A. Student Board Member Reports (15)

Yuri Kawashima – Santa Monica High School

Student Board Member Kawashima reported that the UCLA Blood Drive was on Friday, September 28, and it was a huge success. Although some were turned down due to donation restrictions and despite the fact that the UCLA staff had to leave early due to the closure of the 405 freeway. the campus had roughly 100 people donate. Samohi also had its first Bike it! Day of the year yesterday, presented by the Samohi Solar Alliance. Bike it! Day is a day where students, faculty members, and the community are encouraged to bike, bus, walk, or use any alternative to driving to get to school/work in order to help the environment and effectively reduce car traffic. This Saturday is Samohi's Homecoming Dance from 7:00-11:00pm at the UCLA Ackerman Grand Ballroom. ASB is very excited for it and hope the rest of the school is equally enthusiastic. Following Homecoming week will be the Homecoming Spirit week, consisting of fun themed days: Sports Day on Monday, Twin Tuesday, Western Wednesday, Throwback Thursday, and Blue and Gold Friday. Friday will be the Homecoming Rally and Homecoming football game against Beverly Hills High School. D. PTA Council – Patti Braun (5)

Ms. Braun reported that the PTA Council has been engaged with the education initiatives on the November ballot. PTA has partnered with het Measure ES campaign to explaining the facts of Measure ES and Prop 38 to SMMUSD families. Ms. Braun recently met with Samohi teacher Jenna Gasparino, who is part of civic engagement leadership at the high school, and would like to engage students in the election process. She will now speak with Mr. Block about a similar opportunity for students at Malibu High School. PTA Council cosponsored a Board of Education candidate forum last night. There will be another one on October 17 in Santa Monica. There was a parent education presentation from Jonathon Mooney at Will Rogers about differentiated learning. PTA is cosponsoring helmets and stickers as an incentive to get students to participate. Regarding the centralized fundraising process and the Superintendent's Advisory Group, Ms. Braun said she felt the district and Ed Foundation have done a tremendous job working with and informing the PTA unit presidents. She thanked Linda Greenberg Gross for engaging PTAs in the process.

7:21 pm XI. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT (5)

Superintendent Lyon reported that a microgravity experiment designed by students at Lincoln Middle School and Samohi has been chosen as a real research minilaboratory scheduled to fly on the International Space Station. These students participated in a local Flight Experiment Design Competition that included over 300 competitors and was hosted by the Student Spaceflight Experiments Program. The experiment is entitled, "What is the Effect of Microgravity on the Formation of Silly Putty and How Do the Characteristics of that Silly Putty Differ from the Silly Putty Made on Earth?" Yesterday was Bike It! Walk It! Day at Lincoln Middle School, and will be held tomorrow at John Adams Middle School. Participants, including members of the Santa Monica City Council and the Board of Education, walked and will walk in groups to the sites to support the event. Ms. Lyon thanked board members for attending PTA site meetings this month to inform parents of the facts of Measure ES. There will be a Measure ES FAQ posted on the district's web site,

along with facts on Props. 30 and 38. Last night, Village Nation presented to Samoh's AAPSSSG and BAM parents. The superintendent thanked SEIU and the management team negotiators for spending two days last week in Interest Based Bargaining training. Linda Greenberg Gross and Ms. Lyon have been drafting a Memorandum of Understanding between the district and SMMEF for centralized fundraising. It will be coming forward for board discussion at the October 18 board meeting, along with SMMEF's fundraising plan. The MOU will return for action on November 1. The policy regarding signage and naming will be discussion on November 1 and action on November 15. The Superintendent's Advisory Committee for Centralized Fundraising will begin to prioritize funding at its October 29 meeting. The superintendent reminded everyone that the Santa Monica 5000 is this Sunday at 7:30am at Ocean Park. This fundraiser brings in revenue for SMMUSD's elementary and middle school PE programs and athletic teams. People who are not interested in participating in the race are still encouraged to make a donation.

STUDY SESSION ITEM NO. S.01

This discussion item is to allow the Board of Education to hear an update from staff regarding enrollment and staffing data at each site as of Friday, September 14, 2012

The staffing process begins in February of each school year and continues through the spring and summer. It culminates around the third week of September. Human Resources staff confers with the school sites throughout this period to address staffing needs.

During the first ten days of the fall semester, the sites conduct a physical count of students. Based on these numbers, necessary adjustments are made to help balance classes.

This report presents a general timeline for the staffing allocation process. It will also present enrollment data and provide details on class sizes. More data will be presented at the Study Session.

Ms. Washington's presentation, including class size and permit data, can be found under Attachments at the end of these minutes and online under the link to this agenda.

Mr. Mechur asked about class sizes. Ms. Lyon explained how staffing is decided at elementary schools based on the number of students enrolled per grade level at each school. She added that the master schedule and the existence of single advanced high school classes can have an impact on class size. For example, AP classes might be large to accommodate students when an extra section cannot be added, while a fourth-year foreign language, like Chinese, might have a smaller class size because not all students have persevered through the fourth year. Ms. Leon-Vazquez asked about enrollment timelines. Ms. Washington explained that families enter the district throughout the year, and that Student Services works diligently to try to enroll students in their neighborhood school and/or with siblings. Dr. Kelly explained the process of overflowing students to nearby schools.

DISCUSSION ITEM NO. D.01

Given concerns expressed to the Board of Education that the allocation of Measure ES funds be determined by Malibu community input, staff is recommending the formation of a Malibu Pathways Facilities Committee.

Following up on the board's discussion at its August 1 meeting, staff is working proactively to form a Malibu Pathway Facilities Committee that will ensure community involvement in Measure ES school site facility planning, should the measure pass in November 2012. The purpose of the committee is to enable a group representing all of the Malibu schools to gather input in a coordinated way and help set direction as to how the Malibu-specific allocation in the bond measure would be spent at the Malibu schools. This direction would guide the district's decisions as we comply with the language of the Measure ES bond.

This new Malibu Pathway Facilities Committee will be, in effect, a super-site committee. It would bring together and coordinate the work of the individual sites by prioritizing needs, ensuring collaboration among sites, helping to determine how each site is being used, and contributing input to the architectural teams in terms of schematic designs. This larger committee would determine how the 20% of Measure ES funds set aside for Malibu projects would be allocated among the schools in Malibu. Each site would continue operating its own facilities building committee, as it does currently. The individual site committees will identify the projects that are the priorities for their sites, as they did with Measure BB. This new Malibu Pathway Facilities Committee will coordinate and examine the individual site plans and make a recommendation for Malibu ES projects to a bond advisory committee (similar to the current Measure BB Advisory Committee), which will ultimately submit project recommendations to the Board of Education for approval.

The proposed composition of the committee will be similar to the individual site committees that exist currently – parents, site administrators, site and District office staff, architects, program managers, bond advisory committee liaisons – but will also be expanded to include Malibu City staff, such as representatives from the City administration and/or the Planning Department, and other interested parties, including neighborhood organizations near the schools or citywide organized groups.

Various stakeholders in the Malibu community have expressed interest in the existence of such a committee. Senior staff has made attempts to schedule a meeting with Malibu leaders, but have not yet been able to find a date during which all of the Malibu participants are available. We will continue to try to schedule a meeting. Staff will provide the Board of Education with an update of any changes or updates following that meeting.

The board was informed of this discussion item at the September 20, 2012 meeting.

Public Comments:

• Laura Rosenthal, Craig Foster, Seth Jacobson, and Hans Laetz encouraged the district to establish a JPA, or JPA-like, for these facilities improvement projects.

Ms. Lieberman asked the superintendent to explain why she decided not to pursue a JPA on this matter. Ms. Lyon explained that in a JPA, there are representatives from established organizations. In this case, there is not an established organization with which the district could negotiate. Ms. Lieberman and Mr. Mechur agreed that the committee format proposed by staff would allow for a wider representation of Malibu stakeholders than a JPA would. Mr. Patel reminded everyone that the elected officials on the school board are interested in doing what is best for all the students throughout the entire district, and therefore would not approve facilities improvement projects and plans that were not in the best interest of the students and staff at the sites. In response to the board's discussion, Ms. Lyon said she would provide the board with more information. She said that she and staff would be meeting with some of the Malibu stakeholders tomorrow for a different purpose, but would schedule a future meeting with them to discuss this newly proposed committee, adding that she would need to find out from them what they mean by, "JPA-like." She asked the board how soon they would like this item to return. Ms. Leon-Vazquez suggested staff first meet with the Malibu stakeholders prior to bringing the item back.

In May 2000, the American Civil Liberties Union filed a lawsuit against the State of California claiming that the state had failed in its duty to provide students with equal educational opportunity. That lawsuit, known ad Williams v. State of California, was settled in August 2004. SMMUSD has engaged in several accountability measures in order to comply with the Williams lawsuit settlement. Among the measures is the requirement to inventory all Board of Education-adopted core materials, including: English, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, Foreign Languages, Health, and laboratory science materials.

Assembly Bill 831, Chapter 118, Statutes of 2005, took effect July 25, 2005. AB 831 modified the annual public hearing requirement in Education Code (EC) Section 60119 and modified the expenditure requirements related to Williams instructional materials funds. Under EC Section 60119, the governing board of every local educational agency (LEA) that receives state instructional materials funds must hold an annual public hearing before the end of the eighth week from the first day pupils attend school for that year. At the public hearing, the governing board must make a determination as to whether each pupil in each school has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards and are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board of Education in reading/language arts, mathematics, science, and history-social science. In addition, the definition of sufficiency now provides that each pupil, including each English learner, must have a standards-aligned textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home.

Tonight we will hold the annual public hearing of sufficiency, present our resolution on the adequacy of materials for all students, which includes our compliance and non-compliance with legal guidelines, and propose remedies for our areas of non-compliance. We request that the Board of Education adopt the resolution on the adequacy of materials for all students in the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District.

Education Code Section 60119

Certification of Provision of Standards-Aligned Instructional Materials

Resolution No.12-07 Regarding Sufficiency Or Insufficiency Of Instructional Materials:

WHEREAS, the governing board of Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District, in order to comply with the requirements of Education Code Section 60119 held a public hearing on October 4, 2012 at 5:30 p.m., which is on or before the end of the eighth week of school and which did not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board provided at least 10 days notice of the public hearing posted in at least three public places within the district that stated the time, place, and purpose of the hearing, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board encouraged participation by parents, teachers, members of the community, and bargaining unit leaders (if the district or county office has a bargaining unit) in the public hearing, and;

WHEREAS, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" means that each pupil has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home to complete required homework assignments, and;

WHEREAS, all elementary students have sufficient textbooks and/or instructional materials in the following areas of study: English Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science. and Health.

WHEREAS, secondary students at John Adams Middle School, Lincoln Middle School, Olympic High School and Malibu High School have sufficient textbooks and/or instructional materials in the following areas of study: English Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, Foreign Language, and Health.

WHEREAS, sufficient laboratory science equipment was provided for science laboratory classes offered in grades 9-12, inclusive, and;

WHEREAS, information provided at the public hearing and to the governing board at the public meeting detailed that insufficient textbooks or instructional materials were provided to pupils in the following subjects and grade levels at Santa Monica High School:

Three percent of students at Santa Monica High School lacked textbooks in History/Social Science.

WHEREAS, the above insufficiency resulted for the following reasons:

The number of sections for the new World History AP course was expanded late in the summer. The number of students enrolled in the course exceeded the number of textbooks originally ordered.

THEREFORE, it is resolved that for the 2012-2013 school year, the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District has not provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks and instructional materials consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum framework, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the following actions have been taken to ensure that all students have sufficient textbooks or instructional materials in all subjects that are aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks within two months of the beginning of the school year in which the determination is made.

The additional World History AP textbooks were ordered on August 22, 2012, but are not due to arrive until after the eighth week of school. The publisher has given permission for the teacher to make electronic copies of the textbook material available to students in the interim.

Certification was approved by the local governing board at a public meeting held on October 4, 2012.

THERFORE, it is resolved that for the 2012-2013 school year, the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District has not provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks or instructional materials aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks as specified in Education Code section 60119.

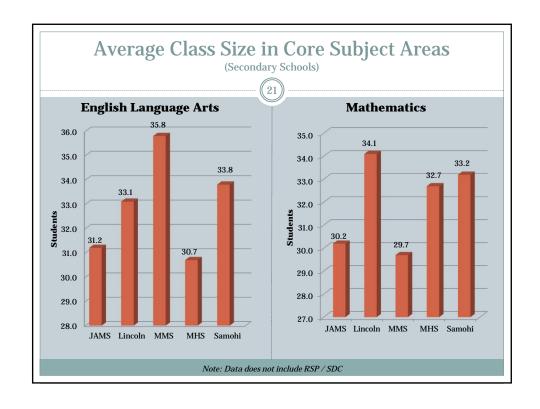

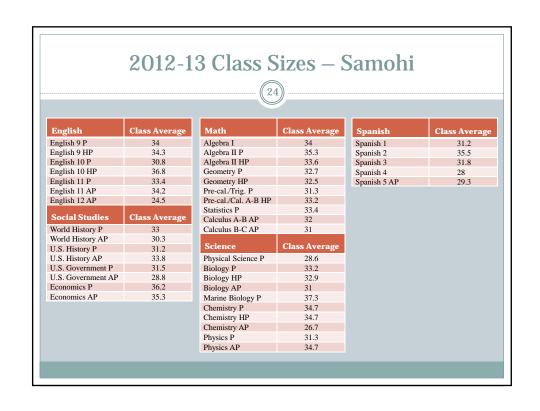








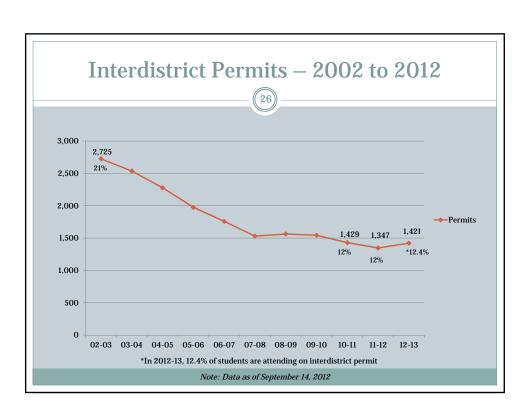




Details on Permits

- 70 permit requests were denied.



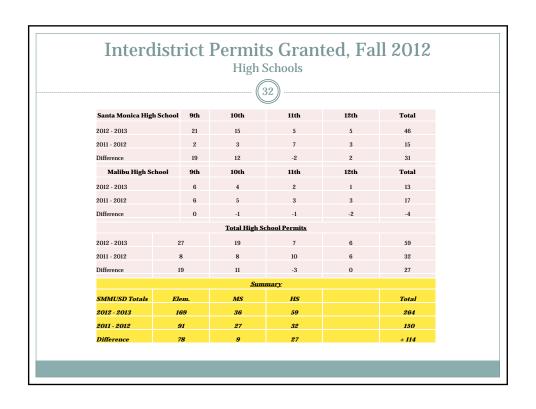

Interdistrict Attendance Revised March 15, 2012

Board Policy 5117, excerpts

 $The \ District \ Board \ of \ Education \ recognizes \ justifiable \ reasons \ for \ interdistrict \ permits.$ Parents must submit verification of continuing enrollment annually.

- D. Final approval of permits for all students, including students needing specialized programs, such as GATE, special education, ELL, etc., shall rest at the district and shall be contingent upon space, budget and staff availability. The district will not pay excess costs to provide specialized services to students on permit.

 E. The district will accept applications for interdistrict permits in grades K through 11. Permits will be granted per the language of section
- 1. The total number of all new interdistrict permits that will be accepted and approved for the 2012-2013 school year will not exceed 300.

 - a. The total number of new permits accepted and approved for kindergarten will not exceed 50.
 b. The total number of new permits accepted and approved for grades 1 through 5 will be issued on a space available basis.
 c. The total number of new permits accepted and approved for John Adams Middle School and Lincoln Middle School for grade 6 will not exceed 10.
 d. The total number of new permits accepted and approved for grades 7 and 8 at John Adams Middle School and Lincoln Middle School will not exceed 10 per grade level.
 e. The total number of permits accepted and approved for grades 9 through 11 at Santa Monica High School will not exceed 20 per grade level.
- e. The total number of permits accepted and approved for grades 9 through 11 at Santa Monica High School will not exceed 20 per grade level.

 2. All students currently attending on an interdistrict permit will be allowed to remain in the district until they leave or graduate, assuming that they submit a verification of continuing enrollment annually and uphold appropriate standards of behavior. attendance, and academic effort. Interdistrict attendance permits for 11th and 12th graders may not be rescinded. It is the intention of the district to provide same-school placement for all siblings in a family once an intradistrict permit has been granted, except in cases where students need a specialized program which is only available on another campus.

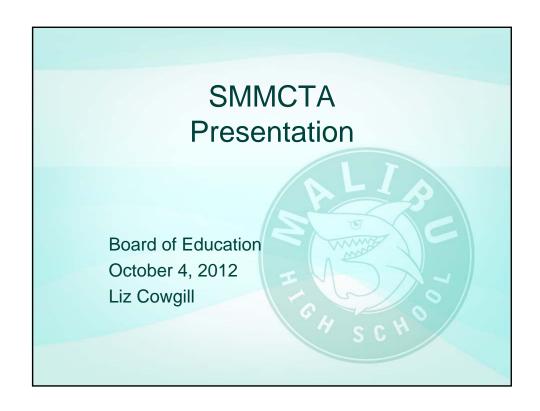
 4. Interdistrict permits are accepted if space, staffing and budget allow, and students meet the criteria in #2 above.

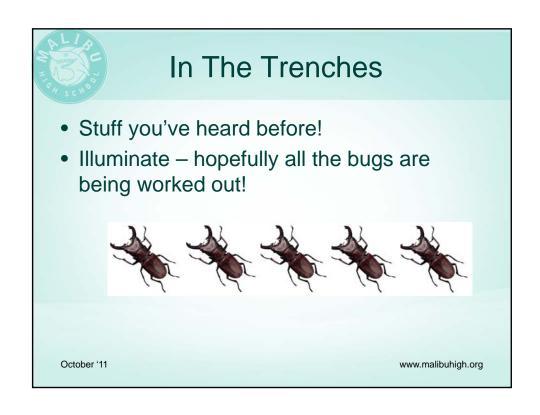

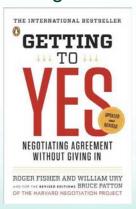
