# THIS WEEK AT MHS:

**FALL CSF/CJSF DRIVE** – California (Junior) Scholarship Federation is a state-accredited honor society that recognizes California students for academic scholarship and service. Current 8-12th Graders may apply for fall CSF/CJSF. The Fall CSF/CJSF Drive is the **week of October 16 - 20.** Your counselors will be set up at a table during lunchtime near the cafeteria every day during that week. During that same window, students will complete a writing assessment in English classes. These benchmark tests allow students to experience the state testing format and provide teachers with information to monitor progress prior to the spring assessment.
