



A DAY IN THE LIFE OF A KINDERGARTENER

- Two dedicated kindergarten yards with play structures

- Daily instructional assistant support



| Rey Area | Example | Tips for Parents/Caregivers |

| Social Emotional Development | "I take turns, share and help others." | Make time for playing with friends- When children play together, they learn to take turns, share and respect others' feelings. |
| Self-Care, Motor Skills, Physical well-being | "I can kick balls, hop on one foot and climb a ladder at the park." | Go outside with your child, walk a straight line and climb on a jungle gym at the park. Limit medla and screen time. |
| Language Development | "I use words to talk about thoughts, wants and needs." | Ask your child questions that make them describe things, events or feelings. |
| Early Learning | "I hear and understand the meaning of words, stories and songs." | Read every day with your child. Ask your child questions about the story. |







A LOOK AT TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN

How are the classes staffed?

- A child can be enrolled in TK if their fifth birthday is from Sept. 2nd-Feb. 2nd
- TK classrooms are taught by a certificated classroom teacher.
- TK teachers participate in SMMUSD professional learning opportunities alongside Kindergarten teachers.
- Instructional assistant time is allocated based on student enrollment.

How do I enroll my child?

- Pick up an enrollment packet at your home school once you have submitted necessary items (See Next Slide)
- Families will be contacted by the school site once the TK classrooms/sites are confirmed for the 2022-2023 school year.
- Students in the TK program are pre-enrolled in their home school for the following year (Kindergarten). Families contact the home school to update information, provide proof of residence and provide medical and dental examinations.
