Attendance: <u>Committee Members</u>: Jeffrey Jarow (*Chair*), Neil Carrey (*Vice Chair*), Laurie Charchut, Jerry Nickelsburg, Steven Rodman, Jan Maez (*Staff*), None (*Public*), Laurie Lieberman (*Board Liaisons*).

I. <u>Call to Order</u>:

Mr. Jarow called the meeting to order at 4:07 p.m.

II. <u>Approval of Minutes</u>: May 23, 2011/June 14, 2011

Upon motion made by Mr. Carrey and seconded by Ms. Charchut the minutes of the May 23, 2011 meeting were approved. The minutes of June 14, 2011 were corrected and accepted as meeting notes, as a full quorum of the committee was not present at the meeting. The notes included a notice of a future planned meeting on June 25, 2011. Ms. Maez was asked to include in the current meeting minutes that the June 25, 2011 meeting was not held.

III. <u>Public Comments:</u>

No comments were made from the public.

IV. Update from Chief Financial Officer: (Janece L. Maez, Chief Financial Officer)

Ms. Maez introduced the district's new Superintendent, Sandy Lyon. She briefly described her background. Ms. Maez informed the committee of the progress being made on the projects. She stated that the Edison and John Adams projects had been bid and were in the initial construction phases. The Lincoln modernization projects were well under way. She also stated that the Samohi project is ready for the bidding process and should begin before the end of the year. The Malibu project is in the final environmental process, with the EIR expected to be approved by the end of November. She stated that the process for projects in the Malibu area is lengthier than in other areas because of the involvement with the City of Malibu and their Local Coastal plan and the need for a Coastal Development Permit issued by the city.

V. <u>Update from Ad Hoc Committees</u>:

Site Ad Hoc Committee – no report at this meeting. Ms Maez was asked to correctly list the remaining committee members on each Ad Hoc Committee on the next agenda. Mr. Rodman stated that he will work with Stuart Sam to set up sites walks for committee members.

Legal/Process Ad Hoc Committee – Mr. Carrey posed the question as to whether a 'termed out" committee could continue serving until their replacement was named. He will research and communicate back to the Committee at the next meeting. Mr. Nickelsburg suggested that the district begin advertising for the vacancies expected on the committee in July.

Financial Reporting Ad Hoc Committee – The committee report was given under Old Business.

VI. <u>Old Business</u>:

Committee members had received the first draft of the Annual Report for fiscal year ending June 30, 2010 as prepared by Mr. Nickelsburg and Ms. Charchut. Mr. Nickelsburg stated that the full committee needed to recommend the general conclusions that would be included in the report. Mr. Carrey stated that it was important that all issues be resolved, particularly those which were included in previous year reports. Ms. Charchut noted that the third paragraph under Description of the Data We Used should be deleted.

Mr. Nickelsburg reviewed the report presented in some detail. He pointed out on the second page, that although the concerns were different than previous years that issues surrounding cash and investments continue. He mentioned the augmentation within the Audit Report has improved the transparency and understandability of the data.

There remains a question related to the calculation of interest earning. As Mr. Nickelsburg described the cash balances of fiscal year 2008-09 were approximately half the balances in 2009-10, however the interest reported was almost the same. The Ad Hoc Committee is requesting to see the average daily balances of cash in the BB program. Ms. Maez indicated that she would provide a report for them to review.

There was also a question related to the cost of issuance. Ms. Maez had provided the Ad Hoc Committee the answer to their question.

The Committee continued the discussion of the Annual Report by discussing and questioning the district's issuance of the Bond Anticipation Notes. There was a sense that the risks of those notes were not completely considered when issuing. Ms. Maez had invited representatives of Keygent, the firm the district uses as fiscal advisors, to the last meeting where a detailed explanation of the note issue was described. Ms. Maez also restated the involvement of the district's Financial Oversight committee when considering bond or note issues. She stated that, it was the FOC who encouraged the district to issue the notes, it was not considered a high risk effort at the time, and the result of issuing the notes was positive.

There are several questions remaining open at the time of the meeting. Ms. Maez provided documentation on some of those issues and will meet with the Ad Hoc Committee before the next full committee meeting to resolve any remaining questions.

The Ad Hoc Committee is expected to return at the next meeting with final recommendations for the entire committee to consider.

On a separate subject the committee discussed the membership vacancies remaining. Ms. Maez was asked to pursue filling of those vacancies as soon as possible.

VII. <u>New Business:</u>

No new business was discussed.

VIII. <u>Next meeting:</u>

The next meeting date of the committee was not set.

I. <u>Call to Order</u>: Mr. Jarow called the meeting to order at 4:05 p.m.

Financial Reporting Ad Hoc Committee – Mr. Nickelsburg presented the final report of the Ad Hoc Committee on Financial Reporting for fiscal year 2009-10. The committee report was given under Old Business.

VI. <u>Old Business</u>:

The Committee considered the 2009-10 Annual Report as drafted by the Ad Hoc Committee on Financial Reporting. Mr. Carrey moved, with a second from Mr. Rodman that the report be approved and forwarded to the Board of Education. Ms. Maez was asked to schedule a Board presentation where it could be presented.
