THE WILDFIRE YOUTH MEDIA INITIATIVE: The Wildfire Youth Media Initiative at the USC Annenberg Center on Communication Leadership and Policy is a new four-week summer program that trains high school students to collect community stories of the devastating January 2025 wildfires and their aftermath. The initiative will bring together about 12 students—all aged 16 and above, six with connections to the Pacific Palisades and six to the greater Altadena area—two to three times a week during July/August. As a cohort, students will attend community listening sessions in both the Palisades and Altadena, documenting the stories of each other and their communities. At USC, students will be taught how to turn those interviews into local news products, such as podcasts. KCRW, one of LA's NPR member stations, is a partner of the initiative. The deadline to apply is May 16. Eligible students include rising and current sophomores, juniors, and seniors.
