# Why are we here?

## *EC 32288 specifies:*

*(a) In order to ensure compliance with this article, each school shall forward its comprehensive school safety plan to the school district or county office of education for approval.*

*(b) (1) Before adopting its comprehensive school safety plan, the school site council or school safety planning committee shall hold a public meeting at the school site in order to allow members of the public the opportunity to express an opinion about the school safety plan.*

*(2) The school site council or school safety planning committee shall notify, in writing, the following persons and entities, if available, of the public meeting:*

*The local mayor.*

*A representative of the local school employee organization. (ex: SMMCTA or SEIU)*

*A representative of each parent organization at the school site, including the parent teacher association and parent teacher clubs. (ex: PTA/ELA/Other)*

*A representative of each teacher organization at the school site.*

*A representative of the student body government. (ex: ASB)*

*All persons who have indicated they want to be notified.*

*(3) The school site council or school safety planning committee is encouraged to notify, in writing, the following persons and entities, if available, of the public meeting:*

*A representative of the local churches. (Discuss with SSC and give them the task to invite)*

*Local civic leaders. (Discuss with SSC and give them the task to invite)*

*Local business organizations (Discuss with SSC and give them the task to invite)*



# What is in the CSSSP?

*Comprehensive School Safety Plans are required under SB 719 & AB 115 and contains the following elements:*

- Assessment of school crime committed on school campuses and at school-related functions
- **Child abuse reporting procedures**
- **Disaster procedures including ICS and responsibilities and specific procedure for response to various types of emergencies including aircraft crash, disorderly conduct, fire, flooding, medical emergency, tsunami etc.)**
- **Suspension and expulsion policies**
- **Procedures to notify teachers of dangerous pupils**
- **Discrimination and harassment policies**
- School wide dress code policies
- Procedures for safe ingress and egress
- Policies enacted to maintain a safe and orderly environment
- Rules and procedures on school discipline
- **Hate crime reporting procedures**



# CSSP PROCESS/TIMELINE:

- Annual Update (Evaluate/Amend as needed)
- Begin with assessment of the current status of school crime
  - -Surveys (ie: CHKS, Climate, Olweus)
  - -Office Referrals, Suspension, Expulsion
  - -Any additional information available
- **Update maps**
- **Update student information**
- **Revise team members**
- **Revise locations**
- October 12, 2023: SSC: Present, allow for public opinions, SSC Approval
- Revise/Update information
- October 19, 2023: Deadline to submit to district
- TBD: School Board Approval

# ANNUAL SECURITY STEPS:

- Emergency/Disaster Binder Updated by Administration (new maps – including assembly area to permanent fixtures, evacuation routes, emergency tree)
- Backpack Grab Bags Updated by Health Office - PTSA
- Updated Emergency Contact lists including off hour response
- Update Student Health Info
- Annual Staff Trainings (board policies, mandated reporter, targeted response, depression/suicide)
- Annual Student Rules Talks
- Coordination with Club, LASD, LA County Fire
- Annual Audit of Emergency Supplies
- Annual Safety Drills, Procedures

- Building Lettering
- Guidepost Assessment– City of Malibu
- 4<sup>th</sup> Security Cart - PTSA

- Tabletop Activity with LASD – Lost Hills

# Challenges:

- Internet and connectivity, cell service: communication
- Building Design (ie: Building E, windows and single door)
- After hour access controls
- Sheriff Response Time
- Reliability of VASS
- Staff follow through on security measures (ie: video doorbell, raptor, locked gates)
- Interior parking areas, BGC access
- Single drive way at blind turn, traffic calming
- Maintenance and Operations (ie: detailed map, simplex numbering, room signage indoors)



# Current Input (LASD/MHS/MMS):

- Ongoing School Resource Deputy Discussion
- Ongoing questions regarding perimeter fencing, visitor controls
- Vape detector analysis – PTSA
- Detailed Utility Map
- Numbers Inside of Classrooms, Rooftop
- Knox Boxes – LASD
- VASS (Coverage, monitoring, tech issues)
- PA – Ability to Access Across Campus
- Wayfinding Signage
- Film on Windows
- Bus Radio Repair



# Current Input (Guidepost - 95):

- Reinforce expectations around traffic/pick up and drop off/visitors
- Consistent location of emergency backpacks and supplies
- “Security culture” ie: staff badges, empower staff to question unfamiliar people)
- Additional Walkie Talkies
- Signage- Restrooms for Student Use, Main Entrance, Way Finding, Speed Limits, fixed signage
- Visitor Management (ie: Meet/escort, remove old paper screening, signage)
- PA system upgrades
- Numbers Inside of Classrooms, Rooftop
- Door routines (ie: closed/locked)
- VoIP backup system
- Secure fencing around equipment, panels, IDF, covers
- Utility rooms (MDF) being used as storage
- Staff Emergency Operations Handbook Edits



# Current Input (Guidepost):

- Lock Down Button with LASD Notice
- Perimeter (ie: 8 feet, fence toppers, 1 inch), layout, glass facades
- Ongoing School Resource Deputy Discussion (“highly beneficial”)
- Expanded Use of Salto ( and tech integration)
- VASS monitoring (ie: cafeteria, library, front entry, exterior of each restroom) and upgrades
- Films/coverings-glazing
- Intrusion Detection upgrades (ie: glass break, vape, panic, motion)
- Door hardware upgrades
- Speed controls, vehicle barriers, parking in designated parking areas
- Exterior lighting
- MO (ie: secured cages over utility points, elevator, electrical tape)
- Card readers/intercoms at all pedestrian entry points
- Automated electronic access gates

# PRIOR SECURITY EFFORTS

- Security Assessment performed by JRIC (Joint Regional Intelligence Center)
- Implementation of Raptor Visitor ID System, Second Raptor System
- Single Entry, Video Doorbell System (Building AB)
- Security Camera Installation
- Perimeter Fencing
- Electronic locks in new buildings
- Lockdown button/magnets with locked doors
- Flashing student cross walk, Crossing guards (City Supported)
- Secondary Emergency Supplies Bin (PTSA Supported)



# PRIOR SECURITY EFFORTS

- Created clear Incident Command System: identified alternate team leads, alternate locations
- Added info on student with health/special needs
- Added information around air quality index and response
- Key controls
- Lockdown kits
- Stop the Bleed Kits (PTSA Supported)
- Additional AEDs
- Narcan/Naloxone (2 doses)
- Updated Staff Grab Bags (PTSA Supported)
- A2A Behavior Alert System



# PRIOR SECURITY EFFORTS

- Increase campus security staffing from 2 to 4.
- Alert notification system (Blackboard, Twitter)
- Revised threat and risk assessment procedures and team
- Freshman CPR training, identifying student state trained lifeguards
- Volunteer/staff screening procedures
- NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) presentations
- Wellness Center Partnerships/Classroom presentations
- School staff attended active shooter training with Lt. Jenn Seetoo
- School staff attended US Secret Service National Threat Assessment
