STUDY SESSION ITEM NO. S.01

With the passage of recent legislation, the California Department of Education is making substantive changes to the assessment and accountability systems for all public schools.

AB 484 stipulates that as of January 1, 2014, most of our current Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) system of CST and CMA assessments will be replaced with the California Measurement of Academic Performance and Progress (CalMAPP). CalMAPP consists of the new Smarter Balanced on-line tests designed to assess students' achievement of Common Core State Standards in English language arts and mathematics. Certain components of STAR will remain in place for this year and next. These components include the science tests at grades five, seven and ten, as well as the CAPA assessment for students in grades two through eleven. Eleventh graders will still have the option this year to take the STAR (CST) tests for the purpose of the Early Assessment Program (EAP) in order to gauge their readiness for college-level English and math coursework. In 2015, and readiness score will be derived from Smarter Balanced.

The Smarter Balanced on-line assessments will be fully implemented in the 2014-15 school year. This spring, however, all California students in grades three through eight, and in grade eleven, will be required to participate in a Smarter Balanced field test in either English language arts or mathematics. The purpose of the field test is to "test the test" and the technology systems in place to support on-line assessment. The field tests will not yield individual student, school or district results. For this reason, schools' API and AYP standings will be frozen at their 2013 levels.

This study session will provide information to the Board of Education and the public about the steps SMMUSD is taking to prepare for the Smarter Balanced field tests this spring and for full implementation in 2014-15. These steps include: an inventory for each site of existing hardware and infrastructure; calculation of the number of computer workstations needed to accommodate student testing; purchase of new equipment where needed; training of school site test coordinators, administrators, teachers, and tech support personnel; and development of parent and community education pieces.

RECOMMENDATION NO. A.22

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the allocation of \$60,000 from the Equity Fund to the Educational Services Department for supporting 2013-14 summer school. Staff also recommends that all remaining funds be allocated to sites since this is the year where schools must meet both PTA and VSS fundraising goals.

COMMENTS: The Equity Fund was established to improve the achievement of all students while simultaneously closing the achievement gap by mitigating the effects of the inequitable enrichment resources to schools. AR 3290 allows the distribution of the fund to:

- 1. Support district-wide initiatives to provide academic support, intervention and/or remediation in accordance with the mission of the school district;
- 2. Support school sites using the weighted-student formula for distribution of fund;
- 3. Reserve resources within the fund.

The 2013-14 Equity Fund total of \$506,382.38 was generated by the following:

- Schools collectively contributed \$322,087 from 2012-13 fundraising activities and gifts.
- \$184,295 of unspent Equity Funds were carried over (including reserve) to the current funding year.
