

### **An Update About Local Funding** for Malibu Schools

## **Important Information About** Measure M: the Malibu School **Improvement Funding Measure**

### The Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District serves approximately 1,700 students in three elementary schools and one

combined middle/high school in Malibu. Highly qualified teachers and staff and strong academic programs support Malibu students to achieve some of the state's highest honors and enable them to go on to top colleges. School facilities are also integral to the quality of education. However, Malibu schools are in need of modernization to

support 21st-century learning, and repairs and upgrades are needed at all Malibu schools to ensure student safety. Malibu High School is 60 years old, was originally built as a middle school, and no longer adequately supports the needs of Malibu middle or high school students.



### In June of this year, we mailed a survey asking for the community's opinions regarding improvements to the District's educational facilities. Here is what the Malibu community told us was most important:
