#### A. Student Board Member Reports (15)

Tanya Choo - Santa Monica High School - no report

#### Elizabeth Wilson - Malibu High School

Student Board Member Wilson reported that ASB is busy planning for activities during the week of Homecoming as well as facilitating and promoting the magazine drive. ASB students participated in a food tasting on Monday. They enjoyed the event and appreciated having the opportunity to survey and taste the food options. ASB is also working with the Board of Education candidates this Tuesday to plan a debate at the high school.

School spirit has increased and more students are attending the athletic games. The Malibu High School Operation Smile Club received the Outstanding Operation Smile Student Club of the Year Award at the 2010 International Student Leadership Conference held at the University of Denver in Colorado this past August. In the past six years, the club has raised over \$75,000 – enough to fund 312 surgeries.

Mr. Allen asked if the school's ASB had discussed the Point Dume Marine Science Charter School petition. Ms. Wilson said they hadn't, since they were preoccupied with Homecoming. She is, however, trying to get the ASB to discuss district-related issues.

#### **Billy Foran – Olympic High School**

Student Board Member Foran updated the board regarding the Olympics' WASC accreditation; the school received a six-year accreditation.

There have already been four guest speakers on campus so far this semester. Terry McCarthy, a foreign correspondent from CBS, who presented a report on soldiers training dogs to sniff out bombs in Iraq. Marsha Moutrie, City Attorney for the City of Santa Monica, and Terry White, Chief Deputy City Attorney, discussed sexism, racism, and ageism in the workplace in honor of Constitution Day. Just yesterday, 1983 graduate SMPD Captain Dan Salerno presented to the Criminal Justice class. The school has a new School Resources Officer, Carlos Jean. Officer Jean is now working with Officer Stockwell.

Mr. Foran congratulated teachers Mr. Fuller and Ms. Alexander for receiving the 2010 Academic Enrichment Grant from the Education Foundation. The award will fund the Astronomy Project and the Digital Photography and Graphic Design classes. On September 5, the Red Cross mobile bus visited the campus for a blood drive. Over forty faculty, staff, and students donated blood. This year, Olympic applied for the model continuation school designation through the California Department of Education. The application passed the first level of screening and representatives will be visiting the school on October 19. Mr. Foran invited board members to attend the visit.

#### B. SMMCTA Update – Mr. Harry Keiley (5)

Ms. Liz Cowgill delivered Mr. Keiley's report. Her presentation can be found under Attachments at the end of these minutes. She thanked management, parents, and students for participating in the SOS campaign, especially Martha Simons at Roosevelt Elementary School. SMMCTA supports the City of Santa Monica's Propositions Y and YY on the November 2 ballot. Union members have been phone banking and precinct walking. The union also made a campaign donation. Union leadership will being sending out a survey to its members with questions about class size, student test scores being included in teacher evaluations, layoffs based on seniority, etc. She said the survey would be sent out on September 20, and results should be in before Thanksgiving. The survey is anonymous. Dr. Escarce suggested asking the members to choose their age group on the survey. Mr. Allen wondered how teachers would answer questions comparing cuts to certificated staff based on various reasons. Dr. Escarce thought this was a good idea, and said he knew individuals who could help the union leadership craft those questions. Ms. Cowgill said the union will be meeting with the district to discuss future school year calendars, including the beginning of the school year, the length of winter and spring breaks, etc. There was a membership meeting at Malibu High School last week to discuss the Point Dume Marine Science Charter School petition, including how it could affect the other Malibu high schools, tenure, etc.

#### D. PTA Council – Shari Davis (5)

Ms. Davis reported that the PTA Council Special Education Committee's Parent Resource Network will be holding a parent training this month. The committee has a meeting on October 20 and another on October 27 for Spanish-speaking parents. The PTA continues its advocating at all levels for arts education, including holding the annual Reflections program during which K-12 students express themselves artistically. Last year, one of SMMUSD's students won an award at the Reflections state convention. The California state PTA has come out with a statement of dismay in response to the recent proposed state budget and \$3 billion in cuts to education. The PTA believes these cuts show a disregard for the health and welfare of children in our state. Last night, the PTA Council and League of Women Voters cosponsored a candidate event for citizens to inform themselves before they vote on November 2. The State of Our Schools report will be held on October 25 and 26; it is cosponsored by the district, PTA, and CEPS. The PTA is also focusing on helping the Propositions Y and YY campaign, which could generate important revenue for SMMUSD. The PTAs have donated \$70,000 to the campaign so far. Ms. Davis said it is a paramount urgency to generate and motivate volunteer hours before the election. Phone banking volunteers can come to the campaign headquarters at 3000 Ocean Park Boulevard. Precinct walking will occur on October 23, 24, and 30.

Ms. Pye reported that SEDAC, at its meeting last night, expressed its gratitude for the work of the PTA Special Education Committee. Mr. de la Torre asked how many parents were in the Parent Resource Network. Ms. Davis said she would get that data.

#### 6:36 pm X. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT (5)

Superintendent Cuneo reminded everyone that the State of Our Schools event, which is a partnership with the PTA Council and CEPS, will be held on October 25 in Santa Monica and October 26 in Malibu.

He was invited to a meeting at Pepperdine regarding a workforce housing project in Malibu to discuss potential accommodations for employees of Pepperdine, the City of Malibu, and the school district.

There will be a board workshop on Monday, October 11 from 5:00-7:00pm at the district office. The board will be provided with an update on BB project communications throughout the district.

There was a taste test for students at Malibu High School last week during which students had the opportunity to test food from eight vendors. The Food and Nutrition Services Department received positive feedback from students. There will be a similar event for PTA Council members and board members on November 3 at Santa Monica High School.

The Middle School Task Force will hold a workshop on October 23 at the PDLC. The morning portion will include staff and members of site councils and PTAs at the middle schools. The afternoon portion would be for staff and administration. The workshop will be facilitated by ASCD.

Mr. Cuneo said it was great that Olympic High School is being considered as a model continuation high school. The community is also invited to attend.

Mr. Mechur expressed his concern that the Middle School Task Force workshop was being held on the same day as a Prop Y and YY precinct walk. Mr. Cuneo replied that those who would like to attend both can volunteer in the afternoon on the 23<sup>rd</sup>.

 Advise the Board of Education about attitudes, opinions, and issues significant to the Special Education community.

#### Activities to meet this goal:

- o Continue the practice of posting and holding monthly meetings that are open to the public, and will provide Spanish translation when needed.
- Increase public awareness of the existence of the SEDAC as a mechanism that facilitates a flow of information to the Board that the community deems important.
- Within the bounds of the Brown Act, meetings will allow for flexibility in engaging DAC Staff Liaison and other administrative staff in attendance regarding information brought to the committee by the public and members of SEDAC.
- Continue to generate meeting Minutes in a timely and accurate fashion for public examination through the District website.
- Continue the practice of rotating meeting locations to include school sites to assure district-wide outreach to Special Education staff and parents.
- Work to restore the practice of providing childcare during monthly meetings in order to increase the diversity of public participation.
- Continue the recent successful practice of creating time-limited Ad Hoc committees to address thoughtfully issues that rise to a level of importance.
- Continue to work with District staff in the identification of relevant and unrealized goals included in the recommendations of the Working Group (2009), the Lou Barber Report (2008), and the Special Education Strategic Plan (2004).

#### Activities to meet this goal:

- Continue work with senior administrative staff on the Program Task Force, which carries forth recommendations from the Working Group. Assist in crafting the initial report and defining implementation of recommendations that come from the Task Force work.
- Continue to use the Barber report as a baseline resource to analyze spending trends in Special Education and in the ongoing improvement of instructional program as taken up by the Working Group's Program Task Force work.
- Refer to the content of the Special Education Strategic Plan to inform the work of the Program Task Force content, particularly in the areas of reading, mathematics, and Autism Spectrum Disorder.
- Continue Work of Ad Hoc Committee for Transition (elementary to middle school, middle school to high school, post high school).
- O Work toward the creation of a parent support group in the community. SEDAC can support this group in a variety of ways, such as SEDAC members attending meetings to help with facilitation or provision of information, bringing recurring issues back to SEDAC for examination, etc. This activity is placed under this particular charge, because it essentially addresses the issue of 'culture', which was a central theme of all 3 reports referenced this charge.
- Through the Special Education Parent Handbook Ad Hoc Committee, produce revisions to the Special Education Parent Handbook in collaboration with District staff based on changes in relevant law, District updates and feedback from community members.

#### Activities to meet this goal:

- Despite the positive reception to the Special Education Parent Handbook, two areas are notably left undone: Transition and Preschool. Ad Hoc committees will be convened to expand on these areas in collaboration with staff in a manner similar to the production of the initial Handbook. Further discussion is required to determine if a new edition of the handbook will be published or if the information will be issued as an addendum on the District website.
- Distribution of the Handbook needs to be improved and the committee will work with staff to determine ways in which this will be done.
- Review and assess the instructional technology in the District's Special Education
  Classes and report on how our District compares to districts that prioritize technology
  and utilize technology based curriculum and whether additional/updated equipment
  and/or software is needed to enable students to become computer literate and allow
  students and teachers meaningful access to current technology-based curricula. <u>The</u> Ad
  Hoc Committee will <u>continue</u> to fulfill this charge, including financial impact.

#### Activities to meet this goal:

- Continue to <u>survey and develop</u> inventory of hardware, software and other technology now available to special education teachers and students in the district
- Continue to explore ways to upgrade the district's technology and bring new tech into the district
- Continue the Financial Ad Hoc Committee's work with the Director of Special Education, the District's Chief Financial Officer and the Financial Oversight Committee in developing recommendations.

#### Activities to meet this goal

Continue last year's collaboration with the district's Chief Financial Officer (CFO), Director of Special Education, and Chief Academic Officer to analyze Special Education expenditures. This will be aided by the newly developed internal report that the CFO will generate on Special Education that will parallel District's overall budget cycle and reporting. This work will be done in conjunction with the District's Financial Oversight Committee.

#### **RECOMMENDATION NO. A.18**

It is recommended that the Board of Education receive the Point Dume Marine Science Charter School Petition.

<u>COMMENTS</u>: Education Code 47605(b) sets forth the process for consideration of a petition to establish a charter school and provides that within 30 days of the governing board's receipt of a charter petition, the board must hold a public hearing on the provisions of the charter proposal, at which time the governing board of the district shall consider the level of support for the petition by the teachers employed by the district, other employees of the district, and parents.

The statute further provides that the governing board must make a determination whether to grant or deny the charter petition within 60 days of its receipt of the petition.

The Board receives the Point Dume Marine Science Charter School petition on October 7, 2010, and will consider the petition according to the following schedule: On November 4, 2010, a public hearing shall be held on the provisions of the charter, at which time the governing board of the school district shall consider the level of support for the petition by teachers employed by the district, other employees of the district, and parents; on December 6, 2010, the Board will determine whether it will grant or deny the charter petition.

A copy of the full petition is available for review in the Superintendent's Office.

#### Public Comments:

 Ali Thonson, Janelle Ruley, Karen Farrer, Laura Rosenthal, Anne Payne, Sadie Barish, Roohi Stack, Marty King, Suzy Forman, Amy Young, Jeff Mazzarella, Cecilia Loftus, and Marlo Hartsuyker addressed the board regarding the petition review timeline.

Ms. Leon-Vazquez recommended moving the Dec. 6 action date to Nov. 29 or 30. Dr. Escarce asked if staff could complete a thorough review if the date is moved up. Mr. Cuneo said in order for staff to complete a comprehensive report to allow the board to make an informed decision takes a considerable amount of time, considering there are sixteen elements staff must analyze. He said staff might be able to meet a Dec. 2 action date, but that between now and then there are holidays and furlough days. Board members said they understood the timeline concerns of both parties. Ms. Pye asked if other resources could be brought in to help evaluate the petition, such as LACOE. Mr. Cuneo said outside groups had not expressed interest in helping to review the petition. He added that if the board rejected the petition, the appeal would go to LACOE; therefore, in order to prevent a potential conflict of interest, LACOE would not be available to assist in the review of the petition.

The chart below compares the library staffing levels at the district's schools for the 2009-10 and 2010-11 years. As a result of the 2010-11 budget process, the board reduced all elementary library coordinators, 1 FTE librarian, and 3 classified Library Assistants. In August, the board was able to reinstate the elementary library coordinators as a result of Save Our Schools Campaign funding. Staffing of the elementary libraries was one of the three goals of the campaign.

#### Public Comments:

• Susan Bodok, Dana Bart-Bell, Petra Wolfe, and Kelly Urtz addressed the board regarding this item.

Ms. Moore Washington outlined the difference between a librarian assistant and a library coordinator. Dr. Chou explained that the district office library coordinator helped organize the elementary library coordinators.

Ms. Leon-Vazquez asked how much it would cost to restore the above positions. Ms. Moore Washington replied it would cost approximately \$180,000 to bring back the three library assistants and approximately \$275,000 to restore every position listed in the chart.

Dr. Escarce said the three library assistants and .5 FTE librarian should be reinstated using funds from the federal Education Jobs Act, since the district is scheduled to receive more funds than originally estimated. He added that if the .5 FTE librarian position could not be filled, staff should instead reinstate the 1 FTE librarian. The board agreed.

#### DISCUSSION ITEM NO. D.03

In the fall of 2008, the Board of Education established the Exceptional Latino Educator Award to be awarded in conjunction with national Hispanic/Latino Heritage Month, which is recognized every year from September 16 through October 16.

Since then, the board has presented the award to two Latino educators, one in 2008 and one in 2009. This year, the nomination form was emailed to site principals during the late summer with the request that they nominate exceptional Latino educators from their schools. Once the forms had been received, a subcommittee of the board was to select a recipient to receive the award at an October board meeting.

To date, only one nomination form has been submitted to the Superintendent's office. As a result, the board has requested this discussion item to determine the best way to move forward. Below are possible options for recognizing educators:

- Extend the timing of the award to later in the year, given the busy schedules at the beginning of the school year;
- Expand the concept beyond Exceptional Latino/a Educator of the Year to Exceptional Educator of the Year, and...
  - o Present an award near the end of the school year
  - Ask for nominations from each level (elementary school, middle school, and high school).

This discussion item will allow the board the opportunity to discuss these and other options for recognizing the achievements and efforts of SMMUSD's outstanding educators.

Mr. de la Torre agreed with idea to extend the concept to an Exceptional Educator of the Year Award. He requested that a criteria for nomination be that the person shows a personal commitment to closing the achievement gap. Dr. Escarce and Mr. Allen supported Mr. de la Torre's suggestion. They also supported the Superintendent's suggestion to recognize a person from all three levels.

The board agreed to move the award to the spring.

#### INFORMATION ITEM NO. I.02

Board Policy 5141.4 and the adjoining Administrative Regulation state:

By no later than October 31st of each year, the Superintendent shall inform the public via an Information Item in the Board of Education agenda the number of child abuse reports and the number involving District employees for the previous school year. The Superintendent shall also inform the public that the training for all mandated reporters has been provided. In the event that training is not provided to mandated reporters, the Superintendent shall report to the California Department of Education and the public the reasons that such training has not been provided.

This information item provides the data stipulated by the Board Policy.

All employees of the Santa Monica – Malibu Unified School District are mandated reporters.

"Employees who are mandated reporters, as defined by law and administrative regulation, are obligated to report all known, suspected, or alleged incidents of child abuse and neglect." (SMMUSD Board Policy 5141.4)

During the 2009-10 School Year, 98 suspected child abuse cases were reported. The chart bellows breaks down the reports by type and age.
