Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior involving a real or perceived imbalance of power. The behaviors is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time. Bullying may be physical, verbal or psychological. It may occur in person or on social media.

Bullying includes actions such as making threats, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally, manipulation or purposefully excluding someone from a group. Some bullying behaviors are illegal and must be reported to the police.






### Cyberbullying

Includes sending, posting, or sharing negative, harmful, false or mean content about someone else.

# Most Common Cyberbullying Tactics

Throw glitter, not shade!



- Posting comments or rumors that are mean, hurtful, or embarrassing.
- Threatening to hurt someone or telling them to kill themselves.
- Posting a mean or hurtful picture or video.
- Posting mean or hateful names, comments, or content about any race, religion, ethnicity, or other personal characteristics online.
- Creating a mean or hurtful webpage or social media post about someone or fake accounts.



# **Trustworthiness**



If you see something, say something!! We are all responsible for ensuring a safe school.



Every student should have at least one person on campus to whom you would report a concern. Who is your trusted adult?







#### Hate Motivated Behavior/Harassment

- Behavior/harassment toward a person's race, ethnicity, culture, heritage, age, political affiliations, immigration status, sexual orientation, gender, disability, or religion.
- Students do not have to endure harassment of ANY kind

You may report to any adult from school or use We-Tip (1-800-78-CRIME)








#### **Historical Hurt**

- Physical abilities








LMS is a supportive place where everyone should feel accepted, valued, and comfortable.

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Suspension means removing a student from school for serious disciplinary infractions for a few days.

- You will not be allowed on campus during the school day.
- You may not attend any school activities.
- If you are on a permit, your permit may be revoked.

Reasons for suspension include:

- Fighting/mutual combat
- Possession of weapons or dangerous objects
- Illegal substances (i.e. tobacco, vapes, marijuana, alcohol)
- Causing serious bodily harm
- Sexual and/or disability harassment
- Ongoing bullying

#### **Expulsion...**

... removing a student from school, and the school district, for serious disciplinary infractions.

- Your education in a Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District (SMMUSD) school is stopped.
- You must appear before a hearing panel; the Board of Education will decide if you are to be expelled.
- Students who are expelled attend county schools.

### **Expulsion**

A student **MUST be expelled** (**ZERO TOLERANCE**) for any of the following reasons:

- Possessed, sold or furnished a firearm
- Brandished a knife at another person
- Sold controlled substance
- Committed, or attempted to commit, sexual assault or sexual battery
- Possessed an explosive

# A student may be RECOMMENDED for expulsion

for any of the following reasons:

- Caused serious injury to another person
- Possessed any knife, or other dangerous object, of no reasonable use to the student
- Unlawfully possessed any controlled substance (second offense)
- Engaged in robbery or extortion
- Committed assault or battery upon any school personnel
