Meeting began at 3:45.
Minutes taken by Linn Griffin, secretary.

Kellye McKinna moved to approve the minutes. Sophia O'Brien seconded.

Minutes from 10.21 approved with all in favor.

Mr. Miller gave us an update on recent student award celebrations. Covid-compliance issues were the focus of a 3-hour meeting today. A survey will go out soon to families. We discussed the current protocols and what we might change/loosen, if any. The high school play begins tomorrow (Friday), and there are music concerts in the coming week. On weekly Covid testing: if students are absent on Jan. 4th, they will have to provide a negative test to come back to school.

Soniya Perl gave a PTSA update. PTA Reflections Zoom occurred yesterday, winners have been forwarded to SMMUSD. In need of new Treasurer, but Kelly Kincaid has stepped in to assist. Possible service event in January, which will be a great way for kids to be involved near MLK day. Shark Week: raised over \$250,000.

We discussed the bylaws and SSC terms and office roles. Sean Ryan made a motion to adopt the amended bylaws. The Council voted unanimously in favor.

ELAC: Currently 21 English learners at MHS. ELAC parent input is required for the SPSA. Once we have 3 parents out of 21 to form an ELAC. Finding a liaison between the school and EL students would be very helpful for teachers and students alike. There is a community group (Cafe con Leche) which may serve the school in terms of what the district requires to be compliant.

The goals on the SPSA summary were reviewed again, as well as the Climate and Culture Comprehensive Needs Assessment Survey, conducted in Spring/Summer of 2021. Makenna Samsel moved to approve the SPSA summary and Sean Ryan seconded. All on the Council voted to approve.

CSSP discussion was tabled for next month. Students take an interim CSSP to assess learning. Ms. Smith and Mr. Miller updated us on the different departments and timing of this test. In

December, we will compare last year's scores to this year's data. Data is used to identify and assist students who need extra help in certain areas.

Bella reported on complaints regarding Spirit Packs. Boys' basketball usually receives Spirit Packs and girls do not. Funding seems to be uneven. Bathrooms need attention. Mr. Miller addressed the bathroom issues to say that feminine products are available in the nurse's office. MHS is not a Title I school, meaning feminine products are not required to be provided for free. Spirit Packs are optional. Uniforms are on a 3-year rotation. We will revisit these topics on our next agenda.
