Meeting began at 3:47.

Katherine Kennedy moved to approve the minutes. Makenna Samsel seconded.

Minutes from 12.9 approved with all in favor.

In Cindy Smith's absence Sean Ryan led the meeting.

Today we focused on the Comprehensive School Safety Plan. Mr. Miller explained some components are within the school's discretion to change. No one from the first responder community was in attendance but they were invited. Items that were discussed:

- Substitutes should be included in training.
- The campus can feel vulnerable and very open, since we are an outside school.
- Plan is to do a lockdown active shooter drill, which will happen either this semester or at the beginning of next year.
- Campus is safer now than in year's past.

Katherine Kennedy made a move to approve the plan, Julia Hoos seconded. The Comprehensive Safety Plan was approved with all in favor.

Soniya Perl provided a PTSA update. The general meeting will be next Thursday for parents. A presentation by NAMI will follow Mr. Miller's update to parents about the second semester. Also, the PTSA is looking for additional people to serve on the executive board.

The Middle School Site Council members left our meeting to begin their own meeting separately.

Malibu Medical Group has helped identify cases, but the school has not received many test results. MMG is looking into changing labs as a result.

Sarah Lipetz updated everyone on Science Department Goals for 2021 -2022.

Alex Mayle discussed English Department Goals for 2021-2022.

Isabella Howe provided an update from Student Voice.

- Some students are having difficulty while in quarantine working with Google Classroom.
- Lines at the cafeteria are too long.
- Seniors would like to have the juniors' parking lot
- Boys bathrooms have been cleaner
- Eating at lunch has been more spaced out which students appreciate
- Students say teachers have been very considerate

Alexandra gave us an update on ELAC.

Mr. Miller addressed Isabella's concerns.

Mr. Miller discussed the fact that Calculus BC AP students will take the AP test at the end of the year. Calculus AB students are concerned that students will not be able to cover all material prior to the test. Geometry and Geometry Honors do not have an impact on MHS math sequencing. Geometry Honors will not be offered next year.

We will discuss the pros and cons of adding a National Honor Society to MHS at a future meeting, along with writing the advisory letter.
