### XI. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Public Comments is the time when members of the audience may address the Board of Education on items not scheduled on the meeting's agenda (the following rules apply to both general public comments as well as comments about a specific agenda item). The Brown Act (Government Code) states that Board members may not engage in discussion of issues raised during Public Comments, except to ask clarifying questions, make a brief announcement, make a brief report on his or her own activities, or to refer the matter to staff. Individual members of the public who submit a public speaking card prior to the Board hearing an agenda item or general public comments shall be allowed three (3) minutes to address the Board on each agenda or nonagenda item, depending on the number of speakers. If there are ten or more speakers on an agenda or nonagenda item, the Board shall limit the allowed time to two (2) minutes per speaker. Individual speakers who submit a public speaking card after the Board begins to hear an agenda item or general public comments shall be allowed one (1) minute to address the Board. A public speaker may yield his/her time to another speaker, but must be present when his/her name is called. The donor would then give up his/her opportunity to speak. The public speaker who receives the donated minutes shall speak for no more than four (4) minutes maximum. The president may take a poll of speakers for or against a particular issue and may ask that additional persons speak only if they have something new to add. Individuals represented by a common point of view may be asked to select one individual to speak for the group. The president may, at his/her discretion, allow five (5) minutes for those who are serving as a spokesperson for a group or organization. The Board may limit the total time for public input on each item to thirty (30)

minutes. If the number of persons wishing to address the Board of Education exceeds the time limit, additional time will be provided in Section XVI. CONTINUATION OF PUBLIC COMMENTS.

### **DISCUSSION and MAJOR Items**

As a general rule, items under DISCUSSION and MAJOR will be listed in an order determined by the President, Vice President, and Superintendent, Individual Board members may move to request a change in the order prior to consideration of any Major item. The Board may also move any of these items out of order to be heard earlier in the meeting if it appears that there is special interest by the public or as a courtesy to staff members making presentations to the Board.

- 4) Analyze student performance data

- 9) Recommend the plan to the local governing board
- 10) Monitor progress
- 11) Evaluate the effectiveness of planned activities
- 12) Modify the plan

The SPSAs are considered working documents. Plans may be modified throughout the course of the year, as School Site Councils continually monitor their implementation. One public copy of each plan will be available at the Board of Education meeting. Hard copies of each school's SPSA are available for viewing at each school office and in the Educational Services Department of the District Office.

An initial contract was approved in the amount of \$462,500 for a single Phase project. Contract Amendment #1, in the amount of \$284,000, was approved February 20, 2014.

> SPAIC was issued a contract to provide both a Class I and Class II Inspector of Record services for the Science and Technology Building and Site Improvements Project at Santa Monica High School. The project was originally designed to be constructed in a single phase and consisted of the Science and Technology Building, associated site work, a Utility building, CIS softball field, Parking lot renovation and retaining walls. Late in the process of design, a decision was made by the District to maintain the existing Science Building for needed classrooms and only demolish the Technology Building. This resulted in a redesign of the site improvement component of the project which was then filed as a separate DSA project estimated to take 9 months to construct. The policy also contains optional language for districts that choose to provide "pathway awards" recognizing benchmarks toward biliteracy at earlier grade levels.

> The regulation has been updated to reflect eligibility criteria and other requirements for State Seal of Biliteracy as added by AB 815. The regulation also adds optional general rules governing student applications for the district's scholarship and loan fund and optional notifications to inform students of eligibility requirements for various awards.

#### AWARDS FOR ACHIEVEMENT

The Board of Education encourages excellence as a goal for all students and wishes to publicly recognize students for unique or exemplary achievements in academic, extracurricular or community service activities. The purpose of such awards shall be consistent with school goals.

#### **District/School Awards**

Student awards may include verbal recognition, a letter, a certificate, a Board resolution, public ceremony, trophy, gift, plaque or cash gift.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop procedures for the appropriate selection of student award recipients.

#### **Biliteracy Award**

The district shall present the State Seal of Biliteracy to each graduating high school student who has attained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing in one or more languages in addition to English. (Education Code 51460-51464)

#### **AWARDS FOR ACHIEVEMENT**

The Superintendent or designee may appoint an awards committee at each school <u>which may consist of school administrators</u>, teachers, parents/guardians, community members, and student representatives. to consider student accomplishments. This committee may consist of school administrators, teachers, parents/guardians and/or community members.

The committee shall submit recommendations for student awards to the Superintendent or designee for approval.

Individual awards in excess of \$200 must be expressly approved by the Board of Education. (Education Code 44015)

#### **Biliteracy Award**

To be eligible to receive the State Seal of Biliteracy upon graduation, a student shall meet all the following criteria: (Education Code 51461)

- 1. Complete all English language arts requirements for high school graduation with an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or above in those classes
- Pass the CST in English language arts administered in grade 11 at the proficient level or above
- 3. Demonstrate proficiency in one or more foreign languages, which may include American sign language, by fulfilling one of the following criteria:
  - a. Pass a foreign language Advanced Placement examination with a score of 3 or higher or an International Baccalaureate examination with a score of 4 or higher
  - b. Successfully complete a four-year high school course of study in a foreign language, attaining an overall GPA of 3.0 or above in that course of study
  - <u>Pass a district language examination that meets the rigor of a four-year high</u>
     <u>school course of study in that language, provided the test has been certified to or</u>
     approved by the Superintendent of Public Instruction
  - d. Pass the SAT II foreign language examination with a score of 600 or higher

In addition to meeting the criteria in items #1-3 above, a student in any of grades 9-12 whose primary language is other than English shall attain the early advanced proficiency level or higher on the California English Language Development Test (CELDT). As necessary for this purpose, the district may administer the CELDT an additional time outside of the regularly scheduled administration specified in AR 6174 - Education for English Language Learners. (Education Code 51461)

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain appropriate records to identify high school students who qualify for the award and shall affix the insignia to the diploma or transcript of each student who earns the award. (Education Code 51463)

RE: CONSIDER REVISING BP AND E 5145.6 – PARENTAL NOTIFICATIONS

#### **RECOMMENDATION NO. A.06**

It is recommended that the Board of Education consider revising BP and E 5145.6 – Parental Notifications.

COMMENTS: CSBA recommends revising this policy to reflect new law (AB 2262), which allows the annual parental notifications to be sent electronically upon request by the parent/guardian and requires that any notifications sent electronically be written both in English and in the family's primary language when required by law. The policy also reflects existing law prohibiting schools from undertaking

specified activities if parents/guardians are not notified.

The exhibit updated to (1) reflect new law (AB 1575, 2012), which requires the uniform complaint procedure notice to include information about complaints regarding student fees; (2) add notice regarding process for reclassifying English learners as fluent English proficient and the opportunity for parents/guardians to participate in that process; (3) consolidate and clarify notifications related to education of English learners; (4) add notice of failure to achieve annual measurable achievement objectives for English learners; and (5) add notice regarding student's assignment to a supervised suspension classroom.

Students BP 5145.6

#### PARENTAL NOTIFICATIONS

The Board of Education recognizes that notifications are essential to effective communication between the school and the home. The Superintendent or designee shall send students and parents/guardians all notifications required by law, including notifications about their legal rights, and any other notifications he/she believes will promote parental understanding and involvement.

The notice required pursuant to Education Code 48980 shall be sent at the beginning of each academic year and may be provided either by regular mail, in electronic form when so requested by the parent/guardian, or by any other method normally used to communicate with parents/guardians in writing. (Education Code 48981, 48982)

If any activity specified in Education Code 48980 will be undertaken by any school during the forthcoming school term, the notice shall state that fact and the approximate date on which any such activity will occur. No such activity shall be undertaken with respect to any particular student unless his/her parent/guardian has been information of such activity through the annual notification or other separate special notification. (Education Code 48983 – 48984)

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that notifications which must be sent at the beginning of each academic year include a request that the parent/guardian sign the notice and return it to the school. (Education Code 48981, 48982)

The annual notification shall include a request that the parent/guardian sign the notice and return it to school or, if the notice is provided in electronic format, that the parent/guardian submit a signed acknowledgment of receipt of the notice to the school. The parent/guardian's signature is an acknowledgment of receipt of the information but does not indicate that consent to participate in any particular program has been given or withheld. (Education Code 48982)

Notifications to parents/guardians shall be written both in English and in the family's primary language when so required by law. (Education Code 48981, 48985; 20 USC 6311, 6312)

Whenever an employee learns that a student's parent/guardian is for any reason unable to understand the district's printed notifications, the principal or designee shall work with the parent/guardian to establish other appropriate means of communication.

## Educational Protection Act (EPA)

After passage of Proposition 30, the Schools and Local Public Safety Protection Act of 2012, the District received funds through a new Education Protection Account to help stabilize school budgets and restore educational opportunities that were decimated by revenue shortfalls brought by the Recession. The District will receive \$2,187,400 in 2014-15 and will use all funds to support Teacher Salaries. EPA funds are one of the three components that make up the LCFF funds in the district.





## **RECOMMENDATION NO. A.27**

It is recommended that the Board of Education ("Board") adopt Resolution No. 14-09 to declare its intention to convey a 50-year easement in a portion of the John Muir Elementary School and the Santa Monica Alternative School House to the City of Santa Monica to construct, maintain, operate, repair, replace, and remove a subterranean storm water harvesting system ("Underground Utility") for the Los Amigos Park Stormwater Harvesting and Direct Use Demonstration Project ("Project") as set forth in the proposed "Easement Agreement" attached to the resolution.

### COMMENT:

The Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District ("District") would like to convey a 50-year, nonexclusive easement to the City of Santa Monica ("City") for public utility purposes ("Easement") on a portion of the John Muir Elementary School, located at 2526 6th Street, Santa Monica, California 90405 and the Santa Monica Alternative School House located at 2525 5th Street, Santa Monica, California 90405, known as Los Amigos Park ("Property"), which the District currently owns and operates. The Easement will allow the City access to construct, maintain, operate, repair, replace, and remove the Underground Utility, which entails an underground system to treat 100,000 gallons of stormwater annually for irrigation and restroom flushing on the Property, as more further described in the Easement Agreement. The Project is undertaken by the City to demonstrate the effectiveness of harvesting urban runoff for beneficial uses. Since the Project is mainly underground, the District does not need the Easement area for classroom buildings or educational purposes.

Education Code section 17556 allows for the conveyance of the Easement by the District. Education Code section 17557 provides that the District may convey the Easement only if the Board first adopts a resolution declaring its intention to convey the Easement in a regular open meeting by a two-thirds vote of all its members.

After adopting a resolution of intention to convey the Easement, Education Code section 17558 requires the District to give 10-days' notice of a public hearing and consideration of adopting a resolution to convey the Easement and publication in a newspaper. The resolution sets the public hearing at 5:30 p.m. on January 15, 2015. After considering the staff's presentation, public comments, and any formal protests at the public hearing, the District will consider adopting a Resolution to Convey an Easement for Public Utility Purposes to the City of Santa Monica. If the vote passes by two-thirds, the District can convey the Easement to the City of Santa Monica with no further proceedings.

ADOPT RESOLUTION 14-09 – RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO CONVEY AN EASEMENT FOR PUBLIC UTILITY PURPOSES TO THE CITY OF SANTA MONICA FOR THE LOS AMIGOS PARK STORMWATER HARVESTING AND DIRECT USE DEMONSTRATION PROJECT

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Monica ("City") seeks the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District's ("District") conveyance of an easement to a certain portion of the John Muir Elementary School campus and the Santa Monica Alternative School House, known as Los Amigos Park ("Property"), in the form of a 50-year, nonexclusive easement ("Easement") to the City to construct, maintain, operate, repair, and replace a subterranean storm water harvesting system ("Underground Utility") for the Los Amigos Park Stormwater Harvesting and Direct Use Demonstration Project ("Project");

**WHEREAS**, the proposed Easement Agreement that includes the description and location of the Easement area and the Underground Utility is set forth in **Exhibits "A" and "B"** to the proposed Easement Agreement, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference:

**WHEREAS**, the District desires to assist the City in preserving precious water resources by conveying the Easement to the City to construct, maintain, operate, repair, and replace the Underground Utility to treat up to 100,000 gallons of stormwater and dry-weather runoff annually to provide insight into the feasibility of reusing these wastewater resources for productive non-potable purposes, such as irrigation and restroom flushing;

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Education Code section 17556 et seq., the District may convey an easement in its Property to the City for public utility purposes, which include stormwater harvesting facilities upon such terms and conditions as the parties thereto may agree without complying with any other provisions of the Education Code;

**WHEREAS**, the District does not need the Easement area for classroom buildings or educational purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Education Code section 17557, the first step to conveying the Easement to the City of Santa Monica is by passing this resolution by a two-thirds vote of the District's Board of Education.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Board of Education ("Board") hereby finds as follows:

- 1. The real property upon which the Easement is to be located is not needed for school classroom buildings or educational purposes.
- 2. The conveyance would be in the best interest of the District in that by conveying the Easement to the City of Santa Monica, the District would assist the City in saving precious water resources by facilitating the Los Amigos Park Stormwater Harvesting and Direct Use Demonstration Project's treatment of stormwater and dry-weather runoff, while still limiting the District's liability that arises out of or is connected with the construction, maintenance, operation, repair, or removal of the Underground

Utility, and while enjoying continued use of the Easement surface area for educational activities.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** the Board adopts this resolution of intention to convey the Easement in accordance with the procedures of Title 1, Division 1, Part 10.5, Chapter 4, Article 15 of the Education Code.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board will hold a public hearing on the proposed Easement and Notice to Convey an Easement for Public Utility Purposes at 5:30 p.m. or later as this item shall be duly called on January 15, 2015 in the District Board Room located at 1651 16<sup>th</sup> Street, Santa Monica, California 90404.

# INFORMATION ITEM NO. I.01

The Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District has entered into a Pre-Negotiation Agreement with PCA I, L.P., the entity currently holding the ground lease on district owned property at 1721 Fourth Street in Santa Monica. This is the ground lease commonly known as the Doubletree or Hotel lease. It is the desire of both parties to begin discussion that could potentially amend and restate the current lease. Among other provisions, this Pre-Negotiation Agreement outlines the nature of negotiations, the term of the negotiations and how the cost of the negotiation will be handled. The agreement is included for information purposes only.

## PRE-NEGOTIATION AGREEMENT

This PRE-NEGOTIATION AGREEMENT (this "<u>Agreement</u>" or "<u>NA</u>") is dated as of November \_\_\_\_, 2014 ("<u>Effective Date</u>"), and is entered into by and between Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District, a public body, corporate and politic, of the State of California ("<u>District</u>"), and PCA I, L.P., a Delaware limited partnership ("<u>Ground Lessee</u>"). District and Ground Lessee are sometimes individually referred to as a "<u>Party</u>" and are sometimes collectively referred to as the "<u>Parties</u>".

## RECITALS

The Parties enter into this Agreement on the basis of the following facts, understandings and intentions:

- A. District owns that certain real property located at 1721 Fourth Street, in the City of Santa Monica, California (the "<u>Site</u>"). Among other improvements, a Doubletree Hotel is located on the Site.
- B. Pursuant to the documents set forth on **Exhibit "A"** attached hereto (collectively, the "**Ground Lease**"), District has ground leased the Site to Ground Lessee.
- C. District and Ground Lessee desire to commence discussions to potentially amend and restate the Ground Lease in its entirety in order to, among other things, consolidate and modernize the Ground Lease and amend and restate the economic relationship between District and Ground Lessee with respect to the Site (the "A&R Ground Lease").
- D. Ground Lessee and District are willing to enter into this Agreement setting forth, among other things, the terms pursuant to which District shall negotiate with Ground Lessee for certain specified periods of time, as set forth in <u>Article II</u>, regarding the principal terms of the proposed A&R Ground Lease, and, if applicable, the terms of such proposed A&R Ground Lease.
- E. The Parties hope that the negotiations described herein will result in a non-binding letter of intent setting forth the principal terms of the proposed A&R Ground Lease (the "LOI"), and that, if applicable, negotiations subsequent to the mutual execution and delivery of the LOI and consistent with the LOI might result in the mutual execution and delivery of the A&R Ground Lease.
- F. Throughout the NA Period (as defined below), District staff, consultants and attorneys shall devote time and effort in meeting with Ground Lessee and its representatives and in negotiating the terms of, and documenting, the proposed LOI and, if applicable, the proposed A&R Ground Lease.
- **NOW, THEREFORE,** in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the Parties, the Parties hereby mutually agree as follows:

# **ARTICLE I Nature of Negotiations**

- 1.1 <u>Good Faith</u>. District and Ground Lessee agree that for the periods set forth in <u>Article II</u> herein, they will negotiate in good faith in an effort to agree upon and document the terms of an LOI (which LOI shall in all events be non-binding except as otherwise expressly set forth therein), and if the LOI becomes effective, an A&R Ground Lease.
- No Obligation to Enter into the LOI or the A&R Ground Lease. This Agreement is solely an agreement to negotiate and is <u>not</u> a final lease agreement. The Parties acknowledge that this Agreement, and, if entered into, the LOI do not establish the final terms of the A&R Ground Lease and that such essential terms, if agreed to by the Parties, shall be set forth, if at all, in an A&R Ground Lease approved and executed by the authorized representatives of each Party. Subject to <u>Article III</u> below, each Party assumes the risk that, notwithstanding this Agreement and good faith negotiations, the Parties may not enter into the LOI or if the Parties do enter into the LOI, the Parties may not enter into the A&R Ground Lease due to the Parties' failure to agree upon essential terms of the transaction. As this Agreement may not result in an effective A&R Ground Lease, neither Party should forego any other opportunity.
- Negotiation. During the NA LOI Period (as defined below), District shall negotiate in good faith with Ground Lessee with respect to the LOI, and, if applicable because the Parties agree upon, execute and deliver the LOI, during the NA A&R Ground Lease Period (as defined below), District shall negotiate in good faith with Ground Lessee with respect to the A&R Ground Lease. Either Party may terminate negotiations and this Agreement for any or no reason and in its sole and absolute discretion if the Parties have not executed and delivered (x) the LOI prior to the expiration of the NA LOI Period (unless and until the Parties thereafter execute and deliver such LOI) or (y) the A&R Ground Lease prior to the expiration of the NA A&R Ground Lease Period (unless and until the Parties thereafter execute and deliver such A&R Ground Lease).
- 1.4 <u>Costs.</u> Except as set forth in <u>Article III</u> below, each Party hereto shall be responsible for its own costs and expenses relating to or incurred in connection with the negotiations contemplated hereunder, including, without limitation, all costs and expenses relating to attorneys' fees, consultants' fees, and architectural and engineering fees, costs and expenses.
- 1.5 Ground Lease. Prior to the A&R Ground Lease becoming effective, if at all, the Parties' relationship with respect to the Site shall continue to be governed by the Ground Lease and nothing contained herein or in the LOI or any draft A&R Ground Lease or draft LOI prior to full execution and delivery thereof, if applicable, nor any actions, writings, statements or negotiations undertaken hereunder or in respect of the proposed LOI or A&R Ground Lease, if applicable, or in connection therewith or herewith, shall be used by either Party in any action or proceeding to interpret the Ground Lease, nor shall the foregoing modify, amend, effectuate a waiver of rights or remedies or otherwise affect in any manner whatsoever or be deemed to modify, amend, effectuate a waiver of rights or remedies or otherwise affect in any manner whatsoever the Ground Lease or its terms.

1.6 <u>LOI/A&R Ground Lease</u>. Ground Lessee understands and acknowledges that, if negotiations culminate in an LOI and/or an A&R Ground Lease, such LOI and/or A&R Ground Lease shall be effective only after, in each instance, the LOI or the A&R Ground Lease, as applicable, has been considered and has received final approval from District's Board of Education (the "<u>Board</u>"). If the terms of the LOI or the A&R Ground Lease are finalized and the Parties are merely awaiting approval or denial thereof by the Board, the NA LOI Period and the NA A&R Ground Lease Period, respectively, shall be automatically extended to that date on which the Board issues its final approval or disapproval of the LOI or the A&R Ground Lease, as the case may be.

# **ARTICLE II Term of Negotiation**

2.1 Term. The term of this Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and shall end on the earlier of: (i) ninety (90) days from the Effective Date, subject to extension as provided in Section 1.6 above (the "NA LOI Period"), or (ii) the date on which this Agreement terminates as provided in Section 3.1 or Section 4.1 below; provided, however, that upon Ground Lessee's written request Jan Maez (the "Assistant **Superintendent**") may extend the NA LOI Period by written notice to Ground Lessee for an additional period of up to sixty (60) days in the Assistant Superintendent's sole and absolute discretion; and further provided, however, that if the LOI becomes effective during the NA LOI Period, the Term of this Agreement shall be automatically extended to and shall end on the earlier of (x) sixty (60) days from the date that the LOI became effective, subject to extension as provided in Section 1.6 above (the "NA A&R Ground Lease Period"), or (y) the date on which this Agreement terminates as provided in Section 3.1 or Section 4.1 below; provided, however, that upon Ground Lessee's written request the Assistant Superintendent may extend the NA A&R Ground Lease Period by written notice to Ground Lessee for an additional period of up to sixty (60) days in the Assistant Superintendent's sole and absolute discretion. The NA LOI Period and the NA A&R Ground Lease Period are sometimes collectively referred to in this Agreement as the "NA Period".

# **ARTICLE III District's Costs**

3.1 <u>District's Costs</u>. Within three (3) days after the full execution and delivery of this Agreement by the Parties, Ground Lessee will deposit with the District the sum of \$100,000 to be used by the District to pay, in accordance with this <u>Section 3.1</u>, all of the actual out-of-pocket fees, costs and expenses incurred by it after the Effective Date in connection with or arising out of this Agreement, the transactions contemplated herein and the negotiations to be conducted pursuant hereto and the documentation resulting herefrom (the "<u>District's Costs</u>"). The initial budget for the District's Costs is as follows: attorneys' fees - \$70,000; consultants' fees - \$30,000 (the "<u>Budget</u>"). The Parties understand and agree that the consultant fees may include, without limitation, the fees of consultants engaged by a District consultant in connection with or arising out of this Agreement, the transactions contemplated herein and the negotiations to be conducted pursuant hereto and the documentation resulting herefrom. If the initial

Budget will be exceeded, District may seek Ground Lessee's agreement to amend the Budget to reflect the then contemplated District's Costs, which agreement shall not be unreasonably withheld and failing such agreement, District may elect to terminate this Agreement and all negotiations regarding the LOI and/or the A&R Ground Lease. District may apply the deposit (and subsequent deposits) to District's Cost provided that (i) (a) such costs are in accordance with the Budget (as the same may have been amended) or (b) such costs have been otherwise pre-approved in writing by Ground Lessee in its reasonable discretion (and failing such approval District may elect to terminate this Agreement and all negotiations regarding the LOI and/or the A&R Ground Lease) and (ii) District provides Ground Lessee with a monthly statement that shows the amount applied and which is accompanied by supporting documentation (with any privileged information redacted) for the District's Costs against which such deposit has been applied in accordance with clause (i) of this sentence. If the entire initial deposit is applied by the District as permitted above, then within ten (10) days after demand from District from time to time and whether or not the LOI or the A&R Ground Lease has become effective, Ground Lessee shall pay to District, in immediately available funds, additional deposits in increments of \$50,000 each to be applied pursuant to the procedure set forth above (provided that, the Budget has been amended as provided hereinabove). Without limitation on the generality of the foregoing, District's Costs include, without limitation, the fees and disbursements of District's attorneys and consultants, which consultants may be asked to undertake studies, analyses and modeling and render opinions with respect to economic terms that may be reflected or may be proposed to be reflected in the A&R Ground Lease and/or other matters. If this Agreement is terminated and the A&R Ground Lease does not become effective, the balance of the deposit held by the District (after application to the final outstanding District's Costs) will be refunded to Ground Lessee, and unless this Agreement has been terminated due to the default of Ground Lessee, fifty percent (50%) of the District's Costs paid by Ground Lessee to District (and applied by the District as permitted above) shall be credited and applied against Ground Lessee's rental obligations under the Ground Lease. The foregoing rental offset, if applicable, and Ground Lessee's obligations under this Section 3.1 shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

# **ARTICLE IV Termination**

# 4.1 Right to Terminate.

(a) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, either Party may terminate this Agreement and all negotiations regarding the LOI and/or A&R Ground Lease by providing written notice to the other Party at any time during the NA Period if the other Party is in default under this Agreement. Neither District nor Ground Lessee shall be deemed to be in default of its respective obligations under this Agreement unless the non-defaulting Party shall have delivered written notice of any alleged default to the defaulting Party and the defaulting Party shall have failed to cure within ten (10) business days after delivery of such notice.

- (b) If either Party terminates this Agreement after the expiration of the NA Period in accordance with <a href="Article\_II">Article\_II</a> above, then this Agreement shall automatically terminate and, except as expressly provided herein, neither party shall have any further right or obligation hereunder.
- (c) Upon the full execution and delivery of, and the Board's approval of, the A&R Ground Lease, this Agreement shall automatically terminate and, except as expressly provided herein, neither Party shall have any further right or obligation hereunder.
- 4.2 <u>Effect of Termination</u>. In the event this Agreement is terminated as provided in this <u>Section 4</u>, no Party shall have any liability hereunder following such termination except as otherwise expressly set forth in this Agreement.

# **ARTICLE V Miscellaneous**

- Brokerage Commission. District and Ground Lessee hereby represent and acknowledge that neither Party has engaged a broker or finder to represent such Party in connection with this Agreement or the transactions contemplated hereby. District and Ground Lessee hereby indemnify and hold the other free and harmless from and against any and all costs and liabilities including, without limitation, attorneys' fees, for causes of action or proceedings which may be instituted by any broker, agent or finder, licensed or otherwise, claiming through, under or by reason of the conduct of the indemnifying Party in connection with this Agreement. The foregoing representation and indemnity shall survive the expiration and/or termination of this Agreement.
- 5.2 <u>Assignments</u>. Ground Lessee may not assign its right or delegate its obligations hereunder without the prior written consent of District, which may be given or withheld in District's sole and absolute discretion.
- 5.3 <u>Notices</u>. Any notice, consent, approval or disapproval to be given or other document to be delivered by any Party to the other or others hereunder may be delivered in accordance with the notice provisions set forth in the Ground Lease.
  - For purposes of the negotiations contemplated by this Agreement, Ground Lessee's representative shall be Robert Leven, Chief Investment Officer and District's representative shall be Jan Maez, Assistant Superintendent Business and Fiscal Services.
- 5.4 <u>Confidentiality</u>. Ground Lessee shall not disclose to District or its consultants any financial information with respect to Ground Lessee, the Ground Lesse or the Site which Ground Lessee deems to be confidential unless specifically requested by District's consultants in writing and agreed to be provided by Ground Lessee ("<u>Ground Lessee's Confidential Information</u>"). Without limitation on other information which is <u>not Ground Lessee's Confidential Information</u>, in no event shall Ground Lessee's Confidential Information which (i) Ground Lessee is required to provide to District under the Ground Lesse, (ii) Ground Lessee provides to District or District's consultants other than pursuant to the written request of District's consultants,

or (iii) is or constitutes third-party market data regarding the operation and financial performance of hotels generally in Santa Monica, California and the greater Los Angeles, California metropolitan area. Ground Lessee's Confidential Information provided to District's attorneys and consultants pursuant to the specific written request of District's consultants and identified by Ground Lessee as Ground Lessee's Confidential Information at the time it is so provided shall be kept strictly confidential by such attorneys and consultants, and such attorneys and consultants shall not provide (or otherwise share or disseminate) such Ground Lessee's Confidential Information to District or anyone else without Ground Lessee's prior written consent. The Parties agree that the District's attorneys and consultants shall be permitted to disclose to the District, the Board and other third parties all information which is not Ground Lessee's Confidential Information and which is not otherwise subject to confidentiality restrictions in this Section 5.4, including, without limitation, the information described in clauses (i), (ii) and (iii) above. In addition to the foregoing, except as otherwise expressly permitted hereinbelow, each Party (on behalf of itself and its attorneys and consultants) hereby agrees to keep confidential all negotiations and/or discussions regarding, and any proposed terms of, any LOI or A&R Ground Lease (collectively, "Transaction **Information**"); provided that, (x) either Party and/or its attorneys or consultants may disclose to third-parties and/or the public that the Parties are engaged in negotiations involving a possible A&R Ground Lease (without disclosing any proposed terms of such lease), and (y) if and when the LOI and/or A&R Ground Lease is/are fully executed and approved by the Board, then such document(s) shall become part of the public records of the District and may be disclosed by either Party (and/or its attorneys or consultants) to third-parties. Neither Party nor its consultants or attorneys shall be liable for use or disclosure of any Ground Lessee's Confidential Information or Transaction Information if it:

- (a) is or becomes a part of the public knowledge or literature without breach of this Agreement by such Party or its attorneys or consultants; or
- (b) is known to such Party or its attorneys or consultants without restriction as to further disclosure when received; or
- (c) in the case of Ground Lessee's Confidential Information only, is independently developed by District or its attorneys or consultants as demonstrated by written records; or
- (d) is reasonably required to be disclosed in connection with a dispute between the Parties; or
- (e) is required to be disclosed pursuant to any order issued by a court or by applicable law; or
- (f) becomes known to such Party or its attorneys or consultants from a third party who had a lawful right to disclose it and without breach of its Agreement.

- 5.5 <u>Purpose of Agreement</u>. It is expressly understood and agreed by the Parties hereto that this is an Agreement regarding the conduct of contract negotiations only. It is further agreed and understood that this Agreement does not imply any obligation on the part of District or Ground Lessee to enter into any agreement that may result in negotiations contemplated herein.
- 5.6 Entire Agreement/Amendment/Counterparts. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties concerning its subject matter and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous representations or agreements (other than the Ground Lease). This Agreement may be amended only by a document in writing signed by the Parties thereto and approved or ratified by the Board. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original and all of which taken together shall constitute one agreement.
- 5.7 <u>Authority</u>. The persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the Parties hereto warrant that: (i) such Party is duly organized and existing; (ii) they are duly authorized to execute and deliver this Agreement on behalf of said Party; (iii) by so executing this Agreement, such Party is formally bound to the provisions of this Agreement; and (iv) the entering into of this Agreement does not violate any provisions of any other agreement to which said Party is bound.

# 5.8 Governing Law; Disputes.

- (a) The Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with California law, without giving effect to choice of law provisions.
- (b) The Parties agree that in the event of litigation, exclusive venue shall be in Los Angeles County, California,
- (c) In the event of any legal action or other proceeding between the Parties regarding this Agreement (an "<u>Action</u>"), the prevailing Party shall be entitled to the payment by the losing Party of the prevailing Party's reasonable attorneys' fees, court costs and litigation expenses, as determined by the court.
- (d) Likewise, the prevailing Party in any Action shall be entitled, in addition to the amounts set forth in Section 5.8(c) above, to the payment by the losing Party of the prevailing Party's reasonable attorneys' fees, court costs and litigation expenses incurred in connection with: (i) any appellate review of the judgment rendered in the Action; and (ii) any proceeding to enforce a judgment in such Action. It is the intent of the Parties that the provisions of this Section 5.8(d) shall be distinct and severable from the other rights of the Parties, shall survive the entry of judgment and shall not be merged into such judgment.
- 5.9 <u>Superseded by A&R Ground Lease</u>. Following mutual execution by the Parties of the A&R Ground Lease and approval or ratification of such A&R Ground Lease by the Board, this Agreement shall be of no further force or effect, except for those provisions which expressly survive the termination of this Agreement. In the event of any conflict between the provisions of this Agreement and the LOI and the A&R Ground Lease

- approved and executed by the Parties, the provisions of the A&R Ground Lease shall for all purposes prevail.
- 5.10 Non-liability of Officials and Employees. No member, official, representative, director, staff member, attorney, consultant or employee of either Party (the "<u>Defaulting Party</u>") shall be personally liable to the other Party or any successor in interest thereto (the "<u>Other Party</u>") in the event of any default or breach by the Defaulting Party or for any amount which may become due to the Other Party with respect to this Agreement, the LOI or the A&R Ground Lease.
- 5.11 Approval. If the negotiations hereunder culminate in an LOI or the A&R Ground Lease, such LOI and A&R Ground Lease will be considered for approval by the Board. The concurrence of District staff with the terms and provisions of a proposed LOI or A&R Ground Lease under any provisions of this Agreement shall not be construed or interpreted as District approving or accepting such terms. Such concurrence shall be viewed as nothing more than the willingness of District's staff to recommend to the Board that District approve such LOI and A&R Ground Lease. Each of the LOI and the A&R Ground Lease shall only become effective after it has been fully executed and delivered by the Parties and considered and approved by the Board after notice and, if required by law or required by the Board, the conduct of a public hearing.
