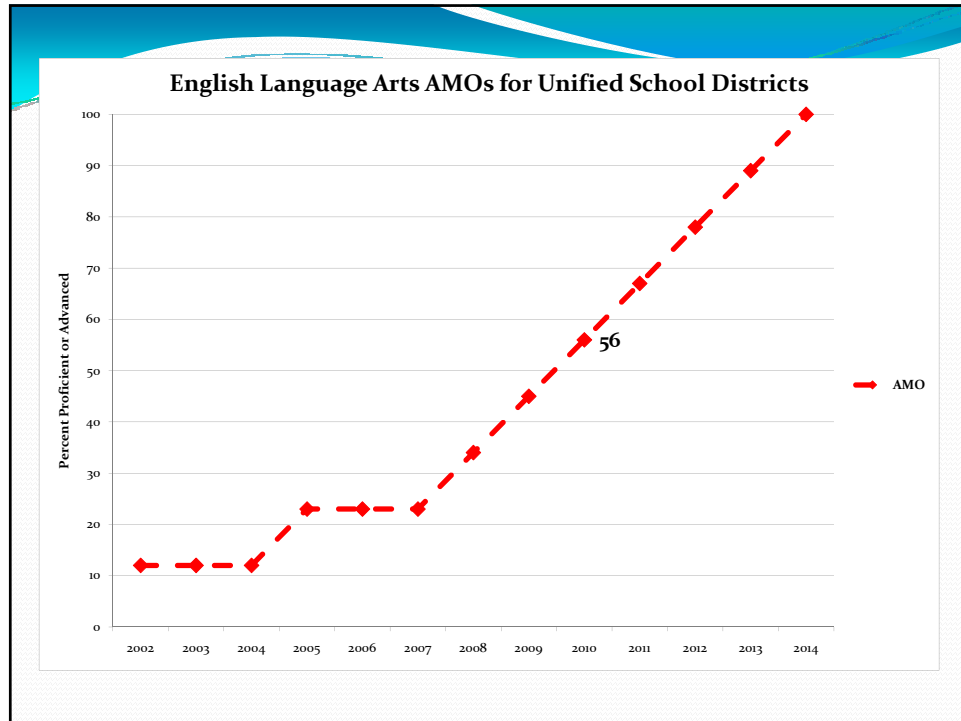
Federal Accountability Reports

- Federal accountability focuses on how well schools and districts are meeting common standards of academic performance.
- The ultimate objective for schools and districts under ESEA is for 100 percent of students to achieve proficiency in English language arts and mathematics by 2013-14.

Federal Accountability Proficiency Rates

- Combined CST, CMA and CAPA percent proficient for grades 2 – 8 in ELA
- Combined CST, CMA and CAPA percent proficient for grades 2 – 8 in Math
- Combined CAHSEE* and CAPA percent proficient for grade 10 in ELA

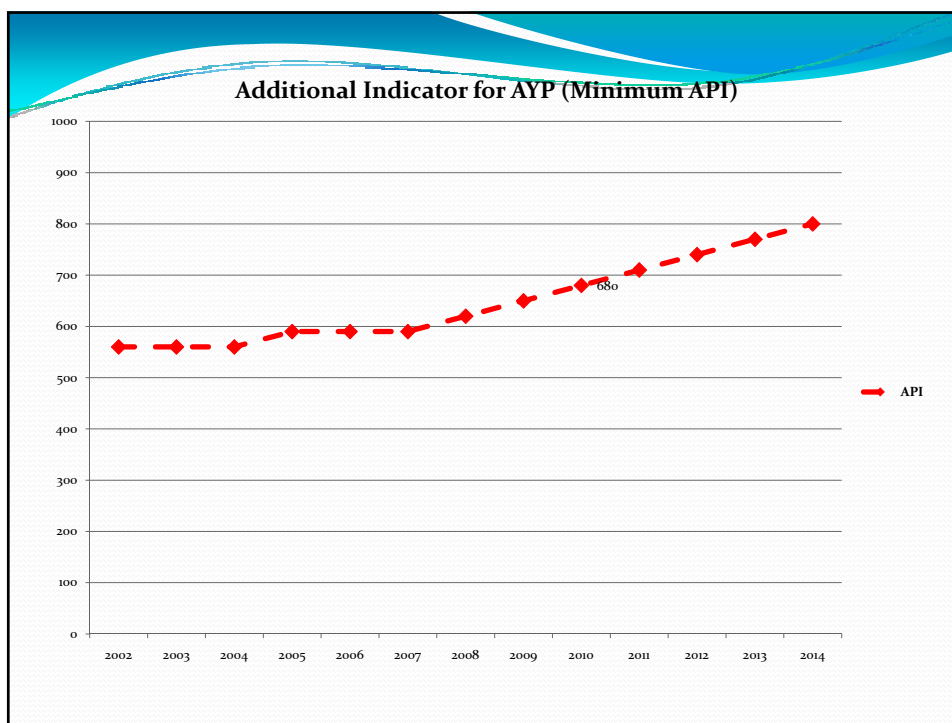

- Numerically significant groups and their proficiency rates will change once new race/ethnicity corrections are posted.
- For STAR reporting purposes, students with missing race/ethnicity were counted as “two or more races”
- For AYP purposes, students with missing race/ethnicity were not counted in any particular racial/ethnic subgroup!
- For schools that hadn’t made race/ethnicity corrections prior to Pre-ID, this may affect Latino and/or White student groups.

Graduation Growth Rate Targets

- Goal is to reach 100% by 2019

 - Meet 2010 Target of 90%
 - OR
 - Meet Growth Target by calculating the distance between 2009 rate and 2019 goal and divide by 10 to get a yearly target
- 2010 Graduation Rates (based on class of 2009) have not yet been released
- 2009 Graduation Rate (based on class of 2008) for SMMUSD was 91.1%

Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP)

- Depending on number of significant groups, there are up to “46 ways to fail” AYP
- A miss in any one of the criteria constitutes missing AYP for the year.

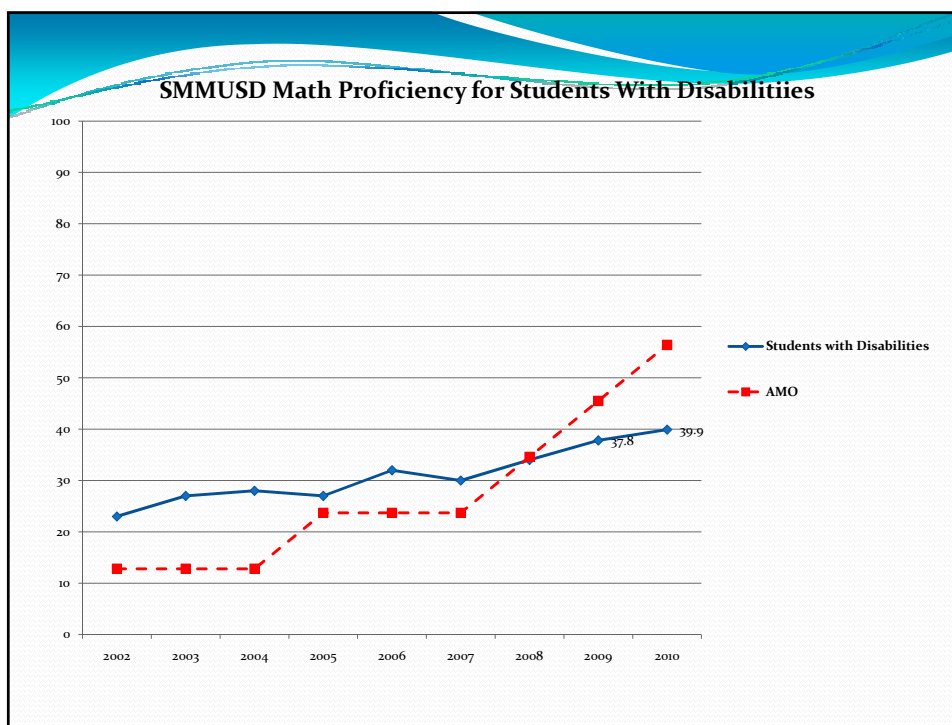

Safe Harbor

- Safe harbor is an alternate method of meeting the AMOs.
- If a school, district, or a subgroup shows progress in moving enough students from scoring below proficient to proficient, it may make AYP if all of the following conditions are met:
 - Percent of students performing **below** the proficient level in either ELA or math **decreased** by at least **10 percent** from the preceding school year
 - Met 2010 AYP participation rate
 - Met API criteria
 - Met graduation rate criteria, if applicable
- It doesn't matter how you meet AYP, so long as you meet it!

District AYP: Grade Span Targets

- Districts must meet AMOs for all subgroups in *at least one* of their grade spans
 - Grades 2 through 5
 - Grades 6 through 8
 - Grade 10

2010 Grade Span Reports

- No grade span met the all of their AMOs in 2010
- That means SMMUSD did not meet AYP in 2010.
- This is our first miss of AYP as a district.
- A second year miss in 2011 would place the district into Program Improvement status for 2012.

Implications for SMMUSD

- **IF** we were to miss AYP for 2011 and enter Program Improvement in 2012 we would be required to:
 - Notify all parents of our Program Improvement status
 - Convene a district team with representation of all stakeholders to analyze achievement data
 - Conduct school and district self-assessment
 - Identify specific academic areas for improvement
 - In consultation with parents and school staff, write an addendum to our LEA Plan
 - Implement the LEA Plan Addendum
 - Reserve at least 10% of Title I funds for professional development

Program Improvement for Schools

- Program Improvement status at the school level applies only to schools receiving Title I funds.
- Program Improvement status applies only to Title I schools that have missed AYP for two years in a row in the same subject area.
- None of our Title I schools missed AYP in 2009.
- None of our Title I schools are in Program Improvement for the current school year.
- One of our Title I schools, however, is at risk for Program Improvement in 2012 if AYP is missed again this year (2011).

Title III Accountability

- Title III of Elementary and Secondary Education Act provides supplemental funding to districts in order to implement programs for English Learners.
- With Title III funding comes additional accountability requirements known as Annual Measurable Achievement Objectives (AMAOs)

- AMAO 1: Increase in the percent of English learners making progress in attaining English, according to the California English Language Development Test (CELDT)
- AMAO 2: Increase in the percent of English learners re-classified as Fluent English Proficient (R-FEP)
- AMAO 3: Meet AYP proficiency criteria for English learners in English language arts and mathematics, according to CST, CMA and CAPA results for grades 2 – 8, and CAHSEE or CAPA results for grade 10.

- This notification will go out to parents in English and Spanish prior to October 13.
- A second miss in 2011, would require the development of an improvement plan that will ensure AMAOs are met.

State Accountability Summary

- District-wide and at nearly every school, our Academic Performance Index continues to climb.
 - **844** for District overall
 - All but three schools now **over 800**
- API for numerically significant groups demonstrate continued achievement gaps, though there is some narrowing for groups over time.

Federal Accountability Summary

- The District missed meeting Adequate Yearly Progress in 2010 for the first time.
- A second miss for 2011 would place the district in Program Improvement Status 2012.
- Will Rogers, a Title I school, missed AYP for 2010.
- A second miss for 2011 would place the school in Program Improvement Status for 2012.
- The District also missed one of its AMAOs for Title III accountability for the first time.
- Families of English learners must be notified.

Challenges for 2010-11:

- The AMO and AMAO bars continue to rise each year.
- The Educational Services Department is committed to supporting all of our sixteen schools and the students they serve.
- State, district and site level data are tools for continuous improvement.
- Our work with principals and teachers is focused on providing targeted curriculum support, instructional leadership and professional development where needs are greatest.
- We are taking a pro-active approach to the possibility of accountability sanctions in 2012.

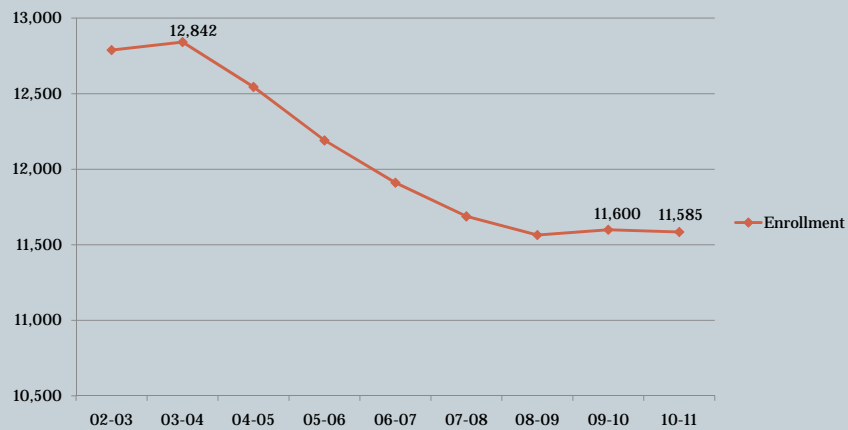
Enrollment and Staffing 2010-11

Enrollment – 2004 to 2010

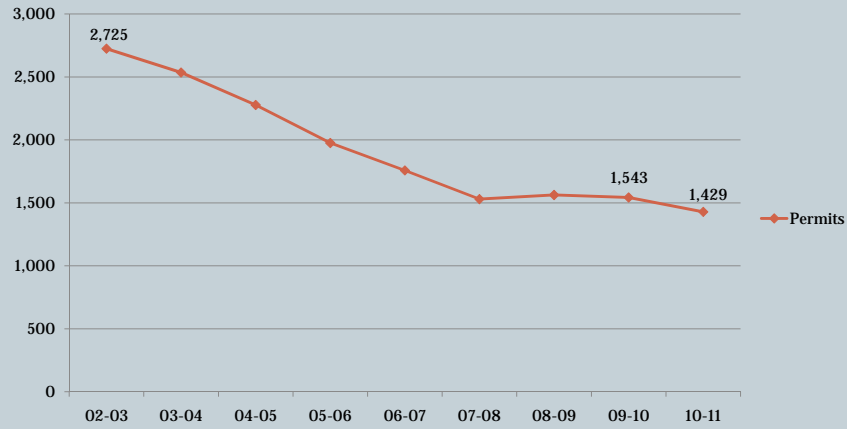

Interdistrict Permits – 2002 to 2010

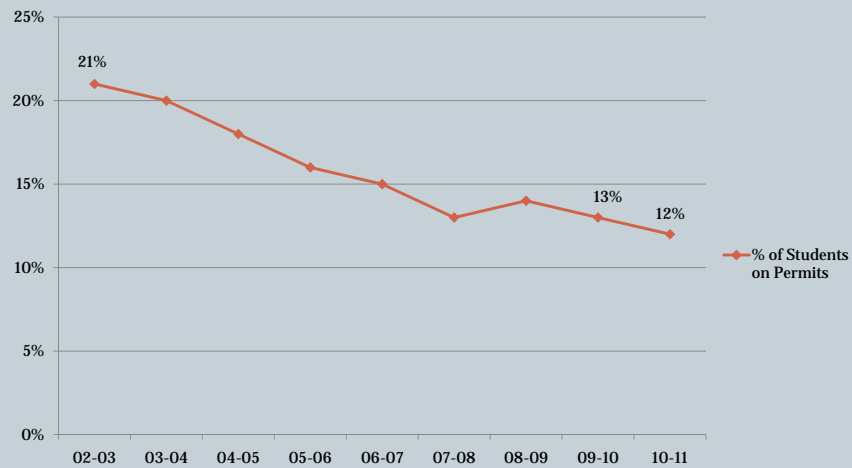

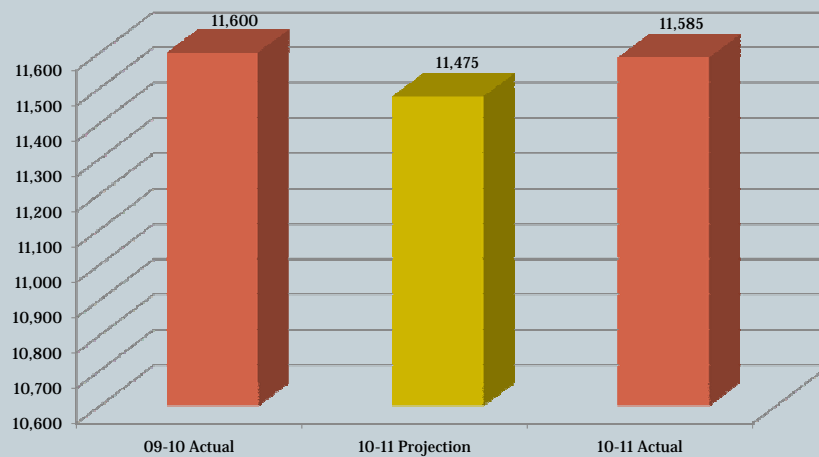

Enrollment Projections vs. Actuals

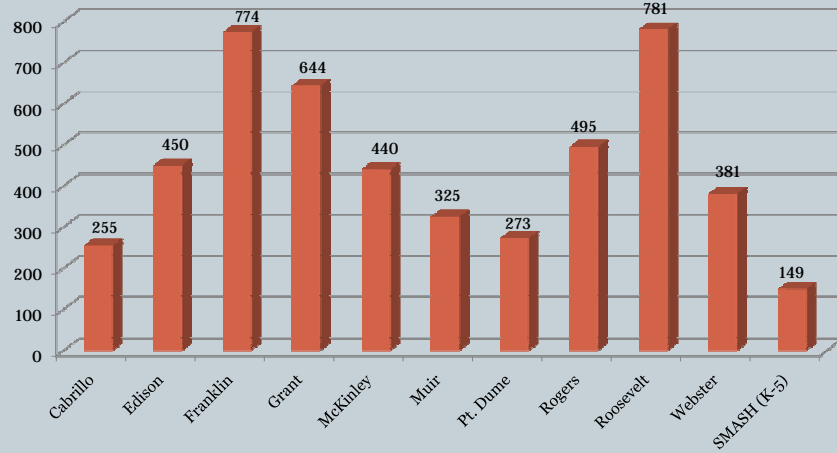

Enrollment – Elementary Schools

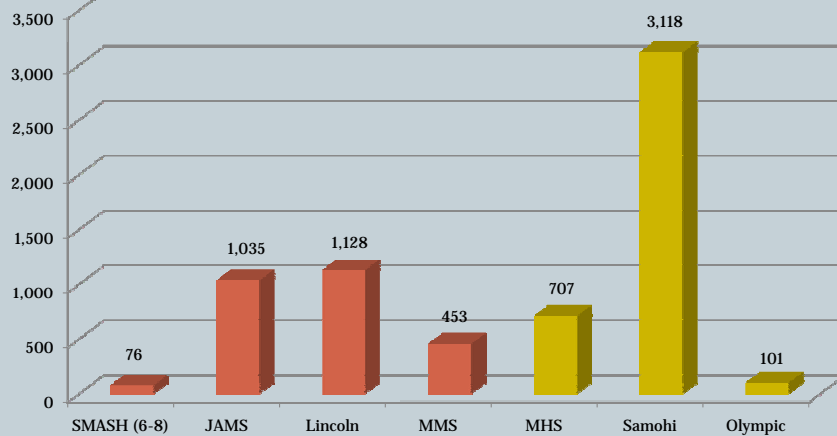

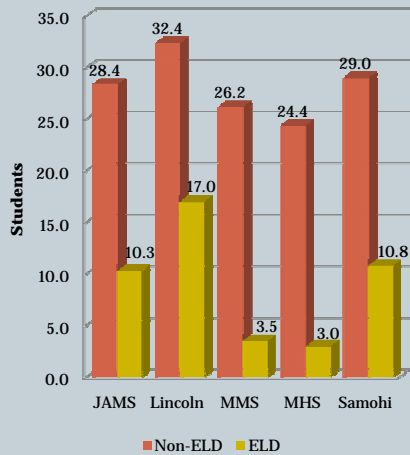

Average Class Size in Core Subject Areas

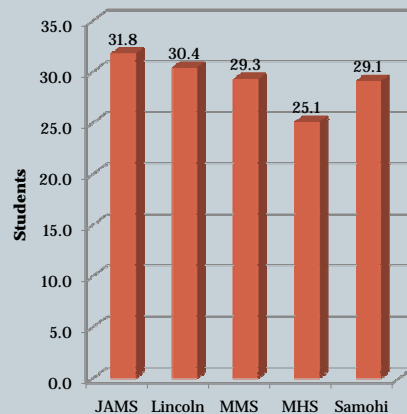

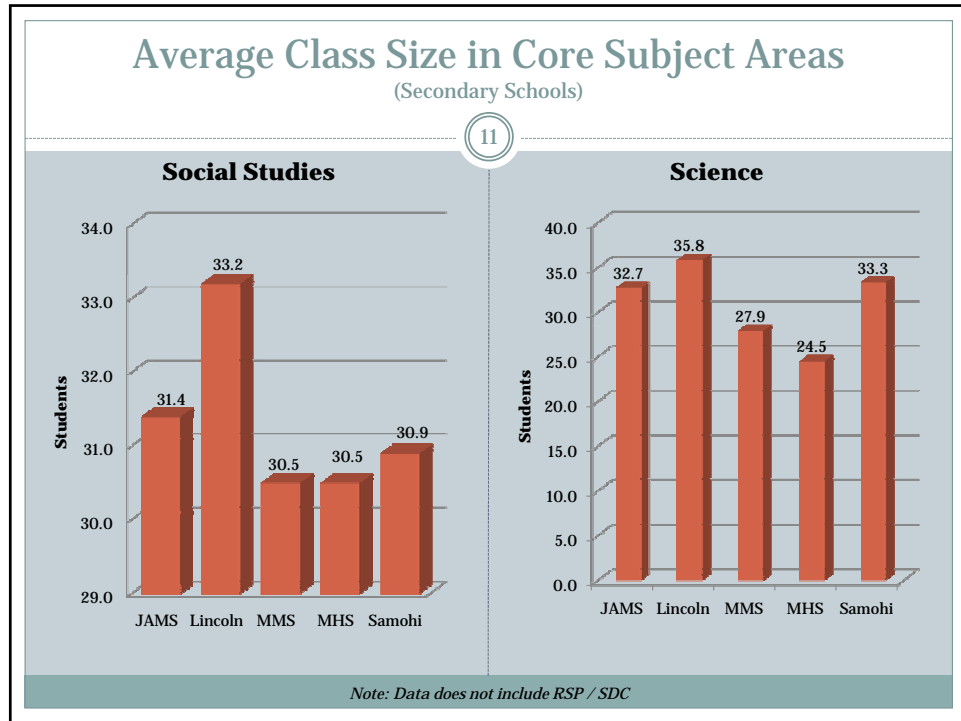
