Review of Agenda: Lynda Holeva

PTA Report: Elizabeth Urquart

PTA President, Elizabeth Uruquart shared that the PTA's big focus is putting together a slate to elect new representatives for 2023-24 sschool year. There are great candidtates with lots of interest. Caroline Mayes will possibly be our next PTA President. The election is in March 2023. Elizabeth will be Executive VP for next year. The Booster Club is working the Family Dance event and it's nearly sold out so no need to further promote. Poker Night is coming up in March 2023. The PTA is looking into how we can assist teachers to comp the event. Some teachers were not asked by room reps if they wanted tickets to events. The Read A Thon is coming up. January 31st is the Kick off. This event will be promoted at the Spirit Assembly on Feb. 1st. There was a brief discussion around some of the Read A Thon reading competitions in years past and prizes. Now badges and prizes can be earned without having to raise money. Elizabeth shared the Rad A Thon Envelope, reading long, reading lounge event., Pajama Night and Lynda is working with Read A Thon Chair to secure an author to do author assemblies for grades 2nd-5th.

Review of STAR Test Data: Lynda Holeva

Lynda shared STAR Assessment data in a slide show with a comparative analysis of Fall and Winter scores overall for each grade level. Math and ELA academic growth was reflected in several grade levels. Lynda shared these scores as reflected with the state benchmarks, and the district will share the STAR data based on the district benchmarks for achievement at the school board meeting tonight. CASSPP testing for 3rd-5th graders is in May.

- Early Literacy- TK-1st grade: 73.9 % scored at or above grade level proficiency. 12% on watch, 8.1% in intervention, 11.6 % are in urgent intervention.
- STAR Reading: Overall fewer students in intervention.
- STAR Math Overall Proficiency is at 53.6% (2nd-5th grades)

We've done well and are moving forward. We've made steady progress. We want to hit our goals by the end of the year. We have one more STAR Assessment Window in March and will need that data to help develop SPSA goals for 2023-24 school year. We need to ask ourselves, what goals do we want to change? All three STAR data points will help to determine.
