The Board will seek applications to fill vacancies on the Committee on an annual basis. Current members whose terms are set to expire may, if in good standing, be recommended for reappointment by the Committee for Board approval after an open interview process has been completed and all applicants considered. All applications received will be reviewed by the FOC, and recommendations regarding FOC members will be forwarded from the Committee to the The FOC is encouraged to recommend more qualified Board. applicants than meet the current demand of the Committee's directives. RECOMMENDATION NO. A.39

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the 2012-13 First Interim Report and the corresponding budget adjustments.

COMMENTS: Education Code (*EC*) Sections §35035 (g), §42130, and §42131 require the governing board of each local educational agency (*LEA*) to certify at least twice a year as to the LEA's ability to meets its financial obligations for the remainder for that fiscal year and for the subsequent two fiscal years.

The 2012-13 Budget was adopted by the Board of Education on June 25, 2012 and was approved by the Los Angeles County Office of Education *(LACOE)*.

This 1st Interim Report reflects changing conditions that have necessitated adjusting the District budget. All of the expenditure and revenue changes previously approved by the Board at the meeting of November 15, 2012 are identified in the First Interim Report which is included as a part of this document.

The First Interim Report was developed based on the following Revenue and Expenditure Assumptions.

REVENUE ASSUMPTIONS

3.24% statutory Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) is applied to the 2012-13 Revenue Limit funding before applying the deficit.

The Base Revenue Limit for Santa Monica-Malibu USD will be \$6,844.99 per ADA (2011-12 Revised P2 ADA – 10,926.91). A <22.272%> deficit factor is applied to the Revenue Limit, and the adjusted Based Revenue Limit will be \$5,286.16 per ADA. These per student numbers are the same as the Adopted Budget. The total Revenue Limit is \$58,884,580.

The 2012-13 District Enrollments for all students is 11,401 up from the Budget number of 11,344.

The Lottery allocation will be \$154 per annual ADA, of which \$124 is for unrestricted expenditures and the remaining \$30 is for Proposition 20 – Mandated for Instructional Materials.

The District will participate in the K-3 Class Size Reduction Program and receive \$1,071 per pupil, less the penalties for classes above the 20:1 limit. Staffing ratios for K-3 classes in 2012-13 will be: K-1 (25:1); Grade 2-3 Non-Title I (30:1); and Grade 2-3 Title I (25:1).

No COLA for Special Education Funding. Adjusted Special Education funding is \$5,058.43 per ADA from AB602. This amount reflects a reduction in SELPA funding due to the elimination of the statewide Special Disability Adjustment. The Special Education transfer from the Revenue Limit is \$1,219,991.

The District will receive \$306,567 for Mandated Block Grant.

The Measure "R" parcel tax of \$366.45 per parcel is estimated to generate \$10,924,607 after processing the senior exemptions.

The estimated revenue from Prop Y is \$6,380,000 from the City of Santa Monica.

The District will receive \$8,128,198 from the Joint Use Agreement with the City of Santa Monica.

The District will receive \$135,500 from the Joint Use Agreement funding with the City of Malibu.

The combined lease revenue is \$2,270,478 which is from the DoubleTree Hotel, Madison Site, 9th & Colorado and 16th Street properties.

The estimated revenue of Tier III programs is \$4.7M.

Deficit Spending

The multi-year budget projection reflects a pattern of deficit spending of between \$3.8 and \$5.3 million dollars.





RE: RECOMMENDATION FROM THE INTERCULTURAL EQUITY AND EXCELLENCE DAC REGARDING THE VILLAGE NATION PROGRAM

PUBLIC/DAC ITEM NO. P.01

The Intercultural Equity and Excellence (IEE) DAC recommends that the Board of Education fully funds and implements The Village Nation program at Santa Monica High School for the remainder of the 2012/13 School Year.

COMMENTS: At its meeting on November 19, 2012, the IEE DAC took action to pass this recommendation. During the meeting, Fluke Fluker gave a presentation about The Village Nation program, and he and Dr. Joyce Watts fielded questions from the DAC. Several members of the DAC, as well as members of the community who spoke under "Public Comments," expressed their support of The Village Nation for a variety of reasons that included the following:

- There is concern that African American students are not receiving adequate resources and opportunities to succeed in their educational pursuits at SMMUSD schools.
- There is concern that the "Achievement Gap" is not being properly addressed, and that programs that have been implemented to address it are not receiving the full financial, administrative, and/or logistical support required from the District, dooming them to be less effective.
- There is concern that the District is trying to close the "Achievement Gap" internally, by relying on the same staff, programs and curriculum that have been tried in the past, and by relying on laudable programs initiated by Samohi students to address the problem, while resisting attempts to bring in outside experts and proven programs.
- There is concern that the one assembly that The Village Nation did provide to Samohi students was only permitted to proceed in a venue that was not conducive to the presentation and breakout group work that was required, and that there were significant issues with the audio part of the assembly, thereby crippling its ability to fully engage the students and to be as successful as it could have been.
- In the survey that was conducted after the Assembly, a vast majority of the students and all of the staff elders that participated in the Assembly indicated that they would like to participate in additional Assemblies provided by The Village Nation.
- Some felt that evaluating TVN program now, mid-year, would be premature and unfair
- It was noted that The Village Nation has programs that address and reduce frictions between African American and Latino students that should also be implemented.
- The DAC was reminded that there has been ongoing and sustained support from many members of the community and a few organizations, for well over a year, to bring to bear the full weight of The Village Nation program at Samohi, by fully implementing it.

Rationale

At SMMUSD, there remains a huge gap between the California Standard Test results of African American and Latino students compared to White and Asian students in both English Language Arts and Math scores. The main reason for fully funding and implementing The Village Nation program is that this program is the only program known to the DAC that has actually shown significant gains in test results of African American students, thereby closing the "Achievement Gap", at the high schools where it has been fully implemented.

Our recommendation comes now because a portion of The Village Nation program was brought to SAMOHI this Fall, and it would be a shame to lose the momentum they have gained by not moving in a timely manner to fully fund the entire program so that it's full impact can be gauged. If their contract is not extended immediately, we will never know what impact the program could have had, and we will be unable to achieve the same remarkable results that other schools experienced once they embraced The Village Nation program.

One of the additional benefits of fully implementing The Village Nation program is that African American students will become more likely to get involved in other aspects of campus life and will find more reasons to want to join and become active in campus organizations such as the Black Student Union, the African American Mentor Society and the Black Academia Movement. At least that has been the experience of other high schools that have embraced the program.

Another additional benefit of embracing The Village Nation program is its positive effect on campus climate and the interrelationships between students of various races, ethnicities and backgrounds at the schools where the program has been implemented. According to a UCLA School of Mental Health Project, "Analyses of research suggests that school and classroom climate are significantly related to matters such as student engagement, behavior, self-efficacy, achievement, and social and emotional development, principal leadership style, stages of educational reform, teacher burnout, and overall quality of school life."

The Village Nation does have an amazing record of success at other high schools and we feel that our high schools should be given the same opportunity to benefit from their unique training and assemblies.

We know this is not the solution to the "Achievement Gap", but The Village Nation program could make a huge difference in the social, emotional and academic lives of hundreds of SMMUSD's African American students. Enhancing the self-identity of these students is the key to changing the existing paradigm of low expectations in a significant way. With the full support of the District, and your commitment to an all-out assault on those causes and contributors to the "Achievement Gap" that you have the ability to affect, the gap will close and the problem will diminish year after year.
